WHEREAS, an appropriation and transfer are necessary in order to place the grant and matching funds in the proper spending account; and,



- 6. Monitoring: The Subrecipient agrees to maintain the records necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of the project. The Subrecipient assures that fund accounting, auditing, monitoring, and such evaluation procedures as may be necessary to keep such records as the Missouri Department of Public Safety, Office of the Director, shall prescribe, will be provided to assure fiscal control, proper management, and efficient disbursement of funds received under this subaward.

- 12. <u>Relationship</u>: The Subrecipient agrees that they will represent themselves to be an independent Subrecipient offering such services to the general public and shall not represent themselves or their employees to be employees of the Missouri Department of Public Safety or the Office of the Director. This provision is not applicable to the Missouri Department of Public Safety or any of its divisions or programs. Therefore, the Subrecipient shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc.
- 13. <u>Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)</u>: The Subreciplent assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 43.505 RSMo</u> relating to uniform crime reporting and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.
- 14. <u>Racial Profiling</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 590,650 RSMo</u> relating to racial profiling and will remain in full compliance for the duration of the project period.
- 15. <u>Federal Equitable Sharing Funds</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 513.653 RSMo</u> relating to participation in the federal forfeiture system and the reporting of proceeds received therefrom to the Missouri Department of Public Safety and the Missouri State Auditor.
- 16. <u>Custodial Interrogations</u>: The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with the state provisions of <u>Section 590.700 RSMo</u> relating to custodial interrogations and has adopted a written policy to record custodial interrogations of persons suspected of committing or attempting to commit the felony crimes described in subsection 2 of this section.

- 17. <u>DWI Law;</u> The Subrecipient assures that its law enforcement agency is in full compliance with <u>Section 43.544 RSMo</u> relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward arrest information for all intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by <u>Section 43.503 RSMo</u>. In addition, the Subrecipient assures that its county prosecuting attorney or municipal prosecutor is in full compliance with <u>Section 43.544 RSMo</u> relating to the "DWI Law" and has adopted a written policy to forward all charge information for intoxication-related traffic offenses to the central repository as required by <u>Section 43.503 RSMo</u>.
- 18. <u>Texting While Driving</u>: Pursuant to Executive Order 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," 74 Fed. Reg. 51225 (October 1, 2009), the Missouri Department of Public Safety encourages the Subreciplent to adopt and enforce policies banning employees from text messaging while driving any vehicle during the course of performing work funded by this grant, and to establish workplace safety policies and conduct education, awareness, and other outreach to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers.
- 19. <u>Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988</u>: The Subrecipient assures that it will comply, and all its subcontractors will comply, with the <u>Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988</u>. - 9. <u>Buy Missouri:</u> The Subrecipient also acknowledges <u>Sections 34.070 and 34.073 RSMo</u> regarding the preference given to all commodities and tangible personal property manufactured, mined, produced, or grown within the state of Missouri and to all firms, corporations, or individuals doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals, or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less, quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less, or when competing bids are comparable.
- Debarment: This certification is required by Executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspensions, and implemented at 28 CFR Part 67, for prospective participants in primary covered transactions, as defined at 28 CFR Part 67, Section 67.510.

The Subrecipient certifies its vendors:

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT by and between **JACKSON COUNTY**, **MISSOURI**, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County, hereinafter referred to as "the County," and **THE INDEPENDENCE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE**, 210 West Truman Road, Independence, MO 64051, hereinafter referred to as "the Chamber."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Chamber desires to use the County's parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds for Santa-Cali-Gon Days; and,

WHEREAS, these events are open to all residents in the unincorporated areas of the County and those residents of the other cities in Jackson County, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, the parties agree to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Chamber respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

1. Services.

- a. Chamber shall be entitled to use the County's parking lots:
- i. The lot located at Kansas and Osage Streets in Independence,
 Missouri from Monday, August 28, 2017, through Wednesday, September 6, 2017.
- ii. The lot located at 315 N. Main (MyArts Building) in Independence, Missouri starting after 5 p.m. on Friday, September 1, 2017, through Monday, September 4, 2017.
- b. County Associates shall have permission to use the parking lots at the First

Christian Church, located at 125 S. Pleasant, Independence, MO, and at the Masonic Temple, located at 120 S. Pleasant, Independence, MO, beginning at 6 p.m. Monday, August 28, 2017, through 6 p.m., Friday, September 1, 2017, and from 12:01 a.m. Tuesday, September 5, 2017, to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, September 6, 2017.

- c. During the week of August 28, 2017, representatives from the County and Chamber shall walk the parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds.
- d. The Chamber agrees to power wash the Historic Truman Courthouse steps, sidewalks, and retaining walls, using an environmentally friendly de-greaser/soap detergent before Monday, September 11, 2017.
- e. The Chamber agrees to return the parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds to the County in the as-good-as condition, as it existed before the event. Chamber shall be responsible for all clean-up and repair to parking lots and lawns as necessitated by their use. Said repairs shall be completed no later than Monday, September 11, 2017.
- 2. Payment. The use of the parking lot shall be granted to the Chamber free of charge as the events are of use and benefit to the citizens of Jackson County, Missouri.
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Chamber agrees that it or its agent will maintain liability insurance at its expense. This Certificate of Liability Insurance is to be issued by an insurance company, licensed to do business in the State of Missouri and acceptable to County. The certificate will provide for sixty (60) days advance notice in the event of termination or cancellation of coverage. Chamber shall provide proof of insurance prior to each event.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence August 1, 2017, and continue through September 30, 2017.

- 5. <u>Default.</u> If Chamber shall default in the performance or observation of any term or condition herein, the County shall give Chamber ten (10) days' written notice setting forth the default. If said default shall continue for ten (10) days after written notice thereof, the County may at its election terminate the contract. Said election shall not in any way limit the County's right to sue for breach of contract.
- 6. Remedies for Breach. Chamber agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the term, provisions and requirements of this Agreement, and Chamber's failure to do so shall constitute a breach of this Agreement and in such event, Chamber consents and agrees as follows:
- (1) The County may without prior notice to Chamber immediately terminate this Agreement; and,
- (2) The County may seek any available remedy and may collect from Chamber all cost incurred by the County as a result of said breach, including reasonable attorney's fees, costs and expenses.
- 7. <u>Severability</u>. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced, by reason of any rule of law or public policy, all other provisions and conditions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect, and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.
- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>. Chamber shall compensate County for any damage to County property due to any breach of contract or tortious conduct by Chamber or its agents, its officers, agents, employees, contractors or subcontractors on the County's premises. Chamber shall indemnify, save harmless and defend County from and against any and all

liabilities, claims, penalties, forfeitures, suits, and the costs and expenses incident thereto (including costs of defense, settlement and reasonable attorney's fees), which it may hereafter incur, become responsible for or pay out, which was caused, in whole or in part, by Chamber's or its agents breach of any term or provision of this agreement, or any negligent act or omissions or willful act of Chamber, its officers, agents, employees, contractors or subcontractors.

- 9. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. Chamber warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

RESOLUTION NO. 19536, July 24, 2017

INTRODUCED BY Greg Grounds, County Legislator

WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Transportation's Highway Bridge Program authorizes bridge replacement and rehabilitation for certain eligible bridges throughout Missouri's counties; and,

WHEREAS, federal funds are available to finance up to 80% of an eligible project's cost, but may be increased with the use of credits earned from replacing, with the County's own funds, an eligible bridge that is not on the federal-aid system list; and,

WHEREAS, if a Local Public Agency (LPA) replaces or rehabilitates an eligible bridge with its own funds, the LPA may receive a credit, known as a "Soft Match Credit," that can be applied to the non-federal share on another federal aid bridge project; and,

WHEREAS, more sparsely populated counties receive less transportation funding to apply toward their bridge replacement and rehabilitation programs; and,

WHEREAS, Pettis County, Missouri, has agreed to transfer \$100,000 of its "Soft Match Credits" to Jackson County in exchange for Jackson County's transfer of \$200,000 of its

Off-System Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Program (BRO) funds; and,

WHEREAS, this exchange with Pettis County will allow Jackson County to use this Soft Match Credit balance toward its 20% cash match for future bridge projects under the BRO program, thereby reducing the required County cash expenditure; and,

WHEREAS, Pettis County and the Jackson County Director of Public Works recommend a BRO fund and Soft Match Credit exchange, which would allow Jackson County to have actual funds applied to its Soft Match Credit account for use on future BRO programs, in exchange for the transfer of off-system bridge funds to Pettis County; and.

WHEREAS, the attached Letter of Understanding is the appropriate mechanism for authorizing this transfer of state BRO funds within the Highway Bridge Program; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute the attached Letter of Understanding with the Pettis County Commission and the Missouri Department of Transportation; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all County officials be and hereby are authorized to execute any and all documents and take any other actions necessary to give effect to this Resolution.

Dear Mr. Landvik:

The members of the Pettis County Commission in discussion with Jackson County, Missouri Officials have agreed to the following exchange of BRO funds and "Soft Match" credits.

Pettis County has agreed to transfer \$100,000 of their "Soft Match" credits to Jackson County. In exchange, Jackson County has agreed to transfer \$200,000 of their BRO funds to Pettis County.
