AN ORDINANCE repealing sections 1511., 1514., 1532., and 1533., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, enacting, in lieu thereof, four new sections, and amending section 1503.45, Jackson County Code, 1984, all relating to the Jackson County Employees Pension Plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 4813, January 19, 2016

INTRODUCED BY Dennis Waits, County Legislators

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Pension Plan Board of Trustees and its special counsel have recommended several technical amendments to the Plan to bring the Plan into compliance with the Internal Revenue Code and current best practices relating to public sector pension plans; and,

WHEREAS, the recommended amendments are in the best interests of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause</u>. Section 1503.45, <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, is hereby amended, sections 1511., 1514., 1532., and 1533. of the Code are repealed, and new sections 1511., 1514., 1532., and 1533. of the Code are enacted, all to read as follows:

1503.45 Service.

The term "Service" shall mean the number of years for which a Member is given credit for the purpose of determining his eligibility for benefits under the Plan. As of

any date, Service shall be equal to the sum of the years of employment calculated under subsection (a), subject to the provisions of subsections b and c of this section, if applicable.

- a. The number of years and completed months of the Member's continuous employment for the Employer as an Employee from his date of hire as an Employee to the date of his termination of employment.
- b. For the purposes of this Plan the following periods of employment shall be considered "continuous employment" but shall not be recognized as Service:
 - i. a break in the continuity of employment of not more than two(2) years, provided the Employee returns to work for at least twelve(12) months;
 - ii. any period of employment during which the Employee was not compensated by the Employer, except that any such period which an employee was on approved leave without compensation while serving on active military duty in the Persian Gulf in Operation Desert Storm shall be recognized as Service;
 - iii. any period of employment excluded pursuant to the provisions of section 1506 of this chapter;

- iv. any period prior to January 1, 1977, during which the Employee was eligible to participate in the Prior Plan but refused to make the Employee contributions thereunder;
- v. a break in the continuity of employment prior to April 1, 1967, of more than two (2) years; provided:
 - A. the Employee was employed by the Employer as an Employee on April 1, 1967; and
 - B. the Employee completes twenty-five (25) years of employment as an Employee by his Normal Retirement Date (including for this purpose any break in the continuity of employment occurring prior to April 1, 1967).
- vi. a break in the continuity of employment of more than two (2) years; provided:
 - A. the reemployed Employee terminated Vested in the Plan, or is a Retired Member of the Plan, and;

- B. the Employee accrues sufficient Service during his period of reemployment to become Vested in the Plan.
- c. Service shall also include the number of years a Vested Member purchases pursuant to section 1503.45.1
- d. Service shall include months or years represented by contributions paid by the Employer to the Pension Plan pursuant to a settlement agreement between the Employer and Employee for an increased benefit under the Plan.

1503.45.1 Purchase of Service Due To Military Service.

a. Only a Vested Member of the Plan may opt to purchase individual years of Military Service, up to four (4) years of Service, one year for each full year of military service. Such option to purchase individual years of Military Service must be exercised or declared within twelve (12) months of [either] the later of the vesting of the Member or [the effective date of Ordinance 4709] October 1, 2015. Once a Member has exercised or declared the option to purchase years of Military Service, the Member shall have twenty-four (24) months from the date of such declaration to provide to the County full payment for years of Service purchased pursuant to the calculations as provided in subsection (b) of this section.

- b. Annually, the Board of Trustees shall determine the cost of the purchase of a year of Service for this purpose, in a manner that is cost neutral to the Plan and based on the following factors:
 - i. A discount factor equal to the then current interest rate on the thirty-year Treasury Bond plus 200 basis points;
 - ii. The immediately preceding five (5) year historical aggregate salary experience of the Plan; and
 - iii. The generational mortality table used for the immediately preceding Annual Valuation.
- c. A Member may elect to purchase years of Military Service, but a Member may not purchase partial years of Service. A member may only purchase complete years of Service.
- d. A Vested Member may purchase Service pursuant to this section 1503.45.1 with either after-tax dollars or with pre-tax contributions, such as rollover contributions or plan-to-plan transfers from other retirement arrangements qualified under Internal Revenue Code sections 401(a), 403(a), 403(b), 457(b), or 408;

- e. If Service is purchased pursuant to this section 1503.45.1, such Service will be considered "Credited Service" pursuant to section 1503.14, unless at the time of the purchase the Member, at the Member's request, opts to purchase Service only for purposes of establishing an earlier Normal Retirement Date than otherwise allowed or provided pursuant to section 1503.39. In this case, Service will not be Credited Service for any purpose other than establishment of an earlier than otherwise allowed or provided Normal Retirement Date under the Rule of 80. A member may purchase up to four (4) years of service for this purpose. The Board of Trustees shall set the cost of Service purchased for establishing an earlier retirement date utilizing the same factors as stated in section 1503.45.1 b, above.
- f. A Member may not purchase Service pursuant to this section 1503.45.1 to establish Vested status pursuant to section 1503.48.
- g. A Terminated Employee as defined under section 1509. of this chapter may not purchase Service under this section.
- h. <u>Military Service</u>.

The term "Military Service" shall refer to a full calendar year of military service within the United States Military, whether active, reserve, or inactive, so long as the Member was honorably discharged from such service.

1511. Pension Income, Basic Form.

The basic form of Monthly Pension Income (to which the formula indicated in Section 1512 applies) shall be a monthly income commencing on the Member's Disability, Early, Normal or Late Retirement Date or the date specified in Section 1530 and continuing for his lifetime thereafter, with sixty (60) payments guaranteed. Prior to his Disability, Early, Normal or Late Retirement Date, or the date specified in Section 1530, the Member may elect, in a written application provided by the Board of Trustees, Pension Plan Administration Committee, and subject to the Committee's approval, to receive his Monthly Pension Income in one of the alternative forms listed below; provided, however, that in the case of a Disabled Member whose Disability Retirement Date is prior to the date such Disabled Member attains age 55, the Disability Payments provided for in section 1515 shall be paid in the basic form provided for in this section 1511 and shall not be paid in any of the alternative forms specified in subsections 1511.1 and 1511.2. Each of the alternative forms shall be the Actuarial Equivalent of the Monthly Pension Income payable under the basic form and shall commence as of the Member's Disability, Early, Normal, or Late Retirement Date or the date specified in section 1530. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section 1511, a Disabled Member whose Disability Retirement Date precedes such Disabled Member's attainment of age 55 and who is receiving Disability Payments in the basic form, may elect, not later than 60 days after attaining age 55, in a written application provided by the Pension Plan Administration Committee, and subject to the Committee's approval, to receive his remaining Monthly Pension Income in one of the alternative forms listed below. Such alternative form shall be the Actuarial Equivalent of the Monthly Pension Income then being received by the Disabled Member

1511.1 A monthly income payable for the Member's lifetime with one hundred and twenty (120) payments guaranteed (an alternative form).

1511.2 A monthly income payable for the lifetime of the Member and continuing thereafter in the same monthly amount to a Beneficiary designated in writing by the Member (an alternative form). Should the Beneficiary named by the Member die prior to the Member's Disability, Early, Normal or Late Retirement Date or prior to the date specified in Section 1530, the election shall be void and Monthly Pension Income shall be paid under the basic form. Should the Beneficiary die after Monthly Pension Income has commenced to the Member, no alternative Beneficiary can be named.

1511.3 If the Member's designated Beneficiary is other than his Spouse or Domestic Partner, the Actuarial Value of the benefits payable to the Member shall be [more than] at least fifty percent (50%) of the Actuarial Value of the benefits payable to the Member and his Beneficiary or survivor.

1511.4 Contributions, benefits and service credit with respect to qualified military service will be provided in accordance with Section 414(u) of the Code, notwithstanding any contrary provision set forth herein.

1514. Pension Income, Effect of Early Retirement.

An Active Member whose Attained Age is at least fifty-five (55) and who is Vested may, upon written application, retire as of an Early Retirement Date. Commencing at his Early Retirement Date, such Active Member is entitled to a reduced Monthly Pension Income which is equal to his Accrued Benefit as of his Early Retirement Date, reduced by one two hundred fortieth (I/240th) each month by which his Early Retirement Date precedes his Normal Retirement Date.

1532. Death Prior to Age 55, Effect.

[Except as specifically provided in section 1533. of this chapter, if any active Member should die being Vested in the Plan, a lump sum Death Benefit equal to the deceased Member's Current Accrued Benefit at the time of death shall be payable: (i) to the deceased Member's surviving Spouse or Domestic Partner, if any; (ii) if the deceased Member is not survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner, to such other survivor as the deceased Member has designated; or (iii) if the deceased Member has made no such designation, to the deceased Member's estate.] If any active Member should die (i) prior to reaching the Attained Age of fifty-five; (ii) being Vested in the Plan; and (iii) be survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner, that Spouse or Domestic Partner shall be entitled to a Death Benefit. Such Death Benefit shall be a monthly income, payable for the life of the

Spouse or Domestic Partner, equal to the benefit that would have been payable to such Spouse or Domestic Partner if the Member had retired on the day before the date of the death and elected the form of payment specified in Section 1511.2 with 75% of the reduced benefit continued to the Member's Spouse or Domestic Partner for lifetime. Such Spouse or Domestic Partner Death Benefit payments shall commence on the first day of the month next following the Member's date of death. If a Member dies without a Spouse or Domestic Partner, a Member's surviving child or children shall receive a return of contributions equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000.00, to be paid in a lump sum distribution and in equal shares.

1533. Death After Age 55 With Spouse or Domestic Partner, Effect.

If any active Member should die (i) after reaching the Attained Age fifty-five, (ii) being Vested in the Plan, and (iii) be survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner, that Spouse or Domestic Partner shall be entitled to a Death Benefit. [No Death Benefit shall be payable if the Member is not survived by a Spouse or Domestic Partner.] Such Death Benefit shall be a monthly income, payable for the life of the Spouse or Domestic Partner equal to the benefit that would have been payable to such Spouse or Domestic Partner if the Member had retired on the day before the date of death and elected the form of payments specified in Section 1511.2 with 100% of the reduced benefits continued to the Member's Spouse or Domestic Partner for lifetime. Such Spouse or Domestic Partner Death Benefit payments shall commence on the first day of the month next following the Member's date of death. Notwithstanding the above, if a Member had reached the Member's Normal Retirement Date and had made a written election as

to the form of benefit payments pursuant to Section 1511, then, upon the Member's death prior to the commencement of benefits, any Death Benefit shall be payable in accordance with such written election. If a Member dies without a Spouse or Domestic Partner, a Member's surviving child or children shall receive a return of contributions equal to the contributions made on behalf of the Member by the Employer up to \$10,000.00, to be paid in a lump sum distribution and in equal shares.

INTRODUCED BY Tony Miller, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Parks + Rec Department has applied to the Jackson County Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled - EITAS for funding assistance for the Department's Special Population Services Division for 2016; and,

WHEREAS, the Board has agreed to provide a maximum sum of \$234,200.00 pursuant to the attached contract, to assist the Division with its programming, which is based on how learned social, physical, athletic, and developmental skills transfer into the individual's every day and vocational life; and,

WHEREAS, execution of this contract with the Board is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute the attached contract with the Jackson County Board of Services for the Developmentally Disabled.

Contract

This Contract entered into this 1st day of January, 2016, by and between Jackson County, in behalf of Jackson County Parks and Recreation's Special Population Services, hereinafter referred to as "Provider", and Developmental Disability Services of Jackson County – Eitas, hereinafter referred to as "Eitas".

1. Contract

Eitas agrees to contract with Provider to fund specific services as described in the Provider's Proposal dated September 2, 2015 and approved by the Eitas Board of Directors on December 1, 2015.

Eitas has agreed to fund up to \$234,200 for these services.

2. Term

The term of this Contract shall be one year from January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016.

3. Client List

The Provider shall provide to Eitas a list of all clients served in its program (those with a developmental disability and those without) for the prior six months and for each and every client as much of the following available information will be provided:

- (a) Date of birth;
- (b) Address, Provider and Zip Code;
- (c) Disability of each client;
- (d) Name of Sheltered Workshop in which client is employed or is supervised by;
- (e) Name and type of Residence facility in which client resides or is supervised by;
- (f) Percentage of clients in program who are residents of Jackson County, Missouri, who have developmental disabilities

pursuant to 205.968 R.S.Mo. <u>et seq.</u>, and who are served by a Sheltered Workshop or Residential facility program.

At least two-thirds (2/3) of all clients participating in this program must "Eligible Persons" and meets Eitas' eligibility requirements as follows:

The term "Eligible Persons" for purposes of this Contract includes any person who is a resident of Jackson County, Missouri and has a primary diagnosis of a developmental disability.

For purposes of the preceding sentence, a developmental disability means either or both of:

- (i) A disability which is attributable to an intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, autism, epilepsy, a learning disability related to a brain dysfunction or a similar condition found by comprehensive evaluation to be closely related to such conditions or require habilitation similar to that required for a person with and intellectual disability which originated before age 22 and which can be expected to continue indefinitely; and
- (ii) A developmental disability as defined from time to time in Section 630.005 of the Statutes.

Persons with a primary diagnosis of a mental illness shall not be deemed eligible for Eitas funding.

Determination of who is a resident of Jackson County, Missouri shall, in situations in which there is doubt, and for all purposes of this Contract, be made by Eitas.

Both Provider and Eitas shall adhere to confidentiality standards and HIPAA regulations, pursuant to those governing the disclosure of client information as outlined by the Kansas City Regional Office concerning the release of specific client information.

4. Accountability

(a) As part of its funding contingencies, Eitas requires Provider to implement an agency wide Outcomes Measurement System for Eligible Persons served based upon the Missouri Quality Outcomes. The Provider shall work cooperatively with Eitas Support Services staff in the development, review, evaluation and reporting of these Outcomes.

Provider shall afford access to designated Eitas staff the premises where person are served, indentified individuals, pertinent records and to the guardian or parent where indicated pursuant to the development, review, evaluation and reporting on successful implementation of the Outcomes Measurement System.

In addition, Provider is to ensure that all staff are trained in the Missouri Quality Outcomes and their significance in working with individuals in the workplace.

(b) In the event that Eitas representatives become aware of problems, or observe situations that are detrimental to Eitas funded persons, Eitas will provide a written report to Provider detailing the issues.

A written response including an action plan and persons responsible for resolution shall be presented to Eitas within an agreed upon timeframe. Failure to address problems and issues brought to the attention of Provider may result in withholding or suspension of Eitas funding.

(c) Provider will comply with all local, state, and federal law. Provider will not discriminate against any Eligible Person on the basis of age, sex, religion, race or ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or financial status.

Provider shall maintain in effect an affirmative action policy, a sexual harassment policy, and a drugs and alcohol policy that are acceptable to Eitas and, in the case of the drugs and alcohol policy, satisfies all applicable standards for such policies applicable to drivers established by any transit authority with jurisdiction over Provider.

Provider will not use or permit the use of Eitas owned facilities for religious purposes.

5. Contract Billing and Payment

(a) The Provider shall, within 15 days following the end of each month during the Term, deliver to Eitas an invoice for compensation due under this Contract for the preceding month.

Each invoice shall provide information about the Services provided under this Contract for the preceding month that is sufficient for Eitas to confirm the amount of compensation owed by Eitas to Provider each such month, and each such invoice shall be signed by appropriate official of Provider and shall be certified by Provider to Eitas as being true and correct.

(b) The Provider shall on the monthly invoice list the name, title, and responsibilities of each employee, the dates so employed, and the amounts paid to said employees.

The Provider also further agrees to submit to Eitas with its quarterly reports, an activity report which document the number of events/programs provided the total number of individuals attending each event/program, and the number of developmentally disabled residents of Jackson County attending each event/program under the Provider program.

6. Eitas Policies

The Provider shall abide by the philosophy and written policies adopted by Eitas that pertain to related services. Eitas shall provide to the Provider a copy of all such policies and at all times as Eitas adopts new written policies. Any proposed policy shall be mailed to the Provider in advance of Eitas meeting at which any new policies will be considered for adoption by Eitas.

7. Religious Use

Provider agrees that it will not directly or indirectly use any Eitas owned facility for religious purposes, nor will Provider use any funds from Eitas either directly or indirectly for religious purposes.

8. Sexual Harassment Policy

Provider shall have in place a sexual harassment policy and submit a copy of the same to Eitas. Such policy shall include verified on-going

training for all personnel relating to sexual harassment and adequate procedural safeguards to report a complaint by either staff or clients.

9. Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Policy

Provider, if required by law, shall comply with all requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act hereinafter referred to as "HIPAA", as well as any and all federal rules and regulations pertaining to "HIPAA", as well as any and all federal rules and regulations pertaining to "HIPAA".

The parties further agree to timely enter into additional agreements or contracts as required by law to implement the requirements of "HIPAA". Provider shall submit to Eitas a copy of its policies regarding the same within thirty (30) days of the date any such policies are required by "HIPAA" law regulations.

10. Invoices

- (a) Invoices for services rendered received 45 days or more after the month of service shall not be honored for payment unless approved by Eitas. All bills for services for calendar year 2015 must be submitted to Eitas by January 15, 2017.
- (b) Eitas reserves the right to audit all invoices and to reject any invoice for good cause, including but not limited to the following reasons:
 - (i) The original invoice is not signed by the appropriate official of the Provider.
 - (ii) The units invoiced for an authorized client or service are in excess of the amount provided in the Budget.
 - (iii) The invoice includes services or costs not authorized by Eitas.
 - (iv) The amounts invoiced for an authorized cost or services are in excess of the known amounts provided.
 - (v) The price for a cost or service differs from the agreed upon price.

- (c) Eitas retains the right to deduct from an invoice of the Provider any overpayment made by Eitas on a prior invoice
- (d) Eitas retains the right to make invoice corrections/changes with appropriate notification to the Provider
- (e) An invoice system must be developed which will enable Eitas to track and account for its dollars through a reporting process, which will be provided to Provider by Eitas.

Such reporting procedures will be jointly reviewed by the parties prior to utilization. The reporting system shall be basically the same as that required of other agencies funded by Eitas and consistent with Eitas' financial systems management policies set forth in the Policy and Procedures manual and the Funding Application packet.

(f) Eitas will pay the Provider for all services provided based on actual costs to the Provider that shall be documented to Eitas by appropriate documentation.

Unless, otherwise provided, Eitas shall not pay the Provider a monthly pro-rated amount based on the yearly contract.

11. Notices

Provider shall give to Eitas' Executive Director written notice of:

- (i) The death of an Eligible Person;
- (ii) A serious accident involving an Eligible Person;
- (iii) A life threatening illness of an Eligible Person;
- (iv) The making of any formal allegations of mistreatment of an Eligible Person;
- (v) Notice of any investigation including but not limited to misuse of funds of an Eligible Person;
- (vi) Abuse, neglect, death or other investigation initiated by any accreditation or regulatory or other investigatory body with similar status, in each case within

24-hours after the Provider becomes aware of the occurrence of such event.

In addition, Provider shall furnish Eitas' Executive Director copies of:

- (i) Any and all reports issued by an investigatory agency promptly but to not exceed five work days of receipt concerning their respective findings;
- (ii) Any corrective action plan or quality improvement plan or recommendations issued to Provider as a result of an investigation; and
- (iii) Any other Provider response to an investigation.
- (iv) Provider also agrees to keep Eitas' Executive Director informed as to the course of any investigation and take active steps to secure any documents and/or reports related an investigation.
- (v) Provider shall notify Eitas' Executive Director within 24-hours of the occurrence of any event that impacts or might impact adversely on Provider's ability to comply fully with the terms and conditions of this Contract.

12. Laws to Govern

The Provider shall comply with all local, state and federal laws and regulations including but not limited to the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, if the Provider is a recipient of federal financial assistance.

Eitas makes no commitment as to funding the requirements of any local, state or federal law or regulations.

13. Work Product

The Provider agrees and understands that all work products developed as a result of the Provider's services under this Contract are to be used solely for the purposes of this contract. If the Provider wishes to use any work product developed under this Contract for any other purpose it must have the prior written consent of Eitas to do so.

14. Sunshine Law

The parties agree that the Provider is a "Governmental Body" pursuant to the Sunshine Law of the State of Missouri, Section 610.010 et seq. R.S. Mo.

15. Inspections

The Provider agrees to allow Eitas or its designated agent to monitor the Providers programs at any reasonable time.

16. Audit

Provider shall furnish annually, on or before ninety (90) days after its fiscal year, its certified audit and the audit must contain a management letter.

17. Termination

- (a) This Contract may be terminated by either party by giving 30 days prior written notice to the other party of such termination
- (b) This contract may be terminated by Eitas if in the sole judgment of Eitas, the funding available to Eitas during the Term is significantly less than had been anticipated by Eitas at the time the Contract was made and the reduction in funding causes continued performance under the Contract by Eitas to be fiscally imprudent.

18. Documents

The Provider shall provide any and all documents required by this Contract by mail, or by delivery to Eitas or by e-mail to jiacobs@eitas.org or its successor.

19. Modifications

This agreement constitutes the complete understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter and may be modified or amended only by written instrument executed by the parties.

The fullest authority at all times with respect to any such commitment or with respect to any transaction deemed by any of the said Authorized Persons and/or agents to be proper in connection therewith is hereby conferred, including authority (without limiting the generality of the foregoing) to give written or oral instructions to the Brokers with respect to said transactions; to bind and obligate the Organization to and for the carrying out of any contract, arrangement, or transaction, which shall be entered into by any such Authorized Persons and/or drafts drawn upon the funds of the Organization such sums as may be necessary in connection with any of the said accounts to deposit funds with the Brokers; to deliver securities and/or contracts to the Brokers; to order the transfer or delivery thereof to any other person whatsoever, and/or to order the transfer record of any securities, or contracts, or titles, to any name selected by any of the said Authorized Persons or agents; to affix the Organization's seal to any documents or agreements, or otherwise; to endorse any securities and/or contracts in order to pass title thereto; to direct the sale or exercise of any rights with respect to any securities; to sign for the Organization all releases, powers of attorney and/or other documents in connection with any such account, and to agree to any terms or conditions to control any such account; to direct the Brokers to surrender any securities to the proper agent or party for the purpose of effecting any exchange or conversion, or for the purpose of deposit with any protective or similar committee, or otherwise; to accept delivery of any securities, to borrow money and securities, if applicable, and to secure repayment thereof with the property of the Organization; to appoint any other person or persons to do any and all things which any and all things which any of the said Authorized Persons and/or agents is hereby empowered to do, and generally to do and take all action necessary in connection with the account, or considered desirable by such Authorized Persons and/or agents with respect thereto.

SECOND: That the Brokers may deal with any and all of the persons directly or indirectly by the foregoing resolution empowered, as though they were dealing with the Organization directly.

THIRD: That the person signing this Non-corporate Resolution on behalf of the Organization be and hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to certify to the Brokers:

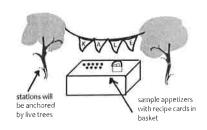

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 2016, by and between Jackson County, Missouri, herein after referred to as "the County," and Mark Siettmann.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County, through the County Executive, is desirous of engaging the services of Mark Siettmann to serve as the County's Director of Communications; and,

WHEREAS, Mark Siettmann, is well-qualified for this position and is desirous of undertaking the professional duties of said position;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

I. Term.

The County hereby engages the services of Mark Siettmann to serve as its Director of Communications, for a term commencing December 7, 2015, and terminating on December 31, 2016. After the initial term, Mark Siettmann's employment may be renewed by mutual agreement of the parties, upon such terms as the parties may agree.

Employment.

For all purposes, County shall treat Mark Siettmann as an officer and employee of the County and shall pay the employer's share of social security contributions and make appropriate deductions from the biweekly payments required under paragraph

III(A) hereof for federal, state, and local taxes, and any other applicable taxes, fees, and assessments, as well as for any benefits which the County offers to its employees, in which Mark Siettmann elects to participate. Mark Siettmann's employment with the County shall be governed by Missouri law and the Jackson County Charter, Code, and Personnel Rules, unless otherwise specifically provided herein.

III. <u>Compensation</u>.

- A. For the entire term of this Agreement, Mark Siettmann shall be paid for his services the base sum of \$80,995.00 annually, payable bi-weekly. In the event that the County grants a cost-of-living increase to all or nearly all of its employees, Mark Siettmann shall be entitled to receive that cost-of-living increase as well. In the event that the County creates a "merit pool" for employee merit salary increases, Mark Siettmann shall be entitled to receive a merit increase no greater than the average increase for employees within the pool, provided that any such increase must be justified by Mark Siettmann's employee evaluation. The County Executive shall have discretion to increase Mark Siettmann's salary in any manner consistent with the County's personnel rules and procedures.
- B. In lieu of submitting invoices for business use of his personal vehicle, Mark Siettmann shall receive an automobile allowance in the amount of \$600.00 per month.
- C. Without regard to the length of Mark Siettmann's actual employment with the County, Mark Siettmann shall earn vacation leave authorized under the County's Personnel Rules at the rate of four weeks (20 days) per year. One week (5 days) can be used during the first ninety (90) days of employment. Mark

Siettmann's accrual and use of vacation leave shall otherwise be governed by said Personnel Rules.

D. The County shall provide Mark Siettmann a cellular telephone for business use. Alternatively, Mark Siettmann shall be entitled to an allowance of \$55.00 monthly for his business use of his personal cellular telephone.

IV. Duties.

Mark Siettmann shall perform all duties and exercise all responsibilities set out by the Missouri Constitution and Laws and Jackson County Charter, Code, and Personnel Rules for the office of the Director of Communications. A copy of the current job description for this position is attached hereto as Exhibit A. In the event that the responsibilities of the position of Director of Communications due to County asset reorganization, then the parties shall meet to discuss and negotiate whether or not Mark Siettmann's compensation should change.

V. <u>Termination</u>.

This Agreement may be terminated by either Mark Siettmann or County as follows:

- A. Upon Mark Siettmann's termination of the Agreement through a written resignation, upon death of Mark Siettmann, or upon finding of a permanent disability of Mark Siettmann, no severance shall be due.
- B. The County may terminate the Agreement without cause. In that event, the County shall pay Mark Siettmann a severance allowance equal to six (6) months' salary, payable within 15 days of the date of termination.
 - C. The County may terminate the Agreement for cause. If Mark

Siettmann is terminated for cause, the severance payment outlined in subparagraph B above shall not be paid to Mark Siettmann. "Cause" in this Agreement means:

- (i.) An intentional act of fraud, embezzlement, theft or any other material violation of law that occurs during or in the course of Mark Siettmann's employment with the County;
- (ii.) Intentional damage to County's assets;
- (iii.) Intentional disclosure of County's confidential information contrary to the County's policies;
- (iv.) Breach of Mark Siettmann's obligations under this Agreement;
- (v.) Intentional engagement in any competitive activity which would constitute a breach of Mark Siettmann's duty of loyalty or of Mark Siettmann's obligations under this Agreement;
- (vi.) Intentional breach of any of County's policies;
- (vii.) The willful and continued failure to substantially perform Mark Siettmann's duties for County (other than as a result of incapacity due to physical or mental illness); or
- (viii.) Willful conduct by Mark Siettmann that is demonstrably and materially injurious to the County, monetarily or otherwise.

For purposes of this paragraph, an act, or a failure to act shall not be deemed willful or intentional, as those terms are used herein, unless the act is done, or omitted to be done, by Mark Siettmann in bad faith or without a reasonable belief that Mark Siettmann's action or omission was in the best interest of County. Failure to meet performance standards or objectives, by itself, does not constitute "Cause." "Cause" also includes any of the above grounds for dismissal regardless of whether the County learns of it before or after terminating Mark Siettmann's employment.

D. In the event of termination of the Agreement, Mark Siettmann shall be paid any compensation and benefits which would be due a County employee

terminated under similar circumstances, pursuant to the Jackson County Personnel Rules.

VI. Construction.

This Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Missouri.

VII. Severability, Waiver, and Modification.

The invalidity or inability to enforce any provision hereof shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. Failure to insist upon strict compliance with any terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such, nor shall any waiver or relinquishment of such right or power at any time be taken to be a waiver of any other breach of this Agreement. Further, any waiver, alteration, or modification of any of the provisions of this Agreement, or cancellation or replacement of this Agreement, shall not be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties.

VIII. Annual Appropriation.

Funds necessary to meet any and all financial obligations incurred by the County herein are subject to appropriation in the County's 2016 and future years' annual budgets.

IX. Incorporation.

This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding of the parties.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into as of the _____ day of _____, 2016, by and between Jackson County, Missouri, herein after referred to as "the County," and Joseph Piccinini.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County, through the County Executive, is desirous of engaging the services of Joseph Piccinini to serve as the County's Director of the Department of Corrections; and,

WHEREAS, Joseph Piccinini, is well-qualified for this position and is desirous of undertaking the professional duties of said position;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

I. Term.

The County hereby engages the services of Joseph Piccinini to serve as its Director of the Department of Corrections, for a term commencing December 7, 2015, and terminating on December 31, 2016. After the initial term, Joseph Piccinini's employment may be renewed by mutual agreement of the parties, upon such terms as the parties may agree.

Employment.

For all purposes, County shall treat Joseph Piccinini as an officer and employee of the County and shall pay the employer's share of social security contributions and make appropriate deductions from the biweekly payments required under paragraph

III(A) hereof for federal, state, and local taxes, and any other applicable taxes, fees, and assessments, as well as for any benefits which the County offers to its employees, in which Joseph Piccinini elects to participate. Joseph Piccinini's employment with the County shall be governed by Missouri law and the Jackson County Charter, Code, and Personnel Rules, unless otherwise specifically provided herein.

Compensation.

- A. For the entire term of this Agreement, Joseph Piccinini shall be paid for his services the base sum of \$110,520.00 annually, payable bi-weekly. In the event that the County grants a cost-of-living increase to all or nearly all of its employees, Joseph Piccinini shall be entitled to receive that cost-of-living increase as well. In the event that the County creates a "merit pool" for employee merit salary increases, Joseph Piccinini shall be entitled to receive a merit increase no greater than the average increase for employees within the pool, provided that any such increase must be justified by Joseph Piccinini's employee evaluation. The County Executive shall have discretion to increase Joseph Piccinini's salary in any manner consistent with the County's personnel rules and procedures.
- B. In lieu of submitting invoices for business use of his personal vehicle, Joseph Piccinini shall receive an automobile allowance in the amount of \$800.00 per month.
- C. Without regard to the length of Joseph Piccinini's actual employment with the County, Joseph Piccinini shall earn vacation leave authorized under the County's Personnel Rules at the rate of four weeks (20 days) per year. One week (5 days) can be used during the first ninety (90) days of employment. Joseph

Piccinini's accrual and use of vacation leave shall otherwise be governed by said Personnel Rules.

D. The County shall provide Joseph Piccinini a cellular telephone for business use. Alternatively, Joseph Piccinini shall be entitled to an allowance of \$55.00 monthly for his business use of his personal cellular telephone.

IV. Duties.

Joseph Piccinini shall perform all duties and exercise all responsibilities set out by the Missouri Constitution and Laws and Jackson County Charter, Code, and Personnel Rules for the office of the Director of the Department of Corrections. A copy of the current job description for this position is attached hereto as Exhibit A. In the event that the responsibilities of the position of Director of the Department of Corrections due to County asset reorganization, then the parties shall meet to discuss and negotiate whether or not Joseph Piccinini's compensation should change.

V. Termination.

This Agreement may be terminated by either Joseph Piccinini or County as follows:

- A. Upon Joseph Piccinini's termination of the Agreement through a written resignation, upon death of Joseph Piccinini, or upon finding of a permanent disability of Joseph Piccinini, no severance shall be due.
- B. The County may terminate the Agreement without cause. In that event, the County shall pay Joseph Piccinini a severance allowance equal to six (6) months' salary, payable within 15 days of the date of termination.
 - C. The County may terminate the Agreement for cause. If Joseph

Piccinini is terminated for cause, the severance payment outlined in subparagraph B above shall not be paid to Joseph Piccinini. "Cause" in this Agreement means:

- (i.) An intentional act of fraud, embezzlement, theft or any other material violation of law that occurs during or in the course of Joseph Piccinini's employment with the County;
- (ii.) Intentional damage to County's assets;
- (iii.) Intentional disclosure of County's confidential information contrary to the County's policies;
- (iv.) Breach of Joseph Piccinini's obligations under this Agreement;
- (v.) Intentional engagement in any competitive activity which would constitute a breach of Joseph Piccinini's duty of loyalty or of Joseph Piccinini's obligations under this Agreement;
- (vi.) Intentional breach of any of County's policies;
- (vii.) The willful and continued failure to substantially perform Joseph Piccinini's duties for County (other than as a result of incapacity due to physical or mental illness); or
- (viii.) Willful conduct by Joseph Piccinini that is demonstrably and materially injurious to the County, monetarily or otherwise.

For purposes of this paragraph, an act, or a failure to act shall not be deemed willful or intentional, as those terms are used herein, unless the act is done, or omitted to be done, by Joseph Piccinini in bad faith or without a reasonable belief that Joseph Piccinini's action or omission was in the best interest of County. Failure to meet performance standards or objectives, by itself, does not constitute "Cause." "Cause" also includes any of the above grounds for dismissal regardless of whether the County learns of it before or after terminating Joseph Piccinini's employment.

D. In the event of termination of the Agreement, Joseph Piccinini shall be paid any compensation and benefits which would be due a County employee

terminated under similar circumstances, pursuant to the Jackson County Personnel Rules.

VI. Construction.

This Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Missouri.

VII. Severability, Waiver, and Modification.

The invalidity or inability to enforce any provision hereof shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. Failure to insist upon strict compliance with any terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such, nor shall any waiver or relinquishment of such right or power at any time be taken to be a waiver of any other breach of this Agreement. Further, any waiver, alteration, or modification of any of the provisions of this Agreement, or cancellation or replacement of this Agreement, shall not be valid unless in writing and signed by the parties.

VIII. Annual Appropriation.

Funds necessary to meet any and all financial obligations incurred by the County herein are subject to appropriation in the County's 2016 and future years' annual budgets.

IX. Incorporation.

This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding of the parties.

A RESOLUTION offering support for the Kansas City, Missouri initiative to renew the earnings tax.

RESOLUTION NO. 19056, January 19, 2016

INTRODUCED BY Crystal Williams, County Legislator

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2016, Kansas City voters will decide whether to renew the Kansas City earnings tax for the next five years; and,

WHEREAS, loss of the earnings tax would eliminate a significant revenue source for the City of Kansas City, resulting in a decrease of \$230 million in revenue to Kansas City; and,

WHEREAS, the earnings tax funds essential services for the citizens of Kansas City and Jackson County, including police and fire protection, snow removal, traffic light and street repair, sanitation, medical and emergency care, and social services for low-income families and children; and,

WHEREAS, a "no" vote on the earnings tax would result in the loss of 810 uniformed police and 550 firefighters, more than half the forces of both departments, and a 30 percent reduction in the city workforce, a loss of about 2,240 jobs; and,

WHEREAS, the loss of funds provided by the Kansas City earnings tax would impose greater taxes on Kansas City residents by forcing the entire tax burden of providing basic services and regional amenities to be carried by Kansas City residents alone and increase the strain on resources provided by Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, loss of the earnings tax could lead to the elimination of a significant source of revenue for the Kansas City general fund, but does not authorize any replacement revenue sources and presents no realistic expectations that an increase in property or sales taxes would fill the void; and,

WHEREAS, in 2011, Kansas City voters turned out with 78 percent approval for the earnings tax and are encouraged to again support this essential source of funding for basic city services; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature pledges its support for the renewal of the Kansas City earnings tax and endorses all efforts to educate the public about the consequences of eliminating the earnings tax.
