



Funding Period for Grant: The grant period is July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023

New or Existing Program/Continued Funding Opportunity: Existing program

Program Description:

Through funding provided in an amendment to the Juvenile Court Diversion Contract, the 16th Judicial Circuit of Missouri provides individual and family counseling to youth referred to the court and diverted from prosecution as well as youth adjudicated and placed on formal supervision.

We continued our collaboration with the following community organizations: AdHoc Group Against Crime; MOCSA; Truman Medical Center Behavioral Health; and Cornerstones of Care. These organizations offer a variety of services that benefit families. However, these existing programs do not reach all of our families or meet their specific needs for services. We proposed in this grant year to increase our provision of mental health services to youth by offering individual and family therapy provided by contract therapists. We referred and connected youth to mental health services in their communities that are sustainable following court involvement. Contract services for individual sessions allowed us to address acute needs and bridge the gap to these community-based services. We proposed serving 50-70 youth in this grant year.

During the last grant year, we signed contracts with six therapists. In order to meet the complex treatment needs of our youth and families, we have identified providers that possess diversity in a broad range of clinical skills and areas of expertise, as well as racial and cultural diversity and gender. At this time, we are working with three women and three men; four of these counselors are African American and two are Caucasian.

Additionally, we have contracted with Midtown Psychological Services, Inc., to provide psychological evaluations for assessment, treatment, and placement recommendations.

Theoretical or Practical Basis:

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), mental disorders among children are described as "serious changes in the way children typically learn, behave, or handle their emotions, causing distress and problems getting through the day. "Attention Deficit Disorder with Hyperactivity (ADHD), anxiety and depression are the most commonly diagnosed disorders in children. Depression and anxiety have increased over time². Mental health services are critical in addressing the needs of system-involved youth and families. A large study involving more than 70,000 youth from 283 programs across the nation indicated as many as 70% of youth involved in juvenile justice present with mental health challenges that rise to the level of diagnosis³. The social isolation and loss of structured activities and disrupted transitions during the global pandemic COVID-19 are exacerbating the challenges of mental health for youth⁴. Community mental health resources are sorely lacking for many segments of the population in Jackson County. Over the years, the number of adults in Missouri suffering from a mental illness has increased, according to Missouri's Division of Behavioral Health. In 2016, 862,000 Missourians struggled with a mental illness. Three years later, in 2019, that number was up to 925,000 and in 2020, it increased again to 1,056,000. According to the department, mental illness is higher among young adults. ⁵"

Even when counseling resources are available, families often struggle to follow-through with services. Families often face barriers in their efforts to access treatment services. In addition to overburdened providers, families face lack of transportation or on-line connectivity, limited financial resources for co-pay obligations and stigma associated with diagnoses and need for treatment services.

In order to meet this critical need in Jackson County, we requested funds in this grant to engage and directly pay providers. This plan streamlines access to care for youth and families referred to the Family Court.

Expected Impact:

We will provide an individual or family counselor to every youth on formal supervision and youth involved in the Emerging Adult Justice program that needs therapy. We anticipate that this will lead to increased adjustment and attainment of goals as youth move through the system. This will support our efforts to maintain low recidivism and increase the number of youth re-engaging in prosocial, educational and vocational activities.

Evaluation Plan and/or Demonstrated Efficacy: All three programs will be evaluated on an ongoing basis by the Jackson County Court's Research and Development Department.

Request Summary

On July 21, 2022, pursuant to their contract, CBIZ distributed Requests for Proposal for basic life, AD&D, voluntary life, dependent life, and long-term disability (LTD) insurance to the major carriers on the market – Standard, Guardian, The Hartford, Lincoln Financial, MetLife, Mutual of Omaha, New York Life, Prudential, and VOYA. Bids were received from Standard, MetLife, and Hartford for both life and LTD; all others either quoted life only or declined to quote.

The Standard contract will continue to provide basic life, AD&D, voluntary life, and dependent life, extending the current rates through 2024 with a two-year rate guarantee. Standard also extended our current LTD plan, which is a mix of self-funded and fully insured programs. They offered rate reductions on the LTD buy-up options, which are also guaranteed for two years. The total premium costs for 2023 Standard Life and LTD plan types and rate options are as follows:

- -Basic Life Associate: \$0.05
- -Dependent Life Spouse & Child per Member: \$2.50
- -Basic AD&D: \$0.02

The Standard


For the 2023 plan year, CBIZ distributed a Request for Proposal for the Life and Disability programs to the market. We surveyed Guardian, The Hartford, Lincoln Financial, Metlife, Mutual of Omaha, New York Life, Prudental, and Voya. Given the plan's mix of self-funded Long Term Disability, fully-insured Long Term Disability, and fully-insured Life programs, the market was not able to replicate current plan design and funding structure, and on an apples-to-apples basis, we did not receive a competitive option from the market. However, this RFP process did garner an improved rate offering from Standard, with an extension of current rates through 2024. Accordingly, it is our recommendation to accept the Standard renewal offering, and evaluate current funding strategy in the future to potentially open up market acceptance by competing carriers.

SUMMARY

CBIZ is proud to have established a strong emerging relationship with Jackson County over the past 2 months, and feel the partnership will be very successful for years to come. We are glad to be able to deliver these RFP results and market offerings for 2023 for associates and the County. Further, we are looking forward to strategic discussion in the coming year about program enhancements and best-in-class practices to optimize the program Jackson County offers to associates and their families.

On July 18, 2022, pursuant to their contract, CBIZ distributed Requests for Proposal for employee group dental and vision insurance to the major carriers on the market – Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS), United Healthcare (UHC), Cigna, Aetna, Humana, Ameritas, Delta Dental, Guardian, EyeMed and VSP. For the dental insurance, bids were received from BCBS, Ameritas, and Cigna; for vision, bids were received from EyeMed, Ameritas, UHC, and VSP; all others declined to quote.

For PPO dental coverage, while BCBS offered proposed savings from the current rates with a rate cap for 2024, Ameritas offered greater savings at -11.9% for 2023, plus a two-year rate hold and a very comparable network to the current plan. The total premium costs for 2023 Ameritas Dental plan types and rate options are as follows (Associate Only/Associate +1/Family):

- PPO Base: \$18.56 / \$34.40 / \$61.88
- PPO Buy-Up: \$29.36 / \$57.88 / \$96.56

For DHMO dental coverage, we will remain with FCL Dental DHMO plan whose rates will continue unchanged. The total premium costs for 2023 FCL Dental plan types and rate options are as follows (Associate Only/Associate +1/Family):

-DHMO: \$8.76 / \$14.26 / \$22.00

For vision coverage, EyeMed offered a 4-year rate extension at no change from the current rates, but competitive bids were received from Ameritas and UHC. Ameritas showed the greatest overall savings at -9.7% with a 4-year rate guarantee and the unique option of offering both EyeMed and VSP networks to associates. This means during open enrollment, associates will have a choice between which network they prefer, but with no difference in rates or plan design. The total premium costs for 2023 Ameritas Vision plan types and rate options are as follows (Associate Only/Associate + Spouse/Associate + Children/Family):

2023 EMPLOYEE BENEFITS RENEWAL

DENTAL/VISION

Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas City/EyeMed

As part of the RFP process, CBIZ also distributed proposal requests for Dental and Vision coverage to the market – the above-mentioned medical carriers, plus Ameritas, Delta Dental, Guardian, and VSP. We received dental options from BlueKC as the incumbent, plus Ameritas and Cigna. For the Vision program, we received a proposal from EyeMed the incumbent, plus Ameritas, United Healthcare, and VSP. While BlueKC's dental proposal offered savings from current, plus a rate cap for 2024, both the Ameritas and Cigna offers showed greater savings for 2023 plus a 2-year rate hold. The Ameritas offer showed greater savings than Cigna, and a very compatible network to the current program. This does not represent any changes to the FCL Dental HMO program.

For Vision, EyeMed offered a 4-year rate extension at no change from current, but the market showed competitive offers from Ameritas and United Healthcare. The Ameritas offer showed the greatest overall savings, a 4-year rate guarantee, and the unique option of offering both the EyeMed and VSP networks to associates at the same time. This means that at Open Enrollment, associates would have the option to choose between the EyeMed network or the VSP network, with the same rates and same plan design. As the two largest vision networks in the country, these are the two most requested vision programs we encounter, and being able to offer both at the same time – at the associate's choice, is a unique opportunity that has resulted in very high member satisfaction in past implementations. Further, Ameritas is offering a \$10,000 implementation credit with their program.

Based on these offerings, it is our recommendation to accept the Ameritas offering for Dental and Vision for 2023.

SUMMARY

CBIZ is proud to have established a strong emerging relationship with Jackson County over the past 2 months, and feel the partnership will be very successful for years to come. We are glad to be able to deliver these RFP results and market offerings for 2023 for associates and the County. - 8. Inspection Sites
- 8.1 The Provider shall conduct sanitation inspections at all regulated child care facilities while in operation, including licensed and licensed exempt facilities, as designated by the Department.
- 9. Inspection Requirements
- 9.1 The Provider shall conduct annual, special circumstance, and re-inspection sanitation inspections as outlined in Section 6.0 Environmental Child Care, subsections: 6.2

- through 6.4, of the Environmental Health Operational Guidelines (EHOG), available at: http://health.mo.gov/atoz/ehog/index.php;
- 9.2 The Provider shall conduct special circumstance sanitation inspections as requested and/or approved by the Bureau of Environmental Health Services; and
- 9.3 The Provider shall upon request from the Department, conduct unannounced annual inspections at existing child care facilities prior to the due date set by the Department.
- 10. Inspection Reports
- 10.1 The Provider shall use the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-34-1 and BCC-34-2 for family child care home inspections;
- 10.2 The Provider shall use the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-35-1, BCC-35-2, and BCC-35-3 for inspections of licensed centers, group homes, and licensed exempt facilities;
- 10.3 The Provider shall use the appropriate Sanitation Inspection Report Form BCC-34 or BCC-35 for special circumstance sanitation inspections.
- 10.4 The Provider may obtain the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-34 and BCC-35 at: http://health.mo.gov/warehouse.
- 11. Re-inspections
- 11.1 The Provider shall conduct a re-inspection on existing child care facilities that do not meet all sanitation requirements at the time of their annual inspection;
- The Provider shall conduct one (1) scheduled re-inspection no more than thirty (30) calendar days after the inspection due date (specified by the Department on the request for the annual child care inspection form);
- 11.3 The Provider shall use the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-34-1 and BCC-34-2 for family child care home re-inspections; and
- 11.4 The Provider shall use the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-35-1, BCC-35-2, and BCC-35-3 for re-inspections of licensed centers, group homes, and licensed exempt facilities.
- 11.5 The Provider shall notify the Department's Bureau of Environmental Health Services within ten (10) working days after a child care facility does not conform to all sanitation requirements after one (1) re-inspection.
- 12. Inspector Qualifications

- 12.1 The Provider shall ensure all inspectors meet the requirements for an Environmental Public Health Specialist as defined by the Office of Administration, Division of Personnel's Uniform Classification and Pay Job Descriptions; and
- 12.2 The Provider shall ensure all inspectors have a minimum of six (6) months of field experience prior to beginning child care sanitation training.
- Qualifications and experience requirements can be found in Section 6.0 Environmental Child Care, subsections: 6.2 through 6.4, of the Environmental Health Operational Guidelines (EHOG), available at: http://health.mo.gov/atoz/ehog/index.php.
- 13. Inspector Training Requirements
- All inspectors shall complete initial child care sanitation training prior to conducting child care sanitation inspections. Trainings include, but are not limited to, distance learning, classroom, and in-field training. Trainings shall be conducted in accordance with Section 6.0 Environmental Child Care of the EHOG;
- All inspectors shall attend annual Environmental Child Care training provided by the Department;
- 13.2.1 Any inspector not attending annual Environmental Child Care training provided by the Department shall attend additional training with Department staff.
- 13.3 New inspectors or inspectors who have not participated in child care inspections for two (2) years shall conduct a minimum of six (6) joint sanitation inspections with Department staff or designee.
- 14. Approval of Inspections/Submission of Forms
- 14.1 For annual, re-inspection, and special circumstance inspections, the Provider shall submit the complete and legible Sanitation Inspection Report form for each child care facility within ten (10) working days following the date of inspection.
- 14.2 If the inspections and forms do not comply with the requirements set out in this Agreement, the Department will not approve the inspections for reimbursement.
- 14.3 The Provider shall remit all forms to the appropriate Regional Licensing Office:

Department of Health and Senior Services Attention: Section of Child Care Regulation

- 15. Reimbursement Requirements
- 15.1 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for inspectors attending annual Environmental Child Care training.

- 15.2 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for more than 140 annual inspection(s) if the Provider does not obtain prior written approval from the Bureau of Environmental Health Services, Department of Health and Senior Services via email to eccprogram.lphas@health.mo.gov.
- 15.3 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for any special circumstance inspection(s) if the Provider does not obtain prior written approval from the Bureau of Environmental Health Services, Department of Health and Senior Services via email to eccprogram.lphas@health.mo.gov.
- 15.4 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for training inspections in which the Department is the lead inspector.
- 15.5 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for any inspections if the Provider fails to submit the Sanitation Inspection Report Forms BCC-34 or BCC-35 by the deadline set out herein; or
- 15.5.1 If the Provider's Sanitation Inspection Report Forms (either BCC-34 or BCC-35) do not meet the criteria for approval by the Department set out in this Agreement.
- 15.6 Annual Inspections
- 15.6.1 The Department will reimburse the Provider at a fixed rate of \$120 for each annual inspection the Provider conducts within their home county.
- 15.7 Re-inspections
- 15.7.1 The Department will reimburse the Provider at a fixed rate of \$70 for one (1) reinspection the Provider conducts per child care facility within their home county.
- 15.8 Special Circumstance Inspections
- 15.8.1 The Department will reimburse the Provider at a fixed rate of \$30 per hour for each special circumstance inspection the Provider conducts within their home county as approved by the Bureau of Environmental Health Services.
- 15.9 Attempted Inspections
- 15.9.1 The Department will reimburse the Provider at a fixed rate of \$25 for responding to a request for an inspection and the facility is closed or otherwise unavailable to the inspector within their home county.
- 15.9.2 The Department will not reimburse the Provider for more than two (2) attempted inspections per child care facility without prior written approval from the Bureau of

Environmental Health Services, Department of Health and Senior Services via email to eccprogram.lphas@health.mo.gov.

- 16. Invoices
- 16.1 The Provider shall submit a monthly invoice for all inspections conducted and reported during each month. If nothing to bill, the Provider shall submit a zero invoice.
- 16.1.1 The Provider may not submit more than one (1) invoice per month or submit an invoice later than thirty (30) calendar days following the end of the month, unless the Provider obtained prior approval from the Department.
- 16.1.2 The Provider may submit its request for an exception to eccprogram.lphas@health.mo.gov.
- 16.1.3 The Provider shall submit the September invoice no later than October 10th.
- 16.1.4 The Provider shall submit all invoices to the Department on the standard DH-38 billing form and shall include both the agreement number and invoice number.
- 16.1.5 The Provider shall submit the complete and legible Reimbursement Request for Child Care Sanitation Inspection DC-38 and copies of the Request for Child Care Inspection and Sanitation Inspection Report BCC-34 or BCC-35.
- 16.1.6 The Provider shall submit the complete and legible Late Reimbursement Request DC-39 for inspections and special circumstance inspections not conducted by the inspection due date listed on the inspection request from the Department.
- 16.1.7 The Provider shall submit the complete and legible Late Reimbursement Request DC-39 for re-inspections not conducted within thirty (30) calendar days of the inspection due date listed on the inspection request from the Department.
- 16.1.8 If the Department denies a Provider's request for payment, the Department shall provide the Provider with written notice of the reason(s) for the denial.
- 16.1.9 The Department shall not reimburse the Provider based on any invoice that the Provider does not submit in accordance with the requirements set out in this Agreement.
- 16.1.10 The Department shall not reimburse the Provider for inspections conducted by an inspector who has not completed their initial child care sanitation training.
- 16.1.11 The Provider shall remit monthly invoices via <u>eccprogram.lphas@health.mo.gov</u>, fax (573-526-7377) or to:

17. **AMENDMENTS**

Any changes to this agreement shall be made only through execution of a written amendment signed and approved by an authorized signatory of each party.

18. **MONITORING**

- 18.1 The Department reserves the right to monitor the Contractor during the contract period to ensure financial and contractual compliance.
- 18.2 If the Department deems a Contractor to be high-risk, the Department may impose special conditions or restrictions on the Contractor, including but not limited to the following: withholding authority to proceed to the next phase of the project until the Department receives evidence of acceptable performance within a given contract period; requiring additional, more detailed financial reports or other documentation; additional project monitoring; requiring the Contractor to obtain technical or management assistance; or establishing additional prior approvals from the Department. The Department may impose special conditions or restrictions at the time of the contract award or at any time after the contract award. The Department will provide written notification to the Contractor prior to the effective date of the high-risk status.

19. **DOCUMENT RETENTION**

- 19.1 The Contractor shall retain all books, records, and other documents relevant to this contract for a period of three (3) years after final payment or the completion of an audit, whichever is later, or as otherwise designated by the federal funding agency and stated in the contract.
- 19.2 The Contractor shall allow authorized representatives of the Department, State, and Federal Government to inspect these records upon request.
- 19.3 If the Contractor is subject to any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action involving the records before the expiration of the three (3) year period, the Contractor shall retain the records until completion of the action and resolution of all issues which arise from it, or until the end of the regular three (3) year period, whichever is later.
- 19.4 If the Department is subject to any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit or other action involving the records, the Department will notify the Contractor in writing to extend the Contractor's retention period.

19.5 The Department may recover any payment it has made to the Contractor if the Contractor fails to retain adequate documentation.

20. **CONFIDENTIALITY**

- 20.1 The Contractor shall safeguard Protected Personally Identifiable Information (PII) as defined in 2 CFR § 200.1. The Contractor agrees it will assume liability for all disclosures of Protected PII and breaches by the Contractor and/or the Contractor's subcontractors and employees.
- 20.2 The Contractor shall maintain strict confidentiality of all patient and client information or records supplied to it by the Department or that the Contractor creates as a result of contract activities. Unless disclosure is required by law, the Contractor shall not disclose the contents of such records to anyone other than the Department, the patient/client, or the patient's/client's parent or legal guardian. The Contractor agrees it will assume liability for all disclosures of confidential information and breaches by the Contractor and/or the Contractor's subcontractors and employees. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable confidentiality and information security laws, including but not limited to sections 192.067 and 192.667, RSMo.

21. **LIABILITY**

- 21.1 The Contractor shall understand and agree that the Department cannot save and hold harmless and/or indemnify the Contractor or employees against any liability incurred or arising as a result of any activity of the Contractor or any activity of the Contractor's employees related to the Contractor's performance under the contract.
- 21.2 The relationship of the Contractor to the Department shall be that of an independent contractor. The Contractor shall have no authority to represent itself as an agent of the Department. Nothing in this contract is intended to, nor shall be construed in any manner as creating or establishing an agency relationship or the relationship of employer/employee between the parties. Therefore, the Contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, or any other applicable employee related obligation or expense, and shall assume all costs, attorney fees, losses, judgments, and legal or equitable imposed remedies associated with the matters outlined in this paragraph in regards to the Contractor's subcontractors, employees and agents. The Contractor shall have no authority to bind the Department for any obligation or expense not specifically stated in this contract. This provision is not intended to waive any claim of sovereign immunity to which a public entity would otherwise be entitled to under Missouri law.

21.3 The Contractor shall be responsible for all claims, actions, liability, and loss (including court costs and attorney's fees) for any and all injury or damage (including death) occurring as a result of the Contractor's performance or the performance of any subcontractor, involving any equipment used or service provided, under the terms and conditions of this contract or any subcontract, or any condition created thereby, or based upon any violation of any state or federal statute, ordinance, building code, or regulation by Contractor. However, the Contractor shall not be responsible for any injury or damage occurring as a result of any negligent act or omission committed by the Department, including its officers, employees, and assigns. This provision is not intended to waive any claim of sovereign immunity to which a public entity would otherwise be entitled to under Missouri law.

22. PUBLICATIONS, COPYRIGHTS, AND RIGHTS IN DATA AND REPORTS

- 22.1 If the Contractor issues any press releases mentioning contract activities, the Contractor shall reference in the release both the contract number and the Department. If the Contractor creates any publications, including audiovisual items, produced with contract funds, the Contractor shall give credit to both the contract and the Department in the publication. The Contractor shall obtain approval from the Department prior to the release of such press releases or publications.
- In accordance with the "Steven's Amendment" in the Department of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, the Contractor shall not issue any statements, press release, request for proposals, bid solicitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money unless it clearly states the following:
- 22.2.1 The percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money; and
- 22.2.2 The percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed by nongovernmental sources.
- 22.3 If the Contractor develops any copyrighted material as a result of this contract, the Department shall have a royalty-free, nonexclusive and irrevocable right to publish or use, and to authorize others to use, the work for Department purposes or the purpose of the State of Missouri.

23. **AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL**

23.1 The Contractor shall be responsible for assuring that all personnel are appropriately qualified and licensed or certified, as required by state, federal or local law, statute or

- regulation, respective to the services to be provided through this contract; and documentation of such licensure or certification shall be made available upon request.
- 23.2 The Contractor shall only utilize personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws. This includes but is not limited to the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 as codified at 8 U.S.C. § 1324a, the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) and Section 274A of the Immigration and Nationality Act. If the Contractor is found to be in violation of these requirements or the applicable laws of the state, federal and local laws and regulations, and if the State of Missouri has reasonable cause to believe that the Contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States, the state shall have the right to cancel the contract immediately without penalty or recourse and suspend or debar the Contractor from doing business with the state. The state may also withhold up to twenty-five percent of the total amount due to the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to fully cooperate with any audit or investigation from federal, state or local law enforcement agencies.
- Affidavit of Work Authorization and Documentation: Pursuant to section 285.530, RSMo, if the Contractor meets the section 285.525, RSMo definition of a "business entity" (https://revisor.mo.gov/main/OneSection.aspx?section=285.530), the Contractor must affirm the Contractor's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services requested herein. The Contractor should complete applicable portions of Exhibit 1, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization, as attached hereto and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein. The applicable portions of Exhibit 1 must be submitted prior to an award of a contract.
- If the Contractor meets the definition of a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo the Contractor shall maintain enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the contracted services included herein. If the Contractor's business status changes during the life of the contract to become a business entity as defined in section 285.525, RSMo pertaining to section 285.530, RSMo then the Contractor shall, prior to the performance of any services as a business entity under the contract:
- 23.4.1 Enroll and participate in the E-Verify federal work authorization program with respect to the employees hired after enrollment in the program who are proposed to work in connection with the services required herein; AND

- 23.4.2 Provide to the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services the documentation required in the exhibit titled, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization affirming said company's/individual's enrollment and participation in the E-Verify federal work authorization program; AND
- 23.4.3 Submit to the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services a completed, notarized Affidavit of Work Authorization provided in the exhibit titled, Business Entity Certification, Enrollment Documentation, and Affidavit of Work Authorization.
- In accordance with subsection 2 of section 285.530 RSMo, the Contractor should renew their Affidavit of Work Authorization annually. A valid Affidavit of Work Authorization is necessary to award any new contracts.

24. **TERMINATION**

- 24.1 The Department, in its sole discretion, may terminate the obligations of each party under this contract, in whole or in part, effective immediately upon providing written notification to the Contractor if:
- 24.1.1 State and/or federal funds are not appropriated, continued, or available at a sufficient level to fund this contract; or
- 24.1.2 A change in federal or state law relevant to this contract occurs; or
- 24.1.3 A material change of the parties to the contract occurs; or
- 24.1.4 By request of the Contractor.
- 24.2 Each party under this contract may terminate the contract, in whole or in part, at any time, for its convenience without penalty or recourse by providing the following written notice.
- 24.2.1 The Department will provide written notice to the Contractor at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the effective date of such termination.
- 24.2.2 The Contractor shall provide written notice to the Department at least sixty (60) calendar days prior to the effective date of such termination.

1. GENERAL

1.1 To the extent that this contract involves the use, in whole or in part, federal funds, the signature of the Contractor's authorized representative on the contract signature page indicates compliance with the following Certifications and special provisions.

2. CONTRACTOR'S CERTIFICATION REGARDING SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT

- 2.1 The Contractor certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this contract by any Federal department or agency pursuant to 2 CFR Part 180.
- 2.2 The Contractor shall include these certification requirements regarding debarment, suspension, ineligibility, and voluntary exclusion in all lower tier covered transactions.
- 2.3 If the Contractor enters into a covered transaction with another person at the next lower tier, the Contractor must verify that the person with whom it intends to do business is not excluded or disqualified by:
- 2.3.1 Checking the System of Award Management (SAM) https://www.sam.gov; or
- 2.3.2 Collecting a certification from that person; or
- 2.3.3 Adding a clause or condition to the covered transaction with that person.

3. CONTRACTOR'S CERTIFICATION REGARDING LOBBYING

3.1 The Contractor certifies that no Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Contractor, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

- 3.2 The Contractor certifies that no funds under this contract shall be used to pay for any activity to support or defeat the enactment of legislation before the Congress, or any State or local legislature or legislative body. The Contractor shall not use any funds under this contract to pay for any activity to support or defeat any proposed or pending regulation, administrative action, or order issued by the executive branch of any State or local government.
- 3.3 The Contractor certifies that no funds under this contract shall be used to pay the salary or expenses of the Contractor, or an agent acting for the Contractor who engages in any activity designed to influence the enactment of legislation or appropriations proposed or pending before the Congress, or any State, local legislature or legislative body, or any regulation, administrative action, or Executive Order issued by the executive branch of any State or local government.
- 3.4 The above prohibitions include any activity to advocate or promote any proposed, pending or future Federal, State or local tax increase, or any proposed, pending or future requirement or restriction on any legal consumer product, including its sale or marketing, including but not limited to the advocacy or promotion of gun control.
- 3.5 If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the Contractor shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying" in accordance with its instructions.
- 3.6 The Contractor shall require that the language of this section be included in the award documents for all subawards at all levels (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- 3.7 This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

4. CONTRACTOR'S CERTIFICATION REGARDING A DRUG FREE WORKPLACE

4.1 The Contractor certifies it shall provide a drug free workplace in accordance with the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1988, 41 U.S.C. Chapter 81, and all applicable regulations. - 6.1.5 The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101-6107) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of age;
- 6.1.6 Equal Employment Opportunity E.O. 11246, as amended;
- 6.1.7 Missouri State Regulation, 19 CSR 10-2.010, Civil Rights Compliance Requirements;
- 6.1.8 Missouri Governor's E.O. #05-30 (excluding paragraph 1, which was superseded by E.O. #10-24);
- 6.1.9 Missouri Governor's E.O. #10-24; and

6.1.10 The requirements of any other nondiscrimination federal and state statutes, regulations and executive orders which may apply to the services provided via the contract.

7. CONTRACTOR'S CERTIFICATION REGARDING EMPLOYEE WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTIONS

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained herein. Any change must be accomplished by a formal signed amendment prior to the effective date of such change.

1. APPLICABLE LAWS AND REGULATIONS

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri (state). The contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract to the extent that the same may be applicable.
- b. To the extent that a provision of the contract is contrary to the Constitution or laws of the State of Missouri or of the United States, the provisions shall be void and unenforceable. However, the balance of the contract shall remain in force between the parties unless terminated by consent of both the contractor and the state.
- c. The contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations.
- d. The contractor must timely file and pay all Missouri sales, withholding, corporate and any other required Missouri tax returns and taxes, including interest and additions to tax.
- e. The exclusive venue for any legal proceeding relating to or arising out of the contract shall be in the Circuit Court of Cole County, Missouri.
- f. The contractor shall only employ personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws and Executive Order 07-13 for work performed in the United States.

2. INVOICING AND PAYMENT

- a. The State of Missouri does not pay state or federal taxes unless otherwise required under law or regulation. Prices shall include all packing, handling and shipping charges FOB destination, freight prepaid and allowed unless otherwise specified herein.
- b. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. For each purchase order received, an invoice must be submitted that references the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. The contractor shall not transfer any interest in the contract, whether by assignment or otherwise, without the prior written consent of the state.
- d. Payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears unless otherwise indicated in the specific contract terms.
- e. The State of Missouri assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any unauthorized quantity is subject to the state's rejection and shall be returned at the contractor's expense.
- f. All invoices for equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased by the State of Missouri shall be subject to late payment charges as provided in section 34.055, RSMo.
- g. The State of Missouri reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state purchasing card.

3. DELIVERY

Time is of the essence. Deliveries of equipment, supplies, and/or services must be made no later than the time stated in the contract or within a reasonable period of time, if a specific time is not stated.

4. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by an agency of the state pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until the agency has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective may be rejected. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective or which do not conform to any warranty of the contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection) may be rejected.
- c. The State of Missouri reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The State of Missouri's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the state may have.

5. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Elected or appointed officials or employees of the State of Missouri or any political subdivision thereof, serving in an executive or administrative capacity, must comply with sections 105.452 and 105.454, RSMo, regarding conflict of interest.

6. WARRANTY

The contractor expressly warrants that all equipment, supplies, and/or services provided shall: (1) conform to each and every specification, drawing, sample or other description which was furnished to or adopted by the state, (2) be fit and sufficient for the purpose intended, (3) be merchantable, (4) be of good materials and workmanship, and (5) be free from defect. Such warranty shall survive delivery and shall not be deemed waived either by reason of the state's acceptance of or payment for said equipment, supplies, and/or services.

7. REMEDIES AND RIGHTS

- a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the State of Missouri of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the State of Missouri of the contractor's default or breach of contract.
- b. The contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the contractor to the State of Missouri of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or the State of Missouri for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or procured by the contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the State of Missouri.

8. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT

- a. In the event of material breach of the contractual obligations by the contractor, the state may cancel the contract. At its sole discretion, the state may give the contractor an opportunity to cure the breach or to explain how the breach will be cured. The actual cure must be completed within no more than 10 working days from notification, or at a minimum the contractor must provide the state within 10 working days from notification a written plan detailing how the contractor intends to cure the breach.
- b. If the contractor fails to cure the breach or if circumstances demand immediate action, the state will issue a notice of cancellation terminating the contract immediately. If it is determined the state improperly cancelled the contract, such cancellation shall be deemed a termination for convenience in accordance with the contract.
- c. If the state cancels the contract for breach, the state reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the state deems appropriate and charge the contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.
- d. The contractor understands and agrees that funds required to fund the contract must be appropriated by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri for each fiscal year included within the contract period. The contract shall not be binding upon the state for any period in which funds have not been appropriated, and the state shall not be liable for any costs associated with termination caused by lack of appropriations.

9. BANKRUPTCY OR INSOLVENCY

Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assignee for the benefit of creditors, the contractor must notify the state immediately. Upon learning of any such actions, the state reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the contractor responsible for damages.

10. INVENTIONS, PATENTS AND COPYRIGHTS

The contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the State of Missouri, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract.

11. NON-DISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

In connection with the furnishing of equipment, supplies, and/or services under the contract, the contractor and all subcontractors shall agree not to discriminate against recipients of services or employees or applicants for employment on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, disability, or veteran status unless otherwise provided by law. If the contractor or subcontractor employs at least 50 persons, they shall have and maintain an affirmative action program which shall include:

- a. A written policy statement committing the organization to affirmative action and assigning management responsibilities and procedures for evaluation and dissemination:
- b. The identification of a person designated to handle affirmative action;
- c. The establishment of non-discriminatory selection standards, objective measures to analyze recruitment, an upward mobility system, a wage and salary structure, and standards applicable to layoff, recall, discharge, demotion, and discipline;
- d. The exclusion of discrimination from all collective bargaining agreements; and
- e. Performance of an internal audit of the reporting system to monitor execution and to provide for future planning.

If discrimination by a contractor is found to exist, the state shall take appropriate enforcement action which may include, but not necessarily be limited to, cancellation of the contract, suspension, or debarment by the state until corrective action by the contractor is made and ensured, and referral to the Attorney General's Office, whichever enforcement action may be deemed most appropriate.

12. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

In connection with the furnishing of equipment, supplies, and/or services under the contract, the contractor and all subcontractors shall comply with all applicable requirements and provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

13. FILING AND PAYMENT OF TAXES

The commissioner of administration and other agencies to which the state purchasing law applies shall not contract for goods or services with a vendor if the vendor or an affiliate of the vendor makes sales at retail of tangible personal property or for the purpose of storage, use, or consumption in this state but fails to collect and properly pay the tax as provided in chapter 144, RSMo. For the purposes of this section, "affiliate of the vendor" shall mean any person or entity that is controlled by or is under common control with the vendor, whether through stock ownership or otherwise.

14. COMMUNICATIONS AND NOTICES

Any notice to the contractor shall be deemed sufficient when deposited in the United States mail postage prepaid, transmitted by facsimile, transmitted by e-mail or hand-carried and presented to an authorized employee of the contractor.


