



JAG funds may not be used as the 50% match for purposes of the DOJ Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) program.

58. Certification of body armor "mandatory wear" policies

If recipient uses funds under this award to purchase body armor, the recipient must submit a signed certification that law enforcement agencies receiving body armor purchased with funds from this award have a written "mandatory wear" policy in effect. The recipient must keep signed certifications on file for any subrecipients planning to utilize funds from this award for ballistic-resistant and stab-resistant body armor purchases. This policy must be in place for at least all uniformed officers before any funds from this award may be used by an agency for body armor. There are no requirements regarding the nature of the policy other than it be a mandatory wear policy for all uniformed officers while on duty.

59. Body armor - compliance with NIJ standards and other requirements

Ballistic-resistant and stab-resistant body armor purchased with JAG award funds may be purchased at any threat level, make or model, from any distributor or manufacturer, as long as the body armor has been tested and found to comply with applicable National Institute of Justice ballistic or stab standards and is listed on the NIJ Compliant Body Armor Model List (https://nij.gov/topics/technology/body-armor/Pages/compliant-ballistic-armor.aspx). In addition, ballistic-resistant and stab-resistant body armor purchased must be made in the United States and must be uniquely fitted, as set forth in 34 U.S.C. 10202(c)(1)(A). 60. Body armor - impact on eligibility for other program funds

61. Reporting requirements

No funds under this award may be expended on the purchase of items prohibited by the JAG program statute, unless, as set forth at 34 U.S.C. 10152, the BJA Director certifies that extraordinary and exigent circumstances exist, making such expenditures essential to the maintenance of public safety and good order.

64. Authorization to obligate (federal) award funds to reimburse certain project costs incurred on or after October 1, 2018

On behalf of the Family Court Committee, I am pleased to announce the award of funding for the Juvenile Justice Program Assistance. The Sixteenth Judicial Circuit has been awarded \$16,231.00 for the Nite Light Program for FY20 under contract OSCA 19-00109-12.

Funds are available to your court per the terms of the attached contract award. OSCA, Contracts Unit, requests the contract award be signed and returned to us for filing with the award documentation. Quarterly reports concerning the number of juveniles served and recidivism outcomes should be submitted with a final report being submitted at the end of the funding period. Additional language OSCA utilizes in contracts concerning liability is as follows. "The contractor shall understand and agree that the state of Missouri and the county cannot save and hold

harmless and/or indemnify the contractor against any liability incurred or arising as a result of any activity of the contractor or any activity of the contractor's employees related to the contractor's performance under the contract. Therefore, the contractor must acquire and maintain adequate liability insurance in the form(s) and amount(s) sufficient to protect the state of Missouri, its agencies, its employees, its clients and the general public against any such loss, damage and/or expense related to his/her performance under the contract."

A. NAME AND BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROGRAM

• Name: Night Light

• Program Category: Supervision

• Submitted By: 16th Circuit Court - Jackson County Family Court Services

• Summary: The Night Light Program is a collaborative effort between the Jackson County Family Court and the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. The program's goals are to help ensure community safety. The program is designed to monitor compliance with conditions of supervision for serious and potentially violent juvenile offenders who are either under pre-adjudication supervision, on probation, or re-entering the community from residential placement. The Night Light program serves primarily as a probation/reentry service provider of supervision and coordinated services, and it is utilized as a graduated sanction to assist primary Juvenile Probation Officers in maintaining or stabilizing youth in the community. Evening and late-night operations occur between the hours of 9:00 PM and 2:00 AM. During this time, Night Light Juvenile Probation Officers (JPOs) are accompanied by uniformed Jackson County Sheriff's Deputies in marked law enforcement vehicles to conduct random home visits. Telephone checks are conducted as well to ensure that youth are complying with the conditions of their supervision. Urinalysis testing and school checks are conducted on a random basis. The overall length of the program is 30-60 days. When time permits, Night Light also attempts to locate youth who have active capias warrants due to absconding from court ordered placement.

B. GEOGRAPHICAL AREA & NEED FOR PROGRAM

Jackson County lies in west central Missouri, bordered on the north by the Missouri River and on the west by the state of Kansas. Kansas City, the largest city by population in Missouri, lies largely within Jackson County's boundaries. Independence (Missouri's fourth largest city), Lee's Summit (sixth largest city), and Blue Springs (eleventh largest city) all lie within Jackson County.

It has been researched and determined that court-involved youth have a higher probability to reoffend between the hours 9:00 PM and 2:00 AM for the following reasons:

- 1. Unaddressed substance abuse by youth and within family.
- 2. The inability to problem solve and handle conflict appropriately.
- 3. The lack of adult supervision.
- 4. Failure to be held accountable for their actions.
- 5. Lack of community support.

In 2018, Night Light received 101 new referrals for services. Of the youth who were released from the program in 2018, 76% successfully completed the program. During 2018, 73% of

curfew checks did not result in a violation and 80% of drug tests administered by Night Light staff were negative for substance use.

C. TARGET POPULATION & SELECTION PROCESS

The Night Light Program serves juvenile clients placed on probation who are classified at medium or maximum level supervision. Pre-adjudicated clients and probation clients displaying increased risk factors at a lower level of supervision may also be referred to the program for supervision if needed. All youth completing Residential Care and Private Placement under Family Court jurisdiction are referred to the program for aftercare supervision.

D. SERVICE PROVIDERS

Teresa Smith, Program Manager, holds a B.A. in Administration of Criminal Justice. Ms. Smith assumed management duties for the Night Light Program in August, 2017. Ms. Smith has been a manager with the Jackson County Family Court for 15 years and has worked in the fields of Corrections and Social Services for over 40 years.

Carolyn Meadows holds a B.S. in General Studies with a minor in Psychology and has been a Night Light Juvenile Probation Officer for 11 years. Ms. Meadows has been employed with the Jackson County Family Court for 38 years.

Terry Yancy holds a B.S. in Business Management and has been a Night Light Juvenile Probation Officer for 8 years. Mr. Yancy has been employed with the Jackson County Family Court for 10 years and has worked in the field of Juvenile Justice/Criminal Justice for over 14 years.

E. NUMBER OF YOUTH SERVED

Approximately 100 youth will be served through this grant.

F. Hours of Service

Night Light employs two full time staff who each work 40 hours a week to execute the program. Night Light partners with the Jackson County Sheriff's Office to provide two law enforcement officers for four hours a night, four days a week, to assist with in-home curfew checks between the hours of 9:00 PM - 2:00 AM, Monday - Saturday.

G. FIDELITY PLAN

The Night Light Program is currently operational within the 16th Circuit, as per implementation planning submitted for previous funding cycles. Renewed funding will allow for continued surveillance and monitoring to those youth assessed to be at risk of reoffending or probation revocation, but who do not require detainment in detention. All probation youth classified as medium or maximum level supervision are required to participate in the program, and other youth under Court supervision may also be referred to the program as needed. Program outputs and outcomes are monitored on a monthly basis.

· Goals:

o Help ensure community safety

Objectives:

- o Program youth will remain at home during curfew hours while enrolled in Night Light.
- o Program youth will remain drug-free while enrolled in Night Light.

Outputs:

- o All youth classified as medium or maximum supervision probation in Jackson County will be referred to the Night Light program.
- o Random phone and face-to-face checks will be conducted during curfew hours.
- o Night Light staff will administer UA drug tests.
- o Night Light staff will make school and parent contacts.

Outcomes:

- o At least 90% of enrolled youth will not reoffend during program participation.
- o At least 80% of enrolled youth will successfully complete the program.
- o At least 75% youth compliance rate with curfew checks.
- o At least 80% of UAs administered will be negative for illegal substances

H. BUDGET

The Night Light program is primarily funded by a grant from the Jackson County COMBAT Fund. The funding paid through this grant covers the salary of the off duty law enforcement officers and mileage reimbursements for nightly ride outs. The salaries of the Court personnel is incorporated into the annual Jackson County General Fund budget. The Night Light program design for 2019 includes the participation of two deputies to accompany the Night Light Juvenile Probation Officers every night to provide curfew checks to youth residing throughout the county. This allows the Sherriff/Family Court staff partnership to provide nightly curfew checks in both Eastern Jackson County and the inner-city of Kansas City, Missouri each night. This results in an increase in the cost of the annual contractual services by approximately 25%. This proposal is requesting \$20,000.00 to supplement the increase in contractual services paid to the law enforcement officers.

- Contractual Services: \$54, 912.00 will pay two off duty law enforcement officers, each at a rate of \$33.00 per hour, for 4 hours each night that curfew checks/home visits are conducted. Home visits will be conducted four nights per week. This is a total cost of \$264 per night. The contract also requires the payment of \$250 monthly to the Sheriff's Department for mileage.

- Proposed number of juveniles served: 75-100
- Number of service hours to be provided:
 - Night Light employs two full time staff who each work 40 hours a week to execute the program. Night Light partners with the Jackson County Sheriff's Office to provide two law enforcement officers for four hours a night, four nights a week, to assist with in-home curfew checks.
- Cost of proposed services per person/per hour and calculation of how costs have been determined:
 - o \$54,912.00 will pay two off duty law enforcement officers, each at a rate of \$33.00 per hour, for 4 hours each night that home visits are conducted. This is a total cost of \$264 per night.
 - o \$3,000.00 will pay \$250 monthly to the Sheriff's office for mileage.

AN ORDINANCE repealing sections 710. and 720., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, relating to County personnel practices, and enacting, in lieu thereof, two new sections relating to the same subject.

ORDINANCE NO. 5288, November 12, 2019

INTRODUCED BY Crystal Williams, County Legislator

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

Section A. <u>Enacting Clause.</u> Sections 710. and 720., <u>Jackson County Code</u>, 1984, are hereby repealed, and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 710. and 720., to read as follows:

710. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following words and phrases have the following meanings unless otherwise clearly indicated in the text.

710.1 Applicant.

Applicant means a person seeking a merit system position with Jackson County.

Applicant does not include a County merit system employee seeking a new position with the County.

710.[1] 2 Appointing Authority.

Appointing authority means an elected official, charter officer, department head, director or the designee of that person.

710.[21] <u>3</u> <u>Commission</u>.

Commission means the Merit System Commission.

710.[3] 4 Continuous County Service.

Continuous county service means employment with Jackson County without interruption except for authorized leaves of absence.

710.[4] 5 Full-Time Employee.

Full-time employee means an employee who regularly works forty (40) hours per week.

710.[5] 6 Merit Employee.

Merit employee means any county employee not exempted by the Jackson County charter or by the merit ordinances.

710.[6] 7 Non-merit Employee.

Non-merit employee means an employee excluded from the merit system by the Jackson County charter or by ordinance.

710.[7] 8 Part-Time Employee.

Part-time employee means an employee who regularly works less than forty (40) hours per week or less than four (4) weeks a month.

710.[8] 9 Permanent Employee.

Permanent employee means an employee who has completed the applicable probationary period for his or her position.

710.[9] 10 Probationary Employee.

Probationary employee means a merit employee during the probationary period of county employment, as further defined under section 723. of this chapter.

710.11 <u>Salary</u>.

Salary means an applicant's financial compensation in exchange for labor, including wages, commissions, and bonuses.

710.12 Salary History.

Salary history means an applicant's current and past salary in the applicant's current or prior position with another employer.

710.[10] 13 Seasonal Employee.

Seasonal employee means a temporary employee who works in county service within a particular season of the year and may regularly work from year to year.

710.[21] 14 Special-Fund Employee.

Special-fund employee means an employee funded by a special fund provided by a grant of any other governmental entity or by any foundation or from any other source other than county revenues.

710.[12] 15 Temporary Employee.

Temporary employee means an employee working in a position for a defined period of time not to exceed six (6) months.

720. <u>Hiring Procedures</u>.

The following hiring procedures apply:

720.1 <u>Budget Authorization</u>, <u>Employee Positions</u>.

The appointing authority shall not hire any employee for a position that has not been provided for either in the annual budget of the department or in a budget adjustment approved by the Director of Finance and Purchasing.

720.2 Position Assignment.

All persons hired shall be assigned a position which has been assigned a class, grade and class specification.

720.3 Special-Fund Employees.

This section shall not prohibit the employment of persons in positions funded by sources other than county revenues if those funds have been allocated to the department of the appointing authority with the approval of the Director of Finance and Purchasing.

720.4 Merit Employees.

The appointing authority shall not hire any employee for a merit position unless the Human Resources Director certifies that the applicant is qualified for the position.

a. Request for Further Recruitment.

The appointing authority may reject with justification any applicant certified and request further recruitment and certification of applicants.

b. Reasons for Selection.

The appointing authority shall submit to the Human Resources Director a written statement of the reasons for selecting an applicant for a merit position.

c. Reasons for Rejection.

The appointing authority shall submit to the Human Resources Director a written statement of the reasons for the rejection of any applicant for a merit position.

720.5 Requesting Salary History, Prohibited.

- a. <u>Neither the appointing authority nor the Director of Human Resources may seek an applicant's salary history, either in an employment application form or otherwise.</u>
- b. The appointing authority may not consider or rely on an applicant's salary history as a factor in determining whether to offer employment to an applicant or in determining pay.

- c. The appointing authority may not refuse to hire or retaliate against an applicant for refusing to disclose the applicant's salary history.
- d. This subsection does not prohibit:
 - i. An applicant from voluntarily, and without prompting, disclosing the applicant's salary history, provided the appointing authority does not rely on that voluntary disclosure to determine an initial offer of starting salary for the applicant;
 - ii. The appointing authority from discussing an applicant's expectations with respect to salary without inquiring about salary history;
 - iii. The appointing authority from verifying non-salary information disclosed by an applicant or received from a background check, provided that any salary history disclosed by a background check is not used to refuse to hire or determine an applicant's salary; and
 - iv. The appointing authority from relying on salary history voluntarily provided by the applicant to pay the applicant a higher wage than initially offered, if reliance on salary history does not result in unequal pay for equal work based on membership or non-membership in a protected class.

SUBJECT: Bucket Truck from Versalift Time Manufacturing

Parks+Rec recommends purchasing a truck mounted, insulated bucket. telescopic aerial platform lift for use in the park system to perform maintenance, repairs, and painting. The truck will be used to paint/repair up to 40' above ground level. Parks will be able to more safely work on damaged trees, replace light pole light fixtures/bulbs, install conduit for electrical at park shelters, erect and light the displays for Christmas in the Park, to name a few of the uses for this bucket truck.

Parks currently has two bucket trucks (1997 & 2001 models) in inventory. Both are increasingly costly to keep in operation. The new truck will replace the 1997 model bucket truck that is currently in service. Additionally, the new truck has a higher effective working height so Parks will no longer need to rent a bucket truck to work on our six flagpoles.

The Sourcewell contract process for this type of equipment involved sending out over 70 requests for bids. They received and evaluated 14 proposals. Seven companies were selected to include the Sourcewell contract. Time Manufacturing was selected, in part, because "the company has a strong dealer and distributor network to...service members across the US...Time offers significantly discounted pricing on their primary equipment offerings, as well as accessories." - From Sourcewell RFP Comment and Review Notes.

Lastly, Parks + Rec uses this type of equipment to assist other County departments, such as Public Works (Facilities, Road & Bridge) and the Sheriff's department.
