WHEREAS, the Director of Human Resources has undertaken a thorough review of certain job classifications for licensed attorneys-at-law in the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney; and,

WHEREAS, the Director has examined salaries in the corresponding legal offices in Johnson County, Kansas, St. Louis, and Greene Counties, Missouri, and the Cities of Overland Park, Kansas, and Kansas City, Independence, and Lee's Summit, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, upon the completion of his evaluation and review, the Director has recommended revision to the salary ranges for all attorneys in the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney with the exception of the ranges for attorneys within the Local 42 IAFF bargaining, which were revised in October 2015; and,

WHEREAS, the recommended revisions are in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Jackson County; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause</u>. Schedule IV to Chapter 2, <u>Jackson County</u>, 1984, is hereby repealed, and one new schedule enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as Schedule IV, to read as follows:

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Family Court Division's Night Light Program is a collaborative effort between the Family Court and local law enforcement agencies in which a Juvenile Probation Officer and a uniformed Deputy Sheriff will make evening and late night supervision and surveillance checks on high-risk juvenile probationers; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of the program is to hold potentially violent youth offenders accountable for their actions, reduce delinquent behavior, encourage sound social decision-making behavior, and reduce illegal substance abuse; and,

WHEREAS, in exchange for the services provided by the Sheriff's Office for this program, the Family Court Division will reimburse the Sheriff's Office at the hourly off-duty rate of \$33.00 per hour, up to \$70,000.00 for 2016, payable through an inter-departmental billing; and,

WHEREAS, the Sheriff recommends the execution of the attached Agreement with the

FAMILY COURT DIVISION 16TH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF MISSOURI TWELFTH AMENDED CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This contract is made and entered into by and between the Family Court Division of the 16th Judicial Circuit of Missouri (hereinafter referred to as the "Court"), and the Jackson County Sheriff's Department (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor"). For consideration as stated below, the parties agree as follows:

1. Definitions

None

2. Term of Agreement

This agreement shall be in effect from January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016, subject to the provisions of this agreement relating to termination of this agreement, as set forth below.

3. Services Rendered

One (1) team, consisting of one (1) Family Court Services Juvenile Probation Officer and one or two (1 or 2) uniformed Deputy Sheriff, using the Sheriff's Department's marked vehicle, will make late night supervision and surveillance checks on high risk juvenile probationers; and as time permits, patrol areas where youth congregate, to look for youth on probation and provide proactive involvement with youth who may be at risk of violence (See attachment "A" for program objectives under the "Night Light Program", incorporated herein by reference).

4. Payment

The Court agrees to reimburse the Contractor for a total amount due for the contract period January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016, not to exceed the amount of \$70,000.00 (seventy thousand dollars and zero cents). This amount includes the use of one or two (1 or 2) deputies per ride out reimbursed for 4 hour ride outs at up to 344 ride outs for the contract period, to be determined at the Court's discretion. Hourly off-duty deputy pay shall not exceed \$33.00/hour. The Court and the Sheriff's Department agree that there will be a reimbursement of \$250.00 per month for the Sheriff's Department's vehicles used to transport each team during the Night Light Program's activities. The \$250.00 per month vehicle reimbursement shall be included in the total amount due for the contract period of \$70,000.00.

5. Invoice

The Contractor agrees to submit an invoice on a monthly basis, no later than fifteen days following the time for which services are being charged in the invoice.

The invoice shall state with specificity the number of units performed, the cost of each unit, and the total amount of reimbursement due for the period of time in which services are being charged.

6. Termination

- a. Either party may cancel this agreement by giving written notice to the other party at least thirty (30) days in advance of a specified date of termination.
- b. Termination of this agreement may occur in the event funds from local, state or federal sources are not obtained and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to allow for the purchase of the indicated quality of service, in which case the obligations of each party hereunder shall be terminated immediately upon receipt of written notice.
- c. The Court may terminate this contract at any time for good cause, at the Court's discretion.

7. Confidentiality Clause

All information that the Contractor may acquire from the Court, in conjunction with the Contractor's services, is confidential and is not to be transferred or disclosed to any other without the specific, written consent of the Court.

8. Other Provisions

- a. Payment for contractual obligations of the Court is contingent upon funds being appropriated, budgeted or otherwise made available by COMBAT, and the provisions of this agreement will become effective only when the funds appropriated for the purpose of compensating Contractor become available to the Court for disbursement.
- b. Any notification under this agreement shall be made to:

Any written notice shall be sent by certified mail, first class, postage paid, and the notice shall be effective upon deposit with the U.S. Postal Service.

- c. This agreement does not establish a master/servant or employer/employee relationship. It is intended between the parties that the Contractor is an independent contractor. Further it is understood as follows:
 - 1) The methods to be employed by the Contractor will be decided upon by the Contractor and not by the Court. The Court will not have any control over the Contractor, except to perform according to this agreement.
 - 2) The Contractor will pay any amounts due as a result of the Federal Insurance Contribution Act ("FICA"), the Federal Unemployment Act ("FUTA"), applicable federal, state, and local income tax liabilities, and all workers' compensation laws, and will furnish proof of the payment in a reasonable form as requested by the Court.
 - 3) The Court does not have mandatory rules of conduct for the Contractor.
 - 4) The Contractor will not be treated as an employee with respect to the services performed under this agreement for federal, state or local income tax purposes.
 - 5) For reporting purposes, the Contractor's taxpayer identification number or in lieu thereof, the Contractor's social security number is <u>44-6000524</u>.
- d. All documents, manuals, and property belonging to the Court, and used by the Contractor, shall be returned to the Court on demand and in no event later than the last day of this term of this agreement. All information obtained by the Contractor from other sources, used in providing services under this contract, is the exclusive property of the Court, and shall be returned to the Court as provided above.
- e. As an independent contractor, the Contractor assumes full responsibility and liability for any damages, claims, losses, costs, actions, and causes of action, whether or not now known or contemplated, including reasonable attorney fees and investigation costs, arising out of the acts, omissions or errors of the Contractor, its employees, agents, independent contractors and/or staff assigned to the Court pursuant to this contract. This

provision of this agreement is intended solely for the benefit of the parties to this contract. Nothing in this contract will be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of Jackson County, Missouri, the State of Missouri, and/or the 16th Judicial Circuit of Missouri.

The Contractor hereby releases and agrees to hold harmless and to indemnify the 16th Judicial Circuit of Missouri, Jackson County, Missouri, the State of Missouri, and their respective employees, agents and/or representatives from any and all liability, actions, causes of action, claims, demands, and damages, whether or not now known or contemplated, arising out of the acts, omissions or errors of the Contractor, its officers, employees, agents, independent contractors and/or staff assigned to the Court pursuant to this contract. Such indemnification shall include, but is not limited to, all reasonable costs of defending any such claims, including reasonable attorney fees, court costs and other associated costs of defending any such claims which may be brought against the Court, the 16th Judicial Circuit of Missouri, Jackson County, Missouri, the State of Missouri, and their respective employees, agents, and/or representatives.

- f. The parties agree that this contract shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri without regard to Missouri's choice of law rules, and that Missouri shall be the forum state for all legal proceedings arising out of this agreement.
- g. If any clause or provision in this agreement shall be adjudged invalid or unenforceable, it shall not affect the validity of any other clause or provision, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- h. Waiver by either party of any term, covenant, or condition in this agreement shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or of any other term, covenant, or condition. No term, covenant, or condition of this agreement can be waived except by written consent, and forbearance or indulgence in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver.
- i. Contractor certifies, by signing this agreement, that all employees of Contractor are legally eligible to work within the United States. Contractor shall provide proof of legal eligibility upon request by the Family Court.

This agreement, and the terms and conditions of the Court's purchase order, contain the entire agreement between the parties to this contract with respect to the matters covered herein, and supersede all proposals and other communication of the parties to this contract. No other agreements, representations or warranties, oral or written, have been made or are being made by, or on behalf of, the parties to this agreement.

EXHIBIT A

Night Light Program Description

The Night Light Program (NLP) is a collaborative effort between the Jackson County Family Court and local law enforcement agencies, and is designed to address serious and potentially violent juvenile offenders who are either under pre-adjudication supervision, on probation, or re-entering the community from residential placements. The Night Light Program serves primarily as a probation/re-entry service provider of supervision and coordinated services, and is utilized as a graduate sanction to assist primary Juvenile Probation Officers in maintaining or stabilizing youth in the community.

The goals of the Night Light Program are to hold youth accountable for their actions, reduce delinquent behavior, and encourage sound social decision-making behavior. Each NLP Juvenile Probation Officer teams with at least one uniformed Deputy Sheriff two nights per week. Monday through Thursday these teams are in the community from 9:00 pm until 1:00 am. On Friday and Saturday these teams are in the community from 10:00pm until 1:00am. During these timeframes the teams make home visits to pre and post adjudicated youth under supervision of the Court who have been assessed to be failure to appear to next court hearing, high risk to re-offend or have their probation revoked. The Night Light Program also provides ancillary support to our residential programs by making curfew checks to youth on weekend home passes.

During the residence visit, the NLP Juvenile Probation Officer determines whether or not the youth is complying with the terms of their supervision.

WHEREAS, adjustments were made to the low bid for math errors and the information technology work allowance in the bid, in the amount of \$25,000.00, has been removed from the bid with this work being accomplished through other term and supply contracts; and,

WHEREAS, this bid exceeded the County requirements of five percent minimum with an MBE/WBE/VBE breakdown of eleven percent MBE, seven percent WBE, and six percent VBE; and,

WHEREAS, in the event that line item adjustments to the contract become necessary, it is appropriate that the Director of Public Works be authorized to approve said line item adjustments to the extent there is no additional cost to the County; now therefore,

Evaluation of Bid 4-16 Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical for Inmates

Prior to 2008 the Health Services Unit at Jackson County Department of Corrections (JCDC) was staffed by Truman Medical Center and operated like a satellite health care facility. In 2007 Jackson County went out to bid to contract with a health services provider that was focused on the needs of a correctional population. Contracted services began in 2008. As a result of the JCDC Task Force Report, presented to the Jackson County Legislature in October, 2015, the JCDC determined that a key element necessary to improve jail operations was to achieve American Corrections Association (ACA) Accreditation. Pursuant to that decision, and in keeping with the best practices as established by ACA, it is now necessary that JCDC begin the process for providing comprehensive health screenings to every inmate admitted to the facilities.

For the current RFP, two bids, one from Advanced Correctional Healthcare, and one from Correct Care Solutions, the current provider for JCDC, were submitted and evaluated. Evaluators were from the JCDC and the Jackson County Health Department. The table below shows the evaluation scores, and other pertinent information. The RFP included the requirement (RFP No. 4-16; Page 27 of 65; 9.17.4 Intake Staffing) that every new admission receive a comprehensive health screening by a Registered Nurse. This is a staff intensive operation (RFP No. 4-16; Page 26 of 65; 9.17.1 Staffing Plan – staffing tables shall meet or exceed current authorized staffing levels with regard to the types and number of health professionals...). In their proposals, CCS provides 31.65 full time staffs while ACH provides only 24.1 full time staffs. Currently CCS staffing is at 26.35, but this staffing level only provides health screenings for 50% to 60% of admissions to the facility.

A minimum of \$125,000 over the base contract fees (shown above) will be needed to cover special medications such as HIV and psychotropic medications, and services, such as x-rays, lab work and dialysis.

The current amendment, Res. 19076, that extends the existing contract with an increase in the base monthly rate ends on May 31, 2016. The new contract should go into effect on June 1, 2016. In order to fund the CCS bid for the remainder of 2016, an increase of \$399,074 is needed. Finance has already reserved \$250,000 in the 2016 Non Departmental Health Fund Contractual Services account in anticipation of a new contract. An additional \$149,074 will be needed. For the year 2017, with a 3% increase in June, a total of \$3,387,463 should be budgeted.

1 Cost and Staffing Overview

Correct Care Solutions (CCS) is pleased to provide the following cost proposal for the consideration of Jackson County. CCS has developed our cost proposal for the services required by RFP NO. 4-16 for Comprehensive Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical Services for the inmate populations of the Jackson County, Missouri Detention Center, the Regional Correctional Center and Kansas City Police Department arrestees. Additionally, we have reviewed the addendums and have utilized our knowledge of your program and Missouri state systems.

Our proposal is based on our extensive experience in Jackson County, our perspective on the needs of the patient population, competitive salary surveys for healthcare professionals in Jackson County, and our experience at multiple similarly sized facilities. We are proposing the following solution to best meet the County's specific needs. CCS is open to discussing our proposal in order to provide the optimal healthcare program for the County; at the same time, we are very confident in our understanding of your facility. With staffing comprising the vast majority of costs, we have looked intensely at the operations to ensure that we have the capacity to operate within the needs of the patient population and JCDOC expectations. Simply stated, our goal is to provide the County with the best healthcare services program that meets or exceeds your requirements. We look forward to discussing our proposal with you.

The proposed CCS staffing plan was developed consistent with your stated goals of program improvement and movement towards facility accreditation. The plan also recognizes significant changes that have already occurred within the facility such as the introduction of new arrestees from the Kansas City Police Department and the requirement to screen all inmates at intake, and seeks to provide staffing solutions to provide care for this added population.

CCS realizes this annual rate constitutes a significant investment in contract value for Jackson County. The cost of the additional staffing (discussed below) presents the vast majority of the increase over our current contract. Other factors include:

- Inmate ADP increased from 800 in our current contract to 952 in this contract
- Inclusion of a Performance Bond
- Addition of shift differentials for nursing staff and on-call pay for the dentist, per RFP requirement





With nearly all costs being fixed, the CCS proposal is based on this annual rate. The RFP requests pricing based on per diem costs. With an ADP of 952, the annual costs would average a Per Inmate Per Day rate of \$9.23. However, since fixed costs will not adjust with fluctuations in population, our proposal is for a contract in which invoicing will be monthly, based upon 1/12 of the annual rate, and payable within 45 days of billing to ensure timely subcontractor payment as outlined in RFP section 9.22.6.

We appreciate the opportunity to engage in discussion with JCDOC about this Cost Proposal.

Flexible Staffing Matrix

CCS will provide the County with a comprehensive healthcare staffing program consisting of qualified medical professionals. The following staffing matrix provides detailed staffing plans for the Jackson County Department of Corrections. This enhanced staffing plan represents an increase of 8.3 FTE which will allow for CCS to dedicate a RN and an LPN 24/7, to the intake screening process and the detox need of your increased admissions.

Please note that the exact days shown in the charts below are for illustrative purposes only and are flexible to meet the County's needs. We will work with the County to create an exact schedule which best maximizes the County's utilization of CCS's resources.

Enhancement Option

CCS proposed that, in addition to the staffing defined above, the contracted matrix include a Quality Assurance & Accreditation Nurse. This role would be filled by a Registered Nurse, who would work with current on-site leadership to monitor our processes through our Quality Improvement program, facilitate nurse training in policies and procedures to ensure appropriate and consistent care in accordance with accreditation standards.

The addition of this position would be \$95,000 incremental cost over our base pricing.

Intake Nursing

The CCS staffing matrix allows for one (1) Registered Nurse in intake at all times, with assistance by an LPN to ensure management of the detoxification population and peak intake times. The LPN is, according to licensure and industry standard, able to collect information and he or she will consult with the RN regarding any inmate who meets certain criteria for emergent and further evaluation.

Based on our operations in various sites and national standards, CCS is comfortable with this model, and we feel it is a more financially responsible model for Jackson County. However, we understand that JCDOC may prefer two RNs in intake instead of an LPN, based on the RFP. This would require replacing 4.2 LPNs (2.1 on Day Shift and 2.1 on Night Shift) with RNs, at an incremental cost of \$119,220 per year over our base pricing.

Comprehensive Medical, Dental, and Pharmaceutical Services

CCS will provide the County with a wide-ranging inmate healthcare program consisting of 31.65 equivalent full-time employees as well as comprehensive onsite medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services. CCS will also provide the County with healthcare policies and procedures, 24 hours a day on-call services, medical and office supplies, medical waste disposal, comprehensive medical malpractice insurance, an electronic medical records application (ERMA) as well as corporate management and oversight.

Pharmacy

Our proposal includes a comprehensive pharmacy program and management solution. This program includes medication prescribing, filling, dispensing, administration, accurate recordkeeping, reporting/invoicing, and quality assurance. CCS will be responsible for all the pharmaceutical costs incurred for County inmates, with the exception of certain medications that are included in the cap.

Electronic Medical Records Application (ERMA)

CCS will provide Jackson County with its electronic medical record application (EMRA) at no cost. This offering also includes installation of and any updates to our exclusive Electronic Records Management Application (ERMA) and Electronic Medication Administration Record (eMAR) during the life of the contract, along with related computer installations and software, as well as regular refreshing of computer hardware.

To ensure the facility receives the maximum benefit of ERMA, CCS would act in a consultative role regarding upgrades and expansion of internet coverage to areas where medical services are normally performed, but not for the cost of system upgrades. Additionally, we would require an interface with your JMS systems. We understand currently there are separate JMS systems documenting inmate information for the County inmates and the Municipal inmates. CCS will not bear any costs that the county or city might incur in the building of this interface.

Performance Bond

CCS understands the mandatory RFP requirement of a performance bond. The cost of issuing and maintaining the bond is \$44,553.00 annually. If the county elects to waive the requirement of the bond in recognition of CCS's continuation of satisfactory performance, CCS will remove this amount from our annual costs.

Pricing Assumptions

The proposed prices reflect the scope of care as outlined in our technical proposal, in the RFP requirements, and based on the current community standard of care with regard to correctional healthcare services. Should there be any change in or modification of the local, national, or community standards of care or scope of services, court rulings or interpretation, state or federal law or statute, or interpretation thereof that results in sustained and material increase in costs, coverage of costs related to such changes are not included in this proposal and may need to be negotiated with Jackson County.

Annual Adjustments – Renewal Pricing

CCS agrees that the contract length shall be 36 months with two (2) 12 month options. The annual cost presented in this price quote will remain in effect through the initial 12-month period. CCS proposes an annual increase based upon the medical component of the Consumer Price Index, not to exceed 3 percent per year.



2 Per Diem Adjustments

This proposal is based on a base average daily population (ADP) of 952 total inmates. If, in any calendar month, the County ADP exceeds 1050 inmates, the County will pay CCS a per diem of \$.73 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly. If, in any calendar month, the ADP falls below 850 inmates, CCS will credit the County a per diem of \$.73 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly. As mentioned above, the majority of expenses are fixed costs related to staffing, as reflected by this minimal per diem rate.

This per diem is intended to cover additional costs in those instances where short-term changes in the inmate population result in higher utilizations of routine supplies and services. However, the per diem is not intended to provide for any additional fixed costs, such as new staffing positions, which might prove necessary if the inmate population grows significantly and if the population increase is sustained. In such cases, CCS reserves the right to negotiate for a contract price increase in order to maintain the same high quality of care for the increased inmate population. If the County experiences a sustained decrease in inmate population, CCS is open to discussing changes in staffing levels to better reflect the normalized inmate population.

3 Aggregate Capitation Limits

Aggregate Cap with County Rebate

CCS will incur the first \$100,000 in costs associated with healthcare services defined under its Aggregate Cap (Cap 1). Such services under the annual Aggregate Cap include all pharmaceuticals for municipal inmates; HIV, Hepatitis, mental health, cancer, and court-ordered pharmaceuticals for county and municipal inmates; onsite and offsite laboratory services; onsite and offsite radiology services; and onsite and offsite dialysis. Any expenses incurred for such services in excess of \$100,000 per year will be the responsibility of the County. Should the costs associated with the provision of healthcare services listed above not exceed \$100,000 in the aggregate in any contract year, CCS shall reimburse the County at a rate of 100% of the difference between the actual cost to CCS for these services and the \$100,000 Aggregate Cap.

We thank you for the opportunity to present this Cost Proposal in conjunction with our Technical Proposal. CCS truly values our partnership in Jackson County, and we respectfully ask to continue this partnership. We welcome discussion on this or any aspect of our proposal.
