RESOLUTION NO. 21418, October 9, 2023

INTRODUCED BY Manuel Abarca IV, Jalen Anderson, Venessa Huskey, Charlie Franklin, Jeanie Lauer, and Sean E. Smith, County Legislators

WHEREAS, the Kansas City Hispanic News is celebrating its 27th Anniversary of serving Jackson County, working to bridge the gap between the Latino community and the broader public, offering representation in a mainstream paper; and,

WHEREAS, founded and nurtured by the dedicated efforts of Jose "Joe" Arce, the Kansas City Hispanic News has stood as a beacon of journalistic excellence, providing vital bilingual news coverage to the Greater Kansas City community; and,

WHEREAS, nestled along Southwest Boulevard in Kansas City's Westside neighborhood, a community steeped in Latino and Mexican American heritage, the Kansas City Hispanic News first opened its doors in 1996, growing to expand its coverage beyond state lines into Kansas, illuminating the impact on Latino households across the region; and,

WHEREAS, Joe Arce, born and raised in Kansas City's Westside, has always felt deeply connected to his Mexican roots and Latino heritage, and, after years as a photojournalist and reporter for WDAF-TV Fox 4 News, recognized the need for a platform that could inform and celebrate the accomplishments of the Latino community, leading him to establish the bilingual newspaper; and,

WHEREAS, through the Kansas City Hispanic News, Joe Arce has not only provided a platform for representation but also empowered local business owners with advertising opportunities, enabling the Latino community to flourish and thrive; and,

WHEREAS, Joe Arce's impact extends far beyond the pages of the newspaper, as he has actively served on boards for organizations such as the Guadalupe Centers and the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce of Greater Kansas City, and played a pivotal role in the renaming of 23rd Street in the Westside Neighborhood to Avenida Cesar Chavez, in honor of activist Cesar Chavez, in 1993; and,


WHEREAS, to enrich celebrations of Latino and Mexican American traditions, Joe Arce played a significant role in expanding Fiesta Hispana KC, an annual festival that commemorates Mexico's Independence Day and Hispanic Heritage Month, providing a space for cultural exchange through music, food, dance, and local businesses; and,


WHEREAS, having the hearings completed before tax notices are sent out will give citizens an opportunity to seek possible tax relief,

Requesting the BOE to finalize hearings to determine property assessed value before tax notices are sent out.

Request Summary
Requiring the Board of Equalization to finish hearings before tax notices go out. If hearings are not finalized that will mean that taxpayers will not have the opportunity to go before the Board of Equalization for possible relief. Tax payers who will not be given the opportunity to appear before the Board of Equalization before tax notices are generated will result in overpayment for those tax payers whose property value was assessed through the '23 assessment cycle as being a higher than what the actual market property value is for their home. The tax payer should be granted the right to appear before the Board of Equalization before being subject to possibly over pay and await a return from the County. If hearings are not finalized and the tax payer is not given the opportunity to go before the BOE before tax notices are generated then the tax notice will reflect the previous year assessed value.

Requesting a transfer of funds within the Multi-Jurisdictional Drug Task Force 2023 adopted budget for reimbursement of salary, benefits and overtime expenses for our intergovernmental agreements with the Police Agencies that provide Detectives to the Task Force.

Request Summary

A Resolution authorizing the transfer of \$234,723 within the 2023 Drug Task Force Fund budget to pay salary, benefits and overtime costs for our Intergovernmental agreements with the Law Enforcement Agencies providing Detectives to the Jackson County Drug Task Force. Those Agencies include the Blue Springs Police Department, the Grain Valley Police Department, the Grandview Police Department, the Independence Police Department, the Lee's Summit Police Department, the Oak Grove Police Department, the Sugar Creek Police Department and the Jackson County Sheriff's Department.

Continuing fentanyl related investigations and resulting fentanyl overdose, both fatal and non-fatal, because of the fentanyl epidemic have increased the afterhours and weekend call out of Task Force Detectives. Increasingly Detectives call out after hours to crime scenes involving a fentanyl overdose are more than anticipated for 2023. As a result, overtime costs associated with those investigations and call outs have increased dramatically. This transfer will cover those costs associated with these ongoing investigations and call outs.

Based on estimates from the Operations Administrator we approximate the need of \$234,723 for the remainder of 2023. There are funds available for transfer within the Task Force 2023 adopted budget.

On November 21, 2022 the Jackson County Legislature approved Ordinance 5696, awarding a three-year contract for the furnishing of a cloud based property tax software for use by the Collection Department to Aumentum Technologies of Niagara Falls, NY, under the terms and conditions of RFP 53-22. This contract includes Aumentum implementation, training, and deployment services as well as hosting fees.

On January 17, 2023 the Jackson County Legislature approved Resolution 21142, awarding a term and supply contract for the furnishing of IT professional consulting services to Remy Corporation of Denver, CO, under the terms and conditions of an existing, competitively-bid government contract.

The Collection department property tax software migration is a prodigious task replacing a legacy system that is the primary tool for our work. The work is tedious and demanding of staff while they continue to manage their day-to-day responsibilities. We recognize the need for and benefit of an experienced project manager that will ensure the team stays on task and that the vendor meets our milestones and deliverables. We request the use of the Jackson County Remy term and supply contract to fill this need.

Based on an estimate from Remy for a project manager and associated possible travel and expenses, we approximate we need \$70,000 for the remainder of 2023.
