5 COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS OF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE

Bill Petrie, County Legislator, asked Jane McQueeny, County Counselor, the status of the case against the Office of Human Relations and Citizen Complaints.

Jane McQueeny, County Counselor, said the case is still pending and she would be happy to discuss it in a closed meeting. She said there have been some after trial motions that have not been disposed yet by the trial clerk. The court retains jurisdiction for 90 days or until he rules on after trial motions, whatever occurs sooner. She said she is representing the individual defendants which are the commissioners of the OHRCC. The plaintiffs have filed a motion and one of the commission members filed a motion and is representing himself.

Bill Petrie asked what costs were incurred by the County Counselor's office to date on this case.

Jane McQueeny responded that she does not have an answer but would be happy to discuss it with him in a private session. She said one of the post trial motions has to do with attorney fees. The specific defendants have asked that this not be discussed in a public forum.

Bill Petrie said he thinks that the cost of this case that has been incurred by Jackson County and the taxpayers should be a matter of public record.

Jane McQueeny said at this point Jackson County has paid \$600.00 in deposition costs.

Bill Petrie asked the cost of time spent and salaries of the County Counselor's staff.

Jane McQueeny said it is not something that is tracked. She could give the annual salary of the attorney working on the case.

Bill Petrie asked if she could present that information at the next legislative meeting.

Jane McQueeny said yes she could but this is not the only case she has worked on.

Bill Petrie said information regarding costs of this case should be given in an open meeting.

Jane McQueeny said questions regarding public record she could answer but any questions pertaining to trial strategy needs to be discussed in a closed meeting.

Bill Petrie said he should not have to audit the County Counselor's office to find out how much time was spent on this case.

Jane McQueeny said the County Counselor's office does not track time spent on cases.

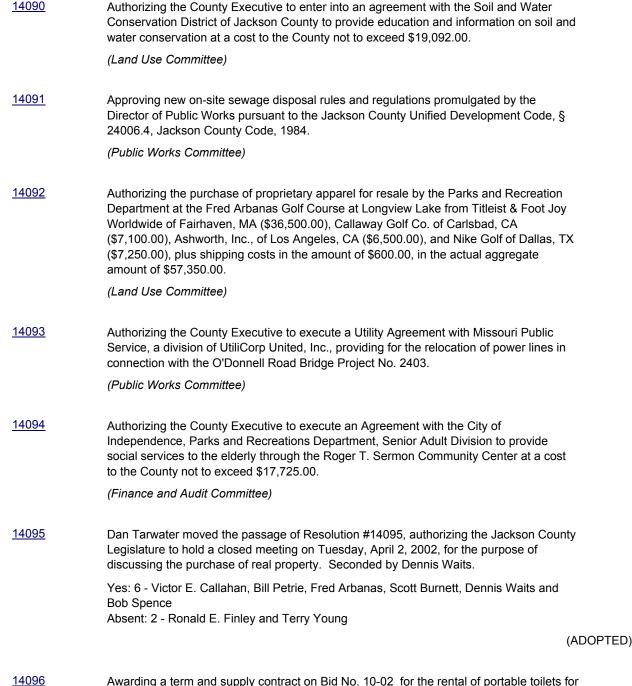

Someone drove on to the bridge exceeding the load limit and the city of Kansas City had to block it off until the bridge can be repaired. Replacement bridge timbers have been ordered and the bridge should be back open in about three to five weeks.

Dan Tarwater also asked how long the Holmes Road Bridge will be closed once work begins on that bridge. Mr. Kirkwood said he would check and report back next week.
