# 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that the Annual Public Employees Recognition Awards Ceremony will be held on Wednesday, May 22nd, from 1:45 - 2:45 p.m. at the Municipal Auditorium. She encouraged all legislators to attend and join her in honoring these employees.

She mentioned that repairs on the sidewalks, steps and curbs around the Independence Courthouse Annex was recently completed.

She said the Children Against Violence Art Program will be displaying some artwork at the Jackson County Courthouse in dowtown Kansas City for the next 30 days. Beginning May 14th the artwork will be on display on the second floor, outside the Kansas City Legislative Assembly Area. The Children Against Violence Art is an inner-city anti-violence initiative for grade school children. The program combines education with art therapy and entertainment to help teach children early coping skills to mediate conflict. She recognized Ron Hunt for his valuable contributions to this program. She encouraged everyone to take time to view the artwork.
