The Contractor hereby assures and certifies compliance with all the following certified assurances:

- 1. The Contractor assures that it shall comply with the applicable provisions of the 2014 DSSSF Solicitation and other applicable state statutes or regulations.
- DSSSF: The Contractor understands the DSSSF was created pursuant to <u>Section 57.278 RSMo</u> and consists of monies collected from charges for service received by county sheriffs under <u>Section 57.280 RSMo</u>. Furthermore, the Contractor assures that all monies received by the Sheriff under Section 57.280 RSMo have been paid to the County Treasury and the County Treasurer has paid, and will continue to pay, such monies to the State Treasurer.
- Administering Body: The Contractor understands the Missouri Sheriff Methamphetamine Relief
 Taskforce (MOSMART) is the awarding body of the DSSSF program funds and the Missouri Department
 of Public Safety provides technical assistance in the form of financial and progress reporting, as well as
 monitoring oversight.
- 4. Availability of Funds: The Contractor understands all awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.
- 5. <u>Allowable Costs</u>: The Contractor understands that only allowable and approved contract expenditures will be reimbursed from the DSSSF award. These monies may not be utilized to pay debts incurred by other activities. The Contractor agrees to obligate funds no later than the last day of the contract period and expend funds within 10 days following the contract period end date.
- 6. <u>Validity of Costs:</u> In the event it is determined the Contractor made false statements relating to a position and/or annual salary in order to receive DSSSF monies, the MOSMART Board may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the contract funds remaining and/or an amount equal to the portion of the contract funds wrongfully used.
- 7. Pro-Ration of Supplemental Salary: The Contractor understands that individuals in a grant-funded position must continue in a full-time, paid employment status to be eligible for continued supplemental salary. Individuals that enter an unpaid leave employment status are not eligible for supplemental salary if the unpaid leave status exceeds 10 hours in a 40-hour week. Furthermore, individuals that leave employment with the Contractor are not eligible for continued supplemental salary after their employment end date. The Contractor shall pro-rate, where applicable, the supplemental salary issued to the employee based on the prescribed format outlined in the Administrative and Financial Guidelines Pro-Ration of Supplemental Salary section of the DSSSF Solicitation.
- 8. <u>Hourly Rate</u>: The Contractor understands that DSSSF monies paid to an individual shall be included with the individual's annual salary when calculating the individual's hourly overtime rate. The individual's hourly overtime rate, as applicable, is not merely based on the county approved annual salary but a combination of the county approved annual salary and supplemental salary, per a decision rendered by the U.S. Department of Labor.

- 9. <u>Wage Garnishments</u>: The Contractor understands DSSSF monies paid to an individual may be subject to increased wage garnishments. Some garnishments (e.g. child support) are based on the individual's monthly salary and as the monthly salary increases so does the wage garnishment amount.
- 10. <u>Non-Supplanting</u>: The Contractor assures that DSSSF monies made available under this contract will not be used to supplant other federal, state, or local funds, but will be used to increase the amount of funds that would, in the absence of these funds, be made available for the activities of this project. In the event it is determined the Contractor is supplanting, the MOSMART Board may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the contract funds remaining and/or an amount equal to the portion of the contract funds wrongfully used.
- 11. Reporting Requirements: The Contractor agrees to complete and submit any reports required for this program, to include, but not limited to: monthly Claim reports to request reimbursement of supplemental salary and fringe benefits and semi-annual Status Reports to provide feedback. Failure to submit reports by the deadline dates as outlined in the Administrative and Financial Guidelines section of the DSSSF Solicitation may result in delay of reimbursement and/or cancellation of the contract if the delinquency becomes problematic.
- 12. <u>Change in Personnel</u>: The Contractor agrees to notify, within a timely manner, the Missouri Department of Public Safety if there is a change in or temporary absence as it affects the 'My Profile' module, 'Contact Information' form, and/or 'Budget' form within WebGrants. The notification shall be sent through the 'Correspondence' component of WebGrants to the appropriate Internal Contact with the *Change of Information* form attached.
- 13. <u>Contract Adjustments:</u> The Contractor understands that any deviation from the approved contract must have prior approval from the MOSMART Board. No additional funding shall be awarded to a Contractor but changes from one budget line to another budget line may be possible if the request is allowable and within the scope of the guidelines. Prior approval must be requested as a Contract Adjustment via WebGrants.
- 14. <u>Monitoring</u>: The Contractor agrees to maintain the records necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of the project. In addition, the Contractor assures that all documentation or records relating to this contract shall be made available to monitoring representatives of the Missouri Department of Public Safety and/or MOSMART Board immediately upon request. The Contractor assures that fund accounting, auditing, monitoring, and such evaluation procedures as may be necessary to keep such records as the Missouri Department of Public Safety and/or MOSMART Board shall prescribe, will be provided to assure fiscal control, proper management, and efficient disbursement of funds received under this contract.
- 15. <u>Audit</u>: The Contractor agrees to comply with the guidelines set forth regarding audit requirements. This guidance states that organizations expending \$250,000 or more in state funds (from all sources including pass-through sub-awards) in the organization's fiscal year shall have a single, organization-wide, independently performed audit. The independent audit should be in accordance with "Government Auditing Standards". Audits shall be conducted with reasonable frequency, usually annually, but not less frequently than every two years. A copy of such independent audit must be forwarded to the Missouri Department of Public Safety.
- 16. Employment of Unauthorized Aliens: Pursuant to Section 285.530.1 RSMo, the Contractor assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, the Contractor shall sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

In accordance with <u>Sections 285.525 to 285.550 RSMo</u> a general contractor or subcontractor of any tier shall not be liable when such contractor or subcontractor contracts with its direct subcontractor who violates subsection 1 of section 285.530 RSMo if the contract binding the contractor and subcontractor affirmatively states that the direct subcontractor is not knowingly in violation of subsection 1 of section 285.530, RSMo and shall not henceforth be in such violation and the contractor or subcontractor receives a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that the direct subcontractor's employees are lawfully present in the United States.

- 17. <u>Unlawful Employment Practices</u>: The Contractor assures compliance with <u>Section 213.055 RSMo</u> in regards to non-discrimination in employment practices as it relates to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, ancestry, age, or disability.
- 18. <u>Discrimination in Public Accommodations</u>: The Contractor assures compliance with <u>Section 213.065</u> <u>RSMo</u> in regards to non-discrimination in public accommodations as it relates to accommodations, advantages, facilities, services, or privileges made available in place of public accommodations.
- 19. <u>Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)</u>: The Contractor assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the provisions of <u>Section 43.505 RSMo</u> relating to uniform crime reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the contract period.
- 20. <u>Racial Profiling</u>: The Contractor assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the provisions of <u>Section 590.650 RSMo</u> relating to racial profiling and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the contract period.
- 21. <u>Federal Seizures</u>: The Contractor assures that its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the provisions of <u>Section 513.653 RSMo</u> relating to participation in the federal forfeiture system and the reporting of proceeds received therefrom to the Missouri Department of Public Safety and the Missouri State Auditor.
- 22. <u>Custodial Interrogations</u>: The Contractor assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the provisions of <u>Section 590.700 RSMo</u> relating to custodial interrogations and has adopted a written policy to record custodial interrogations of persons suspected of committing or attempting to commit the felony crimes described in subsection 2 of this section.
- 23. <u>DWI Law:</u> The Contractor assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the provisions of <u>Section 577.005 RSMo</u> relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward arrest information for all intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by <u>Section 43.503 RSMo</u>.
- 24. <u>Release of Funds:</u> No funds will be disbursed under this contract until such time as all required documents are signed by the Authorized Official and Project Director and returned to the Missouri Department of Public Safety for final review and signature by the MOSMART Board.
- 25. Enforceability: If a Contractor fails to comply with all applicable state requirements governing these funds, the MOSMART Board and/or Missouri Department of Public Safety may withhold or suspend, in whole or in part, funds awarded under the program, or recover misspent funds following an audit. This provision is in addition to all other remedies provided to the State of Missouri for recovery of misspent funds available under all applicable state laws.
- 26. **Fund Availability:** It is understood and agreed upon that, in the event funds from state sources are not appropriated and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to cover the contract costs, or in the event of a change in state laws relevant to these costs, the obligations of each party hereunder shall thereupon be terminated immediately upon receipt of written notice.

- 27. Renewal: An Award of Contract, entered into as a result of this application, shall not bind or purport to bind the MOSMART Board or Missouri Department of Public Safety for any contractual commitment in excess of the original contract period contained in such an award of contract. However, the MOSMART Board and Missouri Department of Public Safety shall have the right, at its sole discretion, to renew any such award of contract on a year-to-year basis. Should the MOSMART Board or Missouri Department of Public Safety exercise its right to renew the contract, the renewal shall be subject to the terms set forth by the MOSMART Board and Missouri Department of Public Safety in the documents developed for such renewal. Failure to comply with such terms set forth by the MOSMART Board and Missouri Department of Public Safety will result in the forfeiture of such a renewal option.
- 28. <u>Termination of Award</u>: The MOSMART Board and Missouri Department of Public Safety reserve the right to terminate any contract entered into as a result of this application at its sole discretion and without penalty or recourse by giving written notice to the contractor of the effective date of termination. The Drug Courts Coordinating Commission (DCCC) is pleased to announce the 16th Judicial Circuit Family Treatment Court program(s) has been awarded a total of \$86,744.00 for fiscal 2015.

Ninety-two proposals were received totaling over \$14.1 million in requests with available funds limited to \$6.4 million. Please be aware due to the current economic conditions of the State of Missouri, it may be necessary for the commission to withhold a percentage of funds. If a decision to withhold funds is made, you will be notified of the changes of the award to your treatment court. However, local funding alternatives should be pursued such as a dedicated tax, direct subsidy, user fees, etc.

As the number of new treatment court programs continues to increase each year without additional funding, it is critical for the DCCC to use the available resources and funding in the most efficient manner. For future award decisions, more consideration may be given to data-driven outcomes, including cost per participant, graduation rates, recidivism rates, education and employment improvement for each program compared to the state averages in each category. Every treatment court program is encouraged to plan accordingly as this may affect funding allocations. You may contact OSCA treatment court staff to discuss how your program's outcomes are calculated.

If the amount of funds your court requested differs from the amount awarded, please email a revised budget to osca.treatment.court@courts.mo.gov by July 15, 2014. Expenditures are reviewed on a monthly basis in relation to the revised budgets. It is necessary to be as accurate as possible in the planned monthly expenditures. If a program has not expended the budgeted funds as planned, notifications will be made to determine if all funds will be used. If some funds will not be used, the excess will be reallocated to other courts.

Enclosed is a one page award contract that must be signed, dated and returned to the address listed on the form by July 15, 2014, to avoid disruption in payment of invoices.

Each program will be required to submit the Certification of Compliance form each month, whether or not there are expenditures. Forms must be submitted by the 20th of each month following the month the expenditures were incurred. Due to the Drug Court Performance Measures, your court must maintain reporting efforts in the JIS Treatment Court forms. Those not maintaining the data in the system are at risk of losing funding from the DCCC.

As Chair of the Commission, I would like to thank each of you for your valued contributions to the drug court field. You make a tremendous difference in the lives of your clients and in the safety of your communities.

Chairman Antey: With development, when people add lawns, even though they

are adding roof lines and driveways, when they add turf grass it acts as a sponge. With row crops water will run and you will

have more runoff from vacant land that if you have a lawn with

turf grass. It soaks it up and holds it.

Mr. Pointer: It's pasture now, isn't it?

Max Pointer: Yes.

Chairman Antey: You are getting more runoff now than you would if it were

developed.

Max Pointer: I've seen the lake come up 3' in an hour. That is pretty heavy

runoff, it's like a big bowl.

Mrs. Mershon: Where does it run to?

Max Pointer: My property is across the street to the Northeast.

Mr. Tarpley: If the dam fails, where will the water go?

Max Pointer: Sni-a-Bar Creek, I believe. There are farms and homes farther

down. The lake is about 25' to 30' deep in spots. It is a fair amount of water. Approximate surface acres of 2 acres. The dam is an earthen dam built in 1977. I've had heavy rains and

I'm repairing near the spillway with concrete.

Mr. Tarpley: What is the depth of this lake?

Max Pointer: Right now it's probably down to about 25' at the deepest. It's

an old creek bed.

Mr. Pointer: Wouldn't the Corps of Engineers be involved in that?
Chris Jenkins: Jackson County Public Works, Engineering Division. The

Missouri Department of Natural Resources is the one who will be involved with a pond of that size. If it is a branch of the Snia-Bar, a lot of times the Corps will look at it, but it depends on the size of the branch. The Corps will definitely take a look at

Mr. Haley: When water when over the top, did it do a lot of erosion?

Max Pointer: No, I was lucky. Water only went over in about 2 areas and it was about 1"½ deep. I have 2 spillways on each side actually that I've repaired damage. It's probably close to 6' deep before

it gets to the top of the dam. When the siding was made on it, it takes quite a bit to get to my house. There is a spillway on the North side, once it gets to a certain height, will go around that side too. 99% of the time there is no problem. The lake was built in 1977 when they had this flood down at the plaza. It filled up in one night. That is the volume of water that comes down through there. I've seen water come out 3' out before it hits the branch. This is why I have concern.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

When the doors to Union Station first opened in 1914, it was heralded as one of the most beautiful train stations in the country.
