AN ORDINANCE setting the 2024 Jackson County, Missouri tentative tax levy.

ORDINANCE NO. 5814, November 27, 2023

INTRODUCED BY Manuel Abarca IV, County Legislator

WHEREAS, Chapter 5, section 539.00 of the <u>Jackson County Code</u> requires the County Legislature to adopt a tentative tax levy sufficient to provide for appropriations in the County budget; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed 2024 annual County budget would require the following tax levies on each hundred dollars of assessed valuation for the fiscal year 2024:

and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to authorization granted by sections 67.500 through .545, RSMo, the qualified voters in Jackson County on November 6, 1979, approved Jackson County Proposition #1 which imposed a county-wide sales tax of one-half of one percent and required that the total county property tax levy be reduced by 70% of the total amount of the sales tax revenues in the tax year; and,

WHEREAS, section 67.505, RSMo, requires that after the County has determined its budget, the total property tax levy must be reduced in an amount sufficient to decrease the total property taxes it will collect by an amount equal to 70% of the sales tax revenue in the same tax year; and,

WHEREAS, section 67.500 defines "sales tax revenue collected" as the amount of sales tax revenue received by a county during the first six calendar months of any year multiplied by two, which is not to be confused with budgeted revenues; and,

WHEREAS, the tentative estimate of the sales tax revenues in 2024, after economic activity taxes are remitted and prior year sales tax adjustment, is \$64,126,551.78; and,

WHEREAS, this tentative estimate is subject to revision based upon actual sales tax revenues during the first six months of 2024 and the permanent levy to be adopted in September 2024 will reflect actual sales tax revenues during the first six months of 2024; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that, based upon tentative estimates of the sales tax revenues in 2024 and based upon the appropriations in the 2024 annual County budget, the following amounts on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation be set as the Jackson County tentative tax levy for the fiscal year 2024 on real and personal property within Jackson County, Missouri:

AN ORDINANCE amending the zoning districts established pursuant to the Unified Development Code by rezoning a certain 10.40± acre tract from District AG (Agricultural) to District RR (Residential Ranchette).

ORDINANCE NO. 5816, November 27, 2023

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Zoning Order of Jackson County, Missouri, and the official maps which are a part thereof, are amended by changing the boundaries of the "AG" (Agricultural) and "RR" (Residential Ranchette) Districts, so that there will be transferred from District AG to District RR a 10.40± tract of land located at 33608 E. Major Road in Jackson County, MO, legally described as follows:

Description: Part of the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 14 Township 48 Range 30, Jackson County, Missouri, described as follows: Commencing at the Southwest Corner of said Northwest Quarter; thence S 88 degrees 32 minutes 54 Seconds E, along the South line of said Northwest Quarter, 564.34 feet; thence North 01 degrees 47 minutes 06 seconds East, along the West line of a survey recorded as Document No. 1991I1043765, 78.40 feet to the North right-of way line of Major Road as established by Document No. 1999I0042995; thence North 01 degrees 47 minutes 06 seconds, continuing along said West line, 612.69 feet to the Northwest corner of said survey said corner also being the Southwest corner of Brooklyn Acres, a subdivision in said Jackson County; thence South 88 degrees 32 minutes 54 seconds East, along the North line of said survey and the South line of said Brooklyn Acres, 710.00 feet to the West right-of-way line of Buckner-Tarsney Road; thence South 01 degree 47 minutes 06 seconds West, along said line, 40.00 feet from the centerline thereof, 269.52 feet (deed=266.61'); thence Southerly, along a curve to the right having a radius of 1,392.39 feet an arc distance of 402.84 feet (deed=402.87') to the North right-of-way line of said Major Road; thence North 88 degrees 32 minutes 54 seconds West, along said line, 25.00 feet from the centerline thereof, 544.04 feet to the North right-of way line of Major Road as established by said Document No. 1999I0042995; thence North 51 degrees 52 minutes 54 seconds West, along said line, 89.99 feet; thence North 88 degrees 32 minutes 54 seconds West, continuing along said line, 78.40 feet North of and parallel with the South line of said Northwest Quarter, 35.60 feet to the Point of Beginning.

Section 2. The Legislature, pursuant to the application of Thomas Gilchrist (RZ-2023-661), requesting the amendment embodied in this Ordinance and with notice that the Jackson County Plan Commission voted 5 to 0 to recommend <u>APPROVAL</u> of this application after a public hearing on November 16, 2023, does hereby adopt this Ordinance pursuant to the Jackson County Charter authorizing the Legislature to exercise legislative power pertaining to planning and zoning.

ORDINANCE NO. 5819, November 27, 2023

INTRODUCED BY DaRon McGee, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Legislature believes it to be appropriate to provide a modest increase to the pension benefits earned by Jackson County associates; and,

WHEREAS, a study dated September 5, 2023, authorized by Cheiron, the Jackson County Pension Plan Board of Trustee retained actuary, determined that the benefits increase enacted in this Ordinance will result in an increase in the normal cost and Actuarial Liability of the Jackson County, MO Revised Pension Plan because the larger pension multiplier results in larger pension benefits; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed benefits increase is in the best interest of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Enacting Clause. Section 1512., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby repealed, and one new section, in lieu thereof, to be known as section 1512., to read as follows:

1512. Pension Income, Calculations.

When a Member lives to his Normal Retirement Date, he shall be entitled to retire and receive a Monthly Pension Income in an amount calculated by the Actuary and certified to the Trustee by the Pension Plan Administration Committee. For Members other than Elected Officials, the Monthly Pension Income under the basic form and payable on his Normal Retirement Date shall be the amount calculated under section 1512.1, but in no event less than the amount calculated under section 1512.2. For Elected Officials, the Monthly Pension Income under the basic form and payable on his Normal Retirement Date shall be the greater of the amount provided in the above sentence or the amount provided in section 1512.3.

[1512.1 <u>1.5% Per Year</u>.

An amount equal to one and one-half percent (1.5%) for each year of Credited Service times the Member's Average Monthly Earnings, but in no event less than fifty dollars (\$50.00).]

1512.1 Monthly Pension Income Formula

a. An amount equal to one and one-half percent (1.5%) for each year of Credited Service times the Member's Average Monthly Earnings, but in no event less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), for retirements prior to January 1, 2024.

b. An amount equal to one and six-tenths percent (1.6%) for each year of Credited Service times the Member's Average Monthly Earnings, but in no event less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), for retirements on or after January 1, 2024.

1512.2 If a Member was a participant in the Prior Plan on December 31, 1976, an amount equal to five-sixths (5/6) percent of the Member's "average monthly earnings" (as hereinafter defined) up to five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00) plus one and two-thirds (1-2/3) percent of his "average monthly earnings" in excess of five hundred fifty dollars (\$550.00), such sum multiplied by the Member's years of Credited Service. For the purpose of this section 1512.2, "average monthly earnings" shall be calculated in the same manner as Average Monthly Earnings assuming the Member's aggregate Monthly Earnings for calendar year 1976 divided by twelve (12) (or by the number of months during which the Member received compensation from the Employer in 1976, if less) continued, without increase, until his Normal Retirement Date or earlier date of severance of employment.

1512.3 Formula for Elected Officials.

An amount equal to four and one-sixth percent (4.167%) of such Elected Official's "compensation" (as hereinafter defined) for each year of Credited Service up to 12 years, plus five percent (5%) of such Elected Official's "compensation" for each year of credited service from 12 to 16 years. In addition, the Elected Official will also receive two hundred dollars (\$200) per month as a health insurance supplement. For purposes of this section 1512.3, the Elected Official's "compensation" will be equal to the monthly compensation of the incumbent of the same office that the Elected Official last held, at the time of the Elected Official's receipt of his first payment under this section. For purposes of this section 1512.3,

Credited Service shall only constitute that period of employment after December 31, 2003, unless such Elected Official has purchased additional Credited Service pursuant to section 1523. Any retirement benefit provided by this section will be reduced (i.e., offset) by any retirement benefits payable under another public pension plan to the extent that such benefits are attributable to service with the Employer. However, no offset will effect the Elected Official's right to the \$200 health insurance supplement under this section.

Effective Date: This ordinance upon final adoption shall be effective on January 1, 2024.

> Recommendation regarding a Benefit Improvement under the Jackson County, Missouri Revised Pension Plan and Fund

Dear Legislators,

The undersigned, as Fund Counsel for the Jackson County, Missouri Revised Pension Plan and Fund (JCRP), has been authorized and instructed to write to you regarding a recommendation to amend the JCRP Ordinance to provide for a benefit improvement in the current pension benefit multiplier from 1.5% to 1.6%.

Attached is a 2023 Actuarial Cost Study prepared by Cheiron, Inc at the request of Board of Trustees (Board) for JCRP. This letter provides an estimated cost projection associated with an increase in the current benefit multiplier of 1.5% to 1.6% effective January 1, 2024. The Board for JCRP respectfully request that the Legislature consider and accept the recommendation as discussed below.

In summary, the attached cost projection demonstrates that an increase in the current benefit multiplier of 1.5% to 1.6% will result in a combined increase of \$9,452,863 to the Actuarial Liability (AL) and Unfunded Actuarial liability (UAL), or an increase of 2.51% in the AL and 44.63% in the UAL. The increase in the normal cost as a percentage of Jackson County's payroll is .44% and the increase in the total contribution rate as a percentage of payroll is 1.62%. This study also reflects what the Actuarial Determined Contribution (ADC) is for the proposed benefit improvement compared to what the ADC is without it. As of July 1, 2022, the ADC is \$7,914,444. If the benefit improvement were adopted as proposed, the ADC would increase to \$9,080,025, or by 14.73%.

The Pension Ordinance was last amended in 1990 to provide for an increase in the benefit multiplier, more than 30 years ago. The Board must act in accordance with the fiduciary duties imposed by the County Pension Ordinance, Missouri state law and the Internal Revenue Code, to benefit the participants and beneficiaries of JCRP. The Board has determined that it is prudent and in the best interests of the participants and beneficiaries to now recommend a benefit improvement.

The Board has worked with the JCRP Fund professionals over the course of several years to monitor the financial health of the Plan and have succeeded such that as of July 1,

2022, JCRP's funded status based on the Actuarial Value of Assets (AVA) is 94.4%, close to being 100% funded.

The Board recognizes that Jackson County is the primary employer and the Plan's sponsor under the JCRP Ordinance and has the exclusive authority to amend the provisions of JCRP Plan to determine the type of benefits provided to County employees.

Missouri State law prohibits the Plan Sponsor from making any substantial change in Plan benefits unless a cost statement has been prepared and same is based on the most recent Actuarial Valuation Report. In addition, before a benefit improvement can be made, such proposed change cannot cause the funding percentage based on the AVA to drop below 80%. The 2023 Actuarial Cost Study contains the necessary information that the Plan Sponsor must consider before making the proposed benefit improvement.

The Board respectfully request that the Legislature consider and accept the recommendation as discussed above to amend the Pension Ordinance which would provide for a benefit improvement which is fairly distributed among <u>all</u> active County employees from 1.5% to 1.6% effective for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2024.

Dear Trustees,

The County Executive and Board of Trustees have requested that we provide an estimate of the impact of potential plan changes for the Jackson County, Missouri Revised Pension Plan (JCRPP). The purpose of this letter is to present the analysis of the proposed changes and the fiscal impact for the JCRPP. This letter is for the use of the Jackson County, Missouri Revised Pension Plan Board.

Summary of the Actuarial Cost Study

It is our understanding that the only proposed change in the Plan is an increase in the pension multiplier from 1.50% to 1.60% for current and future active members.

Fiscal Impact

For purposes of this analysis, all results are based on the assumption that the changes to the Plan would have occurred as of July 1, 2022. The detailed results of the analysis are shown in the attached Exhibit.

The change in multiplier from 1.50% to 1.60% for active members would result in an increase in the normal cost and Actuarial Liability of JCRPP because the larger pension multiplier results in larger pension benefits.

The increase in Actuarial Liability (AL) and Unfunded Actuarial Liability (UAL) as of July 1, 2022 is \$9,452,863, or an increase of 2.51% in the AL and 44.63% in the UAL. The increase in the normal cost as a percentage of payroll is 0.44%, and the increase in the total contribution rate as a percentage of payroll is 1.62%.

Data, Methods, and Assumptions

In performing this analysis, we referred to the data, assumptions, actuarial methods and plan provisions used in the July 1, 2022 actuarial valuation of JCRPP. Please refer to the full July 1, 2022 actuarial valuation report for summaries of the data, assumptions, actuarial methods and plan provisions used in the valuation and this analysis.

In preparing this letter, we relied on information (some oral and some written) supplied by JCRPP staff. This information includes, but is not limited to, the plan provisions, employee data, and unaudited financial information. We performed an informal examination of the obvious characteristics of the data for reasonableness and consistency in accordance with Actuarial Standard of Practice No. 23.

Future results may differ significantly from the current projections presented in this letter due to such factors as the following: plan experience differing from that anticipated by the assumptions, changes in assumptions, and changes in plan provisions or applicable law.

Cheiron utilizes ProVal, an actuarial valuation software leased from Winklevoss Technologies (WinTech) to calculate liabilities and project benefit payments. We have relied on WinTech as the developer of ProVal. We have reviewed ProVal and have a basic understanding of it and have used ProVal in accordance with its original intended purpose. We have not identified any material inconsistencies in assumptions or output of ProVal that would affect this report.

This letter and its contents have been prepared in accordance with generally recognized and accepted actuarial principles and practices that are consistent with the Code of Professional Conduct and applicable Actuarial Standards of Practice set out by the Actuarial Standards Board. Furthermore, as credentialed actuaries, we meet the Qualification Standards of the American Academy of Actuaries to render the opinion contained in this letter. This letter does not address any contractual or legal issues. We are not attorneys, and our firm does not provide any legal services or advice.

This letter is in follow up to your November 16, 2022, letter to the Board of Trustees and my January 6, 2023 letter to you wherein the Trustees acknowledge your inquiry from November 16, 2022 and promise to make recommendations on future benefit improvements to the Jackson County, Missouri Revised Pension Plan and Fund (JCRP).

Over the course of 2023 the Board has sought advice and information from JCRP's actuary to determine the impact to the Fund to provide future benefit improvements for all active County employees.

The Board must act in accordance with fiduciary duties imposed by the County Pension Ordinance, Missouri state law and the Internal Revenue Code to benefit the participants and beneficiaries of JCRP. Therefore, the Board has determined that it is prudent and in the best interest of participants and beneficiaries to recommend a benefit improvement such that the current benefit multiplier of 1.5% be increased to 1.6% effective January 1, 2024 for all active County employees.

Missouri state law prohibits the Plan sponsor from making any substantial change in Plan benefits unless a cost statement has been prepared and same is based on the most recent actuarial valuation report. As a courtesy, the 2023 actuarial cost study is attached for your reference. In addition, before a benefit improvement can be made, such proposed change can not cause the JCRP funding percentage based on the Actuarial Value of Assets (AVA) to drop below 80%. The 2023 actuarial cost study contains the necessary information that the Plan sponsor will be required to consider before making a proposed benefit improvement. The Board's recommendation will not cause the JCRP funding percentage to drop below 80%.

The Board believes that this benefit improvement will be sustainable for both the County and JCRP. It is the hope of the Board that you support this recommendation to increase the current benefit multiplier 1.5% to 1.6% for all active County employees.

The planning effort will facilitate the following objectives:

- Engage regional stakeholder and the public in the planning of the transition to vehicle electrification.
- Identify current interests, needs and barriers among various stakeholders in electric vehicle (EV) and electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE) expansion.
- Identify parcel-level charging station site suitability, expansion strategies and costs,
- Develop an online mapping resource for local governments and other stakeholders to use in identifying charging station priority locations and other factors that may impact expansion.
- Develop policy and best practices guidance that may include sample EV-ready ordinance, uniform permitting standards and inspection processes.
- Develop a plan that will guide EV charging network expansion.

EFFECTIVE

The Partners mutually agree to Articles I, II, and III in accordance with this Agreement effective the date signed by MARC's Executive Director or his/her designee until July 31, 2024.

ARTICLE I

JCMO AGREES:

- 1. To contribute to the EV Plan's required local federal match, by provide local matching funds of \$10,000 with a one-time payment upon receipt of invoice for the local match;

- 6. To accept consultant deliverables only with approval of the Steering Committee.

ARTICLE III

PARTNERS MUTUALLY AGREE:

- 1. That this Agreement and all contracts entered into under provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon the Partner and MARC; and
- 2. That no third-party beneficiaries are intended to be created by this Agreement, nor do the Parties herein authorize anyone not a party to this Agreement to maintain a suit for damages pursuant to the terms or provisions of this Agreement.

EXHIBIT A: Scope of Services

Kansas City Regional EV Readiness Plan Development

1.0 Stakeholder & Community Engagement

1.1 Steering Committee Engagement

Consult with steering committee (coordinated by MARC) throughout the planning process to ensure planning and engagement deliverables meet the needs of future city and regional planning and funding activities.

1.2 Public & Stakeholder Engagement

Identify interest, needs, and current implementation practices and barriers related to EV adoption and EV infrastructure through broad public and stakeholder engagement in urban, suburban, and rural areas of the MARC region. Public engagement must include underserved and disadvantaged communities. Underserved and disadvantaged communities are defined as occupants of public and affordable housing, occupants of multi-unit dwellings, persons with disabilities, zero-car households, low-income and minority communities most impacted by pollution and poor air quality, and other communities identified as "DACs" (disadvantaged communities) in the joint Justice40 Interim Guidance and Electric Vehicle Charging Justice40 Map.

Engagement of municipal stakeholders should identify planning, barriers, and current practices related to codes, ordinances, and parking requirements. If possible, public and stakeholder engagement efforts shall be coordinated with ongoing engagement occurring as part of the Connected KC 2050 MTP Update as well as other parallel MARC planning efforts. Proposers should follow guidance in MARC's Public Participation Plan and are encouraged to include creative public engagement tactics in their strategy.

Note: MARC is planning to conduct a statistically valid survey as part of the ConnectedKC 2050 Update. Two questions in the survey will focus on the intention to purchase electric vehicles and barriers to EV adoption.

2.0 Assessment of Existing Conditions

2.1 Existing Plans & Programs

Review existing local and regional EV planning and assess which plans (or elements of) need to be folded into or considered in the readiness plan. Identify local utility plans, including current and future programs and initiatives. Highlight regional EV-ready goals and targets.

2.2 Current EV Infrastructure Network & EV Market Saturation

Assess existing conditions including EV registrations and charging infrastructure (totals, locations, charge levels, % of useful life, usage data, hardware and software systems inventory).

2.3 Identification of Barriers

Identify current barriers to expanding deployment of electric vehicle charging infrastructure in various charging environments (residential, workplace, etc.) in urban, suburban, and rural areas in the Kansas City region. Identify barriers that are

experienced by public and private sector, homeowners, renters, residents of detached and attached multi-family residential units, etc.

2.4 Utility / Grid Analysis

Work with the electric utilities to identify capacity limitations and needs in regard to the electric utility grid's ability to support electric charging based on regional EV infrastructure needs projections. Evergy, BPU, Independence Power and Light, Ameren and several small cooperatives provide electric service to the 9-county region. Note: Evergy had conducted an analysis to identify areas where existing capacity constraints may limit EVSE expansion.

3.0 Identification of Needs

3.1 Propensity to Purchase Analysis

Using socioeconomic data and other factors, spatially analyze the 9-county MARC region to assess ranges of propensity to purchase electric vehicles. Such analysis would help uncover disparities that might be addressed by programmatic or policy interventions, especially related to equity and Justice 40.

3.2 Needs & Projection

Collect population, employment, and land use projections from MARC to project future demand for EVs and infrastructure needs.

4.0 Site Suitability Assessment

4.1 Scoring System

Develop a scoring rubric for parcels that includes factors that the steering committee considers priority factors for site suitability. These could include accessibility, high-capacity locations, convenience, transit, pollution and health burden, employment, etc.

4.2 Suitability Mapping

Pull together appropriate datasets to implement scoring of parcels and spatial mapping of scoring for site suitability, using ARCGIS. The assessment should consider existing charging stations only if they are publicly accessible and are a DCFC station. While it may be helpful to use existing charging stations to identify coverage gaps, determining site suitability for new charging stations should consider many other factors including equity and accessibility, integration with other infrastructure, growth and emerging markets, among other criteria for a more comprehensive approach. Note: The site suitability mapping will be integrated in the 6.1 EV Readiness Atlas that MARC develops; consultants should provide a Site Suitability ARCGIS map package.

5.0 Strategy

5.1 Prioritization of New Charging Station Locations (short, mid, long-term)

Using the Site Suitability Assessment, identify priority charging station locations, necessary charging levels and capital, operating and maintenance costs for near-, mid-, and long-term phasing of charging network expansion.

5.2 Solutions for EV/EVSE in Underserved Communities

Provide strategies for installation of EVSE in underserved communities that address the barriers identified.

5.3 High-level EV car-share feasibility, Strategy, and Pilot Area Recommendations

Provide guidance on piloting an EV car-share program including feasibility, target users, high-level feasibility, pilot area recommendations, potential partnerships, estimated capital and operating costs, possible funding scenarios and next steps. Note: MARC has included an EV carshare program serving low-income communities in the regional transportation plan, ConnectedKC 2050.

5.4 Emerging Technologies

Provide a high-level overview of emerging technologies related to EVSE and potential implications for planning.

5.5 Land-Use Considerations

Provide insight into land-use related issues that will need to be considered/addressed by local governments with the transition to electric vehicles.

5.6 Funding Strategy & EVSE Management

Identify local, state, and federal funding opportunities including grants, rebates, and direct incentives. Identify opportunities for public-private partnerships and guidance on maintenance and operation strategies for local governments.

6.0 Implementation Resources

6.1 Develop Map Resource (EV Readiness Atlas)

MARC will develop a new mapping resource to help public and private property owners interested in expanding EV infrastructure. Coordinate with MARC to include the propensity analyses and the Site Suitability Assessment data created by consultant. All other data layers will be provided/generated by MARC. The new mapping resource may include the following datasets:

- Site Suitability data
- Potential EV Demand at Multifamily Properties
- Propensity to purchase (regional)
- Employees (heatmap and employer point data)
- Disadvantaged communities
 - Pollution burdened communities
 - EJ communities
- Charging Stations (all levels)
- EV registrations
- Land Use
 - Major regional destinations
 - MARC activity centers and corridors
 - Parking facilities (public pay, public free, park and ride)
 - Multi-unit residential
- Mobility hubs (planned and existing) (KCSmartMoves.org

6.2 Policy and Best Practice Recommendations

Develop standardized language for zoning, ordinances, and building codes that could be used by public entitles, including but not limited to:

- Sample EV-ready ordinance for new construction of homes and commercial development.
- Uniform permitting standards, guidance on streamlined and expedited permitting processes for local government and inspection processes.

6.3 Draft RFP scope for a single-source procurement process

Develop a draft scope that could be used in a request for proposals for a single-source EVSE vendor/installer. The scope should be developed after discussion with the Steering Committee and a draft strategy is in place.

7.0 Kansas City Regional EV Readiness Plan 7.1 Preliminary Draft and Final Plan

The consultant will prepare a preliminary draft of the report for review and comment by the Steering Committee. This draft is to be provided as an electronic PDF. Comments received from the Steering Committee will be incorporated into the final report. Upon final review and consent by the Steering Committee, the consultant will develop a final report that is visually appealing, easy for policymakers and stakeholders to understand, and communicates EV strategies and recommendations. The report should be able to be used both digitally and in hard copy format. This may take the form of separate print and web formats. Specifically, the consultant should develop a final report that communicates a clear message both graphically and with accompanying text, is easy to read and understand; and explains key implications as they relate to infrastructure, services, policies, programs, partnerships, funding and recommendations. The consultant shall provide MARC with appropriate presentation materials for final review and approval of the Electric Vehicle Readiness Study by MARC's Total Transportation Policy Committee and the MARC Board of Directors.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR DESIGN SRVICES TO RESTORE JACKSON COUNTY LONGVIEW TRAIL IMPACTED BY REPLACEMENT OF RAYTOWN ROAD DOUBLE-PIPE CULVERTS

This First Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement is made as of November _____, 2023, between Jackson County, Missouri (the "County") and the City of Grandview, Missouri (the "City").

Recitals

- A. County and City entered into a Cooperative Agreement dated July 8, 2022 to cover the County's share of costs for the design and engineering of a bicycle and pedestrian bridge along the Longview Trail, and adjacent to Raytown Road, within the City of Grandview as a part of the City's planned improvements to Raytown Road ("Project") which includes removal of an existing double-pipe culvert underneath the road and trail and the construction of replacement infrastructure to rebuild the roadway and trail.
- B. The Cooperative Agreement called for an amendment as such time as the City has designed and bid the project, and if County approves of the City's bid and the City's contractor, and wishes to include the construction of the bicycle and pedestrian bridge in the Project, with the County's share of the costs of the bridge to be paid by County.
- C. City has publicly bid the project through City's standard procurement procedures and intends to award a contract for construction of the Project to the lowest and best bidder, in compliance with all requirements for cost-share funding through the Missouri Department of Transportation.
- D. The Project has been allocated \$1,700,000 in Federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Funds.
- E. In order to eliminate construction delays, coordination conflicts, and a prolonged closure of the Longview Trail, City and County hereby agree to include the construction of the new bicycle and pedestrian bridge in the Project.
- F. This First Amendment to the Cooperative Agreement covers the construction and inspection work for the Project, including the construction and inspection of the new bicycle and pedestrian bridge. This separate Amendment is necessary to establish the responsibilities of the parties, including the cost of the County's share of construction and inspections of the bicycle and pedestrian bridge, which will be paid by the County to the City before construction begins.

Therefore, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1, Obligations of the County. The County agrees to:

Expend only local dollars on the Project, including the funds to be remitted to the City or used to pay the contractor. In no event shall federal funds received by the County be used for this project.

Remit to City, upon approval of this agreement by County Executive, the sum of \$118,262.00 (One Hundred Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Two Dollars) for the County's share of construction cost-share match (\$89,982.00) and contingency and inspection (\$28,280.00) of the new bicycle and pedestrian bridge, provided however that if City fails to fulfill its obligations as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement Amendment, County shall be entitled to withhold in full, or recover in full if already remitted to City, County's contribution.

Monitor construction progress of the Project, participate in periodic Construction Progress Meetings hosted by City and City's contractor, and provide input as may be requested of the County to the best of the County's ability.

Acknowledge and accept that it is the owner of the pedestrian bridge and is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the bridge after construction of the bridge is complete.

Comply with all other requirements applicable to County as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement Amendment.

Section 2, Obligations of the City. The City agrees to:

Accept the sum of \$118,262.00 from County and maintain the same intact to be spent exclusively, along with applicable STBG funds, on the construction and inspection of the new bicycle and pedestrian bridge set forth in this Cooperative Agreement Amendment, and no other purpose. Should any funds be remaining of this amount after completion of Project, City shall return such funds to County.

Execute contracts for construction and construction inspection of the project, and exercise general supervision over the construction of the Project and the City's contractors.

Ensure that all plans, drawings, and specifications for the bicycle and pedestrian bridge conform to plans, drawings, and specifications previously approved by the City and County and as such which were made a part of the City's public bid and award to City's contractors.

Administer the construction and inspection phases of the Project, act as fiscal agent for the Project, review all progress invoicing from City's contractors and pay all invoicing for work due to City's contractors. Administer all requirements and perform all tasks required for reimbursement of STBG funds to City.

Keep the County informed of construction progress, unforeseen conditions (if any) in the execution of the Project, and notify the County of periodic Construction Progress Meetings with the City's contractors.

Provide to County an accounting sufficient to satisfy County that the funds contributed by County herein were spent in accordance with the terms of this Cooperative Agreement Amendment and provide such additional supporting documentation as may be required by County to establish City's compliance with all other terms and conditions of this Cooperative Agreement.

Comply with all other requirements applicable to City as set forth in this Cooperative Agreement.

- **Section 3. Sections not Amended**. All other sections of the Cooperative Agreement, unmodified by the terms and provisions of this First Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
- **Section 4. Execution Documents.** This First Amendment may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one agreement.
- **Section 5. Authority.** This Cooperative Agreement Amendment is entered into by the parties pursuant to the authority set forth in Article VI, Section 16 of the Missouri Constitution and RSMo 70.210 et. Seq.

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets forth the points of agreement between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and Radmacher Brothers Excavating Co., Inc. (Employer) regarding the Employer's participation in the Employment Eligibility Verification Program (E-Verify). 

Project/Title:

Authorizing the transfer of funds in the amount of \$19,500 and Authorizing an Amendment to a Contract Awarded under Resolution No. 20952 to CentralSquare Technologies of Lake Mary, FL, for services for Records Management and Computer Aided Dispatch software for use by the Jackson County Park Ranger Division.

Request Summary

The Park Rangers require replacement Records Management and Computer Aided Dispatch software, as the current system is obsolete and is no longer able to meet current standards or requirements.

We propose using the same existing CentralSquare Technologies server as the Jackson Co. Sheriff's Office to reduce the financial costs to the County for this new system and streamline communications and software maintenance.

This will bring the Park Rangers into compliance with the Missouri Court systems' mandate for utilizing an approved secure program to electronically transfer citizens personal information into their system.

Local municipal agencies such as Oak Grove Police Department, Lone Jack Police Department, and Grain Valley Police Department are already utilizing the existing Sheriff's Office computer server for the same reasons. This type of system is also currently in use by the MO State Highway Patrol and the MO Dept of Conservation.

This system will also enhance Officer safety by improving inter-agency communications, including GPS location services of Officers, and allow for future expansion, including e-ticketing. The CentralSquare system is one of the few approved by the MO courts system to allow for e-ticketing.

Expenditures for this award include a one-time implementation services fee, and ongoing software support and maintenance. The one-time implementation fee of \$19,500, to include the complete build of the Park Ranger focused system, will utilize funds from the 2023 Parks + Rec Budget, account 003-1605-56663. \$16,700 is available for transfer from budget account 003-1605-57601 Computer Accessories and the remaining \$2,800 is available for transfer from budget account 003-1605-57520 Small Arms & Ammunition, to total \$19,500. When the system build is complete, subject to appropriation, a payment for software use of \$18,785.58 would be authorized in 2024. Funding for the software portion of the project is included in the 2024 Parks + Rec budget request.

Each following year of use, for the next 5 years, will be at an annual software cost of \$18,785.58, subject

to appropriation. After the initial 5-year period, a cost increase of no greater than 5% amount each following year is permitted, subject to appropriation.

Recently the Ranger Division was made aware by Jackson County Judge James Witteman, Division 301, and Brittainy Simmons, with the prosecutor's office, that the ranger division will need to electronically file tickets because of a state mandate that went into effect in August of 2022. The mandate dictated law enforcement agencies' must electronically file tickets into the state database.

Further, Jackson County IT has stated, effective in 2024, they will no longer be able to support the ranger division Report Management System, (RMS), known as SEIMS. (Safety Enforcement Information Management System)

In May 2022, the legislature approved a contract with Central Square for the Sheriff Office, for a Report Management System, (RMS), and an E-Ticketing system, along with other systems, for their needs.

Ranger Division met with Central Square regarding a report management system and E-ticketing system, to determine if their system would fill the ranger division needs. The result of that meeting determined Central Square could support the needs of the ranger division plus was a practical solution as an "add on" yet separate system to the sheriff system. Central Square supplied the ranger division with the quote for \$38,285.58.

Park Rangers routinely work with the sheriff office to address issues that come up in county parks. Often rangers are on the same calls as sheriff deputies and each department write a report for their separate system. Many times, rangers and deputies handle calls in the park system without the knowledge of the other department and then write reports in different systems. This creates times when the ranger division does not know the circumstances of an incident that occurred in the park. Rangers routinely send reports to the sheriff office from the ranger system and times when the sheriff sends reports from their system.

Using the same system and "piggy backing" on their contract would eliminate all the above issues. There would no longer be a duplication of reports in two different systems. No longer will reports be written without both agencies having the ability to review the other agencies reports. Using one system will make it convenient for agencies to share reports and information.

Custom Forms

CentralSquare offers a custom form generator at no additional cost as a standard part of Public Safety Pro Suite. This tool allows agencies to create unique forms within the system and attach them to specific records in Public Safety Pro Suite, keeping everything in an easily accessible, central location.

Name, address, and vehicle fields are connected to each agency's master indices to reduce data entry. The master indices are searched, and existing information can be selected from the database. This notifies staff of any alerts related to the master indices. If the information being entered is new, the master index is updated so that the information is immediately available in other parts of Public Safety Pro Suite.

When building the form, information from related files, such as case numbers or incident times, can be pulled in automatically. Available information is displayed in a menu for each form type. Adding information to the form is as simple as clicking on the item in the menu.

All data within custom forms are searchable. This makes finding needed information an effortless, efficient process. Instead of searching through paper files or trying to find the correct folder on a server, links and search capabilities make it easy to locate specific information. Data included in forms can also be used to create reports with Reporting.



Custom Modules

Like Custom Forms, Custom Modules give agencies the power to track any information they may need in an integrated part of Public Safety Pro Suite. Agencies can eliminate paper logs and stand-alone spreadsheets by creating modules to fit their exact needs.

Rather than being associated with a record type within the system (as is true for Custom Forms), Custom Modules can track anything an agency needs, such as burn permits, pet licenses, or boat licenses. Each of these records can also create involvements on master name, vehicle, and address records, adding to the power of the data within the system.




