**Extension to Agreement for Detention Services** 

The Jackson County Department of Corrections is interested in pursuing a new Contract Agreement for Detention Services with Johnson County Missouri (previously Resolution 19244). The new Contract includes an increase in the daily rate for inmates from \$40 to \$45 per day. The current contract expires on 8/31/18. Throughout 2018 Jackson County has held several inmates at the Johnson County facility. These are inmates who, for various reasons, cannot be held at the Jackson County Detention Center. In addition, pending negotiations and decisions by Jackson County Administration may include housing up to 60 inmates at Johnson County in 2019, while work is completed on facility rehabilitation.

Under the new contract, in 2018, we expect to house up to 6 inmates over the 122 days (September 1 through December 31) at \$45 per day, spending up to \$32,940. Funding for this is available in 001-2701-56790. For the 2019 budget, Corrections plans to request up to \$82,125 per month for housing 60 Jackson County inmates in Johnson County. This agreement would cover September 1, 2018 until August 31, 2019. Through August 31, 2019, the end of the contract year, \$657,000 would be spent.
