WHEREAS, the DART program is a collaborative and multi-jurisdictional team created to target and close down drug houses within the City of Kansas City; and,

WHEREAS, the grant is subject to a local match in the amount of \$176,558.54; and,

In the event of termination pursuant to this paragraph, all documents, data, and reports prepared by the Subrecipient under the subaward shall, at the option of the Missouri Department of Public Safety, become property of the State of Missouri.

In the event a subaward is suspended or permanently terminated, the Missouri Department of Public Safety may take action as deemed appropriate to recover any portion of the subaward funds remaining or an amount equal to the portion of the subaward funds wrongfully used.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI AND THE CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI

This is a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlining a proposed joint working agreement between the participating agencies to use all applicable regulations, statutes and compliance mechanisms to effectively abate drug and crime related nuisance properties in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

This MOU is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of July, 2019, by and between the City of Kansas City, Missouri (CITY) and the County of Jackson, Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA).

WHEREAS, this MOU provides a suitable mechanism for setting out the mutual responsibilities and obligations of the parties with respect to the establishment and operations of the Jackson County Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) Program; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the COUNTY shall serve as the fiscal agent for any funds distributed by the Missouri Department of Public Service; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this MOU is in the best interests of all parties and that the undertaking will benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, each governing body agrees that the DART Program shall be continued under the administration and direction of the Jackson County Prosecutor's Office; and

WHEREAS, the term of this Agreement shall be for twelve (12) months commencing July 1, 2019 and terminating on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this agreement shall impose any liability for claims against the COUNTY; and

WHEREAS, each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by one or more of the parties; and

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS AGREED BY AND AMONG THE PARTIES THE FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES:

## JACKSON COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

- Will assign two Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys to oversee the filings of expedited evictions, public nuisances, asset forfeitures and related criminal matters.
- Will assign one Trial Team Leader to act as the DART coordinator, who will oversee the operation of DART.
- c. Will assign one paralegal and one investigator to DART.
- d. Will provide notice to property owners of criminal activity and potential litigation.
- e. Will conduct trainings for law enforcement personnel on civil tools to deter crime.
- f. Will collect citizen's complaints regarding drug properties and provide to KCPD.
- g. Will organize regular meetings to discuss problem properties.
- h. Will maintain records of all DART properties.

### CITY OF KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI (Neighborhoods and Housing Services)

- a. Will provide a code enforcement officer to DART. The inspector will be housed within the JCPA offices for a minimum of 12 hours per week. Tentative work schedule is Mondays (12PM-3PM), Wednesday (7AM-3:30PM) and Thursdays (9AM-11:30AM) and subject to change.
- b. Will conduct inspections of properties connected to drug or criminal activity.
- c. Will conduct follow-up inspections on properties deemed uninhabitable.
- d. Will post properties as needed under Ch. 48 and 56 of the City's municipal codes,
- e. Will issue work access permits (when appropriate) to owners and/or residents of DART related cases.
- f. Will provide the necessary documentation for grant reporting purposes (i.e. timesheets, payroll expenditures, status of DART cases, etc.) by the designated deadline.

WHEREAS, the manner in which these services are rendered, the standards of performance, the discipline of the officers and employees, and other matters incident to the performance of these services and the control of personnel so employed, shall remain in the discretion of the respective governing bodies, as applicable, and shall be governed by their respective personnel rules; and

WHEREAS, by entering into this MOU, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those other than those set out herein; further, this MOU shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

We, the undersigned have read and agree with the MOU. Furthermore, we have reviewed the proposed project as outlined in Appendix A and commit to partnering under the terms of this agreement.

### **APPENDIX A**

## **DART: Purpose and History**

The purpose of the DART program is to combat illegal drugs, violence and reduce the harm of criminal activity from Jackson County established a Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) in 1991. Jackson County DART is a collaborative, multi-jurisdictional team created to provide assistance to local citizens by identifying locations where crimes occur, working with homeowners and the community to prevent future crimes and when necessary using legal means to ensure the safety of our communities. Since the inception of Jackson County DART Program, over 9,400 drug houses have been removed from our community.

- a. Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney's Office (JCPA): JCPA is the chief law enforcement agency in Jackson County, Missouri. Led by County Prosecutor (Jean Peters Baker), the office has over 150 total staff which are responsible for prosecuting all criminal and civil cases on behalf of Missouri in the County of Jackson. The office averages filing over 10,000 charges a year based on crimes that occur in 14 different jurisdictions within Jackson County.
- b. City of Kansas City, Missouri (KCMO): is the largest city in Missouri and is the predominant city of a metropolitan area of more than two million people spanning the Missouri-Kansas border. It encompasses 316 square miles (820 km2) in parts of Jackson, Clay, Cass, and Platte counties. It is one of two county seats of Jackson County, the other being Independence, which is to the city's east. The Neighborhoods and Housing Services Department (Neighborhood Preservation Division) is responsible for inspecting and addressing property maintenance and/or nuisance related violations in an attempt to obtain voluntary compliance from homeowners or residents. If voluntary compliance is unsuccessful, other code enforcement actions will be administered including issuing summons or administrative citations to those who refuseto comply.

WHEREAS, the County and Jackson County Sports Complex Authority are interested in

establishing a formal procedure to govern the disposition of County-owned personal

property located at the Harry S. Truman Sports Complex that is no longer needed by the

Authority or either of the Authority's subtenants at the sports complex, the Kansas City

Chiefs and Kansas City Royals; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the attached Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement, the

Authority would first be required to offer any unneeded personal property to the County,

for the County to dispose of by sale, donation, or other means set out in chapter 11 of the

County Code; and,

WHEREAS, if the County, through the Director of Finance and Purchasing, chooses not

to take possession of any such property, the Authority would then be authorized to

dispose of such property in any manner the Authority deems most practicable, with the

net proceeds of such disposition to be paid to the County; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement would take effect once the County has amended its property disposition procedure contained in chapter 11 of the Jackson County Code; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute the attached Intergovernmental Agreement with the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority.

# INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE JACKSON COUNTY SPORTS COMPLEX AUTHORITY AND JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI

This Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") is made this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_, 2019 by and between the Jackson County Sports Complex Authority (the "Authority") and Jackson County, Missouri, (the "County").

WHEREAS, the County and the Authority entered into that certain agreement on March 21, 1967 ("1967 Agreement") in which the Authority was appointed as the agent (the "Agent") of the County for the purpose of planning and designing the Truman Sports Complex (the "Sports Complex"), which 1967 Agreement provided for activities related to the funding, site selection, land purchase, design and construction of the Sports Complex; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Authority entered into a subsequent agreement on October 31, 1970 (the "1970 Agreement"), which recited that the County was constructing the Sports Complex on a site described therein and stating that the land acquisition and construction to date had been financed with the proceeds of the County's 1967 general obligation bonds and that the County leased to the Authority the Sports Complex and the County and the Authority agreed on such other actions as necessary to build, maintain and operate Sports Complex under agreements between the County, the Authority and the Kansas City Chiefs Football Club and the Kansas City Royals Baseball Club (the "Teams"); and

WHEREAS, the County and the Authority entered into certain additional agency agreements in 1987 and 1990; and

WHEREAS, the County has constructed, expanded and renovated the Sports Complex and has leased the Sports Complex to the Authority pursuant to a Lease Agreement dated as of January 19, 1990 and 2006 Lease Amendment dated as of January 24, 2006 (the "2006 Lease") and the Authority has sub-let the portions of the Sports Complex to the Teams pursuant to the 2006 Lease, extending the term of the Lease Agreement to January 31, 2031; and

WHEREAS, on July 15, 2014, the County and the Authority entered into an Amended and Restated Agency Agreement to define and formalize their working relationship with respect to the Authority's role as the County's agent;

WHEREAS, recently questions have been raised concerning the disposal of discarded personal property by the Authority and the Teams and the Authority and the County desire to establish a procedure as to the disposal of discarded personal property upon notification to the County of the same;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE FOREGOING AND THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS CONTAINED HEREIN, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. When items of personal property are discarded by the Authority or the Teams, the Authority shall send written notification either by regular U.S. mail or electronic mail ("Notification") to the County's Purchasing Agent with a general description of the items of

personal property to be discarded by the Authority and the Teams ("Discarded Personal Property").

- 2. The County's Purchasing Agent will determine, within thirty (30) days of the Notification, whether the County desires to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property and notify the Authority of this plan during this thirty (30) day period of the County's intent to assume possession of the Discarded Personal Property.
- 3. If the County desires to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property, the County will remove the Discarded Personal Property from the Sports Complex within thirty (30) days of notifying the Authority of its plan to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property.
- 4. If the County determines that it does not desire to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property, the County will execute a bill of sale in favor of the Authority generally describing the Discarded Personal Property as it was described in the Notification ("Bill of Sale") and said Bill of Sale shall be provided to the Authority within thirty days of the County's determination and notification to the Authority that it does not desire to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property.
- 5. Upon receipt of the Bill of Sale, the Authority will dispose of the Discarded Personal Property in a manner which it deems most practicable. Any net proceeds from such disposal by the Authority shall be paid to the County within thirty (30) days of said receipt by the Authority.
- 6. If the County's Purchasing Agent fails to respond within thirty (30) days as provided in Section 2 above or fails to take possession of the Discarded Personal Property within thirty (30) days as provided in Section 3 above, the Authority will proceed as provided in Section 5 above in disposing of the Discarded Personal Property and the County will provide a Bill of Sale for the same.
- 7. This Agreement shall become effective at such time as the County has amended any ordinances which may conflict with its provisions, specifically Sections 1131, 1131.1 and 1141 of the Jackson County Code, to allow the actions described above.
- 8. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by written instrument signed by the parties hereto.

# CRIME STRATEGIES UNIT

### AN INTELLIGENCE-DRIVEN PROSECUTION APPROACH

This new unit will be charged with implementing a new Intelligence-Driven Prosecution Model (IDPM) based on data and analysis. The IDPM aimed to promote more informed decision making throughout the Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney's Office by improving the collection and circulation of information on the persons, places, and problems driving crime within discrete neighborhoods. Unlike other community prosecution models, IDPM does not focus on one particular type of crime. Instead, the model functions as a countywide strategy that, by dividing the county into distinct areas, can adopt to multiple problems found at the neighborhood level.

### STAFF, STRUCTURE AND STRATEGIES

This model introduces a new set of strategies for community prosecution initiatives: a neighborhood-level focus, community engagement, local information gathering, and individualized solutions to specific neighborhood-based problems.

The unit would consist of an assistant prosecuting attorney, intelligence analysts, and a community affairs coordinator. Every area team is responsible for developing relationships with local law enforcement and community stakeholders, and gaining expertise in the people, places, and problems that drive crime in each neighborhood.

### Community Outreach:

CSU staff will devote significant time to attend meetings with local community groups (e.g., precinct councils, community boards, tenant associations, etc.) to gather information about community players and their public safety concerns.

Other goals would be the creation of a Briefing Book with a summary assessments of each neighborhood. Assessments include a neighborhood maps, data on population demographics and major crime problems, details on homicides and/or shootings, a narrative description of at least two local crime problems, a list of "hot spots," and a list of local gangs or "crews" known to be involved in significant criminal enterprises.
