Dan Tarwater, Chairman, called the meeting of the Jackson County Legislature to order.

3 APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Bob Spence moved to approve the journal of the previous meeting held on 7/19/2005. Seconded by Eugene Standifer Jr..

4 HEARINGS

None.

J. D. Williams, Presiding Judge of the Circuit Court of Jackson County, spoke about Ordinance #3642 which dealt with employee compensation. The Ordinance does not apply to those employee's who work in the Judiciary. All of his employee's do not work for Jackson County. Some employee's are provided for by the State of Missouri. About 37% of County employees also work for Circuit Court. He asked his financial people to take a look at the Ordinance and in order to give the 3% increase to the 37% of county employees who also work for Circuit Court, they would have to eliminate about 25 full time employees. The cost of the 3% increase to the Court would be \$581,000.00. They can not do that without impairing their ability to serve the public and perform their duties in the Circuit Court. They are extremely interested in securing for his employees additional compensation which the Legislature provided to other county employees. He sent a letter to the Legislators endorsing compensation for all county employees whether they worked for the court or other branch and department of the County. At this point there is nothing Circuit Court can do that would not be detrimental to the public welfare and safety. He asked that the Legislature remain receptive if they are able to find some type of budgetary saving or anything that would enable them to respond to the extent that they can give their employees some type of compensation.

Dan Tarwater, Chairman, said that the Legislature wants to look at all options and efficiencies. He asked Judge Williams to report back with any changes.

Henry C. Rizzo, County Legislator, asked if a bond or putting something on the ballot would help.

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, said it would depend. They have not gotten in to it yet.

Henry C. Rizzo asked about court fees.

Judge Williams said that was controlled by the State of Missouri.

5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, gave a brief report on the National Association of Counties Convention. Jackson County received another national environmental award for its recycling program with the Chiefs and Royals. Her staff that attended the NACO Conference worked very hard with the hosting city and learned a lot that will help in 2008 when NACO holds their convention in Jackson County, Missouri.

Robert A. Stringfield, County Legislator, talked about the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report distributed last week. Four areas concern him and they are the employee contributions we have to do on the pension fund and employee benefit fund, being up front with employees, the 911 special revenue fund and adverse decisions on lawsuits.

Henry C. Rizzo asked the County Executive if there would be major changes to the front of the Kansas City Courthouse.

Katheryn Shields said there will be a difference but that it will not be dramatic.
