### Requirements


- Must be a nonprofit organization registered with the State of Missouri.
- Must be on the Jackson County tax roles--proof of paid/exempt County taxes will be required.
- Agency must be in existence for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Agency and program must be located within Jackson County.
- Must serve Jackson County residents.
- Must not be associated with any personal interest of a member of the Jackson County Legislature or County staff that may be deemed a violation of the ethics policy.

## Requirements-continued

- Must obtain a 2023 Jackson County Certificate of Compliance.
- Currently funded agencies must be in compliance with our Finance Department before applying.
- Jackson County <u>cannot</u> be the sole funder for any program nor provide more than 50% of an organization's revenue--organization must show other sources of funding, governmental or otherwise.
- Funding requests are for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2023. The activities or services for which funds are requested must occur in this timeframe.

### Requirements-continued



- Funding cannot be used for events.
- Funding is for the purposes of providing a program or service to Jackson County. Said funds are not designated for capital purchases, equipment or hardware of any kind such as vehicles, computers, laptops or televisions.
- Payment will be made on a quarterly reimbursement basis only after proper documentation and proof of payment are received.

Dear Ms. Bolling,

As advised, we are unable to appear in person at the rescheduled hearing on the above-referenced matter because our annual fundraising Trial College – a three-day conference – is scheduled to commence on May 4, 2023, and end on May 6, 2023. We respectfully ask that the following written answers be considered during the Hearing in lieu of an oral presentation.

1. Service Area: What is your program service area by census tract?

The Clinic remains the sole nonprofit entity located in Jackson County providing low fee and pro bono legal services to noncitizens appearing before the Executive Office of Immigration Review (i.e. the immigration court). In addition, The Clinic conducts regular educational and engagement activities with residents of Jackson County to cultivate better awareness of the processes and plights of non-citizens. This work helps to foster a more diverse and inclusive environment, thus creating a greater sense of belonging and understanding for all Jackson County residents. Because of this important and scarce resource, The Clinic provides services in all the census tract areas.

2. **Diversity & Equity:** What actions are you taking as an agency to ensure diversity & equity on your board and within your organization?

The Clinic strives to maintain a Board that is rich in diversity of culture, experience, and background. The current Board is comprised of men and women passionate about the cause and the work being done. Members come from different communities including the Latino community, the Black community, the Asian Community, and the Jewish Community. In addition to being culturally diverse, The Clinic's Board members represent an eclectic variety of individual experiences and backgrounds. From business to education, they bring a wide range of credentials to bear, adding to the Board's robust and inclusive flavor. 3. **Use of Funds:** How will you use Outside Agency funds to impact your stated outcomes and how will this change future outcomes? How will you measure your agency's progress of success?

For the past 11 years, The Clinic has beaten the odds by providing quality services even with a shoestring budget and no dedicated, large-scale grants. This has been possible because of the generosity of others and the partnerships that have been cultivated over the past decade. A grant from the Outside Agency Funds would allow The Clinic to grow in a way that seemed unimaginable just a few years ago. With the ability to increase personnel comes an opportunity to offer even more services in the furtherance of social justice and due process. When the needs of a community's most vulnerable populations are met, they create healthy, safe neighborhoods. The Clinic's success can be measured in the number of families lifted to prosperity and security. It is also calculated in the number of partnerships and alliances developed, allowing The Clinic to meet the changing needs of the Jackson County area.

The Clinic's growth and success ensures that Jackson County remains a beacon of light, rich with resources and opportunities for indigent individuals who would otherwise have to face an uncertain and intimidating future alone. A grant from the Jackson County Outside Agency fund would not only allow the work to continue, but also for us to expand our programs to help more families and individuals. These expansions would offer an additional, neutral measure of The Clinic's progress and success.
