### COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

AN AGREEMENT by and between **JACKSON COUNTY**, **MISSOURI**, hereinafter referred to as "the County," and the **SAMUEL U. RODGERS HEALTH CENTER**, 825 Euclid Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri 64124, a not-for-profit corporation, hereinafter referred to as "SURHC."

WHEREAS, the County deems it to be in the best interests of its citizenry to support the SURHC mission to improve access and quality of care to racial and ethnic minorities, pregnant women, children, people living with chronic diseases such as asthma and diabetes, and those who would otherwise go without care; and,

NOW THEREFORE, the County and SURHC agree, in consideration of the following mutual promises and valuable consideration, as follows:

- 1. <u>Services</u>. SURHC shall promote health education and screenings through targeted community outreach to increase the number of low income and uninsured Jackson County residents who receive health care services, increase the number of low income and racial and ethnic minority Jackson County residents who receive screening and early detection of chronic diseases, and prevent excessive morbidity and mortality among low income, racial and ethnic minority Jackson County residents as is more fully described in the proposal and budget attached hereto as Exhibit A.
  - 2. Additional Services. SURHC shall employ the following:
- a. Director of Community Relations. Duties will include, but not be limited to oversight of outreach programs and initiatives, supervision of grant programs, development and maintenance of positive relationships with community organizations and health care plans,

development of opportunities to promote the organization's mission, management of reporting processes, representation of organization in community public health activities, service on various community committees and boards.

- b. Community Outreach Nurse Educator. Duties will include, but not be limited to providing community health education to clients who have limited knowledge of health principles, nutrition, disease, appropriate care, or available resources, providing presentations and health education activities and health screening, and identifying residents for facilitating access to medical an health services, educating and counseling clients and their families in health maintenance and promotion and disease prevention.
- c. Volunteer Coordinator. Duties will include, but not be limited to recruiting, training, scheduling and providing for the supervision of volunteers for all programs and departments of SURHC.
- d. Outreach Coordinator. Duties will work under the auspices of the Director of Community Relations to enroll eligible persons in the MC Plus Program and Breast Screening Programs at SURHC; support manager with scheduling and delivery of health education presentations; organize staff and other resources in the participation and the support of select community events and activities; distribute written material; and promote services offered at SURHC to churches, community shelters, food pantries, community health fairs, and other special events.
- e. Patient Service Representative. Duties will include, but not be limited to ensuring that patient issues are addressed and resolved in a professional and timely manner. Representative shall assist patients with payment arrangements and schedule patient transportation, and shall be the primary contact to enroll Medicaid applicants and shall

interview patients daily to assess levels of satisfaction with SURHC and shall keep the channels of communication open between the health center staff and the patients.

- f. Outreach Workers. Duties will include, but not be limited to serving as a liaison to bridge the cultural gap by communication differences and similarities between the cultures. Workers shall also devote sufficient time in the community to build meaningful relationship between provides and patients.
- 3. <u>Terms of Payment</u>. The County shall pay SURHC the sum of \$337,488.00 under this Agreement which shall be used to provide services in the amounts listed on the attached Budget. The County shall make payments quarterly installments of \$84,372.00 each, with the first and second quarters to be made upon execution of this Agreement. The remaining payments shall be made upon the County's receipt of the reports as set forth in paragraph 4 hereof.
- 4. Reports. Within 30 days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter under this Agreement, SURHC shall submit a comprehensive quarterly report, including a statement of budgeted and actual expenditures, and any other documents requested by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, to establish that the funds provided pursuant to this Agreement were used for the purposes set forth herein. The reports for the first and second quarter shall both be submitted within 30 days after the execution of this Agreement. The last quarter's report shall include an annual report which shall summarize all of SURHC's activities pursuant to this Agreement. SURHC's failure to submit this annual report shall disqualify SURHC from future funding by the County.
  - 5. Submission of Documents. No payment shall be made under this Agreement

unless the contracting agency shall have submitted to the County's Director of Finance and Purchasing (1) a written proposal setting out in detail the intended use of the County's funding, including the target population to be served; (2) the agency's IRS Form 990, from the previous fiscal or calendar year; (3) a statement of the agency's total budget for its most recent fiscal year; and, (4) a detailed explanation of actual expenditures of County funds (pertains to final payments and payments on contracts for future years.) If an agency has previously received County funding, to be eligible for future payments, an agency must submit either an audited financial statement for the agency's most recent fiscal or calendar year, by March 31 of the following year, or a certified public accountant's program audit of County funds, by January 31 of the following year. Any document described herein which was submitted to the County's Director of Finance and Purchasing as a part of an application for funding need not be resubmitted to qualify for payment. No payment shall be made if SURHC is out of compliance on any other County contract.

- 6. <u>Audit</u>. The County further reserves the right to examine and audit, during reasonable office hours, the books and records of SURHC pertaining to the finances and operations of this contract by SURHC.
- 7. <u>Default.</u> If SURHC shall default in the performance or observation of any covenant, term or condition to be performed by SURHC, herein contained, the County shall give SURHC ten days' written notice setting forth the default. Thereafter, if said default shall continue by SURHC, the County may, at its election, terminate the Agreement and take such action in law or equity to recover all funds given to SURHC under this Agreement, but not used for the purposes set forth in the Agreement, as the County deems

appropriate.

- 8. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. SURHC warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 9. <u>Term</u>. This Agreement shall commence as of January 1, 2010, and shall terminate on December 31, 2010.
- 10. Equal Opportunity. In carrying out this Agreement, SURHC shall insure that none of the benefits or services of the program are denied to any eligible recipient on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap or national origin. SURHC shall take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, handicap, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship. SURHC shall in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of SURHC, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, handicap or national origin.
- 11. <u>Liability and Indemnification</u>. No party to this Agreement shall assume any liability for the acts of any other party to this Agreement, its officers, employees or agents and SURHC shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) including but not limited to violation of civil rights and/or bodily injury to or death

of any person and for damage to or destruction of property if and to the extent caused by the negligence, willful misconduct or omissions of SURHC during the performance of this Agreement.

12. <u>Incorporation.</u> This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

#### Job Descriptions for Jackson County Grant 2010

One (1.0 FTE) Community Relations Director: supervises work for Community Outreach Nurse Educator, Volunteer Coordinator, Outreach Coordinator, Outreach workers, and Unit Clerk to ensure the focus of grant programs and guidelines are adhered too. The Director oversees the Health Center's health programs that address the needs of residents of Jackson County, particularly the underserved population through targeted community events. The Director facilitates educational forums and special events to enhance the community's knowledge of services that are available. The Director represents Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center in collaborative community-wide public health activities fosters and develops positive working relationships with community agencies, County of Jackson County, and other health care organizations. The Director oversees organization's outreach programs and initiatives and supervises grant programs for women and children. Develop and maintain positive relationships with community organizations and health care plans. Develop opportunities to promote the organization's mission through ongoing networking and interaction with community and local leaders. Responsible for managing reporting processes for Jackson County grant. The Director supervises managed care reporting process for MO HealthNet for outreach component; oversees promotional activities regarding health center services, ongoing community health screenings, and education activities. The Director serves on various community committees and boards to interject Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center's perspective into community-based projects.

One (1.0 FTE) Community Outreach Nurse Educator: The focus of the Community Outreach Nurse, Educator is health promotion, disease prevention, health education, and health care referrals. Provides community health education to clients who have limited knowledge of health principles, nutrition, disease, appropriate care, or available resources. The outreach nurse works in the community presenting presentations and health education activities and health screenings. She identifies residents for facilitating access to medical and health services; educates and counsels clients and their families in health maintenance and promotion and disease prevention in order to enhance their ability to recognize the need for and to seek treatment were appropriate. The Community Outreach Nurse provides educational materials within the community about benefits and eligibility requirements for health care programs and services; plans, implements and/or evaluates prevention activities, programs or care to specific populations; interviews and counsels patients encountered through community events. Conducts health screening and assessments; provides health education presentations to schools, shelters, churches, and other community groups; develops health and education plans for families and individuals. The Outreach Nurse-Educator works in concert with other community agencies to help provide our clients with up-to-date information on health initiatives, health classes and seminars, and health alerts.

One (1.0 FTE) Volunteer Coordinator: Responsible to recruit, train, schedule and provide for the supervision of volunteers for all programs and departments of Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center. The Coordinator will consult with administrators and staff to determine organization needs for various volunteer services and plan for volunteer recruitment. The Volunteer Coordinator will attend and participate in professional and community meetings to recruit interested parties for volunteer service and promote Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center services. The Coordinator will orient and train volunteers prior to assignment in specific units; monitor and evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of volunteer services. The Volunteer Coordinator is responsible to maintain a database of volunteer workers and hours completed.

One (1.0 FTE) Angie McGee, Outreach Coordinator:

The Community Outreach Coordinator, under the supervision of the Director of Community Relations, will coordinate all activities for outreach workers as outlined in program work plans; assist the Community Relations Director and Outreach Nurse Health Educator in developing various activities within the targeted population. The outreach coordinator is responsible for conducting outreach for the Breast and Cervical Cancer program and follow up to complete diagnosis for the State of Missouri. The Coordinator serves as the primary liaison to the Director of Community Relations to expand outreach activities and access points, coordinate special outreach projects; refers patients needing assistance to the Patient Service The coordinator coordinates approved targeted screenings and wellness education for Representative. outreach workers. The Coordinator is responsible for compiling reports for screenings, diagnostic results, treatment plans and follow-up of outcomes for the Breast Health program and submits to the Director.

#### Job Descriptions for Jackson County Grant 2010

One (1.0 FTE) Outreach Worker:

The outreach worker must devote sufficient time in the community to build a meaningful relationship between the providers and the patients/consumers. In addition, the worker must provide education and outreach for preventive dental to care high-risk, hard to reach populations, (on-site and within the community), regarding benefits and eligibility requirements for health care programs and services. The worker will serve as a liaison for OB, Pediatrics, and WIC departments to referral pregnant women and children 0-3 years for preventive dental services. Worker will provide MO HealthNet application assistance for patients referred to dental without health insurance. The outreach worker will promote Health Center services and programs at community events, churches, and shelters, food pantries through health fairs, presentations and education sessions.

Two (0.5 FTE) Outreach Workers .: Serves as liaison to bridge the cultural gap by communicating differences and similarities between the cultures. Communicates as a liaison between the patients/consumers and the providers in the Health Center. The outreach workers must devote sufficient time in the community to build a meaningful relationship between the providers and the patients/consumers. In addition, the workers provide education and outreach to high-risk, hard to reach populations, (on-site and within the community), regarding benefits and eligibility requirements for health care programs and services. They will assist persons or patients who are in need of accessing health care; assist the patient in the registration process and assure its completion. The outreach workers will promote Health Center services and programs at community events, churches, and shelters, food pantries through health fairs, presentations and education sessions. Workers will develop community and Health Center enrollment access points, when needed; assist with application process for State of Missouri's health insurance program. The workers enroll eligible women for well-women exams for breast screening programs; enroll participants in nutrition and diabetes programs; and serve as patients' advocate to ensure the delivery of effective health services for the ethnic communities served by Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center; serve as liaison for the ethnic community and conduct educational outreach on-site. Our bi-lingual outreach workers also provide translation of outreach materials as applicable.

One (.5 FTE) Patient Service Representative: will address and resolve patient issues and concerns in a professional and timely manner. The representative assist patients with payment arrangements; schedules patient transportation. The Patient Service representative is the primary contact to enroll Medicaid applicants and interviews patients daily to assess levels of satisfaction with SURHC and to keep the channels of communication open between the health center staff and the patients; will assist with tracking patient satisfaction surveys.



Health Center patients are racially and ethnically diverse. Among those served, fortytwo percent (42%) are Hispanic or Latino, sixteen percent (16%) Caucasian, twentyseven percent (27%) African-American, eight percent (8%) represent other ethnicities and seven percent (7%) are Asian/Pacific Islander. More than 450,000 individuals in the Kansas City Metropolitan area are either uninsured or covered by Medicaid. In Jackson County, there are an estimated 73,337 uninsured individuals below 200% of the federal poverty level. This is our target population.
