Extension to Agreement for Detention Services

The Jackson County Department of Corrections is interested in pursuing a new Contract Agreement for Detention Services with Johnson County Missouri (previously Resolution 19244). The new Contract includes an increase in the daily rate for inmates from \$40 to \$45 per day. The current contract expires on 8/31/18. Throughout 2018 Jackson County has held several inmates at the Johnson County facility. These are inmates who, for various reasons, cannot be held at the Jackson County Detention Center. In addition, pending negotiations and decisions by Jackson County Administration may include housing up to 60 inmates at Johnson County in 2019, while work is completed on facility rehabilitation.

Under the new contract, in 2018, we expect to house up to 6 inmates over the 122 days (September 1 through December 31) at \$45 per day, spending up to \$32,940. Funding for this is available in 001-2701-56790. For the 2019 budget, Corrections plans to request up to \$82,125 per month for housing 60 Jackson County inmates in Johnson County. This agreement would cover September 1, 2018 until August 31, 2019. Through August 31, 2019, the end of the contract year, \$657,000 would be spent.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County, hereinafter referred to as "the County," and THE INDEPENDENCE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, 210 West Truman Road, Independence, MO 64051, hereinafter referred to as "the Chamber."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Chamber desires to use the County's parking lots and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds for Santa-Cali-Gon Days; and,

WHEREAS, these events are open to all residents in the unincorporated areas of the County and those residents of the other cities in Jackson County, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, the parties agree to be bound by the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Chamber respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

1. Services.

- a. Chamber shall be entitled to use the County's parking lot located at Kansas and Osage Streets in Independence, Missouri from Monday, August 27, 2018, through Wednesday, September 5, 2018.
- b. County Associates shall have permission to use the parking lots at the First Christian Church, located at 125 S. Pleasant, Independence, MO, and at the Masonic Temple, located at 120 S. Pleasant, Independence, MO, beginning at 6 p.m. Monday, August 27, 2018, through 6 p.m., Friday, August 31, 2018, and from 12:01 a.m. Tuesday,

September 4, 2018, to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, September 6, 2018.

- c. During the week of August 27, 2018, representatives from the County and Chamber shall walk the parking lot and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds.
- d. The Chamber agrees that no spike, rebar, stake or any other object will be hammered, pounded or driven into the asphalt surface on the county parking lot.
- e. The Chamber agrees to power wash the Historic Truman Courthouse steps, sidewalks, and retaining walls, using an environmentally friendly de-greaser/soap detergent before Monday, September 10, 2018.
- f. The Chamber agrees to return the parking lot and Historic Truman Courthouse grounds to the County in the as-good-as condition, as it existed before the event. Chamber shall be responsible for all clean-up and repair to parking lot and lawns as necessitated by their use. Repairs shall be approved by the County. Said repairs shall be completed no later than Monday, September 10, 2018.
- 2. <u>Payment</u>. The use of the parking lot shall be granted to the Chamber free of charge as the events are of use and benefit to the citizens of Jackson County, Missouri.
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Chamber agrees that it or its agent will maintain liability insurance at its expense. This Certificate of Liability Insurance is to be issued by an insurance company, licensed to do business in the State of Missouri and acceptable to County. The certificate will provide for sixty (60) days advance notice in the event of termination or cancellation of coverage. Chamber shall provide proof of insurance prior to event.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall commence August 13, 2018, and continue through September 30, 2018.
 - 5. **Default.** If Chamber shall default in the performance or observation of any term or

condition herein, the County shall give Chamber ten (10) days' written notice setting forth the default. If said default shall continue for ten (10) days after written notice thereof, the County may at its election terminate the contract. Said election shall not in any way limit the County's right to sue for breach of contract.

- (1) The County may without prior notice to Chamber immediately terminate this Agreement; and,
- (2) The County may seek any available remedy and may collect from Chamber all cost incurred by the County as a result of said breach, including reasonable attorney's fees, costs and expenses.

- 10. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

The Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office received 4 bids for toxicology services in response to RFP #27-18. A committee of key members of the office reviewed the bids. Following review, we have chosen Axis Forensic Toxicology to be awarded the bid. Key factors in the decision included turn-around-time, invoicing methods, possibility of online ordering and reporting, as well as comprehensive nature of the testing panels. Pricing, both overall as well as for specific features such as return of samples, played a key role in the determination as well.

One request of the bid was the ability to perform STAT carbon monoxide testing. Given that all laboratories that bid are out of town and require overnight shipping, technically none of them can satisfy this requirement. A separate memo will be issued requesting this specific testing from a local laboratory as a sole source.

AMENDMENT #1

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR PARK IMPROVEMENTS AND USE in the BLUE RIVER PARKWAY

WHEREAS, on or about March 5, 2007, the City of Kansas City, Missouri, ("City') and Jackson County, Missouri, ("County") entered into a Cooperative Agreement for Park Improvements and Use in the Blue River Parkway. ("Agreement").

WHEREAS, this Agreement was authorized by the Jackson County Legislature by Resolution # 16169 and by Kansas City Park Board Resolution 28032.

WHEREAS, this Agreement has been successful in providing additional recreational opportunities to the citizens of the City and County through inter-governmental cooperation.

WHEREAS, under this Agreement approximately 2.2 miles of trail have been constructed by the City on County property and have provided a connection between the Blue River Parkway and the Indian Creek Trail system.

WHEREAS, the City and County wish to continue this agreement and expand the area within Blue River Parkway covered under the Agreement.


WHEREAS, expanding the area covered under this Agreement will allow connections to additional trails within the MetroGreen system of trails and greenways.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and considerations herein contained, the parties agree to modify the terms of the Cooperative Agreement with Amendment #1 as follows:

- Paragraph 2. <u>COUNTY LANDS</u>: Shall be modified to add the following additional County owned land within the Blue River Parkway: Section 9, T47N, R33W; Section 16, T47N, R33W; Section 17, T47N, Section 20, T47N, Section 21, T47N, R33W; Section 14, T48N, R33W; Section 22, T48N, R33W; Section 27, T48N, R33W; Section 28, T48N, R33W; Section 29, T48N, R33W; Section 30, T48N, R33W; Section 31, T48N, R33W.
- 2. This Amendment #1 to the Cooperative Agreement for Park Improvements and Use in the Blue River Parkway shall be binding on the parties thereto only after it has been duly approved and executed by the governing bodies of the parties.
- 3. In the event that any provision of this Amendment is inconsistent with any provisions of the Agreement, the terms of this Amendment shall control.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR PARK IMPROVEMENTS AND USE in the BLUE RIVER PARKWAY

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between Jackson County, Missouri, hereinafter called "County", and the City of Kansas City, a Missouri municipality organized and existing under its constitutional charter, hereinafter called "City",

WITHESSETH:

WHEREAS, County presently owns and holds for public use certain lands in connection with County's Blue River Parkway lying between Bannister Road on the north, Red Bridge Road on the south, east of the railroad right-of-way of the Missouri Pacific Railroad Company and west of Blue River Road; and

WHEREAS, City having the means available or potentially available to it to improve said lands with a multipurpose trail, desires to make such improvements as hereinafter described with County's permission,

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. SCOPE, PURPOSE AND INTENT

The scope, purpose and intent of this agreement is to provide for a recreational trail to be built in phases and operated on certain lands owned by the County and held by County for public use for park and recreational purposes, said scope to be confined to park lands in the Blue River Parkway previously defined. It is the intent of the parties that this Agreement is framed pursuant to Sections 70.210, through 70.325 RSMo. 1978, relating to cooperative agreements between governmental units or agencies to provide a common service to the public, in this instance, public recreational facilities.

2. COUNTY LANDS.

The County lands to be utilized by City for trail improvements are located within the Blue River Parkway, the legal description of said lands being as follows:

All land being owned by Jackson County lying within; the Southeast ¼ of Section 28, T48N, R33W; the Southwest ¼ of Section 27, T48N, R33W; the East ½ of Section 33, T48N, R33W and the Northeast ¼ of Section 4, T47N, R33 W.

IMPROVEMENTS BY CITY.

The City proposes to be constructed on the site described above the initial phase of a paved multipurpose trail in accordance with the plans and specifications now or hereafter adopted by the City acting through its Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners and shown generally on Exhibit A which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. After completion of each phase of said multipurpose trail, the City shall make same available for public use.

4. APPROVAL FOR PLANS.

That before commencement of any improvement to be made by City as set forth in Paragraph 3 above, City through its Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners agrees to submit plans and specifications to County, through County's Parks and Recreation Department, for approval before making any alteration on the premises.

5. MAINTENANCE OF IMPROVEMENTS.

City shall provide all maintenance of trail improvements constructed by the City. Maintenance shall be provided by the City to keep the trail safe for users and free of defects. County reserves the right to close and remove the trail should the City fail to maintain the trail to this standard. County shall provide routine grounds maintenance, (general clean-up and mowing along the

trail), for so long as this Agreement is in effect. Scheduling of routine grounds maintenance shall be by the County.

6. OPERATION OF THE TRAIL.

County shall allow parking and trail access to the public at its existing parking lot at 99th and Blue River Road. County and City shall not conduct organized events along the trail without prior notification and agreement of the other party to eliminate conflicts in scheduling.

7. SIGNS AND ADVERTISEMENTS.

County and City agree that they shall not erect or maintain nor permit the erection or maintenance upon any part of the park premises described aforesaid any billboards or advertisements whatsoever, but that the parties contemplate that an appropriate sign or marker designating the trail may be erected and maintained upon approval of both parties.

8. <u>TERM</u>.

This Cooperative Agreement shall become effective upon that date when both parties are by law bound thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by either party or by mutual agreement in accordance with the provisions for termination hereafter.

9. TERMINATION.

This Cooperative Agreement may be terminated by either party upon giving not less than one year's notice to the other. If County elects to terminate this Agreement and the improvements contemplated by the parties have been made, then County shall be liable for the cost of the improvements made by City less depreciation, such cost to be evidenced by the actual cost to City to make said improvements. In the event that said termination shall be at any time prior to the expiration of ten years, then the depreciation shall be based upon the actual depreciation based upon a similar improvement of standard like. Should City elect to terminate the

Agreement at any time, all improvements shall become County property with no cost to County.


