





FIT4LIFE Diabetes Prevention Program

- -Goal: Lose modest amount of weight and physical activity (150 minutes/week)
- **-Who:** Prediabetic, diabetic, and other persons who want to lose weight
- -What: 6-month in-person classes with followup virtual maintenance sessions
 - -Focus on healthy eating and exercise
 - -Text messages to encourage exercise
 - -Certified peer coaches from community
 - Linkage to community-based exercise
- -When: A class starting nearly every other month beginning April/May
- -Where: Community partners and federally qualified health centers

FIT4LIFE Program Referrals

Infant Mortality Early Prevention: Family Planning

Phase 1: Understanding Needs and Issues

Reproductive age potentially birthing persons Survey responses (N=205)

- 15-45 yrs old; 29 average age
- Less than 50% had well-woman exam past year
- 82% would be willing to discuss family planning
- About 10% want to get pregnant in next year
 - 84% want support with family planning
- 47% don't have enough money for food
- 30% exposed to violence (gun, assault)

Listening session highlights

- Very few planned their births
- Unaware of healthy pregnancy steps, except stopping contraceptive
- Many people don't have OB/GYNs
- Clinics, community events, and ERs





WE-CARE Family Planning: Preconception Counseling

- Preventative Care
 - Exam
 - Labs, pap smear, STD screening
- Review status of chronic illnesses
 - High blood pressure, diabetes, asthma
- Review medications
- Assess mental health and social determinants of health


