

Funding Arrangements and Use of Funds: \$110,000 to sustain the therapeutic model Parenting with Love and Limits parenting program within Field Services.

Funding Period for Grant: The grant period is July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020

New or Existing Program/Continued Funding Opportunity: Existing program through the Missouri Division of Youth Services.

**Program Description:** Jackson County Juvenile and Family Courts in partnership with DYS has a joint goal of increasing parent involvement to serve high risk dual diagnosed probation youth (ages I0-17) to both lower recidivism rates and prevent residential commitment through the integration of Parenting with Love and Limits (PLL).

Parenting With Love and Limits is a family therapy program for adolescents with the primary diagnosis of oppositional defiant or conduct disorder and their parents. The program consists of 8-10 family therapy sessions, which are conducted in the family's home. Additional sessions may be offered depending upon the needs of the youth and family. The program is designed to provide parents with tools and techniques to reestablish their ability to determine rules and restore nurturance to the parent-child relationship. The Family Court Clinical Program Manager provides oversight to this program. Additionally PLL provides clinical oversight through web conferencing to critique recorded sessions to insure fidelity and provide additional clinical supervision.

Theoretical or Practical Basis: Parenting with Love and Limits has been widely used in the United States, Canada, and the Netherlands. 31 sites in the United States and 7 sites in the Netherlands have been licensed to implement and practice the PLL model. PLL is an evidenced based program which is based upon a family systems approach.

Expected Impact: In a recent study, youth in the PLL group had significantly greater reductions in problem behaviors compared with youth in the control group. Specifically, they had greater reductions in anxiety and depression symptoms, social problems, attention problems, rule-breaking, aggressive behaviors, internalizing problems, and externalizing problems. Parents in the PLL group reported significantly greater readiness for change compared with parents in the control group. Parents in the PLL group also exhibited significantly improved communication with their teenage children and significant reductions in negative perceptions of their teenage children relative to the control group parents. Teens in the PLL group reported significantly greater levels of readiness to change and significantly improved communication with their parents, compared with teens in the control group. The total scores of parents in the PLL group differed significantly from those of parents in the control group, indicating improved attitudes and behaviors. Parents in the PLL group reported greater parental resilience, more social support, and better problem solving and communication relative to the control group.

Evaluation Plan and/or Demonstrated Efficacy: Parenting with Love and Limits is evaluated on an ongoing basis by the Court's Research and Development Department.

Please explain the reason for the requested adjustment and include the effective date. State the need for the change and how the requested revision will further the objectives of the project

The Jackson County Family Court, Department of Field Services is requesting an extension of the Gender-Specific Tracker Program Grant through September 2020. Additional funds in the amount of \$58,625.02 are being requested to allow for continued program implementation and support. The Gender-Specific Tracker Program provides tracking support services for delinquent youth living in the community. This population of female youth are either Court ordered/supervised while on probation, in residence at the Hilltop treatment center or under community supervision pending adjudication and disposition. Participation in the Gender program enhances youth's success in the community and prevents further penetration into the juvenile justice system.

#### Program objectives Include:

- · Comprehensive tracking which includes the provision of wrap-around services which support case management, and includes the development of Success Plans for both the youth and family
- Phone or face to face contacts at least twice a week in the youth's home, school, or other community settings.
- Monitoring to ensure the youth remain in appropriate community settings, thus increasing their likelihood of safety.
- The administration of drug tests as appropriate and permissible to ensure the youth is living a drug-free lifestyle.
  Collateral contacts with the juvenile probation officer or deputy juvenile officer, parent, school officials, and other pertinent people for the purpose of collaboration around the goals of unified support of the youth.

Trackers will work to provide short-term problem solving, crisis intervention, mediation, counseling and advocacy with youth, their parents, and other significant parties involved in the youth's life. While we will continue to utilize components of the Voices curriculum to help address genderspecific issues that our youth are facing, we will also continue to hold weekly groups as well as monthly Mother/Daughter events and gender-specific workshops that will teach and reinforce a variety of life skills. During the sessions, we will explore a new group of topics and include prosocial activities that will encourage participants to have new, firsthand experiences as well as develop an understanding of the topic that can be used now and in the future. Since our first Mother/Daughter event that was hosted in November 2018, we have seen a steady increase in the number of participants. Our first event hosted one family, two (2) participants, and our most recent event, August 2019, we had a total of fourteen (14) youth with a number of parent participants and community stakeholders and staffi The weekly groups with the youth under probation supervision and in residence at Hilltop have also grown by more than 50%.

Specific topics will continue to Include:

  - Substance Abuse, Mental Health & Depression
  - · Healthy Relationships
    - Trauma & Violence, Stalking and Harassment

    - Education, College Tours, and Career Awareness
      - Character Building & Money Management
      - Discussion Women in High Tech / Well Paying & Professional fields
      - · Higher / Continuing Education
      - Friendship and Sisterhood
        - Friends & Peer Pressure
        - Social Media Etiquette
        - Anti-Bullying Suicide Rates

The Gender-Specific Tracker will continue to work with community partners such as the Kansas City Police Department, Metropolitan Community College, Kansas City Health Department, and community mental health agencies to review programs offered. The Tracker will then work to schedule workshops and make the necessary preparations for the youth to attend by assisting with transportation, securing a location for the workshop, and arranging for food, that is provided and funded by the Jackson County Family Court when needed. A portion of the grant would be used to pay for these workshops and auxiliary expenses related to the workshops.

Each component of the Voices curriculum allows for the youth to participate in a community-based, pro-social activity that will provide the youth an opportunity for new experiences. These activities will provide additional educational and practical experiences that will be tied directly to each module of the Voices curriculum. All activities will be affiliated with gender-specific issues and will promote an opportunity for continued learning and personal growth. We wish to provide the youth with activities such as plays offered by UMKC which will promote the exploration of the youth's creative side and culinary arts classes that will teach the youth independent living skills. Additionally, we will purchase tickets to take the youth to various lectures and workshops throughout the Kansas City area that promote women empowerment, self-esteem, leadership, and personal growth.

We have built into the program two culminating events for the youth. We will host a holiday celebration for the youth and their families to celebrate their successes. For our 2019 celebration, we are working in collaboration with youth that are participating in our Evening Report program to prepare a holiday performance which will showcase various dance styles. The second event is slotted to take place in May 2020. We are working to schedule a Girls to Women Tea. The Tea will promote women empowerment and serve as a reminder that young women have the ability to work in all levels of employment; from the factory floor to the boardroom.

Built into the schedule are two pro-social activities a month. We anticipate that we will have approximately 10-12 you participate in each event at an average cost of approximately \$10 per youth per event.

The total anticipated expense for tickets to the outlined pro-social events is approximately \$1,440

We are asking that funds be utilized for incentives for youth and parents for participation in the program. We believe that recognizing youth for their cooperation helps them to learn to work cooperatively. Incentives will range from gas cards to movie vouchers.

It is anticipated that 95% of the program youth will successfully complete the program without re-offending during the program period. Additionally, 85% of the program youth will complete the program without being placed in secure detention. An internal analysis will be conducted by the Family Court's Assessment and Development Department to determine if the supervision services of a Tracker impacts the recidivism.

The majority of the grant has in the past and will continue to be utilized for the salary and benefits for the Gender Specific Tracker position. Tiaunl Erby, Gender Specific Tracker, has been with the Court since 2004 working with youth at in our secure detention center where she has addressed the programming and direct care needs of Pre-Adjudicated youth. In her role she will resume providing auxiliary services to the females in the Gender Program, as well as facilitate Voicas and pro-social life skill groups. Her work will complement the assigned tasks of Gender Specific Juvenile Probation Officers as well as the Area 1 Program Manager.

It should be also noted that the Court requires that all grant-funded positions also include a benefits package that includes pension, Health, FICA, Unemployment Insurance, Worker's Compensation, and Life Insurance. There is often variance in the true cost of benefits as employees may opt for a less expensive package or walve insurance if they have it available through alternative means. In the event of surplus funds resulting from this variance, we are requesting that grant dollars be used for Back-Up Tracker.

#### Timeline

Effective October 2019 the Gender Specific Program will continue to implement the series of workshops outlined above in addition to pro-social life skills groups and special activities relevant to the topics discussed each month. The workshops are slotted for 10 weeks. All groups will be designed to allow for youth to enter at any point during the session and will recognize those youth who have attended five, ten, and fifteen sessions. The program participants will also provide formal feedback regarding their experience.

- October 2019 -- Program continuation with continued implementation of weekly/monthly workshop series; Monthly Mother/Daughter event
- December 2019 Holiday Event (includes youth's family and caring adults); Holiday Community Service Project; Monthly Mother/Daughter
- January 2020 Sessions continue; Monthly Mother/Daughter event
- March 2020 Gender Specific Logic Model Update and Annual Report completed for the previous year (2019); Monthly Mother/Daughter

- April 2020 -- Program budget adjustments submitted to DPS (If necessary); Monthly Mother/Daughter event.
   May 2020 -- Summer Celebration (pro-social event designed to encourage youth to focus on the opportunities available to them during the summer months); Monthly Mother/Daughter event.
   June 2020 -- Summer activity schedule begins; Monthly Mother/Daughter event.
   July 2020 -- Special summer event/activity; Monthly Mother/Daughter event.
   September 30, 2018 -- DPS funding cycle ends; Monthly Mother/Daughter event.

### TRAIL USE AGREEMENT

This Trail Use Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this day of	_, 20
("Effective Date"), between UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, a Delaware corporation,	whose
address is 1400 Douglas Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68179 ("UPRR") and JACKSON COUNTY, a	
political subdivision, whose address is 415 East 12th Street, Kansas City, MO 64106 ("County	").

### RECITALS

On December 31, 2015, UPRR and the County entered into an agreement (the "Line Sale Agreement") for UPRR to sell to the County and the County to purchase from UPRR, UPRR's interest in approximately 17.7 miles of UPRR's former Rock Island rail corridor, between Milepost 288.3 and Milepost 270.6 (the "Line") near Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri, as more specifically described and provided in the Line Sale Agreement.

On January 22, 2016, the County received authority through the Surface Transportation Board's (the "Board") class exemption process at 49 C.F.R. § 1150.31 to acquire the Line from UPRR and to operate the Line for common carrier rail freight service.

On April 28, 2016, the sale of the Line contemplated by the Line Sale Agreement closed, and UPRR delivered to the County a Quitclaim Deed for UPRR's interest in the Line (the "Closing"). Thereafter, the County initiated a project to construct a trail on the Line.

On October 22, 2018, certain landowners jointly filed a petition asking the Board to revoke the exemption. In a decision served on July 31, 2019, the Board revoked the County's acquisition and operation exemption.

On August 27, 2019, UPRR and the County entered into a letter agreement ("Letter Agreement") regarding UPRR's willingness to cooperate with the County by jointly filing documentation with the Board to secure abandonment authority on the Line and addressing other aspects of the situation.

On October 4, 2019, UPRR and the County jointly filed a Petition for Exemption (the "Petition") under the Board's exemption procedures at 49 C.F.R. § 1152.60, seeking an exemption from 49 U.S.C. § 10903 under 49 U.S.C. §10502 for authority to abandon the Line.

# **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants in this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, UPRR and the County hereby agree as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Compliance with Trails Act</u>. This Agreement is being entered into in accordance with and subject to the National Trails System Act, 16 U.S.C. § 1247(d), and the terms and conditions contained in the decision to be served by the Board ("Trails Use Decision"), as set forth in Section 3 below. The County acknowledges it currently has, and shall retain, full responsibility for management of the Line and for any legal liability arising out of such use or any other use.

- <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Conditions to Abandonment</u>. If the Board imposes any condition to the Petition, the County acknowledges the County shall use its best efforts to satisfy all such conditions as quickly as is reasonably practicable and the County will be responsible for the cost of satisfying all such conditions. Any assistance provided by UPRR to the County in satisfying such conditions shall be undertaken at UPRR's election, in UPRR's sole discretion, and in all events at the County's sole cost and expense, as also provided in the Letter Agreement.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Board Abandonment; Trails Use Decision</u>. In the event the Board does not issue a Trails Use Decision, , or the Trails Use Decision applicable to the Line lapses, expires or is invalidated, for reasons other than UPRR's breach of this Agreement:
- (a) if the Board has not issued any decision authorizing the abandonment of freight rail common carrier obligations on the Line, the County shall still own and retain responsibility for the Line and the County shall, upon a reasonable request for freight rail service on the Line, restore the railroad track on the Line, or otherwise demonstrate to the Board that the County is ready to provide any such freight rail service (or substitute service such as truck transload to rail service) on the Line, and the County shall seek authority from the Board to replace the authority revoked in the Board's July 31, 2019 decision; or
- (b) if the Board has issued a decision authorizing the abandonment of freight rail common carrier obligations on the Line, UPRR may consummate that abandonment authority, the County's interest in the Line shall be subject to the rights and interests of any other parties affected by such abandonment, and the County will have no recourse against UPRR arising out of UPRR's exercise of that abandonment authority; provided that UPRR may not consummate such abandonment, if Jackson County has filed an offer of financial assistance ("OFA") to continue freight rail service on the Line (which UPRR will not oppose), and the Board has not denied the OFA in a decision found to be valid by a final, un-appealable judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- (c) If any person requests freight rail service on the Line, then the County, not UPRR, shall be responsible to provide any such requested freight rail service. In the event the Board orders UPRR to provide any freight rail service on the Line, or UP is otherwise required to provide freight rail service on the Line, then, except for the portion of the Line over which UPRR has reserved a an easement for railroad purposes, the County shall reimburse any cost of UPRR in providing such freight rail service, including any cost to restore the Line to a condition over which freight rail service is possible.
- (d) The County may decide to appeal any decision by the Board, or any failure of the Board to issue a decision, contemplated in this Section. If the County appeals, it must also request an order from the Board or the appropriate court to preserve the status quo pending the outcome of the appeal. If such an order is not granted then UPRR may proceed as allowed under this Section. If the County desires that UPRR not invoke any course of action while the appeal is pending, then the County must so notify UPRR. UPRR agrees to cooperate in the County's request provided the County agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend UPRR in any proceedings or claims that arise out of UPRR's cooperation and the County agrees to reimburse UPRR for any costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred by UPRR due to UPRR's cooperation.
- <u>Section 4. Joint Notice to Surface Transportation Board</u>. In accordance with the requirements of 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29(h), the County and UPRR agree to execute (1) a Joint Notice to the Board certifying that this Agreement includes a provision requiring the County to fulfill the responsibilities described at 49 C.F.R. § 1152.29(a)(3) ("Joint Notice"), and (ii) a Statement of Willingness to Assume

Financial Responsibility ("Statement of Willingness"), both in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof.

<u>Section 5. Notice</u>. Any notices required or desired to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and personally served, given by overnight express delivery, or given by mail. Any notice given by mail shall be sent, postage prepaid, by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the party to receive at the following address or at such other address as the party may from time to time direct in writing:

Express delivery notices shall be deemed to be given upon receipt. Postal notices shall be deemed to be given three (3) days after deposit with the United States Postal Service.

# Section 6. Assignment.

The County shall not transfer or assign this Agreement, or any interest therein, without the consent in writing of UPRR, and it is agreed that any such transfer or assignment, whether voluntary, by operation of law or otherwise, without such consent in writing, shall be absolutely void and shall, at the option of UPRR, terminate this Agreement.

# Section 7. Waiver of Breach.

A waiver by either party of a breach by the other party of any covenant or condition of this Agreement shall not impair the right of the party not in default to avail itself of any subsequent breach thereof. Leniency, delay or failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any agreement, covenant or condition of this Agreement, or to exercise any right

under this Agreement, shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of any such agreement, covenant, condition or right.

# Section 8. Time of the Essence.

Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

# Section 9. Law Governing.

This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of Missouri.

# Section 10. Successors and Assigns.

Subject to the provisions of Section 6, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties, their successors and assigns.

# Section 11. Severability.

In the event that any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction under applicable law, the remaining portions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and such provision shall be enforced to the maximum extent possible so as to effect the intent of the parties and shall be reformed to the extent necessary to make such provision valid and enforceable.

# Section 12. Entire Agreement.

It is understood and agreed that all understandings and agreements, whether written or oral, heretofore had between the parties, with the exception of the Line Sale Agreement and the Letter Agreement, are merged in this Agreement. This Agreement, the Line Sale Agreement and the Letter Agreement fully and completely express the agreement between the parties, and neither party is relying upon any statement or representation not embodied in this Agreement, the Line Sale Agreement or the Letter Agreement, made by the other, and that this Agreement may not be changed except by an instrument in writing signed by both parties.

<u>Section 13. Survival</u>. The terms and provisions of the Line Sale Agreement and the Letter Agreement continue in full force and effect.

Effective September 21, 2019 and extending through September 20, 2020, we are respectfully requesting a one-year extension of this grant funding. When we were awarded this grant we began the process of creating this position which required legislative approval of the grant appropriation and a review by our Human Resources factoring committee. These processes are complete and we are ready to hire for this position. We posted the position and initially received no suitable applicants. We reposted the position and received one qualified applicant. We began the interview process and at the point of second interviews, the candidate withdrew. We have reposted the position and will begin interviewing candidate again this week. In Kansas City this year, we have observed a decline in candidates for our open positions across the board. An extension of these funds will allow us to hire this position and further our work in the area of Disproportionate Minority Contact by allowing us to utilize a dedicated employee. In the interim, this year we have mobilized a group of employees to keep the work on this initiative moving forward, specifically:

We have prepared a newsletter informing staff of the DMC/RED Issues and our work-in-progress;

· We are continuing to develop our decision points data to identify racial disparity in our case processing in both delinquency and child abuse and neglect cases; and,

We brought in trainers from Crossroads Antiracism to train staff on structural racism.

We are in need of this grant-funded dedicated person to continue this work and serve on our State committee, organize our community stakeholders, write a local strategic plan, and develop or procure training to increase cultural competence, eliminate racial biases and improve race relations among our staff and between our staff and clients. We have qualified applicants in our current applicant pool and we are confident we can hire this position by the end of September if this extension is approved.


