#### IN THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

**AN ORDINANCE** enacting a property tax credit to eligible taxpayers within Jackson County, Missouri, in accordance with the Revised Statutes of Missouri §137.1050 (SB190).

**ORDINANCE NO. 5787**, August 28, 2023

INTRODUCED BY DaRon McGee, Megan L. Marshall, Manuel Abarca IV, Donna Peyton & Venessa Huskey County Legislators

WHEREAS, the Missouri legislature passed, and the Governor signed Senate Bill 190 (SB 190), codified as Section 137.1050, RSMo; and,

WHEREAS, SB 190 and Section 137.1050, RSMo., became effective on August 28, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, under SB 190, certain eligible taxpayers may receive a property tax credit; and,

WHEREAS, a taxpayer may qualify as an eligible taxpayer if the taxpayer is a Missouri resident; is eligible for Social Security retirement benefits; is an owner of record of a homestead or has legal or equitable interest in such property as evidenced by a written instrument; and is liable for the payment of real property taxes on such homestead; and,

WHEREAS, SB 190 and § 137.1050, RSMo. authorizes a county to grant a property tax credit to eligible taxpayers residing in such county if a county adopts an ordinance authorizing such credit; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to SB 190 and Section 137.1050, the Jackson County Legislature desires to establish and create a tax credit for certain eligible taxpayers within Jackson County for taxes due for the 2024 tax year and beyond; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

- 1. Adoption and Enactment. The Jackson County Legislature hereby authorizes a real property tax credit to eligible taxpayers residing in Jackson County, Missouri in an amount equal to the eligible taxpayer's eligible credit amount.
- 2. Definitions. For purposes of this Ordinance, and pursuant to the provisions of SB 190 and § 137.1050, RSMo., the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:
  - a. "Eligible Credit Amount": the difference between an eligible taxpayer's real property tax liability on such taxpayer's homestead for a given tax year, minus the real property tax liability on such homestead in the year that the taxpayer became an eligible taxpayer.
  - b. "Eligible Taxpayer": a Missouri resident who:

- i. Is eligible for Social Security retirement benefits;
- ii. Is an owner of record of a homestead or has a legal or equitable interest in such property as evidenced by a written instrument; and
- iii. Is liable for the payment of real property taxes on such homestead in Jackson County, Missouri.
- iv. Is applying for a credit for a homestead [with an assessed value] with a market value that is determined by Assessment that is under \$550,000.
- c. "Homestead": real property actually occupied by an eligible taxpayer as the primary residence. An eligible taxpayer shall not claim more than one primary residence.
- 3. Tax Credit; Statement of Tax Due. Any tax credit granted pursuant to this section shall be applied when calculating the eligible taxpayer's property tax liability for the tax year. The amount of tax credit shall be noted on the statement of tax due sent to the eligible taxpayer by the Jackson County Collector of Revenue.
- 4. Implementation. The County and each of its elected officials shall be authorized and empowered to adopt such rules and procedures as are necessary in order to carry out and implement the provisions of this Ordinance and to develop and require such documents, applications and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to permit the application of the tax credits authorized herein, and to carry out, comply with and perform the requirements of the provisions set forth in this Ordinance.
- 5. Passage and Approval. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval by the County Legislature and shall

be effective for tax year 2024 and each year thereafter.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED following passage of this Ordinance, the Jackson County Legislature will introduce an additional ordinance to codify this language into the Jackson County Code, Chapter 20 and delineate certain policies and procedures for the enactment of this Ordinance in accordance with state law.

\*\*Please note that the approved funding amount may be less than the amount originally submitted to the Regional Coordination Group.

Initial funding allocations represent projections only and therefore are subject to modification by the Regional Coordination Group based upon the progress and needs of the OCDETF investigation. Federal government accounting policy requires all open obligations be reviewed and validated at the end of each quarter; therefore if no costs have been incurred within 90 days of the date of the agreement all funding could automatically be de-obligated unless an extension has been requested and has been granted in writing by the sponsoring Agency Regional OCDETF Coordinator.

If additional funding or agreement modifications are necessary, a written request must be submitted by the sponsoring Agency Regional OCDETF Coordinator to the Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) Regional OCDETF Director **prior** to incurring any overtime and/or expenses. The sponsoring Federal agency and State or Local agency will be notified in writing on the status of the request. Any supplemental funding will be contingent upon availability of funds.

OCDETF Agreement For Fiscal Year FY-23

A reimbursement request will not be deemed "submitted" unless it is completely and accurately prepared Reimbursement requests must be submitted within 30 days of overtime worked. The requests must be approved and signed by the sponsoring Federal agency prior to being forwarded to the U.S. Attorney's office. All requests without the proper signatures will be returned. Approved funds that do not have properly submitted reimbursement requests submitted on a timely basis will be de-obligated by the committee to meet other financial responsibilities.

The State or Local agency is responsible for ensuring and monitoring overtime payments. These payments may not, on an annual per person basis, exceed \$19,840.75 (increased to 25% of a GS-12 Step 1 Federal salary rate in effect for fiscal year beginning 10/01/2022. The field office of the sponsoring Federal agency and the sponsoring Agency Regional OCDETF Coordinator will also monitor these payments, as stated in section 14 of the agreement. Without approval from the Regional Coordination Group and the grant of a waiver from the OCDETF Executive Office in Washington D.C. An agency may not be reimbursed in excess of \$25,000.00 on any OCDETF investigation in a given year.

Reimbursement requests which are not submitted for payment in a timely manner are subject to availability of funds.

This Agreement is between the above-named State & Local Law Enforcement Organization and the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Program. This Agreement shall be effective when signed by an authorized State & Local Organization official, the sponsoring Federal Agency Special Agent-In-Charge, the sponsoring Agency Regional OCDETF Coordinator, the Assistant United States Attorney Regional OCDETF Director, and the OCDETF Executive Office.

- 1. It is agreed that the State & Local Law Enforcement officers named on this Agreement will assist in OCDETF Investigations, Strategic Initiatives and prosecutions as set forth in the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces State & Local Overtime and Authorized Expense/Strategic Initiative Programs, Policies and Procedures Manual, Fiscal Year 2023.
- 2. No individual agreement with a State & Local Organization may exceed \$25,000, and the cumulative amount of OCDETF State & Local overtime monies that may be expended on a single OCDETF investigation in a single fiscal year may not exceed \$50,000 without express prior approval from the OCDETF Executive Office. The OCDETF EXO will entertain requests to exceed these funding levels; however, there will be increased scrutiny from management pursuant to levels of funding needed. To receive approval to exceed this level of funding, a Cap Waiver Request Form approved by the Regional Director, must be sent to the to the OCDETF Internal Auditor and OCDETF Budget Mailbox (ocdetf.budget.mailbox@usdoj.gov).
- 3. Each reimbursable agreement will be allowed no more than five (5) modifications per year. Amendments or changes in the amount of the agreement after an agreement has been executed must be agreed to by all approving officials. If the funds for a particular agreement are completely deobligated with the intention of closing that agreement, it will not count as a modification for purposes of this policy. As a best practice, no increase modifications should be submitted if there are no bills entered on the agreement in MIS. These amendments or changes must be transmitted by a Modification Memo, signed by the Regional OCDETF Director, or designee, and sent to the OCDETF Executive Office in a timely manner not to exceed thirty (30) days. Deobligations only require the initials of the OCDETF Program Specialist. The signed Modification Memo should be returned to the State & Local Organization and included in the region's State & Local agreement file and be available upon request.
- 4. If an agreement does not have a bill entered in MIS within ninety (90) days of the agreement funding date (in MIS) or ninety (90) days between the last bill payment date (in MIS), the funds should be deobligated. [For example, if an agreement is dated October 1st, and there is no activity by December 30th, the agreement's funds should be deobligated.] The Regional Program Specialist Assistant/Program Specialist will run a 90-day inactivity report from MIS monthly to identify inactive agreements eligible for deobligation. The OCDETF EXO will assist with the monitoring of the aging agreements. Further, if a State & Local Organization determines that it is no longer performing work under a particular agreement, a Funding Change Notification (modification memo) identifying the amount to be deobligated should be submitted to the OCDETF EXO as soon as possible.
- 5. The State & Local Law Enforcement Organization agrees to provide experienced drug Law Enforcement officers who are identified in this Agreement to work on the specified OCDETF Investigation or Strategic Initiative. Any change in Law Enforcement officers assigned must be agreed to by all approving officials.
- 6. Officers who are not deputized shall possess no Law Enforcement authority other than that conferred by virtue of their position as a commissioned officer of their parent Agency.
- 7. Officers who are deputized may possess Federal Law Enforcement authority as specified by the Agency affording the deputation.

- 8. Any State & Local officers assigned to an OCDETF Investigation or Strategic Initiative in accordance with this Agreement are not considered Federal employees and do not take on the benefits of Federal employment by virtue of their participation in the Investigation or Strategic Initiative.
- 9. Officers assigned to OCDETF investigations or Strategic Initiatives are expected to work full-time (as defined by the State & Local Organization) on the Investigation(s) or Strategic Initiative(s) to be paid overtime. To satisfy the "full-time" expectation, a Law Enforcement Officer should work forty (40) hours per week as defined by the State & Local Organization or eight (8) hours per day on a single or multiple OCDETF investigation(s) or Strategic Initiative(s). Any established exceptions or waivers to this definition shall be approved by the RCG and attached as an Addendum A to the agreement. Officers not meeting the full-time expectation will not be reimbursed for overtime without an approved exception or waiver in the Addendum A. If the Addendum A allows for zero regular hours to be worked, it must also limit the number of overtime hours allowed in a billing month with zero regular hours (the limit established is up to the discretion of the RCG but should be explicitly mentioned in Addendum A if allowed).
- 10. Analysis of reimbursement claims by the Regional Coordination Group may result in a modification of the obligation of funds contained within this Agreement as well as the time period covered. The Organization affected by any such modification will receive a memo notifying them of the changes.
- 11. Overtime payments, including all other non-OCDETF Federal sources (such as Safe Streets, HIDTA, IRS, ICE, FEMA, etc.) may not, on an annual per person basis, exceed 25% of the current approved Federal salary rate in effect at the time the overtime is performed. The State & Local Organization is responsible for ensuring that this annual payment is not exceeded. The Regional Program Specialist Assistant/OCDETF Program Specialist will monitor these payments via MIS and communicate to the Federal Agency Regional OCDETF Coordinators who provide status updates to any officer approaching the threshold.
- 12. The overtime log must be attached to the reimbursement request when submitting the monthly invoices. The Sponsoring Federal Agency Supervisory Special Agent and the State & Local official authorized to approve the Reimbursement Request must certify that only authorized expenses are claimed, the regular hours requirement is satisfied, and that overtime has not exceeded 25% of the current Federal salary rate in effect at the time the overtime was worked.
- 13. Under no circumstances will the State & Local Organization charge any indirect costs for the administration or implementation of this Agreement.
- 14. The State & Local Law Enforcement Organization shall maintain for a period of six (6) years, complete and accurate records and accounts of all obligations and expenditures of funds under the agreement in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles to facilitate on-site inspection and auditing of such records and accounts.
- 15. The RCG is also responsible for identifying and implementing any additional policy requirements for its specific region, as needed. Those regional policies will be documented in the Addendum B and attached to the approved agreement. The agencies are agreeing to adhere to these additional requirements and must have written approval by the RCG for any exceptions to the regional policies.
- 16. Fringe benefits (such as retirement, FICA, or other expenses) are NOT to be included in overtime payment. Auxiliary educational benefits are also NOT to be included in overtime payment. Reimbursement of overtime payment is based solely on the authorized overtime rate of each participating officer listed in the agreement. Under no circumstances may a State & Local Agency include any administrative fees for the processing of overtime. Additionally, officers are not eligible for reimbursement of compensation time earned in lieu of overtime payment.

- OCDETF will only reimburse an actual dollar (\$) amount paid to the officer for overtime worked, any additional benefit (including compensation time) will NOT be reimbursed.
- 17. Fringe benefits (such as retirement, FICA, or other expenses) are NOT to be included in overtime payment. Auxiliary educational benefits are also NOT to be included in overtime payment. Reimbursement of overtime payment is based solely on the authorized overtime rate of each participating officer listed in the agreement. Under no circumstances may a State & Local Agency include any administrative fees for the processing of overtime. Additionally, officers are not cligible for reimbursement of compensation time earned in lieu of overtime payment. OCDETF will only reimburse an actual dollar (\$) amount paid to the officer for overtime worked, any additional benefit (including compensation time) will NOT be reimbursed.
- 18. The State & Local Organization shall permit examination and auditing by representatives of the OCDETF Program, the sponsoring Federal Agency(ies), the U.S. Department of Justice, the Comptroller General of the United States, and/or any of their duly authorized agents and representatives, of all records, documents, accounts, invoices, receipts, or expenditures relating to this Agreement. Failure to provide proper documentation will limit State & Local Law Enforcement Organizations from receiving OCDETF funding in the future.
- 19. The State & Local Organization will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all requirements applicable to OCDETF Agreements pursuant to the regulations of the Department of Justice (see, e.g., 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subparts C and G; 28 C.F.R. 50.3 (1991)) relating to discrimination on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, national origin or handicap.
- 20. This Agreement may be terminated by any of the parties by written notice to the other parties ten (10) business days prior to termination. Billing for outstanding obligations shall be received by OCDETF within thirty (30) days of the notice of termination.
- 21. The Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 requires that most payments made by the Federal government, including vendor payments, must be made by electronic funds transfer (EFT). In accordance with the act, all OCDETF reimbursement payments will be issued via EFT. Participants are required to register in SAM.gov to receive reimbursements; registration information will be provided upon request. In certain circumstances the OCDETF Executive Office may make exceptions for Organizations that are unable to accept this form of payment, however, such Organizations must include written justification in the addendum of each new Agreement.

This Agreement is not a contract or obligation to commit Federal funds in the maximum amounts projected. Funding allocations for the time period set forth and agreed to herein represent projections only and are based upon consultation between the sponsoring Federal Agency and the State & Local Law Enforcement Organization. They are, therefore, subject to modification by OCDETF based upon the progress and needs of the OCDETF Investigation or Strategic Initiative. Additionally, resources are contingent upon the availability of funds per the approval and signature of the OCDETF Executive Office obligating authority. The OCDETF Executive Office will approve and certify that all the terms and conditions of the Agreement have been met.

Each Agreement must be approved and signed by a State & Local Law Enforcement Organization official who has supervisory authority over, and is authorized to assign, the participating Law Enforcement officers to the OCDETF Investigation or Strategic Initiative.

#### West Central Region Addendum A

Definition of "Full-Time Participation" Exemption

The "full-time" rule states:

Officers assigned to an OCDETF investigation are expected to work full-time (e.g. eight hours per day, 40 hours per week) on the single investigation or multiple OCDETF investigations; i.e. the officer/agent is working more than one OCDETF investigation or he/she is assigned to a task force working exclusively OCDETF investigations. The parent State or local agency must pay the base salary of these officers.

However, given the size of narcotics units in most of the departments in this Region and the increasing demands being placed on these units, the West Central Regional Coordination Group has determined that some flexibility in application of the full-time rule is required. To that end the following policy best meets the demand of significant contribution by the State or local agency and the flexibility required to meet all the law enforcement demands:

An agent/officer can work/claim up to a maximum of 16 hours per month of overtime without working any regular hours on an OCDETF investigation.

Additionally, there may be exceptions granted for special circumstances for <u>one-time</u> events such as T-III surveillance, canine searches, aerial surveillance, controlled deliveries, etc. All special circumstances MUST be approved in writing via email by the OCDETF Agency Regional Coordinator prior to use. If special circumstances are NOT approved in advance, the exception will not be granted.


#### **INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION**



1. MANDATORY USE: The contractor shall provide services on an as needed, if needed basis. The State of Missouri does not guarantee any usage of the contract whatsoever. However, any state agency needing the services shall be required to use the contract unless an exemption is granted by the Division of Purchasing. In addition, the contractor shall agree and understand that the contract shall not be construed as an exclusive arrangement and if it is in the best interest of the State of Missouri and approved by the Division of Purchasing, a state agency may obtain alternate services elsewhere.

#### 2. **DEFINITIONS:**

- a. <u>Evaluation Form</u> Attachment 5 b., used to record the evaluation of the price quotes received from the awarded contractors.
- b. <u>Fleet Purchases Only</u> The QVL contractor must provide the specific motor vehicle requested in the PQF, including all specified additional options identified in the PQF, unless the QVL contractor provides documentation from the manufacturer indicating the additional option is not available at the time of the PQF request. A new fleet motor\_vehicle available off the QVL contractor's lot shall mean a vehicle which has never been owned except by a manufacturer, distributor or dealer and has never been registered, and of the current model year of the vehicle.
- c. <u>Fleet Vehicles</u> Manufacturer designated fleet vehicles defined as the vehicles purchased through the manufacturers' fleet program.
- d. <u>OA Fleet Management</u> Office of Administration Fleet Management, the pre-approval authority for all state agencies (except where special delegation exists). Any anticipated vehicle purchases must be pre-approved by OA Fleet Management prior to attempting to make a purchase.
- e. Off the Lot Purchases Only If a QVL contractor has a vehicle located on a lot that meets the requirements of the specific motor vehicle requested in the PQF, but the vehicle may also include additional options not requested by the agency. In which case the vendor should provide a PQF response that specifies





the additional options already installed on the vehicle that the state agency did not request. A new motor vehicle available off the QVL contractor's lot shall mean a vehicle which has never been owned except by a manufacturer, distributor or dealer and has never been registered, regardless of the model year of the vehicle.

- f. <u>Price Quote Form (PQF)</u> Attachment 5 a., Price Quote Form, utilized for requesting price quotes from the awarded contractors.
- g. Qualified Vendor's List (QVL) Qualified Vendor's List (contractors CC222374001-CC222374008, CC230582001-CC230582002, and CC231422001-006), an established supply channel for acquiring new motor vehicles and manufacturer designated fleet vehicles for various state agencies located throughout the state of Missouri.
- h. <u>State Agency</u> defined as a division, section, bureau, office, program, board, regional/district office, etc., that exists within a department of Missouri State Government. For the purposes of this document, this shall also include the public Universities and the Judicial and Legislative branches of the State of Missouri.

6. PRICE QUOTE FORM (PQF) Requirements (see section 2.7 of the Scope of Work for additional details) — The state agency will contact all QVL contractor(s) via email (which includes a pre-filled out attachment 5 a., PQF) who were awarded the requested motor vehicle category(ies) to obtain firm, fixed price quotes. All applicable fields to the agency should be filled out prior to sending the request to the contractors. In addition, the quote request will include the specifications required and the quantity of vehicles required. The state agency's quote request will also indicate if the state agency desires or requires any additional options or features (upgrades) to be included with the motor vehicle in addition to the base model vehicle defined.

NOTE: 1) If additional options and features are already installed on the vehicle then the QVL contractor shall price the vehicle as one total dollar amount for the motor vehicle that includes the already installed options and features. 2) If the PQF requests or requires options and features that are not currently installed on the vehicle proposed by the QVL contractor, then the QVL contractor must price those items separately to ensure the vehicle proposed meets the requirements identified in the PQF.

Agencies are also required to provide a blank Attachment 6, Domestic Product Procurement Act (Buy American) Preference with the PQF form to all contractors at the time of issuing a PQF form. Contractors must fill out Attachment 6 and return it with their PQF response in order to be considered for the award of the purchase order.

7. **EVALUATION OF THE PQF (see section 2.8 of the Scope of Work for additional details)** – Since multiple contracts exist, the state agency shall evaluate and record the total cost provided in each contractor's PQF response utilizing attachment 5 b., Evaluation Form, to determine the lowest-priced contractor. Agencies will need to process the steps outlined in section 2.8 of the Scope of Work. The state agency shall determine the lowest-priced contractor by determining each contractor's total cost for the requested vehicle based





upon the specifications, anticipated options required, quantity(ies) and the prices quoted on the PQF form. In the event the lowest-priced contractor is unable to provide the required vehicle due to unavailability, the state agency shall contact the next lowest-priced contractor as determined by processing the steps in section 2.8 of the Scope of Work. If additional contracts exist, and the first two lowest-priced contractors were unable to provide the vehicles, the state agency shall continue to use the same criteria for selecting a contractor until the needs of the state agency are met. All pricing shall include all shipping, and freight charges *FOB Destination, Freight Prepaid and Allowed*. The State of Missouri shall not make additional payments or pay add-on charges for freight or shipping.

State agencies shall make every attempt to process an award of a PQF within forty-eight (48) hours of the PQF deadline date. Any delays in the forty-eight (48) hour timeframe must be communicated to the QVL contractors that submitted a response to a PQF. QVL contractors shall not face consequences for selling a vehicle off the lot to another customer in the event an award has not been made within the forty-eight (48) hour timeframe and failure of the agency to communicate a delay occurs.

The PQF shall be awarded to the lowest and best QVL contractor defined herein as the specification-compliant QVL contractor who scores the highest number of evaluation points considering:

- a. The specifications and contents included on the PQF form and Attachment 5(b),
   Evaluation Form
- b. Cost, including the Missouri Domestic Products Procurement Act preference,
- d. As applicable, when alternative fuel vehicles are bid, a life cycle cost evaluation must be performed based on the requirements stated in Chapter 414.415 RSMo. The evaluation of cost shall be completed as a life cycle cost analysis based on the quoted firm, fixed vehicle base price included in the response to the PQF using the following: (a) an average life span of 120,000 miles for the vehicle; (b) the combined city/highway fuel mileage rating for the vehicle; and (c) the fuel cost per gallon on the date the PQF responses are due as published in the most recent Missouri Energy Bulletin. The state agency will use the following formula to determine the life cycle cost:

LCC = UP + (LV X GC)

MPG

LCC = Life Cycle Cost

UP = Unit Price of vehicle proposed

LV = Life of vehicle is 120,000 miles

GC = Gasoline cost per gallon for this PQF response will be the current average price for Mid-Missouri on the due date of the POF





MPG = Miles per gallon, combined city/highway mileage as stated by the vendor for each model

NOTE: If there is an inconsistency between vendor responses for the combined city/highway mileage, the state agency shall contact the manufacturer representative for all models quoted for that line item to verify the information. If the combined city/highway mileage is not provided by the vendor for the model proposed, the state agency reserves the right to use the EPA combined city/highway mileage as state at www.fueleconomy.gov when determining the life cycle cost per model. If the combined city/highway mileage is not available at www.fueleconomy.gov, the state agency reserves the right to contact the manufacturer to receive the combined city/highway mileage.

The state agency will provide all responding QVL contractors of the results of the PQF awarded by providing a copy of the completed Attachment 5b. - Motor Vehicle Price Quote Request Form (PQF) Award Record.

8. **Purchase Order Requirements –** The state agency must also provide authorization to proceed through issuance of a purchase order or specific written authorization to ship.

Note to State Agencies: Prior to making a vehicle purchase, the state agency must complete a vehicle pre-approval form and submit to Adam Wankum, OA - Fleet Management. The pre-approval form can be found at the following website address: <a href="https://oa.mo.gov/general-services/state-fleet-management/vehicle-preapproval-process-and-vehicle-credits">https://oa.mo.gov/general-services/state-fleet-management/vehicle-preapproval-process-and-vehicle-credits</a>

Once the state agency receives approval from OA - Fleet Management, the agency shall issue its own PGQ (Quick Price Agreement) order in SAMII or a requisition within MissouriBUYS. **Cooperative Procurement Members Note:** The Vehicle Pre-Approval Form <u>does not</u> apply to cooperative procurement members – only to State of Missouri agencies.





9. **Delivery** – Delivery for all vehicles shall be due as indicated by the state agency on the PQF form prior to issuing the PQF. The QVL contractor who was awarded the PQF shall only deliver upon receipt of an authorized purchase order. The QVL contractor must call the state agency 24 hours prior to making an appointment for delivery. Delivery must be made between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 Noon or 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, Central Time. Deliveries shall not be made on state holidays.

Each delivered vehicle shall be clean, lubricated, serviced and ready for immediate service. This shall include installation of all required options and accessories and removal of all plastic and signage (e.g. window sticker) from the interior and exterior of the vehicle. The window sticker may be left in the "glove box" or included with other documentation.

Each vehicle delivered shall include a proper form to apply for Missouri title and license including the Manufacturer's State of Origin and invoice, an owner's manual, and warranty. The title and invoice for all alternative fuel vehicles must clearly indicate the vehicle is alternative fuel (FFV) or E-85).

The Manufacturer's Standard Factory Warranty shall apply to all vehicles. The warranty shall not become effective until the vehicle is delivered to and accepted by the state agency.

Within forty-eight (48) hours of delivery, the state agency shall fully inspect the vehicle's interior and exterior, including any options required on the vehicle. The state agency must notify the dealer within forty-eight (48) hours of any unacceptability relating to the delivered vehicle. If the state agency fails to notify the dealer of any unacceptability within the forth-eight (48) hour timeframe, the dealer reserves the right to deem the vehicle as acceptable. Agencies are advised to ensure the proper measures are taken as it relates to insuring vehicles beyond the forty-eight (48) hour acceptance timeframe.

10. **Potential Recall or Manufacturer Initiated Customer Service Action/Notification Requirement:** The contractor shall be responsible for accessing potential recall notices from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), as well as any manufacturer initiated customer service actions prior to delivering the vehicles to the state agency location. If a recall or customer service action is found for the vehicle being delivered to the state agency, the contractor should, to the best of their ability, complete the necessary action(s) prior to delivery. If the contractor is unable to address the required recall or customer service action(s) prior to delivery, the contractor must inform the state agency of the "open" recall or customer service action upon delivery. The contractor shall





- then assist the state agency in getting the recall or customer service action(s) completed as quickly as possible.

WHEREAS, the origins of the Kansas City Fiesta Hispana can be traced back to a 1964 initiative to commemorate National Hispanic Heritage Week, which was later extended to a month-long celebration in 1980; and,

WHEREAS, in 1972, Hispanic federal employees in Kansas City, in collaboration with the Greater Kansas City Federal Executive Board, initiated annual activities to honor National Hispanic Heritage Week; and,

WHEREAS, the visionaries behind the Kansas City Fiesta Hispana, including Rebecca Jaramillo, Jose Gonzalez, Ninfa Garza, and others, recognized the importance of extending this celebration beyond the federal sector job sites, culminating in the organization of a parade from downtown Kansas City into downtown Armourdale, Kansas; and,

WHEREAS, in 1981, the idea was realized to showcase Fiesta Hispana as a vibrant and inclusive celebration of the diverse Latino cultures, including Mexican, Central and South American, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Dominican Republic, Equatorial Guinea, and Spanish in the U.S. Hispanic population; and,

WHEREAS, Fiesta Hispana was relocated to the heart of Kansas City's Mexican community along Southwest Boulevard in 1982 and 1983, and later was moved to Kansas City's newly constructed Barney Allis Plaza, a decision that enabled thousands of people to gather comfortably and celebrate Hispanic heritage; and,

WHEREAS, in 1984, the Greater Kansas City National Hispanic Heritage Committee (GKCNHHC) was incorporated, marking a significant milestone in the promotion of Hispanic heritage and culture; and,

WHEREAS, Fiesta Hispana has grown over the years to become the largest and most successful Hispanic fiesta event in the Midwest, attracting over 40,000 local and out-of-town visitors to downtown Kansas City each year; and,

WHEREAS, Fiesta Hispana will feature many activities, including fiesta booths, children's activities, educational exhibits, fine art displays, authentic Latino and non-Latino food vendors, and opportunities for employment, health services, as well as a partnership with LULAC National Educational Services Centers, Inc. (LNESC) to raise funds for local high school and college students; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature hereby extends its best wishes for a successful Kansas City Fiesta Hispana event and congratulations for its decades of dedication in promoting the Hispanic heritage and culture, fostering inclusivity, and contributing to the cultural richness of our community.
