
## **National Data**

 Platte County & Clay County are currently experiencing "substantial transmission" levels.













### **VACCINATIONS**

- The 25-34 age group has the lowest vaccination completion percentage of all fully eligible age groups, with the exception of the newly authorized 5-11 year olds. The 25-34 age group continuously maintains among the highest case rates as well.
- As a population, vaccination rates are inadequate to prevent another surge of COVID-19 cases.



## STRAIN ON THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM

- Daily Average of New Hospitalizations for the MARC region increased, from 74 daily new hospitalizations on 10/31 to 82 on 11/09.
- Per the HCC Metro Report on November 8, 2021, 9 of 27 (33.3%) hospitals reported an anticipated shortage in staffing in the next week.
- High overall hospital volume in the region remains a concern. Staffed hospital bed, especially staffed ICU bed, availability continues to be a challenge in the region.
