4 HEARINGS

Dr. Wayne Lucas, member of the COMBAT Research Committee, made a presentation on the data collected from the Kauffman Teen Survey and the Partnership for Children Report Card. Dr. Lucas is an Associate Professor of Sociology Criminal Justice and Criminology at the University of Missouri-Kansas City.

James Nunnelly, Drug Tax Administrator, made comments on the report given by Dr. Lucas.

There was much discussion on the survey.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, responded to the question asked by Fred Arbanas last week regarding the Kaiser pharmacies. She stated that the Kaiser Centers and pharmacies would remain open until further notice. Coventry has a wide network of pharmacies and will keep the employees enrolled with Kaiser informed on this matter. The Human Resources Department also sent out a benefit bulletin to employees with information about choosing a physician, transferring records etc.

She stated that she would testify on January 30, 2001 before the State Legislature and the Senate Ways and Means Committee regarding Senate Bill 249 and House Bill 189. The Bills would return a portion of tax revenue generated by the stadiums. This revenue would help Jackson County maintain/invest in these important resources. She will testify about the economic impact. A report done by Mid-American Regional Council (MARC) found that the stadiums generate \$302 million annually, they produce 4,418 jobs, \$217.8 million in salaries and wages are paid and \$19.8 million are paid in taxes to cities, counties and the state. Lamar Hunt and David Glass will also testify about charitable and community contributions.

Katheryn Shields reported that Missouri Gas Energy was successful in getting the 44% rate increase for natural gas. She informed the Legislature that there is a companion case in which MGE is asking for an additional increase. Jackson County will intervene with the Public Service Commission on behalf of the taxpayers.

Regarding recycling, she said that a very successfully workshop was held last Friday in which over 50 people attended to learn about sponsoring a Clean Out Your Files day. The workshop was sponsored by Jackson County, Bridging the Gap and the U.S. Conference of Mayors. Jackson County has won a National Recycling in the Workplace Award given by the U.S. Conference of Mayors. The award will be presented on March 5, 2001 in Washington D.C. and she invited members of the Legislature to attend with her. She said Jackson County is doing something truly unique nationwide with recycling. She recognized Bridging The Gap for their support, the County Legislature for providing the funding and the employee driven committee for their hard work.
