#### 5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Katheryn Shields, County Executive, announced that Jackson County is going to receive an award from the Alliance for the mentally ill because of the design of the new detention center annex. The annex was designed so that one of the housing units housed only mentally ill persons. This allows staff to evaluate those individuals better, to segregate them from the rest of the population so they are not preyed upon and they are not preying on other prisoners. It also allows Corrections personnel to begin hooking those persons up with mental health resources in the community so that when they return to the community they are better prepared to cope with life in Jackson County and not return to the facility.

Secondly, she stated that Forbes magazine is putting together a panel on the issue of revitalizing America's infrastructure. Katheryn Shields, along with other County Executives, has been asked to be part of a panel dealing with this issue. The reason she was asked to represent Jackson County is because of the city/county cooperative project we had with the Trigen chilled water loop. The panel will be discussing how private industry has worked with government to revitalize cities.

Ms. Shields talked about the issue of security at the marinas and Christmas in the Park. The company that had won the bid on this service will no longer be operating at the close of this month. Therefore, an emergency purchase authorization has been issued for the next lowest bidder so there will be no lapse in security through the end of this season.

The 24th Annual Missouri Town fall festival is this weekend, October 2nd and 3rd. Hours are 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. on Saturday and 11 a.m. - 5 p.m. on Sunday. The cost is \$5.00 for a car or van and \$20.00 for a bus.

Dan Tarwater asked the term of the new contract for security at the marinas.

Katheryn Shields responded that it was through the end of 1999 and will then go out for bid again.

Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator, asked the County Executive when and where was the seminar she would attend for Forbes magazine.

Katheryn Shields replied that it was being held in New York City and she would attend on Monday and Tuesday, October 4th and 5th.

Ronald E. Finley asked if the meetings would be taped so the Legislature could take advantage of the discussion.

Ms. Shields said if tapes are available she would request copies.
