





Section 1. A conditional use permit is hereby renewed for a period of twenty years for a monopole communication tower, as to an approximate .15 <u>+</u> acre tract of land commonly known as 2120 N. Twyman Road, Independence, MO, and specifically described as follows:

Description: An 80 foot by 80 foot Tower Parcel, situated in the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 23, Township 50 North, Range 31, West in Jackson County, Missouri, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the Northwest Corner of the said Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (Fid. Axle); thence along the West line of said Quarter Quarter, South 00 degrees, 04 minutes, 16 seconds West, a distance of 145.08 feet; thence leaving said West line, North 90 degrees, 00, minutes, 00 seconds East, a distance of 310.48 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence continuing North 90 degrees, 00, minutes, 00 seconds East, a distance of 80.00 feet; thence South 00 degrees, 00 minutes, 00 seconds East, a distance of 80 feet; thence North 90 degrees, 00, minutes, 00 seconds West, a distance of 80.00 feet; thence North 00 degrees, 00 minutes, 00 seconds West, a distance of 80 feet to the point of Beginning. - 3. The lattice tower shall be structurally designed so that at least four (4) other wireless co locators would be allowed space on the tower.
- 4. The lattice tower shall be galvanized finish or painted gray or light blue unless other standards are required by the Federal Aviation Agency.
- 5. The lattice tower shall only be illuminated if required by the Federal Communication Commission and/or the Federal Aviation Agency.
- 6. Any antenna or tower that is not operated for a continuous period of twelve (12) months shall be considered abandoned and the owner of such antenna/tower or property owner shall remove the antenna or tower within 90 days.

Mr. Antey: Is there anyone who is opposed or has questions regarding this application?

William Bohnert, Jr. 2423 N Twyman Road, I've been a neighbor of the tower for 20 years. I was at the last hearing. I feel they haven't been a good neighbor. There isn't a fence around the property. This allows individuals to cross in front of the tower and enter the property to the west and set up targets to shoot. There's no fencing at the road for this facility. We were promised it would be screened with trees. There are no trees on the South side. It's supposed to be painted gray, however it's painted red and white. There's a proliferation of antennas on top. There's supposed to be collaboration with the School District. I wanted to know if any of these issues would be addressed.

Mr. Antey: As for the security issue, the application is only for 6,400 square feet, which is the fenced in area of the compound. The whole parcel of land wouldn't be secured, just the facility.

Mr. Tarpley: What is the size of the lot outside the fenced area?

Mr. Bohnert: The parcel is about 5 acres in size.

Mr. Tarpley: What would you recommend to satisfy your concerns?

Mr. Bohnert: There's no security at the road to stop people from going across to hunt or shoot at targets.

Mr. Antey: So if the tower wasn't there, there would be no hunting or shooting?

Mr. Bohnert: If there was a gate at the road.

Mr. Antey: If the land was vacant and didn't have a gate? How does the proposed use of the property, that small usage, how would that influence someone coming onto the property? Wherever there is not a gate. I understand your concern with firearms in the proximity of the school, I don't know if the cell tower or its facilities have any bearing on that.

Mr. Bohnert: Trespassers go right through the gate at the cell tower.

Mr. Tarpley: Is that a legal range or just people shooting?

Mr. Bohnert: That property has changed hands, I do have pictures of tracts through the property.

Mr. Haley: Has anyone talked to the Sheriff's Office about that?

Mr. Bohnert: My brother thought that someone fired past their house reported it to the Sheriff's Office.

Mr. Crawford: How often does this happen?

Mr. Bohnert: Not as frequently as before.

Mr. Crawford: Do believe this driveway would be here if it wasn't for the cell tower?

Mr. Bohnert: There's no reason for it to be there.

Mr. Crawford: It there any other access to the property?

Mr. Bohnert: There's no fence, so someone could just drive across it.

Mr. Crawford: So the only reason for the driveway is for the cell tower?

Mr. Bohnert: It was originally access to the property. There was a house there a long time ago.

Mr. Crawford: Where is your property?

Mr. Bohnert: I have property to the north, the family farm. My sister lives north on the tower. I live about a quarter mile on the east side of the road.

Mr. Tarpley: Which direction are the people shooing?

Mr. Bohnert: To the north.

Mr. Tarpley: Are they setting up targets?

Mr. Bohnert: They set them up.

Mr. Haley: It sound more like a law enforcement issue.

Mr. Antey: Is there anyone who has questions regarding this application?

Mr. Antey: I have a couple of questions for the applicant's representative and also for Randy. The color of the tower, is it required?

Mr. Diehl: I believe it is a requirement of either the FCC or FAA.

Mr. Antey: Is the color is required by the FAA.

Mr. Holland: Normally when a tower is marked like this, it is requirement by the FAA. There is a rule that if it's over 200 feet, it needs to be lit. In certain cases, towers would need to be painted. I can't answer the question of why it's painted red and white. I will have to find out the answer to that. My assumption is that, it's required by the FAA for other reasoning. It cases of being near an airport, the rules would be more restrictive. It

may be required for those types of reasons. I will find out from my client, why it is painted these colors. They did not initially build the tower, they acquired it. With regards to the access, I think your comments were to the point. We only control the small compound area. We don't control the remainder of the parent parcel. To the extent that this is happening, we have no control other that, it's a separate issue with the land owner. That people travelling across the property and shooting guns, has no relationship with the tower being there. That would be a law enforcement issue.

Mr. Crawford: I understand that this small parcel outlined in blue is what we are talking about, who maintains the driveway?

Mr. Holland: The driveway serves the facility and is maintained by Crown Castle pursuant to the easement.

Mr. Crawford: Without a gate, I can see where this gentleman is coming from.

Mr. Holland: If I heard right, there a people traveling across the property, outside of our fenced and secured area. I don't if they are driving or walking across the property. It's not normal for us to provide a fence or gate at the property entrance. I don't know how a gate without a fence would stop anybody from crossing over it. We do gate and secure the compound area. All our equipment is within that fenced area. We are concerned with people having access with our facility and we don't have this issue here. What happens on the remainder of the property is something we can control. The focus here today is whether or not the conditions of the permit are being met. I believe we are in compliance with the conditions set forth. There is a continuing need for the facility, it serves its purpose and provides wireless service. Most people now have some sort of device that require antennas. You can't, under law, regulate the kind of antennas, or how many or added. Those are technological issues regulated by the FCC, and federal law doesn't along local jurisdictions to delve into those questions or issues. This is no different than the hundreds of thousands of towers all over the county. The antennas are no different than anywhere else.

Mr. Tarpley: Are there are general maintenance requirements?

Mr. Holland: Is most cases we would rather not have it painted because of the maintenance. We would typically use a galvanized pole, which doesn't require the maintenance or the coloring. We prefer not to paint them, unless required to do so. These are unmanned facilities, however they do receive regular maintenance by technicians for adjustments, additions and changes as respect to the equipment. There is always upgrades, equipment changes and improvements.

Mr. Haley: Item 4 states that it will be painted.

Mr. Antey: The FAA would supersede any requirements and I suspect that is the case.

Mr. Holland: I will ask my client for any information regarding the paint.

Mr. Crawford: Mr. Bohnert, if the driveway wasn't there, is there a ditch that prevent people from crossing over?

Mr. Bohnert: It would be a deterrent, unless you had a four wheel drive or ATV.

Mr. Crawford: Are there any trees that would prevent someone from crossing?

Mr. Bohnert: There are some.

Mr. Crawford: Would you be opposed to putting a gate on the driveway?

Mr. Holland: I can't answer that question without speaking to my client. I think it's speculation to attribute trespassing on the parent parcel and the areas outside the portion outside of our control and the driveway to the facility. We have a non-exclusive easement to use the driveway. Yes, we maintain it. Again, I would need to check with my client to see there is a true reason to add a gate. I'm not sure how effective that would be from stopping people from using it. If people want to cross the property and shoot they'll find a way.

Mr. Tarpley: I would like to address to Counsel. Isn't there a liability if someone puts up a gate? A property owner could be liable if someone hits it of a chain?

Mr. Haden: Anyone can sue anyone for anything. A gate that just blocks a road where the access is to step around it, I question there would be any liability over that. All it's doing is preventing a vehicle from getting in there. I'm thinking that Mr. Hollands client doesn't have the right to put a gate up there.

Mr. Tarpley: My point exactly. Mr. Bohnert should approach the land owner, the applicant only has control over a very small portion of the land.

Mr. Haden: The applicant has an easement and an agreement to maintain it. I doubt the agreement has the right to instill a gate.

Mr. Holland: It's non-exclusive, and putting a up gate would make it exclusive.

Mr. Antey: I would like see if there is anyone who would like to testify.

Mr. Tarpley: I would like to ask (Mr. Bohnert), have you talked to the owner of the property?

Mr. Bohnert: The owners a live out of state.

Mr. Tarpley: Do think a gate would keep people from crossing the property?

Mr. Bohnert: Personally, yes

Mr. Tarpley: The problem is that the applicant doesn't control the property.

Mr. Antey: That's the issued that I have, if the property owner quit using this and the tower was removed, and now there's an empty tract of land. The owner used it for access for a tractor, he probably wouldn't have a gate. The trespass wouldn't cease due to the cell tower being gone.

Mr. Holland: By law the owner has a right to have access onto the property. Whether a gate exists or not, that won't stop people from accessing it. I believe the solution for the trespass is law enforcement.

Mr. Antey: It there any new evidence. We've discussed the paint, the gate and the activity going on across it.

Mr. Bohnert: I would like to mention that the original plan was to be a silver colored tower with no light on it. Why do we have a distraction of a light close to my sister's home. The flashing lights causes sleeping problems.

Mr. Antey: I think that's an avenue we need to address within the conditions of this permit. The color should be grey Unless required by the FAA. If that's the reason, I can't imagine the applicant taking it upon themselves to paint it red and white and put a beacon on the top of it. Let's spend the extra money to do that. If we find that there is no justification from the FAA, then it's out of compliance with these conditions.

Mr. Haden: Randy are those conditions within the current permit?

Mr. Diehl: Yes

Mr. Antey: Are there any more questions for the applicant?

Mr. Crawford: I move we take this under advisement.

Mr. Gibler: I second

Mr. Haden: I suggest that if you are requiring any addition information from the applicant, you want to keep it open for the additional evidence.

Mr. Holland: I agree with the Chairman, that more than likely the paint and beacon exist due to FAA requirements, and if not, then it should be painted and the beacon disabled.

Mr. Antey: Hold on, we have a motion and a second on the floor. We need to approve that or not and go back into the public hearing.

Mr. Crawford: I still would like to go into advisement.

Mr. Antey: All in favor of going into advisement?

All: Aye, no Nay

Mr. Antey: I think we have all the conditions in place. If it's found that the tower shouldn't be painted, then that's an enforcement issue. As for the gate, it's a right to have easy access. And I think that just because there's a small facility on it, doesn't have anything to do with the fact that people are accessing the property illegally. I don't think that a secured gate makes a difference. They'll find a way to get on there.

Mr. Haley: The conditions hold, I'm happy.

Mr. Crawford: I do agree. There's two issues, the paint on the tower and the driveway.

Mr. Chairman, I move to come out of advisement.

Mr. Tarpley: I second

Mr. Antey: All in favor of coming out of advisement?

Mr. Haden: I would think that Mr. Holland will check with his client and advise staff.







AN ORDINANCE approving a conditional use permit for the construction of a 160-foot monopole commercial communication tower.

ORDINANCE 2655, April 8, 1997

INTRODUCED BY Dennis Waits, County Legislator

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. A conditional use permit for 20 years for the construction of a 160-foot monopole commercial communication tower, subject to restrictions attached, under the Unified Development Code, is hereby approved as to a certain tract of land described as follows:

A 4 \pm acre tract generally located north of US Highway 24 on the west side of Twyman Road and more specifically,

Commencing at the southwest corner of the north one-half of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 23, Township 50, Range 31, Jackson County, Missouri; thence N 02°02'21" E along the west line of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said Section 23, a distance of 278.38 feet to a point; thence S 87°57'39" E, perpendicular to the last described course, a distance of 60.00 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence N 02°02'21" E, parallel to the west line of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said Section 23, a distance of 400.00 feet to a point; thence S 87°57'39" E, a distance of 439.31 feet to a point in the centerline of Twyman Road as now established; thence S 02°03'55" W, along the centerline of said Twyman Road, a distance of 400.00 feet to a point; thence N 87°57'39" W, perpendicular to the west line of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said Section 23, a distance of 439.12 feet to the point of beginning, and containing 175,686.15 square feet, more or less.

Section 2. The Legislature, pursuant to the application of Sprint PCS (CU-97-017), requesting approval embodied in this ordinance and with notice that the Jackson County Planning Commission favorably recommended approval of this application in a public hearing on March 20, 1997, does adopt this ordinance pursuant to the Jackson County Charter authorizing the Legislature to exercise legislative power pertaining to planning and zoning.

Effective Date: This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its signature by the County Executive.





ATTACHMENT TO RLA CU-97-017 (SPRINT PCS)

A CUP for a Twenty (20) year period subject to:

- The commercial communication monopole shall not exceed a height of 160 feet as measured from ground level.
- The monopole and appurtenances shall be installed according to manufacturers specifications using sound engineering and safety practices.
- The building permit application shall include an engineering report specifying the following information:
 - (a) Detailed Structural plans for the monopole tower signed and sealed by a Missouri Registered Engineer; and
 - (b) An engineer's certification that anticipated levels of electro magnetic radiation to be generated by facilities on the site, including the effective radiated power (ERP) or the antenna, shall be within the guidelines established by the Federal Communication Commission (FCC)
- 4. An evergreen pine with a minimum three inches caliber at three feet (3') above the grade shall be planted on 10 foot centers along the perimeter of the chain link fence for the tower compound area.
- A Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration of Objects that may effect the Navigable Airspace must be filed with the Federal Aviation Agency (FAA). Information regarding the disposition of the FAA Notice will be submitted subsequent to application for a building permit.
- 6. The monopole tower shall be structurally designed so that at least three users would be allowed space on the tower. The applicant shall make a good faith effort to offer space to the Jackson County Sheriff's Department and Fort Osage School District. The County Legislature shall have the right to revoke the conditional use permit if such offering is not made.
- The monopole tower shall be a galvanized finish or painted gray or light blue unless other standards are required by the Federal Aviation Agency.
- The monopole tower shall only be illuminated as required by the Federal Communications
 Commission and/or the Federal Aviation Agency.
- Any antenna or monopole that is not operated for a continuous period of twelve (12) months shall be considered abandoned, and the owner of such antenna/tower or property owner shall remove the antenna or tower within 90 days.

Prohibited acts by authority.

- 67.5094. In order to ensure uniformity across the state of Missouri with respect to the consideration of every application, an authority shall not:
- (1) Require an applicant to submit information about, or evaluate an applicant's business decisions with respect to its designed service, customer demand for service, or quality of its service to or from a particular area or site;
- (2) Evaluate an application based on the availability of other potential locations for the placement of wireless support structures or wireless facilities, including without limitation the option to collocate instead of construct a new wireless support structure or for substantial modifications of a support structure, or vice versa; provided, however, that solely with respect to an application for a new wireless support structure, an authority may require an applicant to state in such applicant's application that it conducted an analysis of available collocation opportunities on existing wireless towers within the same search ring defined by the applicant, solely for the purpose of confirming that an applicant undertook such an analysis; for collocation to any certified historic structure as defined in section 253,545, in addition to all other applicable time requirements, there shall be a thirty-day time period before approval of an application. During such time period, an authority shall hold one or more public hearings on collocation to a certified historic structure;
- (3) Dictate the type of wireless facilities, infrastructure or technology to be used by the applicant, including, but not limited to, requiring an applicant to construct a distributed antenna system in lieu of constructing a new wireless support structure;
 - (4) Require the removal of existing wireless support structures or wireless facilities, wherever located, as a condition for approval of an application;
- (5) With respect to radio frequency emissions, impose environmental testing, sampling, or monitoring requirements or other compliance measures on wireless facilities that are categorically excluded under the Federal Communication Commission's rules for radio frequency emissions under 47 CFR 1.1307(b)(1) or other applicable federal law, as the same may be amended or supplemented;
 - (6) Establish or enforce regulations or procedures for RF signal strength or the adequacy of service quality;
- (7) Establish or enforce regulations or procedures for environmental safety for any wireless communications facility that is inconsistent with or in excess of those required by OET Bulletin 65, entitled Evaluating Compliance with FCC Guidelines for Human Exposure to Radio Frequency Electromagnetic Fields, Edition 97-01, released August, 1997, and Supplement A: Additional Information for Radio and Television Broadcast Stations;
- (8) In conformance with 47 U.S.C. Section 332(c)(7)(b)(4), reject an application, in whole or in part, based on perceived or alleged environmental effects of radio frequency emissions;
- (9) Impose any restrictions with respect to objects in navigable airspace that are greater than or in conflict with the restrictions imposed by the Federal Aviation Administration:
 - (10) Prohibit the placement of emergency power systems that comply with federal and state environmental requirements;
- (11) Charge an application fee, consulting fee, or other fee associated with the submission, review, processing, and approval of an application that is not required for similar types of commercial development within the authority's jurisdiction. Fees imposed by an authority for or directly by a third-party entity providing review or technical consultation to the authority must be based on actual, direct, and reasonable administrative costs incurred for the review, processing, and approval of an application. Except when mutually agreeable to the applicant and the authority, total charges and fees shall not exceed five hundred dollars for a collocation application or one thousand five hundred dollars for an application for a new wireless support structure or for a substantial modification of a wireless support structure. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event shall an authority or any third-party entity include within its charges any travel expenses incurred in a third-party's review of an application and in no event shall an applicant be required to pay or reimburse an authority for consultation or other third-party fees based on a contingency or result-based arrangement;
- (12) Impose surety requirements, including bonds, escrow deposits, letters of credit, or any other type of financial surety, to ensure that abandoned or unused facilities can be removed unless the authority imposes similar requirements on other permits for other types of commercial development or land uses;
- (13) Condition the approval of an application on the applicant's agreement to provide space on or near the wireless support structure for authority or local governmental services at less than the market rate for space or to provide other services via the structure or facilities at less than the market rate for such services;
 - (14) Limit the duration of the approval of an application;
- (15) Discriminate or create a preference on the basis of the ownership, including ownership by the authority, of any property, structure, or tower when promulgating rules or procedures for siting wheless facilities or for evaluating applications;
- (16) Impose any requirements or obligations regarding the presentation or appearance of facilities, including, but not limited to, those relating to the kind or type of materials used and those relating to arranging, screening, or landscaping of facilities if such regulations or obligations are unreasonable;
- (17) Impose any requirements that an applicant purchase, subscribe to, use, or employ facilities, networks, or services owned, provided, or operated by an authority, in whole or in part, or by any entity in which an authority has a competitive, economic, financial, governance, or other interest;
- (18) Condition the approval of an application on, or otherwise require, the applicant's agreement to Indemnify or insure the authority in connection with the authority's exercise of its police power-based regulations; or
- (19) Condition or require the approval of an application based on the applicant's agreement to permit any wireless facilities provided or operated, in whole or in part, by an authority or by any entity in which an authority has a competitive, economic, financial, governance, or other interest, to be placed at or collocated with the applicant's wireless support structure.

AGREEMENT FOR REAL ESTATE APPRAISAL SERVICES RFQ 2017-306-3

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 15th day of February 2017, by and between the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri (hereinafter "City"), and Bliss Associates, LLC (hereinafter "Service Provider").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City intends to have services for real estate appraisals; and

WHEREAS, Service Provider has submitted a proposal for appraisal services and standard fee schedule to perform said services; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager is authorized and empowered by City to execute contracts providing for real estate appraisal services; and

WHEREAS, City desires to enter into an agreement with Service Provider to perform the services as aforementioned; and

WHEREAS, Service Provider represents that the firm is equipped, competent, and able to undertake such an assignment.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and considerations herein contained, IT IS HEREBY AGREED by the parties hereto as follows:

ARTICLE | SCOPE OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY SERVICE PROVIDER

Service Provider shall provide the following services to the City on an as-needed basis.

Perform real estate appraisals for the purposes of market value. All appraisals must be performed in accordance with the *Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice*.

Provide appraisals for Local, State and Federally funded projects.

Provide review appraisals for Local, State and Federally funded projects.

Negotiate and acquire right-of-way, easements and fee simple property.

Provide expert testimony in eminent domain cases as required.

ARTICLE II SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY MEMORANDUM OF AUTHORIZATION

In the event Service Provider is engaged to provide services, City and Service Provider shall enter into a written memorandum of authorization describing (a) the scope of services to be provided by Service Provider and City, (b) compensation to the Service Provider for services to be provided, (c) required deliverables or products from the Service Provider to the City, and (d) completion times for said services. The compensation to be paid Service Provider pursuant to any memorandum of authorization shall be at

the rates set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. In no event is any work in excess of that described in Article I above authorized by this Agreement without City and Service Provider first entering into a written modification.

ARTICLE III LIMITATIONS AND PROCEDURES RELATED TO ON CALL SERVICES

On-call services shall only be provided after written approval of the requested services is provided by the Department Director (or designee) of the Department requesting the services. Such approval shall only be given when sufficient budgeted amounts are available to cover the cost of the services. The city will issue a Purchase Order to authorize work.

ARTICLE IV PAYMENTS TO THE SERVICE PROVIDER

For the services performed by Service Provider pursuant to this Agreement, or any modifications thereto, and as full compensation therefore, and for all expenditures made and all expenses incurred by Service Provider in connection with this Agreement, or any modifications thereto, except as otherwise expressly provided herein, subject to and in conformance with all provisions of this Agreement, City will pay Service Provider according to the following provisions:

- A. The cost of all on-call services covered under Article I shall be billed at the rates set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Expenses incurred to provide the on-call services shall be billed as set forth in Exhibit A.
- B. The City shall make payment to Service Provider within a period not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date an acceptable and accurate invoice is received by City. All invoices shall contain the following information:
 - 1. Name or Description of Agreement/RFQ Number/Project and/or Task Name
 - 2. Invoice Number and Date.
 - 3 City Purchase Order Number.
 - 4. Itemized statement of labor (including personnel description, title or classification for each person on the project, hours worked, hourly rate, and amount), itemized reimbursable expenses, and invoice total.

All moneys not paid when due as provided herein shall bear interest at a per annum rate equal to one percent (1%) plus the average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)-U.S. City Average for the time period in which payment is past due; provided, however, that in no event will the amount of interest to be paid by the City exceed 9% per annum.

ARTICLE V TERM

INSURANCE

Service Provider shall maintain at its expense the following insurance coverage during the period of the Agreement and will provide City with certificates of insurance on all required coverage prior to commencement of any services performed pursuant to this Agreement:

A. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

The Service Provider shall secure and maintain, throughout the duration of this contract, insurance of such types and in at least the amounts that are required herein. Service Provider shall provide certificate(s) of insurance confirming the required protection on an ACORD 25 (or equivalent form). The City shall be notified by receipt of written notice from the insurer at least thirty (30) days prior to material modification or cancellation of any policy listed on the certificate(s). The City reserves the right to require formal copies of any Additional Insured endorsement, as well as the right to require completed copies of all insuring policies applicable to the project. The cost of such insurance shall be included in the Service Provider's rates.

B. NOTICE OF CLAIM

The Service Provider shall upon receipt of notice of any claim in connection with this contract promptly notify the City, providing full details thereof, including an estimate of the amount of loss or liability. The Service Provider shall also promptly notify the City of any reduction in limits of protection afforded under any policy listed in the certificate(s) of insurance in excess of \$10,000.00, whether or not such impairment came about as a result of this contract. If the City shall subsequently determine that the Service Provider's aggregate limits of protection shall have been impaired or reduced to such extent that they are inadequate for the balance of the project, the Service Provider shall, upon notice from the City, promptly reinstate the original limits of liability required hereunder and shall furnish evidence thereof to the City.

C. INDUSTRY RATING

The City will only accept coverage from an insurance carrier who offers proof that it is licensed to do business in the State of Missouri; carries a Best's policyholder rating of "A" or better; carries at least a Class VII financial rating or is a company mutually agreed upon by the City and the Service Provider.

- 6. When "City" is utilized, this includes its officers, employees and volunteers in respect to their duties for the City.

ARTICLE VII MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

The following miscellaneous provisions are agreed to by both parties to this Agreement:

- A. COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES: Service Provider warrants that Service Provider has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the Service Provider, to solicit or secure this Agreement, and that Service Provider has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than bona fide employee, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, the City shall have the right to annul this Agreement without liability or, at its discretion, to deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee
- B. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS: Payment by City to Service Provider as aforesaid in Article II shall vest in City title to all drawings, sketches, studies, analyses, reports, and other paper, documents, computer files, and material produced by Service Provider exclusively for the services performed pursuant to this Agreement up to the time of such payments, and the right to use the same without other or further compensation
- C. MODIFICATIONS TO AGREEMENT: In the event of any changes in the scope of services contained in this Agreement, prior to commencing the services City and Service Provider shall enter into a modification of this Agreement or a Memorandum of Authorization describing the services to be provided by Service Provider and City, and the compensation and completion times for said services.
- D. TERMINATION: In the event of termination by City, if there are any services hereunder in progress but not completed as of the date of termination, then said Agreement may be extended upon written approval of the City until said services are completed and accepted
 - 1. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>: The services called for by this Agreement or any supplements thereto may be terminated upon request and for the convenience of City upon thirty (30) days

- advance written notice. City shall pay Service Provider for all services rendered up to the date of termination.
- 2. <u>Termination for Cause</u>: This Agreement may also be terminated for cause by City or Service Provider. Termination for cause shall be preceded by a fourteen-(14) day correction period effective upon delivery of written notice. City shall pay Service Provider for all services rendered up to the date of termination. In the event of termination for cause by City, compensation for services rendered by Service Provider up to the date of termination shall be offset by City's reasonable cost to mitigate or correct the effects of such termination.
- 3. Termination Due to Unavailability of Funds in Succeeding Fiscal Years: When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of projects in a subsequent fiscal year, this Agreement shall be terminated and Service Provider shall be reimbursed for the services rendered up to the date of termination plus the reasonable value of any nonrecurring costs incurred by Service Provider but not amortized in the price of the services delivered under this Agreement.
- E. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS: Service Provider shall comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the services. Service Provider shall secure all licenses, permits, etc. from public and private sources necessary for the fulfillment of its obligations under this Agreement. Compliance with Section 285.530.2, RSMo (E-verify enrollment), shall be required if applicable.
- F. SUBLETTING ASSIGNMENT OR TRANSFER: Service Provider shall not sublet, assign, or transfer any interest in the services covered by this Agreement, except as provided for herein and except with the prior written consent of City. The use of subcontractors shall in no way relieve Service Provider of his/her primary responsibility for the services. No approval will be necessary for non-professional services such as reproductions, printing, materials, and other services normally performed or provided by others.
- G. CONFERENCES, VISITS TO SITE, INSPECTION OF SERVICES: Upon reasonable advance notice and during normal business hours at Service Provider's place of business, representatives of City shall have the privilege of inspecting and reviewing the services being performed by Service Provider and consulting with him/her at such time. Conferences are to be held at the request of City or Service Provider.
- H. INSPECTION OF DOCUMENTS: Service Provider shall maintain all records pertaining to its services hereunder for inspection, upon reasonable advance notice and during normal business hours at Service Provider's place of business, by a City representative during the contract period and for three (3) years from the date of final payment for each individual project performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- I. INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS: Service Provider shall indemnify and hold harmless City and its officers, employees, elected officials, and attorneys, each in their official and individual capacities, from and against judgments, damages, losses, expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors, omissions, or willful misconduct of Service Provider, or its employees, or subcontractors, in the performance of Service Provider's duties under this Agreement, or any supplements or amendments thereto.
- J. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY: In no event will City be liable to Service Provider for indirect or consequential damages, and in no event will City's liability under this Agreement exceed the amount to be paid to Service Provider pursuant to Article III of this Agreement.

- K. PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY: Service Provider will exercise reasonable skill, care, and diligence in the performance of its services in accordance with customarily accepted standards of practice. If Service Provider fails to meet the foregoing standard, Service Provider will perform at its own cost, and without reimbursement from City, the services necessary to correct errors and omissions that are caused by Service Provider's failure to comply with above standard, and that are reported to Service Provider within one year from the completion of Service Provider's services for each individual project performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- L. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to its subject matter, and any prior agreements, understandings, or other matters, whether oral or written, are of no further force or effect. This Agreement may be amended, changed, or supplemented only by written agreement executed by both of the parties hereto.
- M. CONFLICT: In the event of any conflict, ambiguity, or inconsistency between this Agreement and any other document that may be annexed hereto, the terms of this Agreement shall govern.
- N. GOVERNING LAW: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri.
- O. TAX EXEMPT: City and its agencies are exempt from State and local sales taxes. Sites of all transactions derived from this Agreement shall be deemed to have been accomplished within the State of Missouri.
- P. SAFETY: In the performance of its services, Service Provider shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act, as well as any pertinent Federal, State and/or local safety or environmental codes.
- Q. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE: Service Provider and its agents, employees, or subcontractors shall not in any way, directly or indirectly, discriminate against any person because of age, race, color, handicap, sex, national origin, or religious creed.
- R. DELAY IN PERFORMANCE: Neither City nor Service Provider shall be considered in default of this Agreement for delays in performance caused by circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the nonperforming party. For purposes of this Agreement, such circumstances include, but are not limited to, abnormal weather conditions, floods, earthquakes, fire, epidemics, war, riots, and other civil disturbances, strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns, and other labor disturbances, sabotage, judicial restraint, and delay in or inability to procure permits, licenses, or authorizations from any local, State, or Federal agency for any of the supplies, materials, accesses, or services required to be provided by either City or Service Provider under this Agreement. Service Provider and City shall be granted a reasonable extension of time for any delay in its performance caused by any such circumstances. Should such circumstances occur, the nonperforming party shall within a reasonable time of being prevented from performing, give written notice to the other party describing the circumstances preventing continued performance and the efforts being made to resume performance of the Agreement.
- S. NO THIRD-PARTY RIGHTS: The services provided for in this Agreement are for the sole use and benefit of City and Service Provider. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than City and Service Provider.
- T NOTICE: Whenever any notice is required by this Agreement to be made, given or transmitted to any party, it shall be enclosed in an envelope with sufficient postage attached to ensure delivery and deposited in the United States Mail, first class, with notices to City addressed to:

Jackson County Parks + Rec considers Rowdy Ribbits, LLC the sole source vendor to provide a Wibits Water Sports Park at the Longview Lake Beach during the 2017 season. A Wibits Water Sports Park features a series of rubber sealed air inflatables, which create a water based family entertainment center.

Rowdy Ribbits, LLC is the only vendor to approach Jackson County Parks + Rec, interested in offering this recreational water park. Rowdy Ribbits, LLC is owned and operated by Brittani Hatley from St. Joseph, MO. As the owner and operator of Rowdy Ribbits, LLC they are required to purchase and carry the required insurance associated with the operation of the water sports park. Beach admission will be paid by each participant, and as a part of this partnership a percentage of gross revenue from the sale of admission tickets, memorabilia and rentals will be shared with the Parks Department. This partnership will require no cost to the County. Rowdy Ribbits, LLC will be required to sign a contract, which will be negotiated by the County Counselor's office.

Recreation staff researched two of the major pool management companies in Missouri, USA Pool Management and Midwest Pool management; neither conducts this type of business. Barbara Casamento conducted her own research with no success in finding other vendors interested in partnering with the County. According to the national distributor of Wibits Equipment, Commercial Recreation Specialists, Rowdy Ribbits, LLC is the only company to have contacted them to purchase equipment for the construction of a Wibits Water Sports Park. Barbara Casamento, as well as the Recreation Superintendent, have personally been in contact with Pat Whelan, Product Sales Specialist from Commercial Recreation Specialists and verified this information. With this knowledge, we feel Rowdy Ribbits, LLC is the only vendor capable of providing this new exciting attraction at Longview Lake with no cost to the county.

Jackson County Parks + Rec would like to recommend Rowdy Ribbits, LLC as the sole source provider of a Wibits Water Sports Park at Longview Lake. We believe this would be a popular attraction, delivering an extraordinary beach experience and create a new stream of revenue for the Parks + Rec Department.



Rowdy Ribbit's Proposal for Longview Lake

Rowdy Ribbit's proposes to develop a seasonal Inflatable Sports Park at Longview Lake in Kansas City, Missouri. We will partner with Jackson County Parks + Rec to leverage the beach area and create a venue that will provide local residents and visitors with a unique, safe, fun, and active recreation option that will appeal to all age groups. We are also focused on providing youth groups, churches, and summer sports leagues with a great place for a team building opportunity. Our goal is to create a "Best of Class" attraction that delivers an unprecedented beach experience backed by a sustainable business model that is operationally sound and fiscally stable. To meet these goals, Rowdy Ribbit's will install a custom Wibit Sports Park with a capacity of up to 100 people. We will have activity zones that appeal to different ages and abilities, including a shallow water zone called the "Tadpole Pond", for smaller children unable to use the main Wibit attraction.

In exchange for use of the beach and lake area, Rowdy Ribbit's proposes a 10% profit share of gross revenue generated by the Wibit's Sport Park to be paid out on the first Monday of each month. Revenue will be tracked using state of the art software provided by FareHarbor. FareHarbor will also be the scheduling software used for beach guests to book their time at Rowdy Ribbit's. Jump times will begin at 1:30pm during the week and 11:30am on weekends. Guests will have the option of purchasing one hour for \$20 or two hours for \$25. Children 6 years and under will have access to the "Tadpole Pond" for no charge with the purchase of an adult admission to the Sports Park. Beach guests that do not wish to use the Sports Park but would like access to the shallow water zone or, "Tadpole Pond" may purchase a day pass for their children 6 years and younger for \$5 each. Parents will have access to the shallow water zone during the times their children are utilizing the area. We will also offer "corcl's" and "turbo paddlers" available to rent for \$5. Rowdy Ribbit's will use a color coded bracelet system to track guests in and out of the Sports Park.

Rowdy Ribbit's will maintain it's own staffing to include 2 certified life guards at all times. In addition to the lifeguards, there will be 3 support staff and a park manager to provide direction, assist with life jackets, and keep the park running smoothly. At the beginning of each session, guests will be read the rules and safety regulations of the park. Those will also be posted for guests to read. Any violation of those rules will result in dismissal from the park. Safety is our number one priority. A liability waiver will be required from any and all individuals using the inflatables or other equipment supplied by Rowdy Ribbit's. Our staff will have a small tent set up at the corner of the beach for guests to check-in, sign waivers, etc.

Rowdy Ribbit's will maintain a General Liability policy that indemnifies Jackson County Parks + Rec and the Army Corp of Engineers. The policy will include minimum coverages of \$2 million per occurance and an additional \$2 million general aggregate. Both mentioned parties will be listed as additional insured on this policy.



What kind of PVC material is available?

- 1. Reinforced (supported) PVC material is used for inflatable boats and also for Wibit products
 - Wibit products are made out of reinforced PVC which means it has a polyester mesh "sandwiched" between 2 layers of PVC sheets. The thickness of the 2 layers determines the weight of the reinforced PVC material.







day of	2017, by and between Jackson County Parks + Rec ("JCPR") and
	Rowdy Ribbits, LLC and its Owner Brittani Hatley residing at 13661 County
Road 355, Savannah,	MO 64485 ("RR").

WHEREAS, JCPR is a recreation department organized to provide quality, cost-effective recreation programs and facilities that reflect the needs of Jackson County residents and that add value to the Greater Metropolitan Community;

WHEREAS, RR is a business who is interested in partnering with JCPR to provide a seasonal water based family entertainment center at the Longview Lake Beach; and

WHEREAS, RR desires to utilize the JCPR facilities for the purpose of offering a Wibits Water Sports Park, and JCPR is willing to allow such use, both subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth below, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Management Company Duties.

- A. Water Sports Park. A Wibits Water Sports Park is a series of rubber sealed air inflatables, topped off weekly or semi weekly as deemed necessary. The placement of each inflatable is determined by either depth of water or pattern of play. The inflatables are designed for individuals reaching a minimum height of 48 inches tall. The water play structure would be anchored at the south side of the beach area and protected by a buoyed rope system. See Attachment A and A-1 diagram. A secondary portion of the experience is the option to use Corcls and Paddlers in a lazy river type area surrounding the water structure.
- B. Anchors. The water play structure will be anchored at the south side of the beach area as designated in Attachment B-1 and protected by a buoyed rope system. The anchoring system consists approximately of 40 tires filled with 1/3 yard of concrete each, rope, chain and hooks as designated in Attachment B-2 and B-3. Tire anchors may remain in the lake attached to identifying buoys for future use.

- C. <u>Standards of Conduct</u>. RR agrees that a Wibits Water Sports Park may be perceived as a JCPR facility and RR and his/her staff may be perceived as being part of the JCPR staff. Therefore, RR's owner(s) and staff agree to conduct themselves and administer the Wibits Water Sports Park, according to the highest standards. RR also agrees to ensure their staff shall act according to the same high standards.
- D. <u>Season Dates</u>. The Wibits Water Sports Park would be open Memorial Day through Labor Day during the same hours as Longview Beach: Monday-Friday 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The Wibits Water Sports Park closures would coincide with Longview Beach closings based upon special events, inclement weather or water quality issues.
- E. Equipment. RR shall provide all equipment necessary to operate the Wibits Water Sports Park at no cost to JCPR. For example, but not limited to, inflatable water apparatus, anchoring system for the water apparatus, rental equipment, registration kiosk, perimeter buoys and rope. Excluding the anchors, all equipment must be removed from the Longview Lake Beach no later than September 6, 2017. Neither the anchoring system nor the inflatables are permanent structures.
- F. <u>Location of water sports park</u>. Longview Lake Beach, 11101 Raytown Road, Kansas City, MO 64134.
- G. <u>Insurance</u>. RR shall provide proof of Comprehensive General Liability Insurance indemnifying the Army Corp of Engineers and Jackson County, MO, and naming them as additional insureds with a minimum \$2 million per occurrence and a \$2 million general aggregate. Proof of Liability insurance shall be presented to Jackson County, Missouri no later than June 15, 2017. RR must also be insured for vandalism or damage to the water structure while anchored in the lake.
- H. Patron Reservation Fees. RR shall be responsible for all financial transactions related to the Wibits Water Sports Park. RR shall be wholly responsible for the collection and payment of any and all state and local sales and use taxes due from the sale of admission, memorabilia or rental of equipment at the site. RR shall sell tickets via the internet or onsight at the Longview Beach. RR staff will be responsible for all equipment associated with financial transactions: ticket booth, computer, cash drawer, start up cash, credit card readers Wi-Fi connection, proof of purchase identifying wrist bands and any other equipment deemed necessary.
- I. <u>JCPR Approval of Outside Entity / Individual Involvement.</u> No later than (7) days prior to the commencement of a Wibits Special Event, RR shall notify the JCPR staff liaison of any proposed promotional happenings, contests, raffles, and/or other similar events at the time period offered. The operation of any of the aforementioned contests or competitions and involvement with the event by any outside individual must be approved by JCPR and JCPR may, at its sole discretion, prohibit any such activity or involvement.
- J. <u>Staff Requirement</u>. RR is responsible for hiring, training, supervising and compensating all staff associated with the operation of the Wibits Water Sports Park. RR Staff must be onsite at least (30) minutes prior to the scheduled beach opening time each day and remain on

site until the Longview Beach closes. If the required number of RR staff is not present upon opening of the beach the attraction will not open. If the attraction opens for the day and staffing falls below the required number, the attraction will be closed. RR, or its designee, such designee being at least twenty-one (21) years of age, must be on-site throughout the duration of the day. RR shall hire certified American Red Cross lifeguards to work the Wibits Water Sports Park. JCPR requires a minimum of 3 lifeguards be assigned to guard the Wibits Water Sports Park at all times. JCPR requires RR to position 2-4 staff members plus a daily manager on the beach to assist with the management of the water sports park, including but not limited to selling of tickets, signing of waivers, equipment rental, training of participants and the fitting of patrons with US Coast Guard approved lifejackets and identification wristbands.

- K. Patron Participation Requirements. Participation in this attraction will require individuals to pay the established beach admission fee (\$5 per adult 16 and older, \$3 for kids 3-15), plus purchase a separate ticket to participate at the water sports park. Safety regulations would include each participant signing a waiver, wearing a wristband and being fitted with an appropriate sized US Coast Guard approved lifejacket. Participants may not enjoy the attraction without fulfilling these requirements.
- L. <u>Special Needs</u>. RR shall communicate any special needs to the JCPR staff liaison a minimum of (48) hour prior to the need.
- M. <u>Memorabilia</u>. Upon signing this agreement, RR shall inform the JCPR staff liaison whether or not he/she will sell Wibits Water Sports Park memorabilia.
- N. Property. RR assumes all responsibility and JCPR assumes no responsibility whatever for any property of RR, RR exhibitors or participants placed on said property and the County is released from any and all liability for loss, injury or damage to any property brought onto Park property throughout the season. Additional recreational equipment must be removed from the beach front at the conclusion of each day's business (for example, but not limited to lifejackets, Corcls and Paddlers). A Dry Storage enclosure is available at the Longview Lake Marina for overnight storage of property if RR wishes to utilize such storage. The fee for the Dry Storage space would be based upon the 2017 Schedule of Park User Fees and Charges.
- O. Property Damage. RR will be responsible for repair of any damages to park property, caused through negligence by RR staff, volunteers and/or employees. At the conclusion of the season, RR will be responsible for restoring the property to its condition prior to the season. If the property is not restored within 30 days of season end, the County may retain any and all vendors, suppliers and or contractors necessary to restore the property to its original condition. The cost of such restoration shall be at the sole cost of the RR.
- P. <u>Agreement Assignment.</u> RR shall not assign this Agreement, nor suffer any use of said Property other than specified in this agreement nor sublet the Property or any part thereof, without expressed written consent of the County.

II. <u>JCPR Duties.</u>

A. <u>Beach Front Headquarters</u>. JCPR shall provide an area designated on the Longview Beach as the Wibits Water Sports Park headquarters. This area shall serve as the official

entry point into the Wibits Water Sports Park, along with adequate space to conduct daily business activities.

- B. Additional Services/Items Provided by JCPR. JCPR shall provide such services/items, including, but not limited to, a staff liaison, restrooms, trash barrels, and trash removal, refrigerated storage for staff use and a designated parking area for equipment storage trailer on the Longview Beach parking lot. JCPR shall not provide such services/items, including, but not limited to, paid advertising, equipment or equipment repair, lifeguards, site manager or registration staff.
- C. <u>Beach Set-Up</u>. JCPR staff will prepare the beach and restrooms daily for public use. This includes, but not limited to, cleaning of restrooms, removal of trash and debris from beach grounds and parking lot, removal of goose droppings from sand and sidewalks and weekly dragging of sand.
- D. <u>Beach Manager.</u> A JCPR Beach Manager is on site to help with enforcement of JCPR policies, lifeguard scheduling, daily beach preparation and managing the sale of admissions each day. No additional fees will be charged to the RR for the assignment of this individual.
- E. Proceeds Retained by JCPR. JCPR shall retain proceeds from all concession sales and 10% of gross revenue collected by RR through the sale of admission tickets, memorabilia and rentals from the Wibits Sports Park. RR shall retain 90% of the remaining percentage of gross revenue collected through the sale of admission tickets, memorabilia and rentals generated from the Wibits Water Sports Park. JCPR requires payment on a monthly basis beginning August 1, 2017. Payment must be accompanied by a gross revenue report outlining the previous month's activity and mailed to Jackson County Parks + Rec, 22807 Woods Chapel Road, Blue Springs, MO 64015. Attn: Tina Spallo, Superintendent of Recreation.

It is understood by RR that all water park participants are required to pay the beach admission fee (\$5 adults 16 and older, \$3 children 3-15 years of age). 100% of these fees will be retained by JCPR.

III. Longview Beach Use Guidelines.

- A. <u>Publication of Rules</u>. RR shall provide all signage related to the operation of the Wibits Water Sports Park. This would include, but not limited to, rules, pricing, hours and refund policy information. It is recommended that signage be printed in English and Spanish.
- B. <u>Behavior Rules</u>. RR agrees that the Wibits Water Sports Park rules contain provisions ensuring that the behavior of participants and spectators is appropriately controlled.
- C. <u>Maximum Number of Participants</u>. At no time will RR staff permit more than 100 individuals to be on the water apparatus at one time.
- D. <u>Food and Drink</u>. JCPR allows beach participants to carry in food and drink for consumption inside of the Longview Beach facility. No alcohol or glass containers are allowed. Special event days may be scheduled at the Longview Beach, where food trucks are invited to set up in the parking lot. Food Truck vendors would be required to pay a

vendor fee to JCPR and must comply with the Jackson County Environmental Health Standards. All Food Truck revenue would be retained by the Food Truck vendors.

- IV. <u>Additional Information About JCPR Facilities</u>. Full service restrooms, with shower and changing facilities are available for use by all paying participants.
- V. <u>Term.</u> This agreement will commence upon its execution and expire September 6, 2017. If JCPR and RR mutually agree to continue partnering, RR will be given right of first refusal for corresponding beach season dates for the next year. RR must provide JCPR in writing its intent to continue offering the Wibits Water Sports Park at Longview Beach no later than October 31, 2017.
- VI. <u>Indemnification</u>. RR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Jackson County, Missouri and the Army Corp of Engineers, their elected officials, employees, agents and assigns from any personal injury or property damage incurred by RR, RR employees, agents and assigns, the participants at the water sports park, RR invitees and or any person(s) observing throughout the Longview Beach season.
- VII. <u>Final Authority</u>. JCPR shall have the final decision in any and all matters, including decisions related to inclement weather.
- VIII. <u>Termination of Agreement</u>. JCPR may terminate this agreement at any time based upon, but not limited to unsatisfactory level of service, staffing issues, non-payment of proceeds retained by JCPR and safety enforcement.
- IX. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be subject to and governed by the laws of the State of Missouri.







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Tire Anchor

Do you have an old tire lying around? Put it to use as an achor! First get a piece of plastic or plywood and place it in the middle of the tire as its lying on its side (this prevents wet concrete from seeping out) Then mix a bag of concrete per the instructions and pour it into the tire opening. After the concrete starts to set (roughly 20-30 minutes later), add an anchor bolt and reinforce using rebar. Unfortunately, the companies that were awarded the bid are not able to perform the needed services for these specific vehicles.

The Parks + Rec Department manages several parcels of land that are eligible for the Agricultural Lease Program, but did not receive any response under Request for Proposal No. 59-16. Specifically, Area #2, Longview Lake Fields #2,4,6,9,10a, 10b, and 11. These fields have been out of agricultural production for over five years.

Following the proposal opening in December 2016, the Parks + Rec Department received interest in the Longview Lake Area #2, fields 2,4,6,9,10a, 10b, and 11 from Mr. Clint Hardee of Peculiar, MO.

Terms and conditions have been negotiated with Mr. Hardee who would be responsible for farming and property management activities consistent with the original Request for Proposals. The term of the Agreement is proposed for eight (8) years, beginning January 1, 2017 and continuing through December 31 2024.

Enrolling these fields that have been out of agricultural production will improve the condition of the land, reduce Parks + Rec maintenance requirements, and provide an income stream for reinvestment in the parks system. The Parks+Rec Department respectfully requests approval of the Agreement.
