5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that the Jackson County Records Department facility at the caves off of 291 Highway is receiving its fourth state grant. The grant is for a little over \$35,000.00.

Katheryn Shields said that during the last four years the Jackson County Public Works Department has had 47 bridge construction projects. In 1998 Jackson County has undertaken its biggest bridge construction project in decades. The Public Works Department will spend \$2.2 million for renovation of five major bridges and 23 smaller bridges.

Dan Tarwater, County Legislator, asked if employees were going to work extended hours in the Child Support Division because of the new computer system problems. Katheryn Shields responded that the courts and the state are working hard trying to resolve the problem. She will arrange a report from the Presiding Judge to the Health & Justice Committee to keep the Legislature informed.

Carl Bussey, County Legislator, asked when Corrections Employees would be receiving their raise. Katheryn Shields answered that when they ratify the contract the pay increase will be enforced and retro-active from January 1, 1998.

The Legislature interviewed Carl Chinnery and Berry Jennings, nominees to the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority. More interviews will be held next week.
