WHEREAS, the Parks + Rec department has a need to replace existing playground equipment at the Sam & Lindsey Memorial Playground that has exceeded its useful life; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 1030.4 of the Jackson County Code, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends the award of a contract for the furnishing of the needed playground equipment to GameTime of Charlotte, NC, under the terms and conditions of Omnia Public Purchasing Contract No. 2017001134, an existing, cooperatively bid contract, at an actual cost to the County in the amount of \$121,934.00; and.

WHEREAS, purchase under the existing competitively bid contract will allow the County to take advantage of volume discounts offered to large entities; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriation is required to place a portion of the funds needed for this equipment in the appropriate spending account; and,

WHEREAS, the funds sought to be appropriated are the proceeds from the sale of Arrowhead Stadium seats authorized pursuant to Resolution 20368, dated February 3, 2020; now therefore,

Renovation of the Sam & Lindsey Memorial Playground in the Little Blue Trace Park

Request Summary

The Sam & Lindsey Memorial Playground was created in 2008 as a memorial to the two Porter children who lost their lives in 2004. All materials, labor to construct the site, playground equipment and installation of the equipment was done through volunteers and donation. No County funds were spent. As with time, all equipment ages and we have continually had to repair and/or replace broken equipment and components.

All playgrounds operated in our Park System are inspected on a routine basis for safety issues. The most recent inspection of the equipment at the playground resulted in the recommendation for closure of the site based on the poor condition of the equipment. We recognize the importance of this playground and the need to replace the equipment with new durable pieces.

We recommend purchase of new equipment manufactured and installed by GameTime, A Playcore Company in the amount of \$121,933.25. Many of our playgrounds at neighborhood parks, picnic shelters and campgrounds feature GameTime products. Experience has shown us that they are very high quality. We also wish to use GameTime to keep consistency in our spare parts inventory to quickly address wear or vandalism problems. GameTime products are offered through a 2021 Omnia Partners public purchasing contract at substantially discounted prices. We have chosen new replacement equipment and are submitting the attached quote for purchase under the Omnia pricing contract. Pursuant to Section 1030.4 of the Jackson County Code, the Purchasing Department recommends the purchase and installation of replacement from GameTime under the terms and conditions of the Omnia Public Purchasing Contract No. 2017001134, an existing competitively bid contract.

We are further requesting the following budget appropriation of funds to assist with covering the cost of this purchase. In addition to the new equipment, the Department will separately purchase new safety mulch from Term & Supply vendors that will be necessary for project completion.

The following is a breakdown on the expenditures of that money.

2018 or 2019 MSHP Patrol Vehicles.

Purchase price of vehicles. $$18,950 \times 17 = $322,150.00$

Equipment for Dodge Chargers. $$4,167.21 \times 17 = $70,842.57$

2021 Dodge Durango

Purchase price of vehicles. $$30,624 \times 9 = $275,616.00$

Equipment for Admin Durango. $$5,344.77 \times 2 = $10,689.54$

Equipment for Patrol Durango. $$14,435.53 \times 7 = $101,048.71$

Equipment for radio install. $$116.55 \times 26 = $3,030.30$

Star-Chase changeover. \$8,880.86

Total \$792,257.98

With a budget of \$800,000.00 minus the \$792,257.98 would give the Sheriff's Office a surplus of \$7,742.02

Recommendation

I recommend approval of this plan as this would allow the purchase of seventeen (17) 2018 or newer all-wheel drive Dodge Chargers from MSHP. These vehicles would have an average of 50k miles and give us the ability to replace most of the 2012 and 2013 Dodge Chargers. The Sheriff's Office would also purchase 9 new 2021 Dodge Durangos. One would be assigned as a commander car another would be assigned to the Warrants Division. The 7 remaining would be equipped and assigned to the Patrol Division.

This would also give us the ability to changeover all the Star-Chase units to new Dodge Durangos.

An RLA has been initiated to request the transfer of funds within the 2021 Sheriff's Revolving Fund to address ongoing needs to cover administrative fees assessed by the Missouri Sheriffs' Association ("MSA") for the processing of concealed carry permits.

Transfer From: 048-4201-56830 Contingency \$28,000 Transfer To: 048-4201-56770 Administrative Services Fee \$28,000

Per state statute RSMo. 571.101, "The sheriff shall report the issuance of a concealed carry permit or provisional permit to the concealed carry permit system." The MSA maintains the statewide concealed carry permit system. The MSA assesses \$5.00 for the processing of each new and renewed concealed carry permit issued in the prior month. The fee covers the access, maintenance, and technical support for the database. The Sheriff's Office makes a direct payment each month to Missouri Sheriffs United, part of the MSA. Per Sergeant John Payne, it would be possible to enter the permit information into the database without the charges, but it must be done manually and would be of greater cost. The MSA provided the initial computer hardware and software and continues to provide software updates and technical support. A new permit applicant pays \$100.00, of which \$5.00 goes to MSA, \$27.25 goes to the Missouri State Highway Patrol for fingerprint processing, and the remaining \$67.75 goes to the Sheriff's Revolving Fund. A renewing applicant pays \$50.00, of which \$5.00 goes to MSA and \$45.00 goes to the Sheriff's Revolving Fund.

The 2021 budget was adopted with \$5,992 in 048-4201-56790 Other Contractual Services, the line item previously used to facilitate the payments. This line item is nearly depleted, and we have been advised by the Budget Office to use 048-4201-56770 Administrative Services Fee going forward. The budget transfer amount requested is based on the department forecast for fees that will be assessed by the MSA for the monthly processing of new and renewing concealed carry permits for the remainder of 2021. The forecast for new permits is based on recent demand and the forecast for renewing permits is based on the number of permits issued in 2016 that will expire in 2021.

New Permits May thru December 8 months; 150 per month; 1,200 total @ \$5.00 = \$6,000 Renewing Permits May thru December 4,400 total @ \$5.00 = \$22,000

Except as expressly provided herein, all provisions of the prior Legal Services Agreement dated June 10, 2016, and all prior addendums, related to providing specialized legal advice and representation to the County acting as legal counsel to the Jackson County Board of Equalization, shall remain in full force and effect pursuant to their terms.
- 2. The total compensation payable hereunder shall be increased by the sum of \$32,000.00; and,

- 3. This Ninth Addendum to Agreement shall be effective as of May 1, 2021, and shall extend, together with the Legal Services Agreement dated June 10, 2016, until December 31, 2021.
- 4. This Ninth Addendum to Agreement, together with the Legal Services Agreement dated June 10, 2016, and all previous addendums, incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, County and Legal Counsel respectively promise, covenant and agree with each other as follows:

- 1. Legal Counsel shall provide specialized legal advice and representation to a County official relating to certain state court litigation involving a whistleblower complaint, as is more specifically set out in the engagement letter dated June 3, 2021, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. Legal Counsel shall work as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the County. Legal Counsel shall be subject to the direction of the County only as to the result to be accomplished and not as to the means and methods for accomplishing the result. Legal Counsel shall report all earnings received hereunder as

gross income, and be responsible for its own Federal, State, and City withholding taxes and all other taxes, and operate its business independent of the business of the County except as required by this Agreement.

- 3. The County shall pay Legal Counsel for services rendered under this Agreement in a total amount not to exceed \$65,000.00. Legal Counsel shall bill County monthly for its services at the rates specified in Exhibit A, and County shall pay Legal Counsel promptly upon receipt of Legal Counsel's statement.
- 4. Legal Counsel shall also be entitled to the reimbursement of its reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the course of its performance of services under this Agreement, provided that the total amount payable hereunder for professional fees and expenses shall not exceed \$65,000.00.
- 5. This Agreement shall be effective as of May 1, 2021, and shall continue until December 31, 2021, unless sooner terminated. Legal Counsel or the County may terminate this Agreement by giving five (5) days' written notice to the other party, except as otherwise provided in Paragraphs 6 or 7 of this Agreement. IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

A RESOLUTION expressing the intent of the Legislature that Jackson County intervene in the pending lawsuit filed by St. Louis County and the City of St. Louis challenging the constitutionality of House Bill 85, recently adopted by the General Assembly and signed by the Governor.

RESOLUTION NO. 20708, June 28, 2021

INTRODUCED BY Crystal Williams, Jalen Anderson, and Tony Miller, County Legislators

WHEREAS, House Bill 85, recently adopted by the Missouri General Assembly and signed into law by the Governor, significantly affects numerous state and federal laws as they pertain to the use, tracking, registration and control of and lawmaking regarding firearms in our state in a manner that almost certainly violates provisions of the United States and Missouri Constitutions; and,

WHEREAS, given this unconstitutionality and, more importantly, the public safety risks this law presents, St. Louis County and the City of St. Louis filed a lawsuit in the Circuit Court of Cole County challenging the bill; and,

WHEREAS, the public safety of our citizens as it relates to firearms cannot be ignored and should be of significant concern to the leaders of our state, particularly given the violence we are already seeing as a result of firearms, and also the potential risk this new law has now created; and,

WHEREAS, it is true that the right to bear arms is secured by the Second Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, but that right should be reasonably regulated and not carelessly tossed into the hands of citizens without thoughtful consideration for those citizens' well-being; and,

WHEREAS, it simply cannot be that those who framed the Second Amendment intended for it to be wielded without careful regard and with the result of countless people being killed each year due to the irresponsible or malicious use of firearms; and,

WHEREAS, we must consider the ability of our law enforcement agencies to work with the federal government to enforce our state and federal laws on firearms; and,

WHEREAS, House Bill 85 severely hinders law enforcement agencies' ability to regulate firearms in such a way that keeps those firearms in the hands of responsible citizens and keeps them out of the hands of those with malign intentions; and,

WHEREAS, now more than ever, and given the increase in gun violence we are seeing in our communities statewide and nationally, it is essential for law enforcement professionals to have the power to track and regulate firearms use, the information from which provides them with an investigative tool to identify suspects in crimes and also potentially prevent crimes from even occurring, a power that has no deleterious effect on citizens' Second Amendment rights, but only provides an immense benefit to their safety; and,

WHEREAS, the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution expressly prohibits laws such as House Bill 85, and therefore this law cannot stand; and,

WHEREAS, it seems that House Bill 85 was born out of a concern over the Second Amendment rights of citizens but, if we are to uphold the Constitution as our controlling document, then we cannot ignore the other provisions it contains which prevent the very intentions and effects of House Bill 85; and,

WHEREAS, this part of the debate over the law is simple: under the Supremacy Clause, federal law takes precedence over state law when in conflict; and,

WHEREAS, if House Bill 85 stands, it will prevent citizens and state and local government officials alike from complying with federal law which, without a doubt, is the unconstitutional part in this entire conversation and cannot be imposed upon the citizens of this state; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that, in light of the dangers posed to our residents by House Bill 85 and the importance of upholding our nation's Constitution, the Legislature hereby expresses its intent that the County join the pending lawsuit on the side of plaintiffs St. Louis County and City of St. Louis.
