AN ORDINANCE submitting to the qualified voters of Jackson County, Missouri, at a General Election to be held on November 5, 2024, a question authorizing Jackson County to impose a countywide capital improvement sales tax of one-eighth of one percent for a period of twenty-five years for the purpose of retaining the Kansas City Chiefs sports team in Jackson County, Missouri.

ORDINANCE NO. 5860 June 17, 2024

INTRODUCED BY Manuel Abarca IV, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Kansas City Chiefs Football Club is a County and area-wide asset that has made and will continue to make significant contributions to the economic well-being and quality of life in Jackson County and the Kansas City metropolitan area; and,

WHEREAS, this professional league team has been the County's tenant at Arrowhead Stadium at the Harry S. Truman Sports Complex since the early 1970s; and,

WHEREAS, improvements to and modernization of Arrowhead Stadium is necessary to ensure that the stadium is in nationally competitive physical condition in the marketplace of professional sports, for the foreseeable future; and,

WHEREAS, to achieve a development plan to make the stadium nationally competitive and to guarantee the teams' continued presence in Jackson County, representatives of the team, the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority, and the County have been working diligently to negotiate

and develop a plan for improvements and additions to the existing Arrowhead Stadium for the Chiefs, in Jackson County, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, as an express condition of negotiating possible financial support of the stadium, Jackson County, Missouri, requires and is negotiating (a) a lease and development agreement with the Chiefs which incorporates the terms and conditions under which the Chiefs will develop, renovate, furnish, equip, repair, maintain, operate, and occupy Arrowhead Stadium, and (b) one or more community benefits agreements with the Chiefs set forth the terms and conditions under which the team will financially support and engage in programming designed to create opportunities that will serve and advance the interests and vitality of, among others, the residents, youth, labor, minority and women enterprises, workforce, economies, and communities of Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, subject to the foregoing express conditions, Jackson County, Missouri, has determined that stadium park improvement funding utilizing a countywide capital improvement sales tax at the rate of one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) for a period of twenty-five years from the date first imposed is appropriate and the most effective means of funding the stadium; and,

WHEREAS, the County has determined that, subject to the team agreeing to enter into lease, development, and community benefits agreements, a new countywide capital improvement sales tax to commence upon the expiration or termination of the existing sales tax and to continue for a period of 25 years, for stadium park improvements to retain the Chiefs in the County is in the best interests of the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

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Section 1. Contingent upon the Chiefs agreeing to enter into a lease agreement, development

agreement, and one or more community benefits agreements acceptable to the County, subject to

plans of development, improvement of Arrowhead Stadium, and further subject to approval by the

voters of the County, the levy of a countywide capital improvement sales tax in the amount of one-

eighth (1/8) of one cent (0.125), is hereby authorized for and within Jackson County, Missouri.

Section 2. The current tax levy, as approved by voters on April 4, 2006, will expire on September 30,

2031. Subject to the approval of the voters of the County, the new levy will begin October 1, 2031,

and continue for a term of 25 years, the duration of the proposed lease with the Chiefs which governs

the Chiefs' long-term use, repair, maintenance, operation, and occupancy of Arrowhead Stadium, in

Jackson County.

<u>Section 3</u>. Subject to the foregoing and pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.700, RSMo, there is

hereby submitted to the qualified voters of Jackson County, Missouri, General Election to be held on

November 5, 2024, a question authorizing the imposition of a countywide capital improvement sales

tax of one-eighth of one percent (1/8%), for the purpose of providing funding for park improvements

consisting of Arrowhead Stadium and its surrounds, in Jackson County.

Section 4. The qualified voters at said election shall vote by ballot and the ballots to be used at said

election shall contain the following language:

Jackson County, Missouri?

<u>Section 5.</u> This Ordinance shall be published as required by law.

<u>Section 6.</u> The Clerk of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Jackson County Board of Election Commissioners and the Kansas City Board of Election Commissioners of the adoption of this Ordinance no later than August 27, 2024, by 5:00 p.m. and to include in said notification all the terms and provisions required by Section 115.125, RSMo 2016.

<u>Section 7</u>. The County is hereby authorized to be reimbursed its costs incurred in connection with the November 5, 2024, election out of the proceeds of the tax once authorized.

67.700. Sales tax for capital improvements may be imposed in certain counties, procedure — use of revenue — tax effective when — brackets to be established — rate of tax — sales tax revenue collected, defined.

- 1. Any county, as defined in section <u>67.724</u>, may, by ordinance or order, impose a sales tax on all retail sales made in such county which are subject to taxation under the provisions of sections <u>144.010</u> to <u>144.525</u> for any capital improvement purpose designated by the county in its ballot of submission to its voters; provided, however, that no ordinance or order enacted pursuant to the authority granted by sections <u>67.700</u> to <u>67.727</u> shall be effective unless the governing body of the county submits to the voters of the county, at a county or state general, primary, or special election, a proposal to authorize the governing body of the county to impose a tax under the provisions of sections <u>67.700</u> to <u>67.727</u>. The tax authorized by this section shall be in addition to any and all other sales taxes allowed by law.

If you are in favor of the question, place an "X" in the box opposite "YES". If you are opposed to the question, place an "X" in the box opposite "NO".

If a majority of the votes cast on the proposal by the qualified voters voting thereon are in favor of the proposal, then the ordinance or order and any amendments thereto shall be in effect. If a majority of the votes cast by the qualified voters voting are opposed to the proposal, then the governing body of the county shall have no power to impose the sales tax authorized by sections <u>67.700 to 67.727</u> unless and until the governing body of the

county shall again have submitted another proposal to authorize it to impose the sales tax under the provisions of sections <u>67.700 to 67.727</u> and such proposal is approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting thereon.

- 3. All revenue received by a county from the tax authorized by sections <u>67.700</u> to <u>67.727</u> which has been designated for a certain capital improvement purpose shall be deposited in a special trust fund and shall be used solely for such designated purpose. Upon the expiration of the period of years approved by the voters under subsection 2 of this section or if the tax authorized by sections <u>67.700</u> to <u>67.727</u> is repealed under section <u>67.721</u>, all funds remaining in the special trust fund shall continue to be used solely for such designated capital improvement purpose including the payment of principal and interest on any bonds issued to pay for such capital improvement. Any funds in such special trust fund which are not needed for current expenditures may be invested by the governing body in accordance with applicable laws relating to the investment of other county funds.
- 4. The sales tax may be imposed at a rate of one-eighth of one percent, one-fifth of one percent, one-fourth of one percent, three-eighths of one percent, or one-half of one percent on the receipts from the sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services at retail within the county adopting such tax, if such property and services are subject to taxation by the state of Missouri under the provisions of sections <u>144.010</u> to <u>144.525</u>.
- 5. In addition to the rates provided in subsection 4 of this section, any county of the first class without a charter form of government which adjoins a county of the first class containing part of a city containing more than three hundred fifty thousand inhabitants and which also adjoins a county of the third class having a township form of government shall also be authorized to (1) levy such sales tax at a rate of one-eighth of one percent; or (2) levy such sales tax at a rate of one-fourth of one percent in conjunction with a reduction in its property tax levy or levies for general revenues or for funding the maintenance of roads and bridges, or both, for

each year in which the sales tax is imposed. Such reduction shall be in an amount sufficient to decrease the property taxes it will collect by not less than fifty percent of the sales tax revenue collected in the tax year for which the property taxes are being levied. If in the immediately preceding year a county actually collected less sales tax revenue than was projected for purposes of reducing its property tax levy or levies, the county shall adjust its property tax levy or levies for the current year to reflect such decrease. Any such county seeking voter approval of the sales tax alternative authorized in this subsection shall include in the ballot of submission authorized in subsection 2 of this section language clearly stating the appropriate percentage of the sales tax revenue shall be used for property tax reduction as provided herein. For purposes of this subsection, the term "sales tax revenue collected" shall have the meaning provided in section 67.500.

WHEREAS, improvements to and modernization of Arrowhead Stadium is necessary to ensure that the stadium is in nationally competitive physical condition in the marketplace of professional sports, for the foreseeable future; and,

WHEREAS, to achieve a development plan to make the stadium nationally competitive and to guarantee the teams' continued presence in Jackson County, representatives of the team, the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority, and the County have been working diligently to negotiate

and develop a plan for improvements and additions to the existing Arrowhead Stadium for the Chiefs,

in Jackson County, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, as an express condition of negotiating possible financial support of the stadium, Jackson

County, Missouri, requires and is negotiating (a) a lease and development agreement with the Chiefs

which incorporates the terms and conditions under which the Chiefs will develop, renovate, furnish,

equip, repair, maintain, operate, and occupy Arrowhead Stadium, and (b) one or more community

benefits agreements with the Chiefs set forth the terms and conditions under which the team will

ORDINANCE NO. 5864, July 1, 2024

INTRODUCED BY Manuel Abarca IV, County Legislator

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> There is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of Jackson County, Missouri for approval or disapproval one question to amend the 2018 Jackson County Charter, as set forth in this Ordinance, at the general election to be held in Jackson County, Missouri, on the first Tuesday in November 2024.

<u>Section 2.</u> Subject to the approval of the qualified voters of Jackson County, Missouri, at the general election to be held on November 5, 2024, the 2018 Jackson County Charter is hereby amended with amended sections to read as follows:

ARTICLE III.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Section 6. The County Executive, in addition to other powers and duties provided in this charter, shall

have the power to:

1. Appoint, subject to the County Legislature's power of disapproval, directors of

departments, officers not otherwise provided for, members of boards and commissions, and

acting officers to fill any vacancy in any appointive or elective office, except that of County

Legislator; the County Executive shall file written notice of such appointments with the Clerk of

the County Legislature.

2. Employ experts and consultants in connection with any of the functions of the county,

and ensure that all professional services contracts over \$5,000, except in emergency

situations, follow a competitive process to determine award of the contract.

3. Coordinate and supervise the work of the departments, officers and agencies of the

county subject to his or her control.

4. Transfer employees from one department to another department to promote

efficiency and economy. If the employee reports to the County Legislature, Sheriff, Prosecuting

Attorney, Assessor, or Circuit Court, the transfer shall require the approval of the Legislature,

applicable office holder or presiding judge of the Circuit Court.

5. Execute and enforce the provisions of this charter, and the ordinances, resolutions

and policies of the County Legislature, and the laws of the state pertaining to the government

of the county; see that all contracts with the county are faithfully performed and cause to be

instituted in the name of the county appropriate actions thereon.

6. Attend meetings of the County Legislature and participate in its discussions without

vote.

7. Recommend to the County Legislature such measures as may, in his or her opinion,

tend to improve the county government and the general well being of the people; submit to the

County Legislature an annual report of the affairs of the county; promote, encourage and

participate in cooperative relationships between the county and political subdivisions and

governmental bodies and agencies, either within or outside the county or state in matters

relating to public health, ecology, highways, sewers, parks, safety, public welfare, and any and

all other functions for the welfare of the people of Jackson County.

8. Investigate any matter or circumstance having to do with the operation of the county

government, and examine witnesses, parties and others on oath or affirmation touching any

matter or circumstance in the examination of any payroll, account, demand or claim against

the county, and have access to all county books, records and papers kept by county officers

and employees.

[9. Correct errors in assessment and tax records.]

[10] 9. Represent the county and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by

this charter or be required of the County Executive by ordinance or resolution of the County

Legislature or as may be implied by the powers and duties specified in this charter, law or

county ordinance.

[11] 10. Establish by County Executive order from time to time systems of

administrative organization in the departments which shall be as uniform as the various

departmental functions will permit.

[12] 11. Submit to the County Legislature for approval by ordinance an annual balanced

budget at the time and in the manner provided in this charter and by county ordinance.

ARTICLE IV.

DEPARTMENTS

Section 5. The County Executive shall assign all duties and functions prescribed by law or this

charter for [the county assessor,] the county collector, and the county treasurer.

ARTICLE V.

CHARTER OFFICERS

ASSESSOR

Section 16. Effective January 1, 2025, the Assessor shall be elected at the general election in 2028, and every four years thereafter. The Assessor shall take office on January 1 following his or her election. The Assessor shall be a qualified voter, and shall have been domiciled in the county for at least three years before assuming office. No Assessor may serve more than three consecutive full terms commencing on or after January 1, 2029. The Assessor shall forfeit office if they:

- 1. Ceases to be a qualified voter of the County;
- 2. Removes his or her residence from the county:
- 3. Holds any other federal, state, county, or municipal elective office;
- 4. Owes federal income tax, Missouri state income tax, or Missouri local tax which remains unpaid for more than twelve months after such tax debt becomes final under the law of the jurisdiction assessing such tax, unless a payment plan to resolve such delinquency is in effect and is current on its terms.

The Assessor shall be in charge of and responsible for the Division of Assessment and Extension.

The Assessor shall possess and exercise all the powers and duties given by law, charter and ordinance to the County Assessor and shall perform such other duties and exercise such other

powers relative thereto as are provided by law, charter and ordinance. The assessor shall be responsible and accountable for efficient, effective and predictable taxation within the County, as well as responsive to taxing jurisdictions. The assessor will, if requested, report at least guarterly to the

Legislature the plans, outcomes, and anomalies of the assessment, making themselves available

and responsive to legislative and executive communications.

Section 3. The qualified voters at said election shall vote by ballot and the ballots to be used at said

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2024, during the Chiefs' Championship Parade, a shooting was perpetrated that resulted in one death and twenty-two gunshot injuries; and,

WHEREAS, two of the alleged perpetrators of this heinous shooting were juveniles under the age of majority; and,

WHEREAS, the threat and reality of gun violence perpetrated by juvenile offenders is a growing and critical concern in Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Jackson County Legislature to ensure the safety and security of all of Jackson County citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Legislature desires to create a new section in Chapter 55 regarding possession of firearms and age restriction; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Enacting Clause.

Section 5577., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby enacted, to read as follows:

5577. Firearms and Age Restriction.

Possession of pistol or semiautomatic assault rifle by persons aged 18 to 21 years old.

- (1) A person under twenty-one years of age may not purchase a pistol or semiautomatic assault rifle, and except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person may sell or transfer a semiautomatic assault rifle to a person under twenty-one years of age.
- (2) A person less than twenty-one years of age, may possess a pistol only:
 - (a) In the person's place of abode;
 - (b) At the person's fixed place of business; or
 - (c) On real property under his or her control.
- (3) A person at least eighteen years of age, but less than twenty-one years of age, may possess a semiautomatic assault rifle only if they are:
 - (a) In attendance at a firearms safety course;
 - (b) Engaging in practice in the use of a firearm or target shooting at an established range authorized by the governing body of the jurisdiction in which such range is located or any other area where the discharge of a firearm is not prohibited;
 - (c) On real property under the control of his or her parent, other relative, or legal guardian and who has the permission of the parent or legal guardian to possess a firearm;
 - (d) Is a member of law enforcement, the armed forces of the United States, national guard, or organized reserves, when on duty.

(1) A person under twenty-one years of age may not purchase a pistol or semiautomatic assault rifle, and except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person may sell or transfer a semiautomatic assault rifle to a person under twenty-one years of age.

- (2) A person less than twenty-one years of age, may possess a pistol only:
 - (a) In the person's place of abode;
 - (b) At the person's fixed place of business; or
 - (c) On real property under his or her control.
- (3) A person at least eighteen years of age, but less than twenty-one years of age, may possess a semiautomatic assault rifle only if they are:
 - (a) In attendance at a firearms safety course;
 - (b) Engaging in practice in the use of a firearm or target shooting at an established range authorized by the governing body of the jurisdiction in which such range is located or any other area where the discharge of a firearm is not prohibited;
 - (c) On real property under the control of his or her parent, other relative, or legal guardian and who has the permission of the parent or legal guardian to possess a firearm;
 - (d) Is a member of law enforcement, the armed forces of the United States, national guard, or organized reserves, when on duty.

 - ii. For all other taxpayers, the year in which the taxpayer meets all requirements of section 2066.1(b) is the "initial credit year".

2066.2 Tax Credit; Statement of Tax Due.

Any tax credit granted pursuant to this section shall be applied when calculating the eligible taxpayer's property tax liability for the tax year. The amount of tax credit shall be noted on the File #: 5866, Version: 0

statement of tax due sent to the eligible taxpayer by the Jackson County Collector.

2066.3 Subsequent Credit Amount.

If in any tax year subsequent to the eligible taxpayer's initial credit year the eligible taxpayer's real property tax liability is lower than such liability in the initial credit year, such tax year shall be considered the eligible taxpayer's initial credit year for all subsequent tax years.

<u>2066.4</u> <u>Impact of New Construction.</u>

If an eligible taxpayer makes new construction and improvements to such eligible taxpayer's homestead, the real property tax liability for the taxpayer's initial credit year shall be increased to reflect the real property tax liability attributable to such new construction and improvements.

2066.5 Impact of Annexation.

If an eligible taxpayer's homestead is annexed into a taxing jurisdiction to which such eligible taxpayer did not owe real property tax in the eligible taxpayer's initial credit year, then the real property tax liability for the taxpayer's initial credit year shall be increased to reflect the real property tax liability owed to the annexing taxing jurisdiction.

I respectfully request the transfer of \$577,680 to provide additional professional services in support of software implementation and optimization. Also, I request approval for two additional 12-month options for Remy Corporation term and supply contract.

Professional Services

On Sept. 19, 2022, the Jackson County Legislature passed Resolution 21036, awarding a contract for the furnishing of Workday, a cloud-based software- as-a-service for financial and human capital management. We launched Workday Human Capital Management in December 2023 and Finance and Budget in February 2024 marking significant milestones in this journey.

As we continue to embrace this transformative shift, we have identified the need for additional professional services to ensure the project's success in 2024. Our team has demonstrated unparalleled dedication and resilience in navigating the complexities of this new technology. We have not only adapted to change but are actively shaping it to better serve our organization. In this vein, we recognize the need for continued support in some of the more technically complicated areas.

One of the most exciting aspects of this transition is the discovery of functionalities previously unavailable to us. Automation of work has had a dramatic impact to previous paper processes. Additionally, our newfound ability to integrate systems directly streamlines data input, freeing up valuable time for our staff to focus on more strategic endeavors. This not only enhances productivity but also reduces errors and overall costs for our organization.

Moreover, our proactive approach extends beyond mere adaptation; we are actively establishing a robust governance structure to ensure accountability and ownership among our team members. This framework will guide us as we continue to review and align our business processes, a task that requires technical expertise in configuration, business process definitions, and reporting coding.

In addition to optimizing and streamlining current configurations, we anticipate several key initiatives for the 2nd half of 2024, including employee Open Enrollment for 2025 benefits and year-end employee tax processing. To this end, we have identified the need for resources covering various functional areas, including Strategic Change, Integrations, Human Capital Management/Security, Benefits, Absence, Payroll, Purchasing, Financial Accounting, and Financial Reporting, estimating 3,640 hours level of effort at an estimated cost not to exceed \$577,680. The attached estimate provides the estimated hours for each functional area at our average hourly rate of \$165 for Workday consultant professional services.

Remy Corporation term and supply contract

On January 17, 2023, the Jackson County Legislature approved Resolution 21142, establishing a term and supply contract with Remy Corporation of Denver, CO, under the terms of State of Oklahoma Contract No. SW1025, a pre-existing, competitively-bid government contract. Remy Corporation specializes in staffing and consulting services, specifically in recruiting Information Technology professionals across diverse industries and roles, and is a certified Workday services partner. Our collaboration with Remy enables us to tailor our resource requests to precisely meet our needs on an as-needed basis, proving invaluable in our efforts to implement Workday.

The Oklahoma Contract No. SW1025 Master Agreement was originally executed 7/22/22 and is currently effective from 10/1/2023 to 9/30/2024, with four annual renewal options available through 9/30/2028. The initial term of the Jackson County/Remy contract was 12 months, with an option to extend it for an additional 12 months. We now aim to further extend the contract with two additional 12-month options, not to exceed 9/30/2028. This extension ensures continuity of services as we continue optimizing and enhancing our business processes using Workday software.

WHEREAS, the Legislature desires to change its rules regarding how legislation can be transferred from one committee to another; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri that Rules 16 and 19 of the Rules of the Jackson County Legislature be and hereby are amended to read:

RULE SIXTEEN. Ordinances - Introduction.

A. Proposals for ordinances shall be introduced by members by submitting a Request for Legislative Action (RLA), including short title, to the County Counselor's Office. The County Counselor's Office shall assign a number to the proposal and transmit it to the County Clerk to place it on the agenda for the next regular meeting. Upon the reading of the short title at the meeting, the sponsoring member or members may briefly explain the purpose and application of the proposal.

B. A proposal for any ordinance which would grant a permit under Chapter 240 of the Jackson County Code, the Unified Development Code, shall be assigned a number and placed on

the agenda for the next regular meeting by the Clerk, without a sponsor. For purposes of compliance with other provisions of this Rule, Rule Seventeen governing the perfection of ordinances, Rule Twenty-one, governing the results of no action on ordinances and resolutions, and Rule Twenty-two, governing the dropping of ordinances and resolutions, the chair of the Legislature's Land Use Committee shall be deemed the sponsor of such an ordinance. (Resolution #11766)

- C. Proposals for ordinances shall be assigned to the appropriate committee by the Chairman of the Legislature. If a [sponsor of the proposal] <u>Legislator</u> objects to assignment to that particular committee, the [sponsoring member] <u>Legislator</u> may move for reassignment to some other designated committee. Passage of such a motion for reassignment requires a simple [two-thirds] majority of those present and voting.
- D. A proposal for ordinance may be immediately added to the perfection agenda of the same meeting at which the proposal was introduced only if a motion for immediate perfection is carried. Passage of such a motion requires a two-thirds majority of those present and voting. If the ordinance appropriates funds, a motion for immediate perfection will be defeated by two "No" votes. (Resolution #17631)
 - E. No proposal for ordinance shall contain more than one subject.

RULE NINETEEN. Resolutions - Introduction and Assignment to Committee.

A. Proposals for resolutions shall be introduced by members by first submitting a written draft of the proposal, including short title, to the County Counselor's office. The County Counselor's office shall then assign a number to the proposal and transmit it to the County Clerk to place it on the agenda for the next regular meeting. Upon the reading of the short title at the meeting, the sponsoring member or members may briefly explain the purpose and application of the proposal.

B. Unless immediately adopted, proposals for resolutions shall be assigned to the appropriate

committee by the Chair of the Legislature. If a [sponsor of a resolution] <u>Legislator</u> objects to the committee assignment, that member may move for reassignment to some other designated committee. Passage of such a motion requires a [two-thirds] <u>simple</u> majority of those present and voting.

- C. If a Resolution is assigned to committee, the committee may:
 - (1) Accept the resolution in the form approved by the Counselor;
 - (2) Amend the resolution; or
 - (3) Substitute a new draft of the resolution.

A committee may:

- (1) Take no action;
- (2) Return the resolution to the Legislature with no recommendation;
- (3) Recommend that the Legislature do not pass the resolution; or
- (4) Recommend that the Legislature do pass the resolution, the resolution as amended, or its substituted draft of the resolution.
- D. Amendments by a committee or substitution of a new draft by a committee shall not be contrary to or beyond the scope of the short title of the resolution.
- E. If a committee's vote on a motion to recommend "do pass" is a tie, the motion is defeated, and the proposal shall be returned to the Legislature with no recommendation.
- F. Copies of any resolution which has been amended in committee shall show the amendments by bracketing any words which the amendment deletes and underlining any words which the amendment adds. Committee chairs shall ensure that the County Counselor provides a sufficient number of copies of any resolution so amended to the Legislature at the regular meeting at which it is reported out of committee. Neither a committee nor the Legislature as a Whole may take action on a resolution amended in committee or on the floor of the Legislature until the amendment has been

Mr. Konon,

The Public Works Facilities Management division is recommending MC Janitorial be awarded the Term and Supply Contract regarding Bid No 24-033 for custodial services used by our department.

Although MC Janitorial was not the lowest bid received, this recommendation is based on important factors including the high quality of service that MC Janitorial has provided the County with over the previous 24-month contract term. The company has had little to no turnover, they have consistently sent the same person to work in our buildings, this person is familiar with our needs and requirements. No training would be necessary as MC Janitorial has completed all required training. They are a local company with a staff of 52, whereas the lowest bidder, Aspen Cleaning LLC has only 7 employees and the second lowest bidder, Tech Link Business and Services Corporation (a company based out of Texas), has only 12, limiting their ability to insure the consistency we need with the staff they are able to send for this outsourced service.

County employees deal with the same MC Janitorial employees so there is a level of trust when they are in our buildings. This facilitates better communication of needs between MC Janitorial staff and our employees, including our judges, who do need to interact with them from time to time.

MC Janitorial staff has also completed all of the county's mandatory training, such as Active Shooter and tornado drills. We would not have to take time away from work to repeat these trainings as we would need to do with the other companies.

It is for these reasons that the Facilities Management Division of Public Works strongly feels that awarding Bid No. 24-033 to MC Janitorial is the best, most cost-effective option.

The Facilities Management division has estimated an annual spending amount of \$159,000.00 for this contract. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me at (816) 217-9310.



6. PRICE QUOTE FORM (PQF) Requirements (see section 2.6 of the Scope of Work for additional details) — The state agency will contact all QVL contractor(s) via email (which includes a pre-filled out Attachment 1, PQF) who were awarded the requested motor vehicle category(ies) to obtain firm, fixed price quotes. All applicable fields to the agency should be filled out prior to sending the request to the contractors. In addition, the quote request will include the specifications required and the quantity of vehicles required. The state agency's quote request will also indicate if the state agency desires or requires any additional options or features (upgrades) to be included with the motor vehicle in addition to the base model vehicle defined.

NOTE: 1) If additional options and features are already installed on the vehicle then the QVL contractor shall price the vehicle as one total dollar amount for the motor vehicle that includes the already installed options and features. 2) If the PQF requests or requires options and features that are not currently installed on the vehicle proposed by the QVL contractor, then the QVL contractor must price those items separately to ensure the vehicle proposed meets the requirements identified in the PQF.

Agencies are also required to provide a blank Attachment 3, Domestic Product Procurement Act (Buy American) Preference with the PQF form to all contractors at the time of issuing a PQF form. Contractors must fill out Attachment 3 and return it with their PQF response in order to be considered for the award of the purchase order.

7. **EVALUATION OF THE PQF (see section 2.7 of the Scope of Work for additional details)** – Since multiple contracts exist, the state agency shall evaluate and record the total cost provided in each contractor's PQF response utilizing Attachment 2, Motor Vehicles Price Quote Form Award Record, to determine the lowest-priced contractor. Agencies will need to process the steps outlined in section 2.7.4 of the Scope of Work. The state agency shall determine the lowest-priced contractor by determining each contractor's total cost for the requested vehicle based upon the specifications, anticipated options required, quantity(ies) and the prices quoted on the PQF form. In the event the lowest-priced contractor is unable to provide the required vehicle due to unavailability, the state agency shall contact the next lowest-priced contractor as determined by processing the steps in section 2.7.4 of the Scope of Work. If additional contracts exist, and the first two lowest-priced contractors were unable to provide the vehicles, the state agency shall continue to use the same criteria for selecting a contractor until the needs of the state agency are met. All pricing shall include all shipping, and freight charges FOB Destination, Freight Prepaid and Allowed. The State of Missouri shall not make additional payments or pay add-on charges for freight or shipping.





State agencies shall make every attempt to process an award of a PQF within forty-eight (48) hours of the PQF deadline date. Any delays in the forty-eight (48) hour timeframe must be communicated to the QVL contractors that submitted a response to a PQF. QVL contractors shall not face consequences for selling a vehicle off the lot to another customer in the event an award has not been made within the forty-eight (48) hour timeframe and failure of the agency to communicate a delay occurs.

The PQF shall be awarded to the lowest and best QVL contractor defined herein as the specification-compliant QVL contractor who scores the highest number of evaluation points considering:

- a. The specifications and contents included on the PQF form and Attachment 2, Motor Vehicles Price Quote For Award Record;
- b. Cost, including the Missouri Domestic Products Procurement Act preference; and
- c. As applicable, when alternative fuel vehicles are bid, a life cycle cost evaluation must be performed based on the requirements stated in Chapter 414.415 RSMo. The evaluation of cost shall be completed as a life cycle cost analysis based on the quoted firm, fixed vehicle base price included in the response to the PQF using the following: (a) an average life span of 120,000 miles for the vehicle; (b) the combined city/highway fuel mileage rating for the vehicle; and (c) the fuel cost per gallon on the date the PQF responses are due as published in the most recent Missouri Energy Bulletin. The state agency will use the following formula to determine the life cycle cost:

 $LCC = UP + (LV \times GC)$

MPG

LCC = Life Cycle Cost

UP = Unit Price of vehicle proposed

LV = Life of vehicle is 120,000 miles

GC = Gasoline cost per gallon for this PQF response will be the current average price for Mid-Missouri on the due date of the PQF

MPG = Miles per gallon, combined city/highway mileage as stated by the vendor for each model

NOTE: If there is an inconsistency between vendor responses for the combined city/highway mileage, the state agency shall contact the manufacturer representative for all models quoted for that line item to verify the information. If the combined city/highway mileage is not provided by the vendor for the model proposed, the state agency reserves the right to use the EPA combined city/highway mileage as state at www.fueleconomy.gov when determining the life cycle cost per model. If the combined city/highway mileage is not available at www.fueleconomy.gov, the state





agency reserves the right to contact the manufacturer to receive the combined city/highway mileage.

The state agency will provide all responding QVL contractors of the results of the PQF awarded by providing a copy of the completed Attachment 2 - Motor Vehicle Price Quote Request Form (PQF) Award Record.

8. **Purchase Order Requirements –** The state agency must also provide authorization to proceed through issuance of a purchase order or specific written authorization to ship.

<u>Note to State Agencies</u>: Prior to making a vehicle purchase, the state agency must complete a vehicle pre-approval form and submit to Kelly Ocheskey, OA - Fleet Management. The pre-approval form can be found at the following website address:

Once the state agency receives approval from OA - Fleet Management, the agency shall issue its own PGQ (Quick Price Agreement) order in SAMII or a requisition within MissouriBUYS.

NOTE (Cooperative Procurement Members Only): The Vehicle Pre-Approval Form <u>does</u> <u>not</u> apply to cooperative procurement members – only to State of Missouri agencies. <u>State agencies</u> must use the following Line Item/Commodity (UNSPSC) code combinations when issuing their purchase orders (these line items and codes are the same for all contracts):

Line item 2	25101505	Minivans or Vans
Line item 3	25101507	Light Trucks or Sport Utility Vehicles
Line item 4	25101702	Police Vehicles
Line item 5	25181602	Trucks Chassis

9. **Delivery** – Delivery for all vehicles shall be due as indicated by the state agency on the PQF form prior to issuing the PQF. The QVL contractor who was awarded the PQF shall only deliver upon receipt of an authorized purchase order. The QVL contractor must call the state agency 24 hours prior to making an appointment for delivery. Delivery must be made between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 Noon or 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, Central Time. Deliveries shall not be made on state holidays.





Each delivered vehicle shall be clean, lubricated, serviced and ready for immediate service. This shall include installation of all required options and accessories and removal of all plastic and signage (e.g. window sticker) from the interior and exterior of the vehicle. The window sticker may be left in the "glove box" or included with other documentation.

Each vehicle delivered shall include a proper form to apply for Missouri title and license including the Manufacturer's State of Origin and invoice, an owner's manual, and warranty. The title and invoice for all alternative fuel vehicles must clearly indicate the vehicle is alternative fuel (flex fuel (FFV) or E-85).

The Manufacturer's Standard Factory Warranty shall apply to all vehicles. The warranty shall not become effective until the vehicle is delivered to and accepted by the state agency.

Within forty-eight (48) hours of delivery, the state agency shall fully inspect the vehicle's interior and exterior, including any options required on the vehicle. The state agency must notify the dealer within forty-eight (48) hours of any unacceptability relating to the delivered vehicle. If the state agency fails to notify the dealer of any unacceptability within the forth-eight (48) hour timeframe, the dealer reserves the right to deem the vehicle as acceptable. Agencies are advised to ensure the proper measures are taken as it relates to insuring vehicles beyond the forty-eight (48) hour acceptance timeframe.

- 10. Potential Recall or Manufacturer Initiated Customer Service Action/Notification Requirement: The contractor shall be responsible for accessing potential recall notices from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), as well as any manufacturer initiated customer service actions prior to delivering the vehicles to the state agency location. If a recall or customer service action is found for the vehicle being delivered to the state agency, the contractor should, to the best of their ability, complete the necessary action(s) prior to delivery. If the contractor is unable to address the required recall or customer service action(s) prior to delivery, the contractor must inform the state agency of the "open" recall or customer service action upon delivery. The contractor shall then assist the state agency in getting the recall or customer service action(s) completed as quickly as possible.
- 11. **SCOPE OF WORK** Due to the large amount of information included in the contract's Scope of Work, the information is not included in the Statewide Contract Notification. TITLE: An ORDINANCE transferring funds in the amount of \$127,500 from 001-8003-56830 General Fund Contingency to 001-1608-56030 Parks - Architectural & Engineering.

SUMMARY: During a severe storm in early May 2024, a large tree fell directly onto a pedestrian bridge along the Little Blue Trace Trail near the Bundschu Trailhead causing catastrophic damage. After review by licensed Professional Engineers, the bridge was deemed unsafe for use and closed to trail users. The bridge must be replaced. This popular 15.5 mile trail is heavily used by the citizens of Jackson County. Parks + Rec requested a proposal from Term and Supply consultant Olsson Engineering for survey work and the preparation of plans and specifications for bridge replacement. A proposal in the amount of \$127,500 was received on May 30, 2024. This proposal exceeds the amount available in the 2024 Parks budget. To get this unexpected yet crucial engineering project moving forward so the trail can re-open as quickly as possible, the Parks + Rec Department requests a budget transfer of \$127,500 from 001-8003-56830 to 001-1608-56030.

Pedestrian Bridge Replacement on Little Blue Trace Trail at MM 2.8 (#LBT07-02) in Independence, MO

Upon execution, this Work Order shall become part of the Professional Services Agreement (Agreement) between the Jackson County Missouri (Client) and Olsson (Olsson) dated April 12, 2022. The terms and conditions of the Agreement shall apply to this Work Order.

WITNESSETH, that in accordance with the mutual covenants herein contained, the Client hereby agrees to employ Olsson to perform engineering services hereinafter outlined.

GENERAL

Olsson has acquainted itself with the information provided by Client relative to the project and based upon such information offers to provide the services described below for the project. Client warrants that it is either the legal owner of the property to be improved by this Project or that Client is acting as the duly authorized agent of the legal owner of such property.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION

Project will be located at: Little Blue Trace Trail, Mile Marker 2.8, South of E. Bundschu Road

Project Description: Pedestrian Bridge Replacement

SCOPE OF WORK

Olsson shall provide the following services (Scope of Services) to Client for the Project:

Phase 1 - Design Services

Task 1.1: Project Management, Meetings, and Utility Coord. \$12,500 Provide staff management, monthly invoicing, and progress reporting for the duration of the project (maximum 8 months).

Olsson will coordinate with Jackson County staff members for the design and preparation of construction bid documents for the project. Included in this task is time for completing a preliminary field check meeting and attending a final design review meeting after submission of office check review plans (90% unsigned/unsealed for client review).

Utility Coordination

Identification and verification by the Utility Companies of major utility conflicts such as fiber optic lines, gas pipelines, crude oil pipelines, high-pressure waterlines, transmission lines, etc., will be accomplished at the earliest possible time. The Consultant and the County's Project Manager will discuss major conflicts and attempt to avoid them. If avoidance is not possible, the Consultant will then request the Utility Company to verify the conflict, provide a preliminary relocation schedule, and as appropriate, a preliminary estimate of potentially reimbursable costs associated with the utility relocation.

Task 1.2: Field Survey (Powell CWM – WBE)

\$23,000

Topographical survey services and base mapping are included within this proposal. This work shall consist of completing a boundary survey, requiring research and delineation of right of way within the project area. A survey text file, fully symbolized CAD drawings, generated and checked topographic file, and TIN file for use in preparation of the plans will be created.

Horizontal Control

Provide a list of horizontal control points with coordinates, descriptions, station and offset. Coordinate information will be provided as ground (project) coordinates and will be referenced to State Plane Coordinates and tied to known area land survey control monuments.

Vertical Control

Vertical control will be referenced to the NAVD 88 datum.

Boundary Research

Obtain Title Work, deeds, and research available plat maps. Delineate right-ofway of parcels within the project limits for incorporation into project base mapping.

Locate Section Corners

Survey additional section corners to tie down rights-of-way.

Utility Locate

A utility locate will be performed and drawn from surveying above ground features, including marking utility companies resulting from the locate request through the Missouri One-Call System. The Consultant will request that utility companies return marked up plans with verification of the presence of affected property. Locations from the utility plans will be transferred into the topographic survey. Information supplied by utility companies will be used to complete the placement of existing utilities on the plans. Where available, above-ground features will be used to improve accuracy.

The Consultant will add a disclaimer to the drawings with respect to undetermined location of underground utilities.

Prepare Right-of-Way Documents

Prepare property exhibits and legal descriptions for obtaining temporary construction easements and permanent right of way from up to two parcels.

Survey Extents.

Full 1-foot contour mapping of the area within the following aerial imagery. Valley sections upstream and downstream of the bridge will be extracted from commercially available GIS data.



Location and elevation of site features will be obtained, such as: top of trail, trail centerline, creek flowline, creek centerline, existing bridge deck, existing top of abutments, structures, guardrail, fences, power lines, manholes, utility markers, signs, walls, and trees in excess of 8 inches in diameter.

Survey related expenses (mileage, title history fees, etc) and supplies are included in this task's overall fee, as well as the following anticipated costs for title history.

Mileage – 100 miles @ \$0.85/mile = \$85 Title History Reports – 1 @ \$400/ea = \$400 (Utilize Clear Title, Inc.)

Task 1.3: Hydrology & Hydraulic Design

\$14,000

The proposed project in located in a FEMA Zone AE floodplain. A Zone AE floodplain should have a detailed effective model associated with it on file with FEMA. Olsson will request this model and review it for accuracy and adoption for modelling the existing conditions. In lieu of an effective model from FEMA. Olsson will obtain the Missouri State Emergency Management Agency's recent base level engineering (BLE) hydrologic and hydraulic study. The BLE study will be used as the best available data for design. From the BLE study, the hydrologic data will be reviewed and used as for preparation of a 1D hydraulic model of the bridge. An existing conditions and proposed conditions HEC-RAS model will be prepared for design of the new bridge. Hydraulics of 10, 25, 50, and 100-year storms will be calculated and evaluated at the structure. Criteria will be developed based on APWA and County design criteria. Olsson will communicate the hydraulic performance of the structure, anticipated freeboard/overtopping frequency, available options for making improvements, and request Client approval prior to completing preliminary design. A city floodplain development permit will be prepared and submitted to the city for review and approval.

Drilling Services (RC Drilling – Subcontractor)

- a. The drill crew will contact Missouri One Call to locate underground utilities. To ensure the safety of the crew on site, Owner must inform Olsson of the location of all private utilities and private utility service connections. The cost of locating private utility lines and private service connections is the Owner's responsibility. Olsson is not responsible or liable for damage to any private utilities or private service connections.
- b. All boring locations must be readily accessible. Any fees resulting from clearing operations to achieve access to boring locations is Owner's responsibility and not included in this scope of work. Olsson cannot perform field work until access to boring locations is satisfactory to Olsson.
- c. One boring will be advanced at the northwest abutment and will be accessed along the trail beginning at the intersection of Little Blue Trace Trail and Bundschu Road. The second will be advanced on the southeast abutment and accessed from the Little Blue Trace Trail Access and Picnic Area. While the drill crew will attempt to minimize damage to the trail, drill rigs are heavy equipment and may cause disturbance to natural surroundings including but not limited to cracking within the trail and soil indentations in grass covered areas. Olsson will not be liable or responsible for any site disturbance that may occur as a result of bringing equipment on site. The Owner accepts full responsibility for site disturbance.
- d. We propose to use a truck-mounted drill rig to complete two borings for the project.
 - The boring on the north abutment location will be advanced to shale bedrock that we anticipate will be encountered within 80 feet from the existing ground surface.
 - The boring on the south abutment will be advanced to a depth of 30 feet
- e. Split spoon and thin-walled samples shall be collected from the borings. Samples will be obtained at 5-foot intervals up to a depth of 50 feet and at 10-foot intervals thereafter.
- f. We will obtain groundwater levels in the test borings at the time of drilling and upon completion of the drilling operations.
- g. After obtaining groundwater level readings, we will backfill the borings with soil cuttings and patch pavements as necessary.

Laboratory Services

Laboratory tests may include moisture contents, unit-weight dry density, unconfined compressive strength, Atterberg limits, gradation analysis and one-dimensional consolidation.

Geotechnical Evaluation & Report

A geotechnical engineering report will be prepared under the direction of a registered professional engineer based on the findings of the field and laboratory programs. The report will include a boring location plan, computer-generated boring logs, results of the laboratory testing program and a description of the surface and subsurface conditions encountered at the site. In addition, the report

will present our opinions and recommendations regarding bridge abutment foundation design. These recommendations will include allowable soil bearing strength or rock bearing strength, lateral earth pressures, driven pile recommendations, and sliding resistances. The recommendations for the foundation system will also discuss suitable foundation material, possible over excavation/surcharge requirements, pre-bore requirements, L-Pile parameters. Estimated total and differential settlements for foundation elements pile tip protection, minimum footing sizes and acceptable bearing depths:

Boring Locates

Boring locations will be identified at the desired location by the Consultant's drillers and indexed off of the existing structure to identify the approximate elevation.

Task 1.5: Trail Design (HG Consult – MBE)

\$25.500

The trail design work near the crossing is anticipated to primarily address reconstruction of the approaches within the immediate vicinity of the structure. This work is anticipated to address a profile adjustment, shoulder reshaping and transitioning, pedestrian fencing (where necessary), temporary construction fencing and signage, erosion control, tree clearing, seeding, replacement of wayfinding signage, tabulation of quantities and preparation of special provisions. The limits of the trail project shall be within 500 feet north and 250 feet south of the crossing.

Advanced warning signage indicating closure of the trail at the adjacent trail heads will be provided.

Task 1.6: Bridge Layout and Foundation Design

Olsson shall prepare structural designs and construction bid documents for a pedestrian bridge (assumed length < 90 feet). It is assumed that the superstructure will be a prefabricated truss system, which will be designed by the manufacturer. Olsson will design the foundations and coordinate with a truss manufacturer to determine preliminary truss loadings, which will be presented as conditional information subject to verification during the preconstruction shop drawing approval process. The lines and grades will be based on the required span length and clearance over the creek to satisfy the H&H design criteria. The design will conform to AASHTO LRFD's Pedestrian Bridge Design Guidelines and utilize the current edition of MoDOT Standard Specifications for Highway Construction to govern methods and materials used for construction of the bridge.

Olsson will coordinate with the geotechnical engineer, identify suitable subgrade for founding the bridge based on the borings collected, and prepare designs for either abutments on shallow spread footings or concrete cap beams on driven piles. Foundation designs prepared shall be in accordance with the specifications and standards utilized in AASHTO LRFD Pedestrian Bridge Design Guidelines and MoDOT's Engineering Policy Guide, where appropriate.

Task 1.7: Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment

\$5,500

A Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment of the project study area, which is located in Independence, Jackson County, Missouri. Olsson will follow the methods described in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Wetland Delineation Manual (January 1987) and the Regional Supplement to the Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual: Midwest Region (Version 2.0) (March 2010).

The following environmental permitting tasks are anticipated and included in this scope of services:

Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment Site Visit

a) A site visit will be conducted to field-verify the presence or absence of wetlands and other waters within the project study area. The site visit must be conducted during the USACE specified growing season (March 15 – October 31). The site visit will be conducted by traversing the project study area to identify wetland characteristics including hydrophytic vegetation, hydric soils, and wetland hydrology. Wetland and/or other waters boundaries will be delineated using sub-meter accuracy global positioning system (GPS) units. Midwest Region Data Forms will be filled out. Photographs documenting site conditions, including wetlands and other waters, will be taken.

Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment Documentation

- a) Desktop Review. The first step of the Wetland Delineation consists of a desktop review of available databases to determine areas within the project study area that may have potential wetlands or other waters. This review will include accessing information from the National Hydrography Dataset (NHD), National Wetlands Inventory (NWI), U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5minute topographic maps, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) soil data, and current and historical aerial imagery.
- b) Documentation. Upon completion of the site visit, a written document of the findings of the Wetland Delineation will be prepared detailing the presence or absence of wetlands and other waters within the project study area. The Wetland Delineation Document will include a narrative of how the Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment was conducted and a summary of the results of the Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment and Threatened and Endangered Species Habitat Assessment. Figures documenting information gathered during the desktop review and figures showing wetland and other waters boundaries, sample point locations, and photo point locations will be included along with a photo log documenting conditions at the time of the site visit.

Threatened and Endangered Species Habitat Assessment

a) **Site Visit.** Concurrent with the Wetland Delineation and Stream Assessment site visit, Olsson will conduct a targeted on-site habitat assessment for listed

threatened or endangered species to determine if potential habitat exists and if species investigations may be needed. It is assumed that the on-site analysis will occur during suitable weather conditions, when snow is not present, and preferably during the growing season if possible. Olsson assumes the on-site analysis will focus on available threatened and endangered species habitat. Habitat documentation will not be inclusive of all habitats within the Project area, rather will focus on habitat used by the threatened and endangered species (e.g., bat roost trees).

b) Document. Olsson will include the findings of the threatened and endangered species habitat assessment within the Wetland Delineation Document. Within the Wetland Delineation Document, Olsson will prepare threatened and endangered species summaries, describing each species' habitat requirements, potentially suitable habitat available within the Project area, and measures to avoid, reduce, or minimize the possibility of impacting the species or its potential habitat present within the Project boundary.

Task 1.8: Section 404 Nationwide Permit App. and Coord.

\$4,500

Olsson will submit a nationwide permit (NWP) pre-construction notification (PCN) to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for the Project once preliminary project plans have been provided. Prior to submittal of the NWP PCN, Olsson will complete a site visit to document site conditions and delineate streams, wetlands, and other waters. Olsson's findings will be documented in a wetland delineation and stream assessment report, which will accompany the NWP PCN. NWPs are general Department of the Army (DA) permits that meet a set of nationwide standards that have minimal individual and cumulative environmental impacts. NWPs are required when jurisdictional aquatic impacts occur related to a project and are less than 0.50 acre of impact to wetlands and other waters and 0.03 acre of impacts to streams. Olsson will follow the Clean Water Act regulations (33 CFR Parts 320-332) and Section 404(b)(1) Guidelines (40 CFR Part 230). NWPs include a description of the project, aquatic impacts, threatened and endangered species (habitat assessment), and cultural and historical resources (desktop evaluation). As part of the NWP process, Olsson will also coordinate with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the Missouri State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) if requested by the USACE. Following the submittal of the NWP application, Olsson will coordinate with USACE to verify that they have all the required information needed to process the application.

If the project's scope or limits change substantially, then additional environmental permitting requirements may be necessary, and the Client shall be responsible for completing these tasks (or a contract amendment may be prepared for Olsson to complete them.)
- Under 1 acre of land disturbance will occur such that a SWPPP will not be required.
- Structure is located in a FEMA regulated floodplain (Zone AE). FEMA's Flood Insurance Rate Map indicates the structure is not within a regulatory floodway. The structure will be sized to avoid generating a significant rise in the base flood elevations in accordance with the regulations. A CLOMR/LOMR design and survey is not included as part of these engineering efforts.
- The trail will be completely closed during construction.
- Structural engineering fees assume a prefabricated steel truss will be utilized. A sealed superstructure design, shop drawings, and a bill of reinforcing will be developed by the Contractor and submitted for review and approval as a preconstruction work item.
- County funding will be used for design and construction of the project (no federal funding).
- Current foundation information for the existing bridge is unknown at the time of this proposal.
- Commercially available GIS data will be used to establish existing upstream cross-sections. Topographic mapping will be confined to the immediate project area as shown in the above exhibit.
