AN ORDINANCE transferring \$189,189.00 within the 2021 Anti-Crime Sales Tax Fund and appropriating \$321,626.00 from the undesignated fund balance of the 2021 Grant Fund in acceptance of the DART Grant awarded by the Missouri Department of Public Safety.

ORDINANCE NO. 5582, December 13, 2021

INTRODUCED BY Theresa Cass Galvin, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Public Safety has awarded a grant in the amount of \$132,436.61 to the Prosecuting Attorney's Office for its Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) program for partial funding of salaries and benefits for the employees of the DART Unit for the period of July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the DART program is a collaborative and multi-jurisdictional team created to target and close down drug houses within the City of Kansas City; and,

WHEREAS, the grant is subject to a local match in the amount of \$189,188.73; and,

WHEREAS, a transfer and appropriation are necessary in order to place the grant and matching funds in the proper spending accounts; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the following transfer within and appropriation from the undesignated fund balance of the 2021 Anti-Crime Sales Tax Fund be and hereby are made:

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Article I - Governing Directives

The Subrecipient assures that it shall comply, and all its subcontractors as applicable shall comply, with the applicable provisions of the "RSAT Solicitation", the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guide", the "DPS Subrecipient Travel Guidelines", any applicable federal nondiscrimination requirements, which may include the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3789d); the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984 (42 U.S.C. § 10604(e)); the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDPA) of 2002 (42 U.S.C. § 5672(b)); the Violence Against Women (VAWA) Act of 2013 (42 U.S.C. 13925(b)(13)); Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794); Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-34); Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. §§ 1681, 1683, 1685-86); the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101-07); 28 C.F.R. This requirement applies regardless of an individual's employment status. The details of this requirement are posted on the OJP website at https://ojp.gov/funding/Explore/Interact-Minors.htm.

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Article XVIII - Relationship

The Subrecipient agrees that it will represent itself to be an independent Subrecipient offering such services to the general public and shall not represent itself or its employees to be employees of the Missouri Department of Public Safety. (This provision is not applicable to the Missouri Department of Public Safety or any of its divisions or programs.) Therefore, the Subrecipient shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc.

Article XVIX - Texting While Driving

Pursuant to Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," 74 Fed. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the Missouri Department of Public Safety encourages the Subrecipient to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this subaward, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.

Article XX - Drug-Free Workplace

As required by the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, as implemented at 28 C.F.R. Part 83, Subpart F, as defined by 28 C.F.R. §§ 83.620 and 83.650:

The Subrecipient certifies and assures that it will, or will continue to, provide a drug-free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in its workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation of such prohibition;
- (b) Establishing an on-going drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:
 - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - (2) The Subrecipient's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - (3) Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and
 - (4) The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace;
- (c) Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of work funded by this subaward be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a);
- (d) Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment funded by this subaward, the employee will:
 - (1) Abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (2) Notify the employer in writing of the employee's conviction for a violation of a criminal drug statute occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) calendar days after such conviction;

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(e) Notifying the Missouri Department of Public Safety, in writing, within 10 calendar days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2) from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction. Subrecipients of convicted employees must provide notice, including position title of any such convicted employee, to the Missouri Department of Public Safety by one of the following methods:

- (f) Taking one of the following actions, within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee who is convicted:
 - (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or
 - (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency; and
- (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).

Article XXI - Computer Networks

The Subrecipient understands and agrees that funds subawarded may be used to maintain or establish a computer network unless such network blocks the viewing, downloading, and exchanging of pornography. Nothing in this provision limits the use of funds necessary for any Federal, State, tribal, or local law enforcement agency or any other entity carrying out criminal investigations, prosecution, adjudication activities, or other law enforcement-or victim assistance-related activity.

Article XXII - Noninterference with Federal Law Enforcement

The Subrecipient understands that it may not prohibit or in any way restrict any government entity or official from sending or receiving information regarding citizenship or immigration status as described in 8 U.S.C. § 1373(a). The Subrecipient further understands that it may not prohibit or in any way restrict a government entity or agency from sending, requesting or receiving, maintaining, or exchanging information regarding immigration status as described in either 8 U.S.C. § 1373(b) or 1644.

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Article XXIII - Public Disclosure of Certain Law Enforcement Sensitive Information

The Subrecipient understands that no funds from this subaward may be used to make any public disclosure of any federal law enforcement information in a direct or indirect attempt to conceal, harbor, or shield from detection any fugitive from justice under 18 U.S.C. Chapter 49, or any alien who has come to, entered, or remains in the United States in violation of 8 U.S.C. Chapter 12, without regard to whether such disclosure would constitute (or could form a predicate for) a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1071 or 1072 or of 8 U.S.C. § 1324(a).

Article XXIV - Noninterference with Federal Interrogation of Certain Aliens

Consonant with federal law enforcement statutes and regulations, including 8 U.S.C. § 1357(a), under which certain federal officers and employees "have power without warrant...to interrogate any alien or persons believed to be an alien as to his right to be or to remain in the United States," and 8 C.F.R. 287.5(a), under which that power may be exercised "anywhere in or outside the United States", the Subrecipient understands it shall not interfere with the exercise of that power to interrogate "without warrant" (by agents of the United States acting under color of federal law) by impeding access to any State or local government correctional facility by such agents for the purpose of "interrogating any alien or person believed to be an alien as to his or her right to be or to remain in the United States".

Article XXV - Noninterference with Notice of Scheduled Release

Consonant with federal law enforcement statutes, including 8 U.S.C. § 1231 (for an alien incarcerated by a State or local government, a 90-day "removal period" during which the federal government "shall" detain and then "shall" remove an alien from the U.S. "begins" no later than "the date the alien is released from...confinement"; also the federal government is expressly authorized to make payments to a "State or a political subdivision of the State...with respect to the incarceration of [an] undocumented criminal alien"); 8 U.S.C. § 1226 (the federal government "shall take into custody" certain criminal aliens "when the alien is released"); and 8 U.S.C. § 1366 (requiring an annual DOJ report to Congress on "the number of illegal alien [felons] in Federal and State prisons" and programs underway "to ensure the prompt removal" from the U.S. of removable "criminal aliens"), the Subrecipient understands it shall not interfere with the "removal" process by failing to provide, as early as practicable, advance notice to DHS of the scheduled release date and time for a particular alien, if the Subrecipient receives from DHS a formal written request pursuant to the INA that seeks such advance notice.

Article XXVI - Ensuring Access to Federally Assisted Programs

The Subrecipient acknowledges that federal laws prohibit recipients of financial assistance from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, or disability in funded programs or activities, not only in respect to employment practices but also in the delivery of services or benefits. Federal law also prohibits recipients from discriminating on the basis of age in the delivery of services or benefits.

Article XXVII - Enforcing Civil Rights Laws

The Subrecipient acknowledges that all recipients of federal financial assistance, regardless of the particular source, the amount of the grant award, or the number of employees in the workforce, are subject to the prohibitions against unlawful discrimination. Accordingly, DOJ's Office for Civil Rights

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(OCR) investigates recipients that are the subject of discrimination complaints from both individuals and groups.

Article XXVIII - Limited English Proficiency (LEP)

The Subrecipient assures that, in accordance with the *Guidance to Federal Financial Assistance Recipients Regarding Title VI Prohibition Against National Origin Discrimination Affecting Limited English Proficient Persons*, 67 Fed. Reg. 41455 (2002) as it pertains to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. 2000d, recipients of federal financial assistance must take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to their programs and activities for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP). "Meaningful access" will generally involve some combination of oral interpretation services and written translation of vital documents. For more information, visit https://www.lep.gov/.

Article XXIX - Equal Employment Opportunity Plan (EEOP)

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the applicable requirements of 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subpart E., DOJ's Equal Employment Opportunity Program (EEOP) Guidelines. The Subrecipient will prepare an *EEO Utilization Report* if the Subrecipient (1) is a state or local government agency or any business; and (2) has 50 or more employees (counting both full and part-time employees but excluding seasonal employees, political appointees, and elected officials); and (3) receives a single award of \$25,000 or more from the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), or Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). The *EEO Utilization Report* must be prepared and submitted to DOJ's Office for Civil Rights (OCR) through OCR's online EEO Reporting Tool within 60 days of receipt of such federal subaward.

If the Subrecipient does not meet all the aforementioned criteria, the Subrecipient is exempt from preparing the *EEO Utilization Report*; however, all Subrecipients, regardless of their EEOP obligations, must complete the *Certification Form*, in which the Subrecipient declares its satisfaction of its obligations. The *Certification Form* must be prepared and submitted to DOJ's OCR through OCR's online EEO Reporting Tool within 60 days of receipt of such federal subaward.

Article XXX - Using Arrest and Conviction Records for Employment Decisions

The Subrecipient understands the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) issued an advisory document for recipients of federal financial assistance on the proper use of arrest and conviction records in making hiring decisions. Refer to Advisory for Recipients of Financial Assistance from the U.S. Department of Justice on the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's Enforcement Guidance: Consideration of Arrest and Conviction Records in Employment Decisions Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (June 2013), available at

Subrecipients should be mindful that the misuse of arrest or conviction records to screen either applicants for employment or employees for retention or promotion may have a disparate impact based on race or national origin, resulting in unlawful employment discrimination. In light of the

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Advisory, Subrecipients should consult local counsel in reviewing their employment practices. If warranted, Subrecipients should also incorporate an analysis of the use of arrest and conviction records in their Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Plans.

Article XXXI - Finding of Discrimination

The Subrecipient assures that, in the event a federal or state court or federal or state administrative agency makes a finding of discrimination after a due process hearing on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin or sex against a Subrecipient of federal funds, the Subrecipient will forward a copy of the court judgment to the Missouri Department of Public Safety within 30 days of the court judgment date. The Missouri Department of Public Safety will act as the liaison in all civil rights matters with DOJ's Office for Civil Rights (OCR).

Article XXXII - Unlawful Employment Practices

The Subrecipient assures compliance with Section 213.055 RSMo in regards to non-discrimination in employment practices as it relates to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, ancestry, age, or disability.

Article XXXIII - Discrimination in Public Accommodations

The Subrecipient assures compliance with Section 213.065 RSMo in regards to non-discrimination in public accommodations as it relates to accommodations, advantages, facilities, services, or privileges made available in place of public accommodations.

Article XXXIV - Fund Availability

The Subrecipient understands all subawards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law. It is understood and agreed upon that, in the event funds from federal and/or state sources are not appropriated and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to cover the costs under this subaward, or in the event of a change in federal and/or state law relevant to these costs, the obligations of each party hereunder shall thereupon be terminated immediately upon receipt of written notice.

Article XXV - Release of Funds

The Subrecipient acknowledges no funds will be disbursed under this subaward until such time as all required documents are signed by the Subrecipient Authorized Official and Subrecipient Project Director and returned to the Missouri Department of Public Safety for final review and signature by the Director or his/her designee.

Article XXXVI - Duplicative Funding

The Subrecipient agrees that if it currently has an open award of federal and/or state funds or if it receives an award of federal and/or state funds other than this subaward, and those award funds have been, are being, or are to be used, in whole or in part, for one or more of the identical cost items for which funds are being provided under this subaward, the Subrecipient will promptly notify, in writing, the Missouri Department of Public Safety. If so requested and allowed by the Missouri Department of Public Safety, the Subrecipient shall submit a Subaward Adjustment for a budget revision or program revision to eliminate any inappropriate duplication of funding.

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Article XXXVII - OJP Financial Guide

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the financial and administrative requirements set forth in the current edition of the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) Financial Guide.

Article XXXVIII - Allowable Costs

The Subrecipient understands that only allowable and approved expenditures will be reimbursed under this subaward. These monies may not be utilized to pay debts incurred by other activities. The Subrecipient agrees to obligate funds no later than the last day of the project period. (Funds are obligated when a legal liability to pay a determinable sum for services or goods is incurred and will require payment during the same or future period.) The Subrecipient also agrees to expend funds no later than the date identified in the "RSAT Solicitation". (Funds are considered to be expended when payment is made.) Any funds not properly obligated and/or expended will lapse. Any deviation from the approved subaward must have prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety. The Subrecipient shall fully coordinate all activities in the performance of the project with those of the Missouri Department of Public Safety. The Subrecipient certifies that all expendable and non-expendable property purchased funds under this subaward shall be used for approved project purposes only.

Article XXXIX - Financial Reporting Requirements

The Subrecipient agrees to complete and submit any financial reports required for this program as outlined in the "RSAT Solicitation". Failure to submit reports by the deadline dates may result in delay for reimbursement requests and/or cancellation of the subaward.

Article XL - Program Income

The Subrecipient agrees to account for program income generated by the activities of this subaward, and shall report receipts and expenditures of this income on the monthly Claim report. The Subrecipient understands that all program income generated as a result of this subaward shall be expended during the life of the project period, unless otherwise stated.

Article XLI - Procurement

The Subrecipient assures that all procurement transactions whether negotiated or competitively bid and without regard to dollar value shall be conducted in a manner to provide maximum open and free competition. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that all procurement transactions will meet the minimum standards set forth in the "DPS Financial and Administrative Guidelines" and identified here:

- (a) All quotations and the rationale behind the selection of a source of supply shall be retained, attached to the purchase order copy, and placed in the accounting files.
- (b) Purchases to a single vendor totaling less than \$10,000 may be purchased with prudence on the open market.
- (c) Purchases estimated to total between \$10,000 but less than \$100,000 to a single vendor, must be competitively bid, but need not be solicited by mail or advertisement.

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- (d) Purchases with an estimated total of \$100,000 or over to a single vendor shall be advertised for bids in at least two daily newspapers of general circulation in such places as are most likely to reach prospective bidders at least five days before bids for such purchases are to be opened.
- (e) Where only one bid or positive proposal is received, it is deemed to be sole source procurement.
- (f) Sole source procurement on purchases to a single vendor of \$10,000 and over requires prior approval from the Missouri Department of Public Safety.

Article XLII - Buy American

The Subrecipient acknowledges Sections 34.350-34.359 RSMo regarding the Missouri Domestic Products Procurement Act (or commonly referred to as the Buy American Act) and the requirement to purchase or lease goods manufactured or produced in the United States, unless exceptions to the Buy American Act mandate in Section 34.353 RSMo are met.

Article XLIII - Buy Missouri

The Subrecipient also acknowledges Sections 34.070 and 34.073 RSMo regarding the preference given to all commodities and tangible personal property manufactured, mined, produced, or grown within the State of Missouri and to all firms, corporations, or individuals doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals, or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less, quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less, or when competing bids are comparable.

Article XLIV - Debarment/Suspension

The Subrecipient certifies, pursuant to nonprocurement debarment and suspension regulations implemented at 28 CFR Part 2867, and to other related requirements, that it and its principles:

- (a) Are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, sentenced to a denial of Federal benefits by a state or federal court, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal department or agency;
- (b) Have not within a three-year period preceding this subaward been convicted of a felony criminal violation under federal law, or been convicted or had a civil judgment rendered against it for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, tribal, or local) transaction or private agreement or transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, tax evasion or receiving stolen property, making false claims, or obstruction of justice, or commission of any offense indicating a lack of business integrity or business honesty that seriously and directly affects its (or its principals') present responsibility;

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- (c) Have not within a three-year period preceding this subaward been convicted of a felony criminal violation under any federal law, unless such felony criminal conviction has been disclosed in writing to the Department of Justice at ojpcompliancereporting@usdoj.gov, and, after such disclosure, the Subrecipient has received a specific written determination from the Department of Justice that neither suspension nor debarment of the Subrecipient is necessary to protect the interests of the Government in this case;
- (d) Are not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (federal, state, tribal, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (b) of this certification; and/or
- (e) Have not within a three year period preceding this subaward had one or more public transactions (federal, state, tribal, or local) terminated for cause or default.

Article XLV - Audit

The Subrecipient agrees to comply with the organizational audit requirements of OJP Financial Guide, Chapter 3.19, Audit Requirements. This guidance states that non-federal entities that expend \$750,000 or more in federal funds (from all sources including pass-through subawards) in the agency's fiscal year (12-month turnaround reporting period) shall have a single organization wide audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of Title 2 C.F.R. Subpart F (§ 200.500 et seq.). The Subrecipient assures a copy of the financial audit report will be submitted to the Missouri Department of Public Safety within 60 days of the project period start date if it has met or exceeded this federal threshold.

Article XLVI – Compensation

The Subrecipient understands that federal funds may not be used to pay cash compensation (salary plus bonuses) to any employee of the Subrecipient at a rate that exceeds 110% of the maximum annual salary payable to a member of the federal government's Senior Executive Service (SES) at an agency with a Certified SES Performance Appraisal System. (The Subrecipient understands it may compensate an employee at a higher rate, provided the amount in excess of this compensation limitation is paid with non-federal funds.)

Article XLVII - Suspension/Termination of Subaward

The Missouri Department of Public Safety reserves the right to suspend or terminate any subaward entered into as a result of this subaward at its sole discretion and without penalty or recourse by giving written notice to the Subrecipient of the effective date of suspension or termination. In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by the Subrecipient under the subaward shall, at the option of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, become property of the State of Missouri.

In the event a subaward is suspended or permanently terminated, the Missouri Department of Public Safety may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the subaward funds remaining or an amount equal to the portion of the subaward funds wrongfully used.

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Article XLVIII – Enforceability

If a Subrecipient fails to comply with all applicable federal and/or state requirements governing these funds, the State of Missouri may withhold or suspend, in whole or in part, funds awarded under the subaward, or recover misspent funds following an audit. This provision is in addition to all other remedies provided to the State of Missouri for recovery of misspent funds available under all applicable state and federal laws.

Article XLIX - Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)

The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 43.505 RSMo relating to uniform crime reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.

On January 1, 2021, the FBI retired the UCR Program Summary System and replaced it solely with the Nation al Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). To comply with section 43.505 RSMo, all MO law enforcement date must adhere to the state specific Missouri Incident Based Reporting System (MIBRS). Any agency that is not compliant after December 31, 2022, may be ineligible to receive state or federal funds.

Article L - Vehicle Stops

The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 590.650 RSMo relating to vehicle stop reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.

Article LI - Federal Equitable Sharing Funds

The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 513.653 RSMo relating to participation in the federal forfeiture system and the reporting of proceeds therefrom to the Missouri State Auditor.

Article LII - Custodial Interrogations

The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 590.700 RSMo relating to custodial interrogations and has adopted a written policy to record custodial interrogations of persons suspected of committing or attempting to commit the felony crimes described in subsection 2 of this section.

Article LIII - DWI Law - Law Enforcement

The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a law enforcement agency, its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of Section 43.544 RSMo relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward arrest information for all intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by Section 43.503 RSMo.

Article LIV - DWI Law – Prosecutors: The Subrecipient assures, where the project agency is a county prosecutor's office or municipal prosecutor's office, its county prosecutor's office or municipal prosecutor's office is in compliance with Section 43.544 RSMo relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward all charge information for intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by Section 43.503 RSMo.

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Article LV - Project Requirements:

The Subrecipient agrees the proposed project will conform to the criteria requirements outlined in the "RSAT Solicitation". In addition, the Subrecipient agrees to implement or continue to require urinalysis or other proven reliable forms of testing of individuals in correctional residential substance treatment programs, where such is required of the program. Such testing shall include individuals released from residential substance abuse treatment programs who remain in the custody of the State.

Article LVI - Data Reporting Requirements

The Subrecipient agrees to complete and submit any data or statistical reports required for this program as outlined in the "RSAT Solicitation". Failure to submit reports by the deadline dates may result in delay for reimbursement requests and/or cancellation of the subaward.

Article LVII - Printed Materials

The Subrecipient agrees that all materials and publications (written, web-based, audio-visual, or any other format) resulting from the activities of this subaward shall contain the following (or similar) statement: "This project was supported by the Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice's RSAT Formula Grant Program administered by the Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director. The opinions, findings, conclusions, and recommendations expressed in this publication/program/exhibition are those of the author(s) and do not necessarily reflect the views of the State or the U.S. Department of Justice."

Article LVIII - Breach of Personally Identifiable Information

The Subrecipient assures it has written procedures in place to respond in the event of an actual or imminent "breach" (OMB M-17-12) if it (1) creates, collects, uses, processes, stores, maintains, disseminates, discloses, or disposes of "personally identifiable information (PII)" (2 CFR 200.79) within the activities of this subaward or (2) uses or operates a "Federal information system" (OMB Circular A-130). The Subrecipient's breach procedures must include a requirement to report actual or imminent breach of PII to the Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of Director no later than 24 hours after an occurrence of an actual breach, or the detection of an imminent breach.

Article LIX - Time Records Requirement

The Subrecipient assures that, **all** project personnel funded through this subaward will maintain timesheets that detail 100% of their time along with the activities/services provided. The timesheets must be signed by both the employee and the appropriate approving official. These timesheets must be provided to the Missouri Department of Public Safety upon request.

Article LX - Body Armor

The Subrecipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body armor, that JAG funds may be used to purchase body armor but may not be used as the 50% match for purposes of BJA's Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Program. Further, the Subrecipient understands that body armor purchased with JAG funds may be purchased at any threat level, designation, make, or model from any distributor or manufacturer, as long as the body armor has been tested and found to comply with the latest applicable National Institute of Justice (NIJ) ballistic or stab

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standards. Further, body armor or armor vests must also be "uniquely fitted vests". In addition, body armor purchased with JAG funds must be made in the United States.

Article LXI - Body Armor Policy

The Subrecipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body armor, that the law enforcement agency must have a written "mandatory wear" policy in effect. Per the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), there are no requirements regarding the nature of the policy other than it being a mandatory wear policy for all uniformed officers while on duty. **The Subrecipient will be required to forward a copy of such policy to the Missouri Department of Public Safety at the time of acceptance of the subaward.**

Article LXII - Body-Worn Cameras

The Subrecipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body-worn cameras, that JAG funds may be used to purchase body-worn cameras but may not be used as the 50% match for purposes of BJA's Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program (BWC Program).

Article LXIII - Body-Worn Camera Policy

The Subrecipient understands, if monies are requested and awarded for the purchase of body-worn cameras, the law enforcement agency must have written policies and procedures in place related to equipment usage, data storage and access, privacy considerations, training, etc. [The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Toolkit, which can be found online at https://bja.ojp.gov/program/body-worn-cameras-bwcs/overview, provides model BWC policies and best practices to assist departments in implementing BWC programs.] The Subrecipient will be required to forward a copy of such policy(s) to the Missouri Department of Public Safety at the time of acceptance of the subaward.

Article LXIV - Criminal Intelligence Systems

The Subrecipient agrees that any information technology system funded or supported by OJP funds will comply with 28 C.F.R. Part 23, Criminal Intelligence Systems Operating Policies, if OJP determines this regulation to be applicable. Should OJP determine 28 C.F.R. Part 23 to be applicable, OJP may, at its discretion, perform audits of the system, as per the regulation.

Article LXV - Duplication of Networks

The Subrecipient assures that all equipment/software requested and purchased under this subaward must be compatible with the statewide system. All software, if applicable, must be compatible with the statewide criminal records system. All communication devices, if applicable, must be capable of operating in accordance with the guidelines established by the Missouri Homeland Security Advisory Council.

Article LXVI - Mitigation Plan

The Subrecipient agrees to fully comply with the Missouri Department of Public Safety's *Mitigation Plan for Clandestine Methamphetamine Laboratory Enforcement Operations*, where such grant-funded project is for a drug task force. No monies from this subaward may be obligated to support

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methamphetamine lab operations unless the Subrecipient agrees to this special condition and fully participates in implementation of the *Mitigation Plan*.

Article LXVII - NEPA

The Subrecipient agrees to assist BJA in complying with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the National Historic Preservation Act, and other related federal environmental impact analyses requirements in the use of these grant funds, either directly or indirectly. Accordingly, the Subrecipient agrees to first determine if any of the following activities will be funded by the grant, prior to obligating funds for any of these purposes. If it is determined that any of the following activities will be funded by the grant, the Subrecipient agrees to contact the Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of Director.

The Subrecipient understands this condition applies to its following new activities whether or not they are being specifically funded with these grant funds. That is, as long as the activity being conducted by the Subrecipient or any third party, and the activity needs to be undertaken in order to use these grant funds, this condition must first be met. The activities covered by this condition are:

- (a) New construction;
- (b) Minor renovation or remodeling of a property located in an environmentally or historically sensitive area, including properties located within 100-year flood plain, a wetland, or habitat for endangered species, or a property listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places;
- (c) A renovation, lease, or any proposed use of a building or facility that will either (a) result in a change in its basic prior use or (b) significantly change its size; and,
- (d) Implementation of a new program involving the use of chemicals other than chemicals that are a) purchased as an incidental component of a funded activity and (b) traditionally used, for example, in office, household, recreational, or education environments.
- (e) Implementation of a program relating to clandestine methamphetamine laboratory operations, including the identification, seizure, or closure of clandestine methamphetamine laboratories.

The Subrecipient understands and agrees that complying with NEPA may require the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement, as directed by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.

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INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI AND THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

This is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlining a proposed joint working agreement between the participating agencies to use all applicable regulations, statutes, and compliance mechanisms to effectively abate drug and crime related nuisance properties in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

This MOU is made and entered into this <u>27th</u> day of May 2021, by and between the City of Kansas City, Missouri (CITY) and the County of Jackson, Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA).

WHEREAS, this MOU provides a suitable mechanism for setting out the mutual responsibilities and obligations of the parties with respect to the establishment and operations of the Jackson County Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) Program; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the COUNTY shall serve as the fiscal agent for any funds distributed by the Missouri Department of Public Service; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this MOU is in the best interests of all parties and that the undertaking will benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the DART Program shall be continued under the administration and direction of the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office; and

WHEREAS, the term of this Agreement shall be for twelve (12) months commencing July 1, 2021 and terminating on June 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this agreement shall impose any liability for claims against the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by one or more of the parties; and

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS AGREED BY AND AMONG THE PARTIES THE FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES:

JACKSON COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

- a. Will assign two Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys to oversee the filings of expedited evictions, public nuisances, asset forfeitures and related criminal matters.
- b. Will assign one Trial Team Leader to act as the DART coordinator, who will oversee the operation of DART.
- c. Will assign one paralegal and one investigator to DART.
- d. Will provide notice to property owners of criminal activity and potential litigation.
- e. Will conduct trainings for law enforcement personnel on civil tools to deter crime.
- f. Will collect citizen's complaints regarding drug properties and provide to KCPD.
- g. Will organize regular meetings to discuss problem properties.
- h. Will maintain records of all DART properties.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI (Neighborhoods and Housing Services)

- a. Will provide a code enforcement officer to DART. The inspector will be housed within the JCPA offices for a minimum of 12 hours per week. Tentative work schedule is Mondays (12PM-3PM), Wednesday (7AM-3:30PM) and Thursdays (9AM-11:30AM) and subject to change.
- b. Will conduct inspections of properties connected to drug or criminal activity.
- c. Will conduct follow-up inspections on properties deemed uninhabitable.
- d. Will post properties as needed under Ch. 48 and 56 of the City's municipal codes.
- Will issue work access permits (when appropriate) to owners and/or residents of DART related cases.
- f. Will provide the necessary documentation for grant reporting purposes (i.e. timesheets, payroll expenditures, status of DART cases, etc.) by the designated deadline.

WHEREAS, the manner in which these services are rendered, the standards of performance, the discipline of the officers and employees, and other matters incident to the performance of these services and the control of personnel so employed, shall remain in the discretion of the respective governing bodies, as applicable, and shall be governed by their respective personnel rules; and

WHEREAS, by entering into this MOU, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those other than those set out herein; further, this MOU shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

We, the undersigned have read and agree with the MOU. Furthermore, we have reviewed the proposed project as outlined in Appendix A and commit to partnering under the terms of this agreement.

APPENDIX A

DART: Purpose and History

The purpose of the DART program is to combat illegal drugs, violence and reduce the harm of criminal activity from Jackson County established a Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) in 1991. Jackson County DART is a collaborative, multi-jurisdictional team created to provide assistance to local citizens by identifying locations where crimes occur, working with homeowners and the community to prevent future crimes and when necessary using legal means to ensure the safety of our communities. Since the inception of Jackson County DART Program, over 9,400 drug houses have been removed from our community.

- a. Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA): JCPA is the chief law enforcement agency in Jackson County, Missouri. Led by County Prosecutor (Jean Peters Baker), the office has over 150 total staff which are responsible for prosecuting all criminal and civil cases on behalf of Missouri in the County of Jackson. The office averages filing over 10,000 charges a year based on crimes that occur in 14 different jurisdictions within Jackson County.
- b. City of Kansas City, Missouri (KCMO): is the largest city in Missouri and is the predominant city of a metropolitan area of more than two million people spanning the Missouri-Kansas border. It encompasses 316 square miles (820 km2) in parts of Jackson, Clay, Cass, and Platte counties. It is one of two county seats of Jackson County, the other being Independence, which is to the city's east. The Neighborhoods and Housing Services Department (Neighborhood Preservation Division) is responsible for inspecting and addressing property maintenance and/or nuisance related violations in an attempt to obtain voluntary compliance from homeowners or residents. If voluntary compliance is unsuccessful, other code enforcement actions will be administered including issuing summons or administrative citations to those who refuse to comply.

WHEREAS, subsequent change orders have increased the total contract price to its present authorization of \$11,652,616.58; and,

WHEREAS, the cost adjustments in this Change Order are related to project changes made at the direction of County staff to successfully complete construction of the trail; and,

WHEREAS, the changes, based on need to match field conditions or resolve design issues, include the addition of three concrete sections of trail, limestone blocks for access control, and seeding and mulching due to insufficient quantities, and the deduction of fence quantities; and,

WHEREAS, a design change recommended by the contractor and other cost-reducing measures implemented by County staff have reduced the ultimate financial impact of these issues; and,

WHEREAS, a change order for these unforeseen conditions is necessary to build the project to the specified design, at an additional cost to the County not to exceed \$25,719.40; and,

WHEREAS, Change Order No. 6, which addresses the retaining wall costs and cost-reducing measures, will bring the total not to exceed cost of the project to \$11,678,335.98; and,

WHEREAS, no other contract changes are included in this change order; now therefore,



LICENSE FOR FACILITY WITHOUT CONCESSION AGREEMENT WITH JACKSON COUNTY MISSOURI AND KANSAS CITY MISSOURI PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

THIS LICENSE made and entered into this ____ day of_____,2021 between KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, a constitutionally chartered municipal corporation (City), through its Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners (Board) and Jackson County, Missouri (Licensee).

WHEREAS, the Board has under its control various park lands and boulevards belonging to City including, Gregg Klice Community Center (Premises) located at 1600 E. 17th Terrace and;

WHEREAS, the President of the Board is authorized and empowered by the City Charter to execute Parks and Recreation Department contracts; and

WHEREAS, the Licensee desires to use the Premises under the terms of this License; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the payments and mutual agreements contained in this License, City and Licensee agree as follows:

Sec. 1. Permission for Use of Premises. City hereby grants to Licensee the non-exclusive permission to enter Gregg Klice Community Center located at 1600 E. 17th Terrace ("Premises") and for the limited purpose of offering basketball practices and games during the dates and times listed in **Attachment No. 4.** Necessary City personnel shall always have access to the Premises.

Sec. 2. Licensee's Responsibilities.

See Attachment No. 1, Licensee's Responsibilities, incorporated into this License.

Sec. 3. Responsibilities of City.

See Attachment No. 2, Responsibilities of City, incorporated into this License.

- **Sec. 4. Term of License.** This License shall begin on December 9, 2021, and shall end no later than March 17, 2022.
- Sec. 5. Compensation and Reimbursables. The Licensee agrees to compensate City in the amount of \$50.00/hour for the use of the gymnasium for a total estimated payment of \$1,400.00 (See Attachment No. 4) All unpaid rent and fee payments due to the City hereunder shall bear a service charge of one- and one-half percent per month if same are not paid and received on or before the 20th of the month in which said payments are due and Licensee agrees it shall pay and discharge all cost and expenses including reasonable attorneys' fees incurred or expended by the City in collection of said delinquent amount due. Licensee shall provide

invoicing and other relevant information reasonably requested by the City as a part of the payment to the City and at other times upon reasonable request of the City. This compensation amount does not include additional compensation which may be necessary pursuant to Attachment 1, Section I

- Sec. 7. Conflicts of Interest. The provisions of City's Code of Ordinances Sections 2-2001, 2-2002, 2-2020, 2-2021, 2-2022, and 2-2023 prohibiting City officers and employees from having a financial or personal interest in any contract with City, and Code Sections 2-2100 and 2-2101, imposing sanctions for violations, shall apply to this License. Licensee certifies that no known officer or employee of City has, or will have, a direct or indirect financial or personal interest in this License, and that no known officer or employee of City, or member of such officer's or employee's immediate family, either has negotiated, or has or will have an arrangement, concerning employment to perform services on behalf of Licensee in this License.
- **Sec. 8. Independent Contractor.** Licensee is an independent contractor with respect to all services performed under this License. Licensee accepts full and exclusive liability for the payment of any and all premiums, contributions or taxes for workers' compensation, Social Security, unemployment benefits, or other employee benefits now or hereafter imposed under any state or federal law which are measured by the wages, salaries or other remuneration paid to

persons employed by Licensee on work performed under the terms of this License. Licensee shall defend, indemnify and save harmless City from any claims or liability for such contributions or taxes. Nothing contained in this License nor any act of City, or Licensee, shall be deemed or construed to create any third-party beneficiary or principal and agent association or relationship with City. Licensee is not City's agent and Licensee has no authority to take any action or execute any documents on behalf of City.

Sec. 9. Insurance.

A Licensee shall procure and maintain in effect throughout the duration of this License insurance coverage not less than the types and amounts specified in this section. In the event that additional insurance, not specified herein, is required by City during the term of this License. Licensee shall use commercially reasonable efforts to supply such insurance, and if obtainable by Licensee. Policies containing a Self-Insured Retention will be acceptable to City.

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate, written on an "occurrence" basis. The policy shall be written or endorsed to include the following provisions:
 - a. Severability of Interests Coverage applying to Additional Insureds
 - b. Contractual Liability
 - c. Per Project Aggregate Liability Limit or, where not available, the aggregate limit shall be \$2,000,000.
 - d. No Contractual Liability Limitation Endorsement
 - e. Additional Insured Endorsement, ISO form CG20 10, current edition, or its equivalent.
 - f. IF children are involved: Sexual abuse/molestation coverage be included under general liability or obtained in separate policies in an of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence / \$2,000,000 aggregate on an occurrence basis.
- 2. Workers' Compensation Insurance: as required by statute, including Employers Liability with limits of:

- 3. Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance: with a limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, covering owned, hired, and non-owned automobiles. Coverage provided shall be on an "any auto" basis and written on an "occurrence" basis. This insurance will be written on a Commercial Business Auto form, or an acceptable equivalent, and will protect against claims arising out of the operation of motor vehicles, as to acts done in connection with the License, by Licensee.
- 4. If applicable, Professional Liability Insurance with limits per claim and annual aggregate of \$2,000,000.
- B. The policies listed above may not be canceled until after thirty (30) days written notice of cancellation to City, ten (10) days in the event of nonpayment of premium. The Commercial General and Automobile Liability Insurance specified above shall provide that City and its agencies, officials, officers, and employees, while acting within the scope of their authority, will be named as additional insureds for the services performed under this License. Licensee shall provide to City at execution of this License a certificate of insurance showing all required endorsements and additional insureds. The certificate shall be on the City approved form furnished as requested.
- C. All insurance coverage must be written by companies that have an A.M. Best's rating of "A+V" or better, and are licensed or approved by the State of Missouri to do business in Missouri.
- D. Regardless of any approval by City, it is the responsibility of Licensee to maintain the required insurance coverage in force at all times; and its failure to do so will not relieve it of any contractual obligation or responsibility. In the event of Licensee's failure to maintain the required insurance in effect, City may order Licensee to immediately stop work or use of the Premises, and upon ten (10) days notice and an opportunity to cure, may pursue its remedies for breach of this License as provided for herein and by law.
- **Sec. 10. Governing Law.** This License shall be construed and governed in accordance with the law of the State of Missouri. The parties submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Missouri and waive venue.
- **Sec. 11.** Compliance with Laws. Licensee shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations applicable to this License. Licensee, at its own expense, shall secure all occupational and professional licenses and permits from public or private sources necessary for the fulfillment of its obligations under this License. Licensee may terminate this License upon ten (10) days written notice to City if City is in material breach of this License and fails to cure the breach before the end of the ten (10) day notice period, or upon thirty (30) days written notice to City if either: (i) the City's estimate of extraordinary expenses for the camp event for any year under Sections K and L of Attachment 1 are greater than anticipated by Licensee and unacceptable to Licensee in its sole discretion; or (ii) Licensee shall reasonably determine that the projected revenue from operation of the camp event for any year is not sufficient to adequately cover Licensee's projected expenses so that it would cause Licensee economic hardship to operate the camp event.
- C. If this License is terminated prior to Licensee's completion of the services to be performed hereunder, then all finished or unfinished documents, including but not limited to data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs, reports, computer programs or other materials prepared or obtained by Licensee pursuant to this License shall become City's property.
- **Sec. 13. Defaults and Remedies.** If either party shall be in default or breach of any provision of this License, the other party may terminate this License, suspend the other party's performance, withhold payment, if any, or invoke any other legal or equitable remedy after giving the defaulting or breaching party at least ten (10) days prior written notice and opportunity to correct such default or breach.
- **Sed. 14. Waiver.** Waiver by either party of any term, covenant, or condition hereof shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same, or of any other term, covenant or condition. No term, covenant, or condition of this License can be waived except by written consent of the applicable party, and forbearance or indulgence by a party in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver of same to be performed by the other party to which the same may apply and, until complete performance by the party to perform the term, covenant or condition, the applicable party shall be entitled to invoke any remedy available to it under this License or by law despite any such forbearance or indulgence.
- Sec. 15. Rights and Remedies Cumulative and Not Exclusive. All rights and remedies granted to either party herein and any other rights and remedies which either party may have at law and in equity are hereby declared to be cumulative and not exclusive, and the fact that such party may have exercised any remedy without terminating this License shall not impair such party's rights thereafter to terminate or to exercise any other remedy herein granted or to which such party may be otherwise entitled.

Sec. 16. Americans with Disabilities Act. Licensee agrees to comply, during the course of this License, with all provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, as applicable and as amended from time to time resulting from Licensee's particular use of the Premises.

Sec. 17. Audit.

- A. The City Auditor, the City's Internal Auditor, the City's Director of Human Relations and, upon reasonable prior notice and at reasonable times, the Department administering this License shall have the right to audit this License and all books, documents and records of Licensee relating thereto.
- B. Licensee shall maintain all its books, documents and records relating to this License during the contract period and for three (3) years after the date of final payment.
- C. The books, documents and records of Licensee in connection with this License shall be made available to the City Auditor, City's Director of Human Relations and the City department administering this License for inspection and audit within ten (10) days after the written request is made.
- Sec. 18. Headings; Construction of License. The headings of each section of this License are for reference only. Unless the context of this License clearly requires otherwise, all terms and words used herein, regardless of the number and gender in which used, shall be construed to include any other number, singular or plural, or any other gender, masculine, feminine or neuter, the same as if such words had been fully and properly written in that number or gender. In the event of any conflict between this License and any incorporated Attachments, the provisions of this License shall control.
- **Sec. 19. Merger.** This License, including referenced Attachments 1, 2, and 3, constitutes the entire License between City and Licensee with respect to this subject matter, and supersedes all prior agreements between City and Licensee with respect to this subject matter, and any such prior agreement shall be void and of no further force or effect as of the date of this License.

Sec. 20. Modification.

- A. Unless stated otherwise in this License, no provision of this License may be waived, modified or amended except by written amendment signed by City and Licensee.
- B. No act, conversation or communication with any officer, agent or employee of City, either before or after the execution of this License, shall affect or modify any term or terminology of this License and any such act, conversation or communication shall not be binding upon City or Licensee.

- Sec. 21. Severability of Provisions. Except as specifically provided herein, all of the provisions of this License shall be severable. In the event that any provision of this License is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or unlawful, the remaining provisions of this License shall be valid unless the court finds the valid provisions of this License are so essentially and inseparably connected with and so dependent upon the invalid provision(s) that it cannot be presumed that the parties to this License could have included the valid provisions without the invalid provision(s); or unless the court finds that the valid provisions, standing alone, are incapable of being performed in accordance with the intentions of the parties.
- **Sec. 22. Binding Effect.** This License shall be binding upon the City and Licensee and their successors in interest.
- **Sec. 23.** Representations and Warranties. City and Licensee each certify that it has the power and authority to execute and deliver this License, to use the funds, if any, as contemplated hereby and to perform this License in accordance with its terms.
- **Sec. 24. Noise Code.** Licensee shall comply with the provisions of the Noise Control Code, Chapter 46 of the Code.
- Sec. 25. License Authorization. This License does require Board approval.
- **Sec. 26. Assignability or Subcontracting.** Licensee shall not subcontract, assign or transfer any part or all of Licensee's privileges, obligations or interests without the Board's prior written approval. If Licensee shall subcontract, assign, or transfer any part of Licensee's privileges, interests or obligations under this Licensee without the prior written approval of the Board, it shall constitute a material breach of this License. If the Board approves an assignment pursuant to this section, Sub-licensee shall comply with all the terms of this contract as set forth in Licensee's Responsibilities, attached hereto as Attachment #1, and incorporated herein by reference.
- **Sec. 27. Parks and Recreation Logos.** To the extent reasonably possible without undue expense to Licensee, Licensee shall place the Kansas City, Missouri Parks and Recreation logo on all information distributed to the public as attached hereto as **Attachment No. 3.**
- **Sec. 28. Force Majeure.** If either party shall be delayed or hindered in or prevented from the performance of any act required under this License by reason of strikes, lockouts, labor troubles, inability to procure materials, failure of power or other utilities, restrictive laws, terrorist acts, flash mobs by youths or other persons or other forms of civil disobedience, riots, insurrection, war or other reason not the fault of the party delayed in performing the work or doing the acts or carrying out the events required under the terms of this License (collectively, "force majeure" or a "force majeure event"), then performance of such act shall be excused for the period of the force majeure delay, and the period for the performance of any such act shall be extended for a period equivalent to the period of such delay.

- Sec. 29. Counterparts. This License may be executed at different times and in any number of originals or counterparts and by each party on a separate counterpart, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute only one instrument. In proving this License, it shall not be necessary to produce or account for more than one such counterpart signed by the party against whom enforcement is sought.

A RESOLUTION authorizing the County Executive to execute a Quit Claim Deed in favor of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, in accordance with the United States Swamp Lands Act of 1850, related to the Jackass Bend Unit, and known also as Big Muddy National Fish and Wildlife Refuge Acquisition Tract Number 110,R.

RESOLUTION NO. 20839, December 13, 2021

INTRODUCED BY Tony Miller, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Big Muddy National Fish and Wildlife Refuge (Refuge) was established in 1994 for the development, advancement, management, conservation, and protection of fish and wildlife resources; and,

WHEREAS, the Refuge spans from Kansas City to St. Louis along the Missouri River floodplain, encompassing seventeen separate units of protected lands and offering a variety of educational and recreational opportunities to the public; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of a 1950's era federal flood contract project, Jackson County currently owns the Jackass Bend Unit of the Refuge, consisting of thirty-five acres, located approximately 45 minutes northeast of Kansas City; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Fish and Wildlife Service has requested that the County donate the Jackass Bend Unit to the federal government; and,

WHEREAS, such a donation would provide enhanced public access to the Jackass Bend Unit, including fishing, hunting, wildlife observation opportunities, and the implementation of a public youth waterfowl hunting program; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Parks + Rec has advised that the Department has no present or future use planned for this property, which is a part of the former river channel, topographically rough terrain and difficult to access; and,

WHEREAS the attached Quit Claim deed provides a suitable mechanism by which to effect the donation; now therefore,



A recommendation of award to Fred Dreiling, LLC is made as the most qualified respondent with the highest evaluation score. Fred Dreiling will serve as Chief Lobbyist with participation from the following team members, to include both minority and woman participation at 12.5% and 15% respectively: Bennie Lewis, Cara Hoover, and Noel Torpey. Together, the team has over 60 years of combined experience.

Fred Dreiling's pricing is attached to this memo at an annual cost of \$117,500. Funds for December 2021 are in the current budget 001-0112-56021. Funds for 2022 are subject to appropriation and adoption of the annual budget.

To better align with the state legislative cycle, the initial contract award will run for an eleven-month period from December 2021 thru October 2022, with two twelve-month options for extension for the periods November 2022 thru October 2023 and November 2023 thru October 2024.

- 7. Consultant will be responsible for directing the efforts amount shall be divided by the consultants as prescribed by the contract. of the entire legislative team in Jefferson City.
- 8. Consultant shall be paid \$9,791.66 per month. This amount shall be divided by the consultants as prescribed by the contract.

CONSULTING AGREEMENT

THIS CONSULTING AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this _____ day of _____, 2021, by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, hereinafter called the "County" and FRED DREILING, LLC, 7325 Summit, Kansas City, Missouri 64114, hereinafter called "Consultant."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Consultant has agreed to perform consulting services for the County in the areas of intergovernmental relations, in accordance with the terms, conditions, and covenants as set forth in this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, Consultant and County have agreed to be bound by the provisions hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, County and Consultant respectively promise, covenant and agree with each other as follows:

1. Consultant shall serve as the "Lead Intergovernmental Relations Consultant" to the County Legislature as provided in section 295.1 of the <u>Jackson County Code</u>. Consultant will assess the current political climate in the State of Missouri and recommend appropriate strategies that would benefit the County and inform the County on all pertinent legislative issues and provide lobbying services as requested. Consultant shall work at the direction of the Chair of the County Legislature's Intergovernmental Affairs Committee and be available to attend such meetings as the County Legislature may request, all as is more fully set out in the Description of

Services, attached hereto as Exhibit A.

- 2. County shall pay Consultant the total sum of \$107,768.26 for its services pursuant to this Agreement, payable in eleven monthly installments of \$9,791.66. The first two monthly installments shall be due within two weeks after the execution of this Agreement, upon receipt of an invoice from Consultant. Subsequent payments will be due on the first day of each calendar month through October 2022, upon receipt of Consultant's invoice. Thereafter, the County shall have the option of renewing the Agreement, at the same monthly rate, for two successive terms of one year each.
- 3. Consultant shall direct a team of assistant lobbyists through sub-contractual relationships. Of the total sum of \$117,500.00 payable to Consultant for twelve months of services, \$36,000.00 shall be allocated to Noel Torpey, \$18,000.00 shall be allocated to Cara Hoover, and \$15,000.00 shall be allocated to Bennie Lewis for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement. Consultant is authorized to execute appropriate subcontracts with these persons.
 - 4. Consultant shall bear all the expenses of its work under this Agreement.
- 5. Consultant shall work as an independent contractor and not as an employee of County. Consultant shall be subject to the direction of County only as to the result to be accomplished and not as to the means and methods for accomplishing the result. Consultant shall report all earnings received hereunder as gross income, and be responsible for its own Federal, State and City withholding taxes and all other taxes, and operate its business independent of the business of County except as required by this Agreement.

- 6. The term of this Agreement shall be effective as of December 1, 2021, and extend until October 31, 2021. Consultant or County may terminate this Agreement by giving seven (7) days written notice to the other party. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which County or Consultant may be entitled to receive or be obligated to perform under this Agreement. Should this Agreement terminate, all books, brochures, fliers, lists, and all other County materials must be delivered and returned by Consultant to County within three (3) days of the demand of County.
- 7. Consultant promises, covenants, and agrees, in addition to all other provisions herein, that during the term of this Agreement, he shall not assign any portion or the whole of this Agreement without the prior written consent of County, except as specifically provided in section 3 herein.
- 8. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid or incapable of being enforced by reason of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 9. Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, Consultant assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, Consultant shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto

and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

- 10. Consultant and its subcontractors shall be responsible for their own compliance with the provisions of section 105.450 et seq., RSMo.
- 11. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

Attached you will find the Jackson County, Missouri Assessment Department's 2022-2023 Maintenance Plan. The Plan attempts to address all *statutory* elements of the coming assessment cycle under my leadership as Director of Assessment.

In the 2020-21 Plan, we identified three objectives for the 2020-2021 Reassessment Cycle:

- Implementation of a new CAMA system which we anticipate will be fully installed and functional by the 2025 reassessment.
- 2. Residential New Construction
- 3. Residential Demolition Permits.

Tyler Technologies has been working with staff on the CAMA system. Staff training will occur between January and March of 2022 and the new system is scheduled to go live in May 2022. We added 1.7 billion in new construction in 2021. New construction and demolition permits remain a priority for 2022-23. We have created a permits unit to help track permits. We are also working with municipalities for more efficient ways of identifying when new construction is completed.

In the fall of 2020, the Jackson County Legislature approve three proposals. The first proposal, a new CAMA system. Staff have been meeting with Tyler weekly to complete the configuration of the new system. Configuration of the new system should be completed at the end of 2021. Staff will be trained January to March in preparation to go live in May 2022. The second proposal was for a parcel-by-parcel review. Tyler Technologies began the parcel-by-parcel review in late January 2021. There are approximately 40 data collectors in the field and approximately 1/3 of the County had been inspected as of the end of October. The parcel-by-parcel review will continue through 2022 and updated information will be entered into the new CAMA system in preparation of the 2023 Reassessment. The third proposal was for the 2023 Re-Assessment. This enables Jackson County time to build and train staff. Additional funding was requested in the 2022 budget for education for the entire Assessment staff. Data Collectors who excel and have an interest will be trained and promoted to appraisers for Jackson County Assessment Department. This will help to build our staff to the level necessary to maintain our new system. 10 Data Collectors have been hired by the County with a goal of a total of 15 by the end of the year. The assessment department currently has 71 staff member and have been approved for 95 FTE. The maintenance plan calls for 96 in 2022 and 105 in 2023. We will seek approval of additional positions in 2023 based on recommendations in the IAAO audit.

Page 2 Assessor's Letter

It should be noted that the cost of three projects is **not** included in the Assessment Budget. The majority of the total contract is being paid from the County Improvement Fund. There is a small portion of approximately \$1.5 million that is to be paid from the 2020 Assessment Fund. To date just over \$4,000,000 has been paid toward this contract

Our goals for 2022-23 Reassessment cycle are as follows:

- 1. Pick up new construction both Residential and Commercial
- 2. Build Staff
- 3. Implement recommendations from the IAAO audit
- 4. Train all staff on new CAMA system in preparation for going live in May 2022.
- 5. Establish and implement a public relations program

The new CAMA system will be available for the 2022 appeal cycle. We are working to make the BOE process more efficient in order to complete appeals in time for the taxing jurisdiction to set levies. Jackson County is looking to add an online appeal system that is integrated in the new CAMA system. Assessment will be responsible for intake, tracking and scheduling of appeals.

The IAAO Audit is underway with consultants for IAAO schedule to conducts interview on December 9th, 13th and 15. We anticipate receiving the full report from the Audit in late January at which time a plan will be put in place to implement the recommendation of the IAAO Audit.

The Assessment department has reorganized it customer service units into a single unit reducing the need to transfer property owners from department to department when they have questions. Meetings with stakeholders and public officials will continue and several public events are planned in preparation for the 2023 reassessment. These meetings are meant to provide education on the assessment process and what to expect in the 2023 reassessment.

Our Personal Property units will continue to assist customers, track and maintain required personal property records via walk-in units at two Jackson County, Missouri, locations, one is in Independence and another facility located in Kansas City, as well as by telephone and electronic communication and field review.

The Jackson County Assessment Department is committed to improving and maintaining the quality of assessments,

In 2023, we will continue to grow and develop staff. Tyler Technologies will be responsible for the 2023 Reassessment and defending values. A copy of the scope of work is attached. Assessment staff will work with Tyler and continue to value on going new construction.

2022-2023 Assessment Maintenance Plan Agreement and Approval

The parties to this plan, the County Assessor, the County Commission, and the State Tax Commission, agree to its specific terms as well as these general obligations:

The Assessor will assess all taxable property in the county uniformly and at the statutorily required percentage of market value for the respective property. The actions of the assessor and staff will comply with the requirements found in Article X, Section 3 of the state constitution, Chapters 53, 137, 138 and any other pertinent chapter of the Revised Statues of Missouri.

The County will provide office facilities and the budgetary support, as set out in this agreement, to allow the Assessor and staff to carry out the terms of this agreement and the duties of the Assessors Office.

The State Tax Commission will provide technical assistance, including regular visits by the field representative, educational training, guidelines and other resources to aid the assessor in the execution of this plan. Further, in consideration for the Assessor supplying assessment services in compliance with the terms and obligations of this plan, the state will provide cost-share reimbursement funds to the extent specified in 137.750, RSMo.

It is hereby affirmed by the County, that an Assessment Fund has been established, and that the general revenue funds required of this plan will be deposited into the Assessment Fund.

Definitions

As used in this agreement the following words shall have this meaning attributed to them in this subsection:

- 1. The word "County" means Jackson County, Missouri.

The words "Market Value" mean the most probable price in terms of money which a property will bring if exposed for sale on the open market for a reasonable length of time, providing there is a knowledgeable buyer and seller both aware of the uses to which a property is adapted and for which it is capable of being used. Used synonymously with True Value in Money.
- 4. For land used for agricultural purposes, the words "Market Value" or "True Value in Money" shall mean the value the land has for agricultural and horticultural use, which is based upon the land's productive capability as set out in Section 137.017 137.021.
- 5. The words "Project", "Plan", or "Agreement" shall mean the assessment maintenance plan.
- 6. The word "Ownership Maps or Mapping" means all ownership maps and related records which are prepared or compiled by the County under the guidelines of the original mapping contract or a more current mapping/GIS project.
- 7. The words "Replacement Cost New (RCN)" means the cost, including material, labor, and overhead, that would be incurred in constructing an improvement having the same utility to its owner as the improvement in question, without necessarily reproducing exactly any particular characteristic of the property.
- 8. The word "Depreciation" means the loss in value of an object, relative to its replacement cost new, whether the loss of value is caused by physical deterioration, economic obsolescence or functional obsolescence.
- 9. The words "Physical Deterioration" mean the loss of value caused by wear and tear.
- 10. The words "Economic Obsolescence" mean the loss in value of a property (relative to the cost of replacing it with a property of equal utility) that stems from factors external to the property.
- 11. The words "Functional Obsolescence" mean the loss in value of a property resulting from changes in tastes, preferences, technical innovations, or market standards.
- 12. The words "Submitting to Commission" for reports or PRC cards means mailing paper copies or emailing digital PDF or TIF files to localassistance@stc.mo.gov.
- 13. The words "Index Study" are synonymous with "Manual Level Study."

A RESOLUTION approving the issuance of a County mask mandate order for the health and safety of its citizens effective until January 12, 2022, or thirty days after the adoption of this Resolution, whichever is later.

RESOLUTION NO. 20844, December 13, 2021

INTRODUCED BY Scott Burnett and Crystal Williams, County Legislator

WHEREAS, Executive Order 21-09 issued by the Missouri Governor on August 27, 2021, continues for certain purposes the previously declared State of Emergency to Assist Continued COVID-19 Recovery established in Executive Order 20-02; and,

WHEREAS, in response to the increased health risk posed to Jackson County citizens evidenced by the Report Supporting Order for Mask Wearing in Public Places provided by the Jackson County Health Department pursuant to section 67.625, RSMo, the County Executive and the County's Emergency Management Coordinator will issue a mask mandate (hereinafter "Health Order") on December 13, 2021, which will be effective upon approval of the Legislature, via adoption of this Resolution, which Health Order will expire on January 12, 2022, or thirty days after the adoption of this Resolution, whichever is later; and,

WHEREAS, a copy of this Health Order is attached; and,

WHEREAS, the Health Order encourages vaccination and requires individuals five years of age and older to wear a face covering or mask in places of public accommodation; and,

WHEREAS, COVID-19 spreads among people who are in contact with one another or present in shared spaces and a gathering of individuals without necessary mitigation for the spread of infection will pose a risk of the spread of infectious disease; and

WHEREAS, the state of Missouri is experiencing another wave of new COVID-19 cases, fueled by low rates of full vaccination (currently 51.7% of residents), the spread of more pervasive and virulent strain variants (the Delta and Omicron Variants), and COVID-19 hot spots across northern Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, area hospitals, including Children's Mercy Hospital, serving the citizens of Jackson County are experiencing high levels of COVID-related admissions, placing them at or near capacity limits, suggesting the Delta and Omicron variants' transmission and infection rates in adolescents and children are more severe than previously anticipated; and,

WHEREAS, as of December 9, 2021, the Jackson County Health Department reported 43,423 total cases of COVID-19 and 554 COVID-19-related deaths in Eastern Jackson County (the area outside of Kansas City, Missouri, and Independence, Missouri); and,

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2021, the Jackson County Health Department reported approximately 51% of Eastern Jackson County residents were fully vaccinated for COVID-19 and that 58% have been administered at least one vaccine dose; and,

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration fully approved Comirnaty, also known as the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, for prevention of COVID-19 disease in individuals sixteen (16) years of age and older, with additional vaccine and booster options available under a prior emergency use authorization; and,

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued emergency use authorization for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for individuals five (5) years of age and up; and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2021, the Food and Drug Administration and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention expanded the emergency use authorization eligibility for both the Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine booster for individuals eighteen (18) years of age and older after the completion of primary vaccination protocols; and

WHEREAS, compelling data demonstrates that community mask wearing is an effective nonpharmacologic intervention to reduce the spread of COVID-19 infection, especially as source control to prevent spread from infected persons, and also as protection to reduce wearers' exposure to infection; and,

WHEREAS, on November 30, 2021, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued new guidance, recommending all vaccinated individuals (in addition to its previous

recommendation for unvaccinated individuals) in "substantial" or "high" transmission areas wear masks indoors; and,

WHEREAS, as of December 9, 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention classifies Jackson County, and every county adjacent to Jackson County in both Missouri and Kansas, as high transmission areas; and,

WHEREAS, medical professionals recommended a return to masks indoors in November 2021, based on the positivity rate for COVID-19 cases in Missouri and the increase in hospitalizations; and,

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2021, the Jackson County Health Department, pursuant to section 67.625, RSMo, submitted an updated report to the Legislature outlining the need for and recommending an extension of the mask mandate; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Health Order be and hereby is approved to be effective until January 12, 2022, or thirty days after the adoption of this Resolution, whichever is later.

SCHULTE DIRECTING ALL INDIVIDUALS LIVING IN, AND BUSINESSES OR ENTITIES OPERATING IN, JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, EXCEPT KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI, AND INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI, TO ADHERE TO THE PROVISIONS OUTLINED BELOW.

DATE OF ORDER: December 9, 2021

Please read this Order carefully. Pursuant to §192.300 R.S.Mo. and §192.320 R.S.Mo., violation of or failure to comply with this Order is a class A misdemeanor punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. Pursuant to sections 4001 and 4052, Jackson County Code, 1984, violation of or failure to comply with this order is also a county ordinance violation, punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both.

UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED INDIVIDUALLY AND COLLECTIVELY BY THE RELEVANT PROVISIONS OF THE MISSOURI STATE CONSTITUTION AND STATUTES, AS WELL AS BY RELEVANT PROVISIONS OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER OF JACKSON COUNTY AND COUNTY CODE PROVISIONS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO: THE JACKSON COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 40, THE JACKSON COUNTY EXECUTIVE, AND JACKSON COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR DO HEREBY ORDER:

- 1. This Order imposes restrictions in Jackson County, excluding the corporate limits of the cities of Kansas City, Missouri, and Independence, Missouri, due to the following:
 - On March 12, 2020, a proclamation of a state of emergency was issued to allow Jackson County, Missouri, to take measures to reduce the possibility of exposure to COVID-19 and promote the health of Jackson County residents; and
 - On March 26, 2021, the Governor of the State of Missouri issued Executive Order 21-07 authorizing the Jackson County Executive to, among other things, issue orders protecting Jackson County residents from the contraction and spread of COVID-19; and
 - on August 6, 2021, the Jackson County, Missouri Executive Frank White, Jr. issued an Order mandating masks be worn in places of public accommodation, subject to certain exceptions, for Jackson County, Missouri, excluding Kansas City, Missouri, and Independence, Missouri; and
 - On August 27, 2021, the Governor of Missouri issued Executive Order 21-09 terminating the State of Emergency declared in Executive Order 20-02; and
 - On November 13, 2021, the Jackson County, Missouri Legislature terminated the August 6, 2021 Executive Order; and

- COVID-19 spreads between people who are in contact with one another or present in shared spaces, and a gathering of individuals without necessary mitigation for the spread of infection will pose a risk of the spread of infectious disease; and
- Missouri is experiencing another wave of new COVID-19 cases, fueled by low rates
 of full vaccination (51.7% as of December 7, 2021), the spread of new strains of
 COVID-19 variants (the Delta and Omicron variant), and hot spots across northern
 Missouri; and
- On December 9, 2021, there were 43,423 total cases and 554 deaths of COVID-19 in Jackson County, Missouri. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) confirmed 49,198,746 total cases and 787,064 deaths nation-wide; and
- In early December 2021, the CDC reported approximately 51.8% of all Jackson County residents were fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and 63.1% have received one vaccine dose; and
- The number of COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and Intensive Care Unit Admissions in Jackson County has increased steadily since early November 2021, with the weekly average for new COVID-19 cases returning to August 2021 levels, and local hospitals are at or near patient-capacity; and
- As of December 9, 2021, the CDC published behavioral guidance that included advising everyone 5 years of age or older be vaccinated against COVID-19, COVID-19 vaccines are effective at helping protect against severe disease and death from the COVID-19 virus and its variants, and even individuals that are fully vaccinated should wear masks indoors in public if they are in an area of "high" or "substantial" transmission; and
- As of December 9, 2021, the CDC classified Jackson County, Missouri, as well as every county adjacent to Jackson County in Missouri and Kansas, as high transmission areas; and
- In November 2021, the CDC published guidance for the return to in-person learning for the K-12 setting, emphasizing the circulation of the highly contagious variants of COVID-19 viruses necessitating universal masking by all students (age 2 or older), staff, teachers, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status; and
- Regional health guidance from chief medical officers in the Jackson County area recommended a return to masks indoors in December 2021 due to the increase in hospitalizations and concerns about future capacity in all age groups of the population; and

Thus, as of the effective date and time of this Order set forth below, <u>December 13, 2021</u>, all individuals, businesses, and government agencies in Jackson County, Missouri, excluding the portions of the County within the corporate limits of the cities of Kansas City, Missouri, and Independence, Missouri, are required to follow the provisions of this Order.

2. All persons are encouraged to be vaccinated for COVID-19. Vaccination prevents severe illness, hospitalizations, and deaths.

- 3. As used herein, the terms below shall have the following meanings:
 - a) A "face covering or mask" means a uniform piece of cloth, fabric or other material that securely covers a person's nose and mouth. It is properly worn when it remains affixed in place without the use of one's hands. A face covering or mask may be:
 - A sewn mask secured with ties or straps around the head or behind the ears; or
 - Multiple layers of fabric tied around the head; or
 - Made from a variety of materials, such as fleece, cotton, or linen; or
 - Factory-made or made from household items.
 - b) A "place of public accommodation" means any place or business offering or holding out to the general public goods, services, privileges, facilities, advantages or accommodations for the peace, comfort, health, welfare and safety of the general public. Public accommodation shall not include a private club or a place of public accommodation owned and operated on behalf of a religious corporation, association or society.
- 4. An individual in an indoor place of public accommodation must properly wear a face covering or mask. These spaces include, but are not limited to, grocery and retail stores, special events, and public transit, but do not include private dwellings or private transportation vehicles.
 - a) Exceptions to the face covering or mask requirement include the following:
 - Minors below the age of 5; and
 - Persons who have disabilities where face coverings or masks constitute a substantial impairment to their health and well-being based upon medical, behavioral or legal direction; and
 - Persons in a restaurant or tavern actively consuming food or drink; and
 - Persons obtaining a service involving the nose or face when temporary removal of the face covering or mask is necessary to perform the service; and
 - Persons who are alone in a separate room or office.

Places of public accommodation shall deny entry to and refuse to serve members of the public who refuse to wear face coverings or masks, unless a medical exemption applies or the individual is a child under the age of five. Places of public accommodation shall neither require the individual to produce medical documentation verifying a medical condition or disability, nor ask about the nature of a medical condition or disability and are encouraged to offer members of the public alternatives to in-person use of their premises.

- 5. Pursuant to §192.300 R.S.Mo. and §192.320 R.S.Mo., the Sheriff, all chiefs of police, Park Rangers in the County, and the Jackson County Environmental Health Department ensure compliance with and enforcement of this Order. The violation of any provision of this Order constitutes an imminent threat and menace to public health, constitutes a public nuisance, and is punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. All remedies prescribed by this Order or otherwise available under applicable law, shall be cumulative, and the use of one or more remedies by Jackson County shall not bar the use of any other remedy to enforce this Order.
- 6. This Order shall be effective on DECEMBER 13, 2021, and will continue to be in effect until it is extended, rescinded, superseded, amended or terminated by the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of R.S.Mo. § 67.265.
- 7. The County Legislature, through the Jackson County Health Department, will consistently monitor data regarding COVID-19 rates in Jackson County and reserves the right to further amend this Order in accordance with infection rates, CDC guidelines, and any other relevant information which indicates the necessity to increase restrictions, or which indicates cause to ease restrictions.
- 8. Copies of this Order shall promptly be: (1) made available outside the Jackson County Courthouses at 415 E. 12th St., Kansas City, MO 64106 (Downtown Location); (2) posted on the Jackson County Health Department website (www.jacohd.org); and (3) provided to any member of the public requesting a copy of this Order.
- 9. If any provision of this Order or its application to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Order, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of this Order are severable.

The Black Archives of Mid-America in Kansas City is working to create a documentary on the desegregation of golf courses and the effect that discrimination in the game had on Black folk. This is a project that we sincerely want to develop because this separation caused a deep chasm for Black sportsmen and businessmen, in particular, to cross.

The film will be centered in Jackson County, MO but will address discrimination in golf across the country. As our society has come to acknowledge, many business and other decisions are made on the golf course. Blacks were excluded from participating in this decision-making process as they were relegated to segregated courses or different tee times. This form of systemic racism extended into the mid-Twentieth century and beyond. For example, in 1950 in St. Louis, a judge ruled that Black golfers could play until noon, at which time a bell was rung signaling that they must leave. Well before the Modern Civil Rights Movement heralded by the lynching of Emmett Till in 1955, the Montgomery Bus Boycott and lunch-counter sit-ins, the Heart of America Golf Club in 1939 sued and won the right to play public courses. Now, this decision did not mean that the local courses happily opened their gates for Black golfers.

This documentary will lay out the history of golf's reception for the Black community in honest, and fair ways. In addition to its discriminatory past, we will focus on the present and future for People of Color to engage in the sport. By no means do we think that our work will negate the importance of golf courses as the places where business and civic leaders come to agreements that affect us all. We intend for this documentary to be foreword looking. We want our community to understand that they can pull this societal sector outside of the world of systemic racism to be inclusionary.

Golf is self-exclusionary in one sense because it is costly. Many urban people, especially young ones, just cannot afford the costs for lessons, green fees and equipment. In this documentary we will showcase how golf can be more inclusive by spotlighting local groups that assist young people learning the sport with coaching and monetary issues. Golf is character building, a disciplined sport. In the words of legendary golfer Tiger Woods, "No matter how good you get, you can always get better—and that's the exciting part." We also want to make the point that golf is not a "White" sport. Long before Tiger Woods Black people played golf. We want to enhance the legacy of legendary golfers like Charlie Luther Sifford (1922-2015), who lays out the condition of golf for Black people when he says, "I don't smile much, and I never laugh. If you'd been through what I've been through you wouldn't be smiling, either." We will explicate what he had been through.

Only in speaking the truth about systemic racism and racial injustices can we heal as a community and as a nation. We want to confront it, address it, and provide a means for healing the rifts in our communities.

I assure you that your largess and that of Jackson County will be acknowledged in all areas of the work. We appreciate your support with this project.

WHEREAS, Resolution 20500, dated September 21, 2020, authorized an addendum/extension to this contract, which had been subsequently assigned by Baum to its successor firm, Stifel, Nicolaus & Co., Inc., of Kansas City, MO (Stifel), to be effective as of September 28, 2020, and to remain in effect until September 11, 2021, unless further extended by the parties for an additional one-year term; and,

WHEREAS, in September 2021 the Director of Finance and Purchasing extended the contract for a renewal term to expire December 31, 2021, a term less than the full extension authorized by Resolution 20500; and,

WHEREAS, on December 9, 2021, the Director extended the contract again, until March 31, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the Legislature's meeting of December 6, 2021, included a presentation by Michael Short and Matt Webster (Stifel); Douglas Coe (Moody Reid) – Co-Financial Advisors regarding a refunding opportunity for the Series 2014 Special Obligation Refunding Bonds (Harry S. Truman Sports Complex Project); and,

WHEREAS, this presentation projected that a net savings of \$13 million upfront would result from the proposed refunding, which could only be used for improvements at the sports complex; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature expresses its support for the County proceeding with the proposed refunding of the Series 2014 Special Obligation Refunding Bonds (Harry S. Truman Sports Complex Project); and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the desire of the Legislature that the existing contract with Stifel be extended until September 11, 2022, consistent with Resolution 20105 and Resolution 20500, in order to conclude this transaction which is expected to close by the end of February 2022, and other potential transactions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, pursuant to the terms of the existing contract with Stifel, all fees associated with the proposed financing, and any other financing, will be paid at the completion of the sale of bonds, notes, or other securities issued on behalf of the County, out of the proceeds of the transaction.

Resolution 20105, dated March 11, 2019 awarded a twelve-month term and supply contract, with two twelve-month options to extend, for the furnishing of financial advisory services for use by the County to George K. Baum under terms and conditions of RFQ 66-18.

Resolution 20500, dated September 21, 2020 authorized an addendum to the Fiduciary Engagement Agreement with Stifel, Nicolaus & Co, Inc, of Kansas City, MO. The addendum was effective September 28, 2020 and shall remain in effect until September 11, 2021; unless further extended by the parties until September 11, 2022.

In September of 2021 the Director of Finance and Purchasing extended the contract for a renewal term of less than the year provided of September 11, 2022. The contract is now set to expire December 31, 2021.

The forty-seventh regular meeting of the Jackson County Legislature, Monday, December 6, 2021, included a presentation by Michael Short & Matt Webster (Stifel); Douglas Coe (Moody Reid) - Co-Financial Advisors to the County regarding the refunding opportunity of the Series 2014 Special Obligation Refunding Bonds (Harry S. Truman Sports Complex Project). The presentation of the refunding opportunity included a projected net savings of \$13 million upfront cash payment which would be limited to capital improvements at the Truman Sports Complex.

The County Legislature expresses support that Jackson County move forward with the opportunity for the Refunding of the Series 2014 Special Obligation Refunding Bonds (Harry S. Truman Sports Complex Project).
