The Jackson County Drug Court Program will fund salaries and benefits through these funds. The Drug Court Program is a proven Diversion Program that reduces crime and increases public safety. The Jackson County Prosecutor's Office will fund a portion of the salary for a KCNoVA Data and Information Analyst. This position will help in a collaborative violence-reduction effort that includes law-enforcement agencies, academic researchers and community groups.

2014 JAG Program Narratives

THE COUNTY OF JACKSON (\$233,190)

Drug Courts (\$193,190)

The Jackson County Prosecutor's Drug Court is a deferred prosecution program that accepts cases from 11 municipalities within the County. Drug Court is a proven Diversion Program that reduces crime and increases public safety. The LLEBG Initiative has been a major source of funding for the Jackson County Drug Court Program. The JAG money will fund salaries and benefits of various Drug Court positions.

Community Based Programs, Community Policing (\$40,000)

KCNoVA is a collaborative violence-reduction effort that includes law-enforcement agencies, academic researchers and community groups. KCNoVA is premised upon the evidence based model of focused deterrence. Essential to the successful application of focused deterrence is the proper collection and analysis of both internal and external data. The hiring of a data and information analyst is necessary to further this project and is not currently within the capabilities of the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office. This person will be responsible for analyzing all data currently possessed within the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office's case management system, Karpel, and then coordinating with other partners to identify potential crime trends (geographical, crime type, person specific), determine internal inefficiencies, and provide recommendations on organizational changes that will help focus resources on cases that will provide the greatest results in reducing violent crime in Jackson County.

KCNoVA became operational in January 2014, and since that time there have been notable reductions in violent crime. Specifically, in comparison to the average homicide totals at this time over the past 4 years, Kansas City has seen a 25.33% reduction. These early signs of improvement are important for a community that has consistently held one of the highest per-capita murder rates and often leads the nation with the highest per capita homicide rate for African-Americans. The addition of a data and information analyst will help ensure that these gains are not lost and that additional steps are taken to further reduce violent crime in Jackson County.

The Jackson County Prosecutor's Office will use JAG money to fund a portion of the salary for a data and information analyst.

WHEREAS, the CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to provide the COUNTY with \$233,190.00 from the JAG award for salaries and benefits for Drug Court staff in the Prosecutor's Office; and salary for the Data and Information Analyst; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to provide the CITY1 \$16,656.00 from the JAG award to purchase law enforcement related equipment and computer hardware; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to provide the CITY2 \$49,969.00 from the JAG award to purchase law enforcement related equipment; and to purchase computer hardware and software; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF KANSAS CITY and the BOARD agrees to receive \$255,398.00 from the JAG Award for training and salaries and benefits for Neighborhood and Community Services and salaries and benefits for the Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission and salaries and benefits for Kansas City No Violence Alliance; and

WHEREAS, CITY OF KANSAS CITY, COUNTY, CITY1, and CITY2 believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the CITY OF KANSAS CITY, COUNTY, CITY1, and CITY2, agree as follows:

Section 1.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to pay CITY1 a total of \$16,656.00 of JAG funds.

CITY1 agrees to use \$16,656.00 to purchase law enforcement related equipment and computer hardware.

Section 3.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to pay CITY2 a total of \$49,969.00 of JAG funds.

CITY2 agrees to use \$49,969.00 to purchase law enforcement related equipment and computer hardware and software.

Section 4.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY and agrees to receive a total of \$255,398.00 of JAG funds.

CITY OF KANSAS CITY agrees to use \$255,398.00 for training and salaries and benefits for Neighborhood and Community Services and salaries and benefits for the Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission and salaries and benefits for Kansas City No Violence Alliance.

Section 5.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against all participating CITIES under this Memorandum of Understanding.

Section 6.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against any COUNTY.

Section 7.

Each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by one or more of the other parties.

Section 8.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this agreement.

Section 9.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.



WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Jackson County to provide assistance to the victims of domestic violence through funding of these shelters; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 8700., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, the Board of Domestic Violence Shelters was established to administer the distribution of fees collected pursuant to state statutes and the Code; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 455.215.2, RSMo, on or before November 15, 2014, the Board or its designee must have provided written notification to any domestic violence shelter that has applied for funding, whether it is eligible to receive funds, and if it is eligible, the amount available from the fees collected; and,

WHEREAS, the Board met November 10, 2014, and recommended an allocation of

\$90,000.00 of the projected 2015 budget revenues to be divided equally between the three eligible shelters, Hope House, New House, and Rose Brooks, in the amount of \$30,000.00 each after January 1, 2015, and has provided the shelters tentative notification of the same; and,

WHEREAS, the Board will hold a second meeting in June 2015 to recommend allocation of the remaining 2015 revenues based on further revenue projections, for distribution to the three eligible shelters; and,

WHEREAS, the Board recommends that the County Executive be authorized to execute cooperative agreements effective as of January 1, 2015, in the amount of \$30,000.00 each, at an aggregate cost to the County not to exceed a total of \$90,000.00; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive is authorized to execute the Agreements, in a form to be approved by the County Counselor, with Hope House, New House, and Rose Brooks domestic violence shelters for 2015 in the amount of \$30,000.00 each, at a total cost to the County not to exceed \$90,000.00; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Finance and Purchasing is authorized to make all payments, including final payment on the Agreements.
