IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

AN ORDINANCE amending the zoning districts established pursuant to the Unified Development Code by rezoning a certain 30.00± acre tract from District AG (Agricultural) to District RR (Residential Ranchette) and approving the preliminary plat "Fields of Peaceful Ridge," creating a six-lot residential subdivision.

ORDINANCE NO. 5627, June 13, 2022

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Zoning Order of Jackson County, Missouri, and the official maps which are a part thereof, are amended by changing the boundaries of the "AG" (Agricultural) and "RR" (Residential Ranchette) Districts, so that there will be transferred from District AG to District RR, a tract of land legally described as follows:

That part of the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 25, Township 47, North of the Base Line, Range 30 West of the Fifth Principal Meridian, Jackson County, Missouri, being described as follows: Commencing at the Southeast Corner of said Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter; thence South 88 degrees 09 minutes 07 seconds West along the South line of said Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter, 40.11 feet to the West right-of-way line of Bynum Road (Missouri Route E), and to the Point of Beginning of the land herein described; thence continuing South 88 degrees 09 minutes 07 seconds West, 1224.98 feet; thence North 02 degrees 07 minutes 55 seconds East, 668.98 feet; thence North 88 degrees 09 minutes 07 seconds East, 420.14 feet; thence North 02 degrees 21 minutes 34 seconds East, 670.64 feet to the North Line of said Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter; thence North 87 degrees 57 minutes 13 seconds East along said North Line, 807.72 feet to said West right-of-way line; thence South 02 degrees 21 minutes 34 seconds West along said right-of-way line, 1342.62 feet to the Point of Beginning. Containing 31.21 acres.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Preliminary Plat "Fields of Peaceful Ridge," creating a six-lot residential subdivision, is hereby approved.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Legislature, pursuant to the application of Steven E. Accurso (RZ-2022-626), requesting the amendment embodied in this Ordinance and with notice that the Jackson County Plan Commission voted 7 to 0 to recommend <u>APPROVAL</u> of this application after a public hearing on May 19, 2022, does hereby adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the Jackson County Charter authorizing the Legislature to exercise legislative power pertaining to planning and zoning.

Mr. Tarpley: Are there any questions for Randy?

Mr. Crawford: Any existing structures?

Mr. Diehl: No. It's being farmed currently.

Mr. Johnson: It's just pastureland right now.

Mr. Antey: Is the applicant here?

Karen Lux: 37904 E US 50 Highway, Lone Jack. I'm with Realty Executives and we represent the seller.

Mr. Tarpley: Do you have anything to add to the report?

Ms. Lux: We have met with MoDOT and they have approved the locations of the two driveways along Bynum Road. We also met with the water district as well.

Mr. Farrar: Have you had any contact with the neighbors regarding this?

Ms. Lux. Not directly. We have sold to some of the neighbors in the area. This is typical of what's in the area and it's not too far from the High School.

Mr. Farrar: Would you say this would be an enhancement to the area?

Ms. Lux: It would make an improvement to the area. We will have restrictions for nice homes. Noting that would de-value out there.

Mr. Tarpley: Is there anyone else who is in favor of this application?

There were none.

Mr. Tarpley: *Is there anyone who is opposed or has questions regarding this application?*

Doug Thomas: 35205 E. Hendricks Road. I live across the street. I would like to know way they are not rezoning the flag lot. And I have a concern with washout from the ditch. There is no proper drainage on that side of the road. All the drainage comes down to the structure, which doesn't function properly, as goes over the road.

Mr. Diehl: The tract in the northwest corner is 8 acres. It will have an additional 2 acres added to it. Since it will be at least 10 acres in size, it does not need to be rezoned. It will remain within District AG (Agricultural).

Mr. Thomas: I thought flag lots were not allowed.

Mr. Diehl: Flag lots under 10 acres are allowed in certain areas. Tracts over 10 acres are not subject to the subdivision regulations. We will not issue a building permit on this until it is a 10-acre tract.

Mr. Lake: Hendricks is a County Road. Does the ditch just need to be cleaned out?

Mr. Thomas: There are trees lining the road. It just doesn't function.

Mr. Diehl: We'll pass along your concern to the Road and Bridge Maintenance Division.

Mr. Farrar: Will the development increase the water?

Mr. Thomas: Yes. It will all flow over the road.

Mr. Tarpley: Actually, once lawns are established with grass, that will help impede the water flow across the lots. They hold more water than row crops.

Mr. Diehl: When driveway permits are applied for, we have the Engineering Department got out and look at each individual site. They will decide on whether a culvert with be required for each of those driveways. That will help alleviate the problem as well.

Mr. Crawford: I'm curious about the restrictions.

Ms. Lux: They are not totally defined yet. The develop will be single family homes, at least 1,700 square feet in size.

Mr. Diehl: The same applicant also developed the property at Hutt Road and 150 Highway.

<u>APPROVAL</u> of this application after a public hearing on May 19, 2022, does hereby adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the Jackson County Charter authorizing the Legislature to exercise legislative power pertaining to planning and zoning.

Evergy basically indicated the area they wanted to sell. We were looking for a location that would be conducive to response time on the South side of the 50 Highway corridor. This was moved up to the front burner when the Blackwell interchange was constructed and MoDOT made improvements and modifications along the highway. This had an impact on our response time to this area.

We have had residents in the around asking about the possibility of a station south of 50.

Trying to cross the Highway at a crossover, as many of you may know, is dangerous on 50 Highway.

We think this would be a good move for both the District and the residences in the southern part of the District.

We expect to be able to be able to build this station within a year or so. Once we finish with Station No. 3, we'll go to the voters with a bond issue. We plan this to be a 2-bay station with 2 trucks. There will be 5 staff members on each of the 3 shifts.

Mr. Lake: What is your role within the District?

Mr. Boinski: I'm on the board with the District.

Mr. Lake: Can you explain the effect a station will have on insurance.

Mr. Boinski: It will definitely have an effect on rates. The rates are based on risk. Having a station in the area will lower rates south of 50 due to the response time.

Mr. Lake: What about the volume of calls can all get.

Mr. Boinski: At the board meeting yesterday, the chief stated that 50 percent of our calls last month were EMS related. For the year that number would be about 60 percent. We've had 12 structure fires within the past four months.

Mr. Tarpley: How many residents are in the district or how big is the district?

Mr. Boinski: The District is 56 square miles.

Mr. Tarpley: Is there anyone else who is in favor of this application?

There were none.

Mr. Tarpley: *Is there anyone who is opposed or has questions regarding this application?*







MISSOURI HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION FEDERAL LANDS ACCESS PROGRAM PROGRAM AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (hereinafter, "Commission") and Jackson County (hereinafter, "County").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, a Project Memorandum of Agreement has been entered into by the Commission, Eastern Federal Lands Highway Division, and the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises and representations in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

- (1) <u>PURPOSE</u>: The United States Congress has authorized, in 23 U.S.C. 204, funds to be used for Federal Lands Access Program activities. The purpose of this Agreement is to grant the use of such Federal Lands Access Program funds to the County.
- (2) <u>LOCATION</u>: The Federal Lands Access Program funds which are the subject of this Agreement are for the project at the following location:

Renovation of roads at Blue Springs Lake near US Hwy 40 and Turkey Hollow Road.

The general location of the project is shown on attachment marked "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference.

(3) <u>REASONABLE PROGRESS POLICY</u>: The project as described in this agreement is subject to the reasonable progress policy set forth in the Local Public Agency (LPA) Manual [and the final deadline specified in Exhibit B attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. In the event, the LPA Manual and the final deadline

within Exhibit B conflict, the final deadline within Exhibit B controls]. If the project is within a Transportation Management Area that has a reasonable progress policy in place, the project is subject to that policy. If the project is withdrawn for not meeting reasonable progress, the County agrees to repay the Commission for any progress payments made to the County for the project and agrees that the Commission may deduct progress payments made to the County from future payments to the County. The County may not be eligible for future Federal Lands Access Program Funds if the County does not meet the reasonable progress policy.

(4) INDEMNIFICATION:

- (A) To the extent allowed or imposed by law, the County shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT or Department) employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the County's wrongful or negligent performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- (B) The County will require any contractor procured by the County to work under this Agreement:
- 1. To obtain a no cost permit from the Commission's district engineer prior to working on the Commission's right-of-way, which shall be signed by an authorized contractor representative (a permit from the Commission's district engineer will not be required for work outside of the Commission's right-of-way); and
- 2. To carry commercial general liability insurance and commercial automobile liability insurance from a company authorized to issue insurance in Missouri, and to name the Commission, and MoDOT and its employees, as additional named insureds in amounts sufficient to cover the sovereign immunity limits for Missouri public entities as calculated by the Missouri Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, and published annually in the Missouri Register pursuant to Section 537.610, RSMo. The County shall cause insurer to increase the insurance amounts in accordance with those published annually in the Missouri Register pursuant to Section 537.610, RSMo.
- (C) In no event shall the language of this Agreement constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation for either party's rights or defenses with regard to each party's applicable sovereign, governmental, or official immunities and protections as provided by federal and state constitution or law.
- (5) <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: Any change in this Agreement, whether by modification or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by the duly authorized representatives of the County and the Commission.
 - (6) <u>COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE</u>: The Commission's Kanas City District

Engineer is designated as the Commission's representative for the purpose of administering the provisions of this Agreement. The Commission's representative may designate by written notice other persons having the authority to act on behalf of the Commission in furtherance of the performance of this Agreement.

- (7) <u>NONDISCRIMINATION ASSURANCE</u>: With regard to work under this Agreement, the County agrees as follows:
- (A) <u>Civil Rights Statutes</u>: The County shall comply with all state and federal statutes relating to nondiscrimination, including but not limited to Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. §2000d and §2000e, *et seq.*), as well as any applicable titles of the "Americans with Disabilities Act" (42 U.S.C. §12101, *et seq.*). In addition, if the County is providing services or operating programs on behalf of the Department or the Commission, it shall comply with all applicable provisions of Title II of the "Americans with Disabilities Act".
- (B) <u>Administrative Rules</u>: The County shall comply with the administrative rules of the United States Department of Transportation relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the United States Department of Transportation (49 C.F.R. Part 21) which are herein incorporated by reference and made part of this Agreement.
- (C) <u>Nondiscrimination</u>: The County shall not discriminate on grounds of the race, color, religion, creed, sex, disability, national origin, age or ancestry of any individual in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment. The County shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by 49 C.F.R. §21.5, including employment practices.
- (D) <u>Solicitations for Subcontracts, Including Procurements of Material and Equipment</u>: These assurances concerning nondiscrimination also apply to subcontractors and suppliers of the County. These apply to all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the County for work to be performed under a subcontract including procurement of materials or equipment. Each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the County of the requirements of this Agreement relative to nondiscrimination on grounds of the race, color, religion, creed, sex, disability or national origin, age or ancestry of any individual.
- (E) <u>Information and Reports</u>: The County shall provide all information and reports required by this Agreement, or orders and instructions issued pursuant thereto, and will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Commission or the United States Department of Transportation to be necessary to ascertain compliance with other contracts, orders and instructions. Where any information required of the County is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the County shall so certify to the Commission or the United States Department of

Transportation as appropriate and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

- (F) <u>Sanctions for Noncompliance</u>: In the event the County fails to comply with the nondiscrimination provisions of this Agreement, the Commission shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the United States Department of Transportation may determine to be appropriate, including but not limited to:
- 1. Withholding of payments under this Agreement until the County complies; and/or
- 2. Cancellation, termination or suspension of this Agreement, in whole or in part, or both.
- (G) Incorporation of Provisions: The County shall include the provisions of paragraph (7) of this Agreement in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempted by the statutes, executive order, administrative rules or instructions issued by the Commission or the United States Department of Transportation. The County will take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Commission or the United States Department of Transportation may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance; provided that in the event the County becomes involved or is threatened with litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the County may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.
- (8) <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: The County shall not assign, transfer or delegate any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Commission.
- (9) <u>LAW OF MISSOURI TO GOVERN</u>: This Agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The County shall comply with all local, state and federal laws and regulations relating to the performance of this Agreement.
- (10) <u>CANCELLATION</u>: The Commission may cancel this Agreement at any time for a material breach of contractual obligations by providing the County with written notice of cancellation. Should the Commission exercise its right to cancel this Agreement for such reasons, cancellation will become effective upon the date specified in the notice of cancellation sent to the County.
- (11) ACCESS TO RECORDS: The County and its contractors must maintain all records relating to this Agreement, including but not limited to invoices, payrolls, etc. These records must be available at no charge to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Commission and/or their designees or representatives during the period of this Agreement and any extension, and for a period of three (3) years after the date on which the County receives reimbursement of their final invoice from the Commission.

- (12) <u>FEDERAL-AID PROVISIONS</u>: Because responsibility for the performance of all functions or work contemplated as part of this project is assumed by the County, and the County may elect to construct part of the improvement contemplated by this Agreement with its own forces, a copy of Section II and Section III, as contained in the United States Department of Transportation Form Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) 1273 "Required Contract Provisions, Federal-Aid Construction Contracts," is attached and made a part of this Agreement as Exhibit C. Wherever the term "the contractor" or words of similar import appear in these sections, the term "the County" is to be substituted. The County agrees to abide by and carry out the condition and obligations of "the contractor" as stated in Section II, Equal Opportunity, and Section III, Nonsegregated Facilities, as set out in Form FHWA 1273.
- (13) ACQUISITION OF RIGHT OF WAY: With respect to the acquisition of right of way necessary for the completion of the project, County shall acquire any additional necessary right of way required for this project and in doing so agrees that it will comply with all applicable federal laws, rules and regulations, including 42 U.S.C. 4601-4655, the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Act, as amended and any regulations promulgated in connection with the Act. However, upon written request by the County and written acceptance by the Commission, the Commission shall acquire right of way for the County. Upon approval of all agreements, plans and specifications by the Commission and by the FHWA, the Commission will file copies of said plans in the office of the County clerk: and proceed to acquire by negotiation and purchase or by condemnation any necessary right of way required for the construction of the improvement contemplated herein. All right of way acquired by negotiation and purchase will be acquired in the name of County, and the County will pay to grantors thereof the agreed upon purchase prices. All right of way acquired through condemnation proceedings will be acquired in the name of the State of Missouri and subsequently released to the County. The County shall pay into court all awards and final judgments in favor of any such condemnees. The County shall also reimburse the Commission for any expense incurred by the Commission in acquiring said right of way, including but not limited to the costs of surveying, appraisal, negotiation, condemnation, and relocation assistance benefits. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing the Commission shall have the final decision regarding the settlement amount in condemnation.
- (14) MAINTENANCE OF DEVELOPMENT: The County shall maintain the herein contemplated improvements without any cost or expense to the Commission. All maintenance by the County shall be done for the safety of the general public and the esthetics of the area. In addition, if any sidewalk or bike trails are constructed on the Commission's right-of-way pursuant to this Agreement, the County shall inspect and maintain the sidewalk or bike trails constructed by this project in a condition reasonably safe to the public and, to the extent allowed by law, shall indemnify and hold the Commission harmless from any claims arising from the construction and maintenance of said sidewalk or bike trails. If the County fails to maintain the herein contemplated improvements, the Commission or its representatives, at the Commission's sole discretion shall notify the County in writing of the County's failure to maintain the improvement. If the County continues to fail in maintaining the improvement, the

Commission may remove the herein contemplated improvement whether or not the improvement is located on the Commission's right of way. Any removal by the Commission shall be at the sole cost and expense of the County. Maintenance includes but is not limited to mowing and trimming between shrubs and other plantings that are part of the improvement.

- (15) <u>PLANS</u>: The County shall prepare preliminary and final plans and specifications for the herein improvements. The plans and specifications shall be submitted to the Commission for the Commission's review and approval. The Commission has the discretion to require changes to any plans and specification prior to any approval by the Commission.
- (16) <u>REIMBURSEMENT</u>: The cost of the contemplated improvements will be borne by the United States Government and by the County as follows:
- (A) Any federal funds for project activities shall only be available for reimbursement of eligible costs which have been incurred by County. Any costs incurred by County prior to authorization from FHWA and notification to proceed from the Commission are **not** reimbursable costs. The federal share for this project will be 80% (eighty percent) not to exceed \$760,000. The calculated federal share for seeking federal reimbursement of participating costs for the herein improvements will be determined by dividing the total federal funds applied to the project by the total participating costs. Any costs for the herein improvements which exceed any federal reimbursement or are not eligible for federal reimbursement shall be the sole responsibility of County. The Commission shall not be responsible for any costs associated with the herein improvement unless specifically identified in this Agreement or subsequent written amendments.
- (17) <u>PROGRESS PAYMENTS</u>: The County may request progress payments be made for the herein improvements as work progresses but not more than once every two weeks. Progress payments must be submitted monthly. The County shall repay any progress payments which involve ineligible costs.
- (18) PROMPT PAYMENTS: Progress invoices submitted to MoDOT for reimbursement more than thirty (30) calendar days after the date of the vendor invoice shall also include documentation that the vendor was paid in full for the work identified in the progress invoice. Examples of proof of payment may include a letter or e-mail from the vendor, lien waiver or copies of cancelled checks. Reimbursement will not be made on these submittals until proof of payment is provided. Progress invoices submitted to MoDOT for reimbursement within thirty (30) calendar days of the date on the vendor invoice will be processed for reimbursement without proof of payment to the vendor. If the County has not paid the vendor prior to receiving reimbursement, the County must pay the vendor within two (2) business days of receipt of funds from MoDOT.
 - (19) PERMITS: The County shall secure any necessary approvals or permits

from any federal or state agency as required for the completion of the herein improvements. If this improvement is on the right of way of the Commission, the County must secure a permit from the Commission prior to the start of any work on the right of way. The permits which may be required include, but are not limited to, environmental, architectural, historical or cultural requirements of federal or state law or regulation.

- (20) <u>INSPECTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND RECORDS:</u> The County shall assure that representatives of the Commission and FHWA shall have the privilege of inspecting and reviewing the work being done by the County's contractor and subcontractor on the herein project. The County shall also assure that its contractor, and all subcontractors, if any, maintain all books, documents, papers and other evidence pertaining to costs incurred in connection with the Federal Lands Access Program Agreement, and make such materials available at such contractor's office at all reasonable times at no charge during this Agreement period, and for three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Agreement, for inspection by the Commission, FHWA or any authorized representatives of the Federal Government and the State of Missouri, and copies shall be furnished, upon request, to authorized representatives of the Commission, State, FHWA, or other Federal agencies.
- (21) <u>CREDIT FOR DONATIONS OF FUNDS, MATERIALS, OR SERVICES</u>: A person may offer to donate funds, materials or services in connection with this project. Any donated funds, or the fair market value of any donated materials or services that are accepted and incorporated into this project shall be credited according to 23 U.S.C. §323.
- (22) <u>DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (DBE)</u>: The Commission will advise the County of any required goals for participation by disadvantaged business enterprises (DBEs) to be included in the County's proposal for the work to be performed. The County shall submit for Commission approval a DBE goal or plan. The County shall comply with the plan or goal that is approved by the Commission and all requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 26, as amended.
- (23) <u>VENUE</u>: It is agreed by the parties that any action at law, suit in equity, or other judicial proceeding to enforce or construe this Agreement, or regarding its alleged breach, shall be instituted only in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- (24) <u>NOTICE TO BIDDERS</u>: The County shall notify the prospective bidders that disadvantaged business enterprises shall be afforded full and affirmative opportunity to submit bids in response to the invitation and will not be discriminated against on grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin in consideration for an award.
- (25) <u>FINAL AUDIT</u>: The Commission may, in its sole discretion, perform a final audit of project costs. The United States Government shall reimburse the County, through the Commission, any monies due. The County shall refund any overpayments as determined by the final audit.

- (\$750,000) or more in a year in federal financial assistance it is required to have an independent annual audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200. A copy of the audit report shall be submitted to the Missouri Department of Transportation (hereinafter, "MoDOT") within the earlier of thirty (30) days after receipt of the auditor's report(s), or nine (9) months after the end of the audit period. Subject to the requirements of 2 CFR Part 200, if the Grantee expend(s) less than seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) in a year, the Grantee may be exempt from auditing requirements for that year, but records must be available for review or audit by applicable state and federal authorities.
- (27) <u>FEDERAL FUNDING ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSPARENCY ACT OF</u> <u>2006</u>: The County shall comply with all reporting requirements of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) of 2006, as amended. This Agreement is subject to the award terms within 2 C.F.R. Part 170.



COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT by and between **JACKSON COUNTY**, **MISSOURI**, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County, hereinafter referred to as "the County," and **THE INDEPENDENCE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE**, 210 West Truman Road, Independence, MO 64051, hereinafter referred to as "the Chamber."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Chamber desires to use the County's parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds for Santa-Cali-Gon Days; and,

WHEREAS, these events are open to all residents in the unincorporated areas of the County and those residents of the other cities in Jackson County, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, the parties agree to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Chamber respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

Services.

- a. Chamber shall be entitled to use the County's parking lot located at Kansas and Osage Streets in Independence, Missouri from Monday, August 29, 2022, through Wednesday, September 7, 2022.
- b. County Associates shall have permission to use the parking lots at the First Christian Church, located at 120 S. Pleasant, Independence, MO, beginning at 6 p.m. Monday, August 29, 2022, through 6 p.m. Friday, September 2, 2022.
- c. During the week of August 22, 2022, representatives from the County and

Chamber shall walk the parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds.

- d. The Chamber agrees to power wash the Historic Truman Courthouse steps, sidewalks, and retaining walls, using an environmentally friendly de-greaser/soap detergent before Monday, September 12, 2022.
- e. The Chamber agrees to return the parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds to the County in the as-good-as condition, as it existed before the event. Chamber shall be responsible for all clean-up and repair to parking lots and lawns as necessitated by their use. Said repairs shall be completed no later than Monday, September 12, 2022.
- 2. <u>Payment</u>. The use of the parking lot shall be granted to the Chamber free of charge as the events are of use and benefit to the citizens of Jackson County, Missouri.
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Chamber agrees that it or its agent will maintain liability insurance at its expense. This Certificate of Liability Insurance is to be issued by an insurance company, licensed to do business in the State of Missouri and acceptable to County. The certificate will provide for sixty (60) days advance notice in the event of termination or cancellation of coverage. Chamber shall provide proof of insurance prior to each event.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence August 1, 2022, and continue through September 30, 2022.
- 5. <u>Default</u>. If Chamber shall default in the performance or observation of any term or condition herein, the County shall give Chamber ten (10) days' written notice setting forth the default. If said default shall continue for ten (10) days after written notice thereof, the County may at its election terminate the contract. Said election shall not in any way limit the County's right to sue for breach of contract.

- 6. Remedies for Breach. Chamber agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the term, provisions and requirements of this Agreement, and Chamber's failure to do so shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and in such event, Chamber consents and agrees as follows:
- (1) The County may without prior notice to Chamber immediately terminate this Agreement; and,
- (2) The County may seek any available remedy and may collect from Chamber all cost incurred by the County as a result of said breach, including reasonable attorney's fees, costs and expenses.
- 7. <u>Severability</u>. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced, by reason of any rule of law or public policy, all other provisions and conditions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect, and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>. Chamber shall compensate County for any damage to County property due to any breach of contract or tortious conduct by Chamber or its agents, its officers, agents, employees, contractors or subcontractors on the County's premises. Chamber shall indemnify, save harmless and defend County from and against any and all liabilities, claims, penalties, forfeitures, suits, and the costs and expenses incident thereto (including costs of defense, settlement and reasonable attorney's fees), which it may hereafter incur, become responsible for or pay out, which was caused, in whole or in part, by Chamber's or its agents breach of any term or provision of this agreement, or any negligent act or omissions or willful act of Chamber, its officers, agents, employees,

contractors or subcontractors.

- 9. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Chamber warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

WHEREAS, on May 1, 1992, the County and Longview Horse Park Association ("the Association") entered into a Cooperation and Use Agreement, approved by the Jackson County Legislature by Ordinance 2089, dated April 13, 1992, whereunder the parties agreed to cooperate in the planning, development, improvement, operation, and use of an equestrian horse park center in the area of Longview Lake Park; and,

WHEREAS, subsequent addenda between the County and the Association have renewed this Agreement through the present; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of the Parks + Rec Department now recommends that the County and the Association enter into a revised Cooperative Agreement setting out the rights and responsibilities of each entity and extending the Agreement for an additional five years through December 31, 2027, at no cost to the County; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be, and hereby is authorized to enter into the attached Cooperative Agreement with Longview Horse Park Association.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between the LONGVIEW HORSE PARK Association and JACKSON COUNTY PARKS + REC

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is made and entered into this	13th	day of April
, 2022, by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI,	(County),	through its Parks + Rec
Department, and the Longview Horse Park Association, Inc. (Association), a	Missouri n	ot-for-profit corporation.

WHEREAS, the County has under its control various lands belonging to the US Army Corps of Engineers, under lease to the County, including park land known as the Longview Horse Park (Premises); where the parties agree 'to cooperate in the programing, operation, maintenance, and improvement of the Premises; and;

WHEREAS, the County and the Longview Horse Park Association previously entered into a cooperative agreement on January 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Association wish to renew this previous agreement and continue to work together through this new Memorandum for mutual public benefit for the programing, operation, maintenance, and improvement (Work) at the Premises described herein; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Jackson County Parks + Rec is authorized and empowered by the County to execute Memorandums of Understanding (Agreement) on behalf of the County;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants of the parties contained herein, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

Sec. 1. <u>Association Rights and Responsibilities</u>. Association shall be authorized to enter onto the Premises and shall perform the following duties and activities:

- A. Programming and Special Events.
 - Association shall be permitted to conduct equestrian events at the Premises. Association shall apply for and receive a Special Use Permit from the County for any event requesting exclusive use for any portion of the Premises. Association shall follow the guidelines set forth by the Parks + Rec Department for each special event.
 - Association may secure sponsors for special events at Premises. Sponsors shall be permitted to
 display appropriate advertising at Premises during special events. All advertising shall be
 removed at conclusion of each special event. Association shall not display any other signage or
 advertising on the Premises without express written permission of County.
 - Association may, with concurrence from County, cancel, postpone, delay, or terminate any scheduled user program or activity on the Premises in the event of severe weather, or other conditions in which the scheduled activity is reasonably likely to damage the Premises, trails or improvements.

- 4. Association shall provide general support for equestrian events and programs permitted by County. Duties shall include, but are not limited to, the following.
 - i. Opening and securing the office building and cook shack during events, and assigning and communicating lock code for doors.
 - ii. Managing the lighting system, including ensuring timely on/off for events approved by County for usage of the Show Arena lighting system.
 - iii. Event Facility Use Scheduling for Association Members Association shall be responsible for submitting proposed show dates for member organizations utilizing Premises for County-approved events by December 31st for the following calendar year.
- 5. Association is responsible for notifying County 30-days in advance, in writing, of any special conditions or grounds preparation that may be needed for an event, e.g. the need for vegetation to be mowed higher or lower than normal. (County will evaluate each request and notify the Association if it is able to accommodate the special request.)
- Association will sign up all volunteers working at the Premises with the Parks + Rec associate
 overseeing the volunteer program, and make sure all volunteer hours are reported, so that any
 injuries sustained by volunteers are eligible to be covered by liability insurance provided through
 the County's standard volunteer program.

B. Maintenance and Operations.

- 1. All areas managed by or under the control of the Association will be kept neat, clean and safe for participants and spectators.
 - i. All show and warm up arena surfaces shall be maintained by the Association. Association shall keep all surface areas free of ruts, holes, or depressions.
 - ii. All competition area features, including horse jumps and water hazards, shall be maintained by the Association. Association shall place and relocate all competition features as may be needed for each event; place and recover any signage/flagging/decoration on or around any feature, string trim (weed eat) vegetation around features, and maintain surface area around features, including repair of ruts, holes, or depressions.
 - iii. Cook shack and office building cleaning shall be the sole responsibility of the Association. Association shall assist County with extra cleaning and restocking of paper products in bathrooms during events, as may be needed.
 - iv. Association is responsible for any custom vegetation maintenance (e.g. mowing height) on trails courses utilized for events on the Premises.
 - v. Association will assist County with beautification of the grounds as Association is able to contribute, including maintenance, tree planting, or other special projects to improve the appearance of the Premises.
 - vi. Should Association need assistance from County for any special or additional cleaning or maintenance, Association must request such assistance at least 30-days in advance.
- Association will not utilize herbicides or other chemicals without prior written approval from the Parks
 + Rec Director. All chemicals, paints and flammable liquids utilized by the Association that are kept
 on site, must be stored in marked cabinets that meet USACE standards for the storage of such
 materials.
- 3. Association will train, supervise and insure, and is solely responsible for, the contractors, employees and volunteers utilized on the Premises. Association will comply with all federal, state and local requirements in connection with the performance of the Agreement, including the provisions of the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 ("OSHA") and to the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this Act.
- 4. Association acknowledges that all maintenance to be performed by the County under this Agreement is subject to budget, appropriation and ground and weather conditions.

- Association acknowledges that County mowing around competition area features, including jumps and hazards, will be done within a reasonable distance of the feature (e.g. within 12"), to avoid the potential for mower damage.
- 5. Association shall monitor Premises and report any needed repair or maintenance concern to County staff immediately, including the Longview Park Operations Supervisor (816.985.7404), Registration Office (816.503.4807).
 - i. For immediate safety concerns Association shall notify Park Ranger Dispatch (816.503.4890); for emergency response Association shall notify 911.
- 6. Any County equipment that is utilized by the Association will only be operated by registered employees or volunteers of the Association, with such list provided to County as a part of the Association's Annual Report. Any changes to the list during the year must be submitted in writing. Association shall ensure that all Equipment Operators are properly trained and qualified and will follow the County's Standard Operating Procedures for the equipment. County will provide a copy on each instance for the Operator.

C. Capital Improvements.

- Association may, at its sole expense, design and construct infrastructure improvements for recreational use by the public. Improvements may include new facilities such as buildings, barns, shelters, bridges, decks, fences, bleachers, and jumps or other competition area components, etc...
- 2. Prior to construction, Association shall provide to County a Design and Plan of Work, to the Director of Parks + Rec, describing and outlining all proposed improvements, for the Director's review and approval following the terms and conditions set forth in **Attachment B.** No Work may proceed until plans have been approved by the Director, in writing.
 - i. Upon completion of Work, Association shall maintain all improvements, unless otherwise agreed to by the County, in writing by both parties.
 - ii. Upon completion of Work, all improvements shall become property of the County, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by both parties.
 - iii. The requirements of Paragraph C-2 shall not apply to small projects that do not involve infrastructure construction or modifications, such as the placement of park benches, or other small volunteer or scout projects.

D. Annual Operations Report.

- 1. By January 31st of each year, Association shall provide a written Annual Operations Report to County summarizing activities on the Premises for the previous year, including the following.
 - i. Programs/events offered, and total public participation at all programs and events;
 - ii. Summary of all maintenance activities performed; summary of all chemicals applied during the year, and anticipated to be used during the coming year, including chemicals for vegetation control;
- iii. Summary of all volunteer projects and capital improvements completed, including costs, date of completion, and description of the project/improvement; summary of future anticipated programs and projects Association plans to offer/complete for the coming year;
- iv. Roster of all paid staff and volunteers employed by the Association, with their position titles and hours generally worked per week;
 - v. Total volunteer service hours performed during the year, and type of work completed by volunteers.

Sec. 2. <u>County Rights and Responsibilities</u>. County shall perform the following duties and services, subject to annual budget and appropriation.

A. Programming and Special Events.

- 1. The County will schedule all equestrian events and other programs at the horse park for a user fee to be collected by or turned over to the County, in accordance to Schedule 1, Chapter 50, Jackson County Code, 1984, related to park fees and charges. Preference and priority will be given to horse-related events. County shall notify Association at least fourteen (14) days in advance of any events for which a permit is issued by the County to any third party for the use of the equestrian facilities or trails or improvements upon the Premises.
- County reserves the right to access any portion of the Premises and address any issue that requires immediate attention, in the sole discretion of the County, without advance notification to Association.
- County may cancel, postpone, delay, or terminate any scheduled user program or activity on the Premises in the event of a health-related emergency, or in case of severe weather, or other conditions in which the scheduled activity is reasonably likely to damage the Premises, trails or improvements.

B. Maintenance and Operations.

- County shall be responsible for repairs to buildings and structures, excluding competition area features which are the responsibility of the Association. Examples for County responsibility include roofing and mechanical systems.
 - i. Bathrooms on Premises will be cleaned by County once on the day before events, and once each day during events. This includes stocking facilities with paper towels and toilet paper. Spare towels and toilet paper shall be stored in the office building for Association to use to restock during events as may be needed.
 - ii. County shall engage contractor to service and pump out septic on a regular basis during the season.
 - iii. County shall provide two portable toilets during the event season to supplement the flush toilet facilities. Any additional portable toilet units shall be provided and paid for by the Association.
 - iv. County shall provide for pest control services for cook shack, office building, and bathrooms.

County shall not be fiscally responsible for repairs needed due to non-County vehicle/personnel damage or misuse of facilities by attendees, vendors or show organizers. County will be reimbursed for all costs by those responsible for the damage. Association will make every effort to assist County in reimbursement of expenses.

- 2. County shall be responsible for basic grounds maintenance, including mowing.
 - Main event area mowing will be done to maintain 6" cut or less, subject to weather and ground conditions.
 - ii. Cross Country Course area mowing will be done to maintain 9" cut or less, subject to weather and ground conditions. The Association will string-trim vegetation around competition area features, such as jumps and water hazards.
 - iii. Carriage Course trails, as noted on Attachment A, will be mowed twice per season. Association is responsible for any custom mowing prior to an event requiring the Carriage trails.
 - iv. County will prune and remove major tree limbs and trees as necessary.
 - v. Trash containers will be emptied once daily, if needed. Anything left behind that is deemed hazardous waste, e.g. tires, oil, unmarked containers, will be disposed of at the expense of the Association.
- 3. County shall maintain roads and parking areas.

- 4. County shall be responsible for prepping horse stalls prior to events, cleaning out horse stalls following special events, and disposing of contents in the muck bin locations.
- 5. County shall provide and install signage on Premises. Any signage provided by Association must be reviewed and approved by County, prior to installation by Association.
- 6. County shall fill water jump hazards, between 6" and 8", per executed event agreements.
- 7. County shall provide and pay for reasonable utility services, including water, electric, and propane services.
- 8. Through its Park Ranger Division, County shall provide for routine security patrols of the Premises and respond to requests for park safety services as needed.

C. Capital Improvements.

County may, subject to budget and appropriation, design and construct new improvements for recreational use by the public on the Premises. County agrees to consult with Association for their input on any new improvements proposed by County.

- **Sec. 3.** <u>Title.</u> Title to the Premises shall at all times remain with the US Army Corps of Engineers. This Agreement conveys no property rights, grants no exclusive license, and in no way restricts the general public's privilege of using the Premises.
- **Sec. 4.** <u>Term.</u> Unless terminated by either party in conformity with the termination provisions contained herein, the term of this Agreement shall be five (5) years.

Sec. 5. Modification and Termination.

- A. This Agreement may be extended, modified or amended with the written consent of both parties. Verbal representations and extra-contractual writings shall not be construed or relied upon as modifications, amendments or waivers of any term of this Agreement.
- B. This Agreement may be terminated with a 90-day written notice by either party. In the event Association terminates this Agreement, Association agrees to remove any personal property from, the Premises, unless such removal requirement is waived in writing by the County.
- **Sec. 6.** <u>Indemnification</u>. Association agrees to indemnify and hold harmless County from any and all damage, loss, or liability of any kind whatsoever, occasioned by or because of any act or omission, negligence, or wrongdoing of Association or any of its agents, representatives, assignees, or employees in the execution of this Agreement, and Association, at its own cost and expense, will defend and protect County against any and all such claims and demands.
- Sec. 7. <u>Insurance</u>. Association shall procure and maintain in effect throughout the duration of this Agreement general liability insurance for any events with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 aggregate (both general and products-completed operations), written on an "occurrence" basis, for any claims, damages liability, losses, costs and expenses, court costs and reasonable attorney fees incurred by the County for enforcement of this section and for any accidents, injuries, including death, damage to property, or other claims arising as a result of or in connection with the performance by Association and its volunteers, employees, agents

or subcontractors, under this Agreement. Jackson County, Missouri shall be named as additional insured under such policy.

Regardless of any approval by County, it is the responsibility of Association to see the required insurance coverage is in force at all times; its failure to do so will not relieve it of any contractual obligation or responsibility. In the event of Association failure to assure the required insurance in effect, County may order Association to immediately stop all activities.

Sec. 8. <u>Notices.</u> All notices required by this Agreement shall be in writing sent by regular U.S. mail, postage prepaid, commercial overnight courier, electronically, or facsimile to the following. All notices mailed by regular U.S. mail are effective three (3) days after mailing.

- **Sec. 9.** <u>Assignability or Subcontracting</u>. Association shall not subcontract, assign or transfer any part or all of Associations' obligations under this Agreement without County's prior written approval. If Association shall subcontract, assign, or transfer any part of Association's interests or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written approval of County, it shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement.
- Sec. 10. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Association is an independent contractor with respect to all services performed under this Agreement. Association accepts full and exclusive liability for the payment of any and all premiums, contributions or taxes for workers' compensation, Social Security, unemployment benefits, or other employee benefits now or hereinafter imposed under any state or federal law which are measured by the wages, salaries or other remuneration paid to persons employed by Association on work performed under the terms of this Agreement. Association shall defend, indemnify and save harmless County from any claims or liability for such contributions or taxes. Nothing contained in this Agreement or any act of County, or Association, shall be deemed or construed to create any third-party beneficiary or principal and agent relationship with County. Association is not County's agent and Association has no authority to take any action or execute any documents on behalf of County.
- **Sec. 11.** <u>Meetings.</u> The Association shall hold quarterly board meetings and agrees to notify the **Director of** Parks + Rec, or their designated representative, of these regular meetings. The County will have a representative present at such meetings subject to scheduling and availability. All members of the Association, the general public, and community equestrian enthusiasts are welcome at these meetings.
- **Sec. 12.** Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed and governed in accordance with the law of the State of Missouri. Any action in regard to the Agreement or arising out of its terms and conditions must be instituted and litigated in the courts of the State of Missouri within Jackson County, Missouri, and in no other. The parties submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of the State of Missouri and waive venue.
- **Sec. 13.** Compliance with Laws. Association shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations, including Missouri Prevailing Wage laws, applicable to the Work. Association shall secure all occupational and professional licenses and permits from public or private sources necessary for the fulfillment of obligations under this Agreement. All references to "Code" shall mean County's Code of Ordinances, including any amendments thereto or recodification thereof.

- **Sec. 14.** Waiver. Waiver of any provisions of this Agreement or any breach of this Agreement shall not thereafter be deemed to be a consent by the waiving party to any further waiver, modification or breach by the other party, whether new or continuing, or of the same or any other covenant, condition or provision of this Agreement. Failure by one of the parties to this Agreement to assert its rights for any breach of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such rights.
- Sec. 15. Rights and Remedies Cumulative and Not Exclusive. All rights and remedies granted to County herein and any other rights and remedies which County may have at law and in equity are hereby declared to be cumulative and not exclusive, and the fact that County may have exercised any remedy without terminating this Agreement shall not impair County's rights thereafter to terminate or to exercise any other remedy herein granted or to which County may be otherwise entitled.
- **Sec. 16.** Merger. This Agreement, including any referenced Attachments, constitutes the entire agreement between County and Association with respect to this subject matter, and supersedes all prior agreements between County and Association, including Agreements entered into when Association was known by other names, with respect to this subject matter, and any such prior agreement shall be void and of no further force or effect as of the date of this Agreement.
- **Sec. 17.** <u>Severability of Provisions</u>. Except as specifically provided herein, all of the provisions of this Agreement shall be severable. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or unlawful, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall be valid unless the court finds the valid provisions of this Agreement are so essentially and inseparably connected with and so dependent upon the invalid provision(s) that it cannot be presumed that the parties to this Agreement could have included the valid provisions without the invalid provision(s); or unless the court finds that the valid provisions, standing alone, are incapable of being performed in accordance with the intentions of the parties.
- **Sec. 18.** Representations and Warranties. County and Association each certify that it has the power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement and to perform this Agreement in accordance with its terms.
- Sec. 19. <u>Condition Precedent.</u> This Agreement shall be subject to all of the terms and conditions of the Lease DACW41-1-85-280, between the United States of America and Jackson County. This Agreement may be terminated by the County without notice if the terms and conditions of the Lease are not followed by the Association.

ATTACHMENT B

SCOPE OF DUTIES AND SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY Association For Any Proposed CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS to PREMISIS

- 1. <u>Design/Work Plan</u>. Prior to construction, Association shall provide to County a Design and Plan of Work, to the Director of Parks + Rec, describing and outlining all proposed improvements, for the Director's review and approval. The Design and Work Plan shall:
 - A. Show all components and materials for construction of any new improvements such as buildings, barns, shelters, bridges, decking, fencing, jumps, bleachers, etc...
 - B. Comply with applicable local construction codes.
 - C. Minimize impact on natural areas to the extent feasible, and utilize best management practices to minimize tree removal, control storm water flow, and prevent erosion.
 - D. Provide a Missouri Professional Engineers signed and sealed drawings for any structural components.
 - E. For any projects proposed to utilize a combination of paid prevailing wage contractors and volunteer labor, provide a list of all volunteer workman proposed to be engaged in the construction of all improvements and the specific tasks they will perform. Any volunteer work shall be documented in accordance with the Missouri Prevailing Wage law, sections 290.210 et seq., RSMo.
 - F. For construction services to be performed by paid contractors or employees, provide a list of all workers and the specific tasks they perform. All paid contractors shall be compensated per Missouri Prevailing Wage laws and Jackson County Code Chapters 10 and 19 to the extent required under the law.
 - G. Provide an estimated anticipated schedule for all construction activities including when work will commence, when work will take place on Premises, and anticipated completion date(s).
 - H. Provide an estimated cost for all Work and funding source for implementation.
 - I. Association shall not commence any work on project until Design and Work Plan is approved in writing by County.

2. Construction.

- A. Using paid contractors and/or Association's volunteers, Association will construct the improvements in conformity with the Design and Work Plan as approved by the County.
- B. Association will provide all labor, tools, and materials necessary for the construction of related improvements, temporary signage and safety features, except as otherwise stated in this Agreement. Association is expressly authorized to employ volunteer labor on projects when such qualified volunteers are available to Association.
- C. Association will train, supervise and insure, and is solely responsible for the contractors, employees and/or volunteers utilized and their safety. Association will comply with all federal, state and local safety requirements in connection with the performance of the Agreement, including the provisions of the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 ("OSHA") and to the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this Act. All work conducted by and for Association shall be entirely at Association's own risk. Volunteer hours shall be reported to County.
- D. In the event excavation is conducted in connection with improvements, Association assumes the risk associated therewith, and will take all reasonable and necessary safety precautions, including but not limited to installation of protective coverings on or fencing around open and

unattended excavations. Coverings shall be sufficient to sustain the weight of any persons and/or objects placed upon them, fixed to the ground so they cannot be moved, have no opening(s) or protuberance(s) of sufficient size to cause a fall and/or injury, and be accompanied by advance warning devices as necessary. Fencing around open excavations shall be installed such that it surrounds the entire area under excavation so as to prevent entry by any persons, be a minimum of 42" in height and be constructed in such a manner that it is adequately secured and will remain upright at all times under normal site conditions. All protective coverings and/or fences on excavations shall be inspected at least daily to assure integrity. Protective coverings and/or fences in heavily trafficked areas shall be inspected more often as necessary. All excavations shall be restored to the level of the adjacent surfaces as soon as practicable. No excavations may be made in, upon, under, through or adjoining any area other than the Premises identified in Attachment A.


E. Association shall be responsible for and in charge of the site and the installation of the Work thereon from the time work on the site commences until final approval by County. If installation requires, Association shall notify all utilities, municipal departments, adjacent property management, and others affected by their operations and shall properly coordinate and expedite their work in such a manner as to cause the least amount of conflict and interference between their operation and those of any other contractor or agency. Notification shall be made sufficiently ahead of time to provide proper rerouting of traffic and erecting of signs before the work is to begin. Any and all damages or claims resulting from the improper or insufficient notification of the affected utility agency and others shall be the responsibility of Association.

Inspection of Installation and Materials.

- A. During installation of the Work, the County shall have the right to inspect the Work thereon to determine whether or not the Work is being installed in accordance with the County approved plans and policies. If, at any time during the progress of such installation, it is determined that such improvements are not being installed in accordance with the County approved plans, upon receipt of written notice thereof from County, Association shall make such alterations as may be required to cause such improvements to conform to the specifications.
- B. All material of whatever nature, required in the performance of the Work embraced in this Agreement, shall be furnished by Association and shall be subject to the inspection and/or test by County or its authorized representative before being placed in the Work. All rejected or unsuitable materials shall be removed at once from the site of the Work.
- C. As soon as practical after completion, the entire work will be examined thoroughly by the County. Association will be notified when the examination is to be made so that a representative may be present. If the inspection reveals any defective or unsatisfactory work, it shall be remedied by Association as County may require before final acceptance. The cost of all such repairs and replacements shall be borne by Association.

Capital Maintenance.

Following completion of construction, Association, unless otherwise agreed to in writing by County, shall maintain all improvements, including removing litter, trash, limbs, and other obstructions from improved areas. Association maintenance shall also include regular inspection, repair and replacement of infrastructure components as needed for the continuous and safe enjoyment of patrons.

Swope Ridge Geriatric Center was one of the thirty-six outside agencies awarded funding in the amount of \$100,000. In March of 2022 the county was notified by Swope Ridge Geriatric Center that their Board of Directors had decided to close the Care Center and would no longer be providing indigent healthcare services following the discharge of their last resident on February 25, 2022. In discussion with Swope Ridge Geriatric Center their contract for 2022 funds was reduced to reflect a contract period of 1/1/2022 to 3/31/2022 and \$25,000, both reflective of one-fourth of the total award of \$100,000. (email notification is attached)

This request will reallocate the remaining unused funds of \$75,000 from Swope Ridge Geriatric Center to Kansas City CARE Clinic dba KC CARE Health Center for \$50,055 and Kansas City Community Gardens for \$24,945. KANSAS CITY 2026 FIFA World Cup EFFORTS

BACKGROUND

On June 13, 2018, FIFA, soccer's world governing body, awarded the 2026 FIFA World Cup to the United Bid of Canada, Mexico and the United States. The 2026 tournament will consist of 48 nations who will play 80 matches from mid-June to mid-July in 16 cities in North America. It is anticipated that the US cities will each host between 5 and 7 matches.

Kansas City is one of seventeen US cities in contention to be named one of the US Host Cities. This final list is anticipated to be announced by end of Q2 / 2022.

The seventeen short-listed US Cities are:

- Atlanta
- Baltimore
- Boston
- Cincinnati
- Dallas
- Denver

- Houston
- Kansas City
- Los Angeles
- Miami
- Nashville
- New York/New Jersey

- Orlando
- Philadelphia
- San Francisco
- Seattle
- Washington, DC

Arrowhead Stadium will be the competition Venue.

NEXT STEPS

With the anticipated economic impact over \$500 million per Host City, the competition will be fierce to be named one of the ten US Host Cities. Work has begun to ensure that Kansas City has a head start on the selection process, with a depth of planning, preparation and inspirational thought, to distinguish ourselves as a leading candidate!

We are in the final phase of a multi-year bid process. Currently, final bid materials are due to FIFA, by December 31, 2021 and it is anticipated that additional deadlines related to the selection process will be conveyed in early 2022. Kansas City is working diligently to respond to all requests including final bid elements that will result in Kansas City being selected. There are many tasks that need to be accomplished to ensure our success when FIFA begins the final evaluation process.

KANSAS CITY EFFORTS

A formal Kansas City 2026 Host Committee has been organized, with 501 (c) (3) revenues collected to aid in any philanthropic effort. Separately, 501 (c) (6) efforts are dedicated to operational efforts in attracting World Cup games and ancillary events. As of October 2021 there is consideration in pursuing the option to incorporate a separate tax exempt LLC with name of KC2026 to house KC efforts Currently, the Host Committee is comprised of Trent Armbrust (Chief Strategy Officer, Kansas Department of Commerce); Doug Bach (County Administrator, Unified Government of Wyandotte Co/Kansas City, KS); Lynn Berling-Manuel (President, United Soccer Coaches); Dave Borchardt (Director, Kansas City Sports Commission); Aaron Borns (VP Marketing, Sporting KC); Caleb Clifford (Chief of Staff, Jackson County Executive); Tim Cowden (President & CEO, Kansas City Area Development Council); Katherine Fox (Director, KC2026 FIFA World Cup Bid); Kimiko

Gilmore (Assistant City Manager, KCMO); Shane Hackett (Executive Director, Heartland Soccer Association); Nathan Hermiston (SVP, Visit KC); Mike Kehoe (Lt. Governor, State of Missouri); Matt Kenny (VP, Arrowhead Operations & Events); Jonathan Knecht (SVP, Kansas City Area Development Council); Angie Long (Owner, KC Current); Chris Long (Owner, KC Current); Alfonso Navarro-Bernachi (Head Consul, Consulate of Mexico in Kansas City); Kathy Nelson (President & CEO, Kansas City Sports Commission); Yann Passet (Consultant, KC2026 FIFA World Cup Bid); Brian Platt (City Manager, KCMO); David Pruente (SVP, Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce); Joe Reardon (President & CEO, Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce); Jake Reid (President & CEO, Sporting KC); Morgan Said (Chief of Staff, KCMO Mayor's Office); David Toland (Lt. Governor, State of Kansas) Frank White (County Executive, Jackson County)

This group has placed a Bid Director (Katherine Fox) to carry out duties to secure KC as a host site. In the meantime, this group is meeting to carry out operational efforts to manage the bid process. Currently, a part-time Consultant works out of the Sports Commission offices to handle grass roots efforts.

SCOPE OF WORK

- **Develop a budget:** Develop, and keep updated, comprehensive budgets that include both revenue and expenses over the life of this project. Budgets will be shared amongst all funding organizations (Jackson County, KCK, KCMO, SKC, VisitKC called the Funders).
- **Establish LLC:** Engage 3rd party entities to provide guidance and assistance with respect to establishing a KC2026 LLC to be fully incorporated upon being named a host city.
- Human Rights: Develop comprehensive and meaningful engagement process with regional stakeholders
 to assess potential human rights-related risks and opportunities associated with hosting FIFA 2026 World
 Cup games in Kansas City.
- Arrowhead Stadium Field Modifications: The Arrowhead field must be widened to meet FIFA
 dimensions. Working with the Chiefs and a local sports architect, develop conceptual plans, schedules &
 cost estimates to advance the project to a point FIFA can have no concerns about this work.
- **Public Transportation Plan**: FIFA requires free public transportation to the Venue on Game Day. FIFA scored Kansas City lowest of all US cities in this category, however we believe the scoring was based on a Euro-Centric view of requiring permanent rail transport. We have developed and can easily implement an alternative to this philosophy, without building permanent t infrastructure, and still successfully achieve FIFA's goals. By working with the KCATA, local and industry experts, we will demonstrate our plan can efficiently and cost effectively transport our visitors, locals, and event staff between the City Center, MCI, Arrowhead Stadium and remote park & ride sites.
- Accommodations Inventory Analysis: FIFA ranked Kansas City lowest of all 17 US Cities in
 accommodation. However, Kansas City's hotel inventory is rapidly increasing, with several new projects
 announced since the bid was submitted, and with new projects announced almost every month. Working
 with Visit KC, the KCK CVB, and the City of KCMO, update and confirm all accommodation options
 including the newly registered units listed on sites such as Airbnb & VRBO.

- **Develop FIFA FAN FEST 2.0:** The FIFA Fan Fest (FFF) is a free, public viewing area open every day of the competition. It was first introduced at the 2006 FIFA World Cup in Germany and was a huge success. Each successive host country has repeated a very similar concept. Kansas City has the world's best sports architects and planners. Working with a diverse local team, develop an updated, next-generation version of the FFF as a way to demonstrate Kansas City's leadership and ability of contribute to the growth of the game world-wide.
- **Build Local and Regional Public Support:** FIFA and the United 2026 Organizing Committee needs to understand and feel the great enthusiasm our region has for soccer. A fast and simple petition process was launched immediately after June's FIFA selection of the United Bid. Work with the entire community and region to obtain at least 250,000 signatures prior to the Inspection Tour.
- Build Government and Civic Support: Although there is much excitement around the bid, there is also
 many questions. Prepare and execute a local government and civic campaign to inspire and educate our
 communities about the benefits of hosting and share ways to become involved in the efforts.
- Plan the Inspection Tour: FIFA and the United 2026 Organizing Committee can be expected to visit Kansas City to inspect our facilities and meet with our governmental, civic and soccer leadership prior to the final decision. This group works to lead the planning and execution of this tour.
- Host & Sellout Big Matches: Work with the Sports Commission, the Chiefs and Sporting to make Kansas City and Arrowhead competitive to host the large international competitions and the yearly summer exhibition matches at Arrowhead and then inspire the community to sell them out!
- **Fundraise:** Planning and implementing the above efforts will take money. In addition, there will be financial obligations the local host committee will have as part of being a Host City. Coordinate a wide-reaching fundraising campaign to cover the immediate costs as well as begin to contribute to the eventual hosting costs. These funds will be placed in a newly created, event acquisition account, restricted solely to World Cup efforts, account held by the Greater Kansas City Sports Commission (called the Fund).

SCHEDULE

This work began December 15, 2018. It is anticipated the final Host City announcement will be made by June 30, 2022. The original agreement was for a 12-month period spanning December 15, 2018 through December 14, 2019. At the conclusion of the original 12-month period, this agreement was extended (by approval from all funding organizations) to cover the period between December 15, 2019 through December 14, 2020. It was then extended for an additional year to cover the period between December 15, 2020 through December 14, 2021. This document serves as a FINAL extension to the agreement and will be in place from December 15, 2021 through the date upon which FIFA announces the Host Cities for the 2026 World Cup (anticipated to occur by June 30, 2022) at which point, if KC2026 is named a Host City, a new, independent agreement will be executed.

Working Arrangements

- A work-space has been provided by the Greater Kansas City Sports Commission (Commission) at 2600 Grand Blvd Suite 100. The Commission will provide an operating space which includes equipment and minimal office supplies as needed. The Commission will provide an email address @sportkc.org. Cloud based storage will be provided. All documents will be saved to this site so that others from the host committee will have access to these files. Access to other meeting spaces including conference rooms as needed will be provided.
- Any expenses incurred will be reimbursed from the above mentioned fund. If there are not sufficient
 funds in this account for reimbursement, reimbursement will be granted at such time that funds are
 available, or through a contribution directly from the Funders. Any reimbursable expenses must be
 approved in advance by the Sports Commission.

CONTRIBUTION OF MONIES TO RESTRICTED WORLD CUP FUND

- VisitKC \$1,000 payable monthly. Funds deposited in restricted World Cup account held at UMB by Kansas City Sports Commission.
