Veto Message from the County Executive

Ordinance 5374

TO THE JACKSON COUNTY LEGISLATURE:

I am returning herewith without my approval Ordinance 5374, which, most notably, proposes a question to voters on the November general election ballot authorizing the removal of Andrew Jackson statues located at Jackson County courthouses in Kansas City and Independence.

Since the tragic murder of George Floyd, I have been inspired by the courageous leadership of so many across our country. The acts demanding change have come from those young and old. They have come from men and women of all races and creeds. They have come from private citizens and elected officials alike. In one form or another, they all have stood up and said — Black Lives Matter.

I am saddened to say, in the days, weeks, and months that have followed the tragic murder of George Floyd, the Jackson County Legislature has not acted courageously. In fact, there has not even been a resolution of the Legislature condemning the horrific murder of George Floyd, nor a statement saying that Black Lives Matter in Jackson County. Even though last year, the very same Legislature unanimously passed a resolution celebrating the anniversary of a former slave plantation, and the year before that they passed a resolution in support of composting.

We must do better.

We must show our community that we are not afraid to confront the most serious of issues and take decisive action when it is right. I am hopeful that the passage of time has provided an opportunity for members of our Legislature to reflect on their vote and act differently. However, I am vetoing this Ordinance not just in the hopes that Legislators will reconsider their position, but also to allow them an opportunity to take a clear position.

Even if Legislators ultimately decide to allow this issue to go to the voters, I am calling upon them to take a stand. As the recently deceased civil rights icon and Congressman John Lewis said just last year:

"When you see something that is not right, not just, not fair, you have a moral obligation . . . to do something. Our children and their children will ask us, 'what did you do?' . . . We have a mission and a mandate to be on the right side of history."

These statues are no longer simply a vestige of the past. These are our statues now and I am giving you another opportunity to directly tell the residents of our community if you believe the statues should be taken down or not. If leaders in my birth state of Mississippi, the NFL team in Washington, D.C., even NASCAR have acknowledged and gotten rid of their hurtful imagery, Jackson County should too.

For the foregoing reasons, Ordinance 5374 has earned my veto.

AN ORDINANCE submitting to the qualified voters of Jackson County, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, a question authorizing Jackson County to remove the statues of Andrew Jackson at the Jackson County Courthouse located in Kansas City and the Historic Truman Courthouse located in Independence.

ORDINANCE NO. 5374, July 13, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Theresa Cass Galvin, Dan Tarwater III, Scott Burnett, Tony Miller, Charlie Franklin, and Jeanie Lauer, County Legislators

WHEREAS, on December 16, 1826, Jackson County, Missouri was organized and named after Andrew Jackson, who would later become the seventh president of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, while serving as presiding judge of Jackson County, President Harry S

Truman was instrumental in the approval by the voters of Jackson County of a bond issue
for the construction of the Downtown Kansas City Courthouse; and,

WHEREAS, using bond funds, then Judge Harry S Truman commissioned the equestrian statue of President Andrew Jackson from sculptor Charles Keck, which was unveiled in front of the newly constructed courthouse on December 27, 1934; and,

WHEREAS, Charles Keck created a smaller, identical equestrian statue that he gifted to President Truman; and,

WHEREAS, on December 26, 1949, President Truman in turn, gifted that statue to the people of Jackson County, to be displayed at the Historic Truman Courthouse located in Independence, Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20337, dated December 16, 2019, the County Legislature approved language to be included on plaques to be affixed to the statues of Andrew Jackson located in Kansas City and Independence, to acknowledge aspects of the history of Andrew Jackson's life which includes evidence of his support of the institution of slavery and the Indian Removal Act; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Subject to the approval of the voters of Jackson County, at the general election to be held on November 3, 2020, the statues of Andrew Jackson located outside the Jackson County Courthouse in Kansas City and the Historic Truman Courthouse in Independence, shall be removed.

<u>Section 2.</u> The qualified voters at said election shall vote by ballot and the ballots to be used at said election shall contain the following language:

JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI QUESTION #_2 GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 3, 2020 OFFICIAL BALLOT

Shall Jackson County, Missouri, remove the statues of Andrew Jackson now located outside the Jackson County Courthouse in Kansas City and the Historic Truman Courthouse in Independence?

<u>Section 3</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective upon approval of the question submitted by the voters of Jackson County at the general election on November 3, 2020.

Section 4. The Clerk of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Jackson County and Kansas City Boards of Election Commissioners of the adoption of this Ordinance no later than 5:00 p.m. on August 25, 2020, and to include in said notification all of the terms and provisions required by section 115.125, RSMo.

During the month of June, I prepared and submitted application to the Department of Justice – Bureau of Justice Assistance for grant funding under the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding program. The funding was sought to allow the purchase of technology related equipment and supplies to allow the Sex Offender Registration Enforcement Unit to conduct their statutorily required offender registration activities while preparing for, preventing, and responding to coronavirus.

The equipment and supplies to be funded by CESF grant funds will allow the Sex Offender Registration Enforcement Unit to conduct registration activities in additional, alternate, and/or in-field locations by providing them with equipment such as computers, printers, scanners, and LIVESCAN fingerprint collection stations which can be used outside of the SORE office.

Congratulations on your recent award. The Office for Civil Rights (OCR), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) has been delegated the responsibility for ensuring that recipients of federal financial assistance from the OJP, the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) are not engaged in discrimination prohibited by law. 5. Required training for Point of Contact and all Financial Points of Contact

Both the Point of Contact (POC) and all Financial Points of Contact (FPOCs) for this award must have successfully completed an "OJP financial management and grant administration training" by 120 days after the date of the recipient's acceptance of the award. Successful completion of such a training on or after January 1, 2018, will satisfy this condition.

In the event that either the POC or an FPOC for this award changes during the period of performance, the new POC or FPOC must have successfully completed an "OJP financial management and grant administration training" by 120 calendar days after -- (1) the date of OJP's approval of the "Change Grantee Contact" GAN (in the case of a new POC), or (2) the date the POC enters information on the new FPOC in GMS (in the case of a new FPOC). PROGRAM NARRATIVE

Introduction

Jackson County (MO) is a local government entity which provides critical public safety and other vital services to a population of approximately 674,158 citizens. The Jackson County Sheriff's Office consists of a staff of approximately 105 sworn law enforcement officers, and 40 non-sworn support staff.

The responsibilities of the Sheriff's Office include the management of 2,252 persons residing or working in Jackson County who are legally required to register as Sex Offenders. The Sheriff's Office is the sole agency in Jackson County with this responsibility.

As required by the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Program solicitation, Jackson County is a local government entity that was identified as eligible for funding under the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 State and Local Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program.

The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) identified Jackson County for an eligible allocation of \$58,008 in the CESF solicitation, found at:

(https://bja.ojp.gov/sites/g/files/xyckuh186/files/media/document/fy20-cesf-allocations-mo.pdf)

This allocation would be utilized for prevention, preparation for and response to the coronavirus.

Due to the unforeseen effects of this pandemic, the Jackson County Sheriff's Office did not have funding allocated for its response to this emergency in the annual Sheriff's Office budget.

Overview

On March 13th, 2020, President Donald Trump declared a national emergency in the United States concerning the outbreak of COVID-19 coronavirus. On Tuesday, March 17th, 2020, the Jackson County Department of Health announced the first coronavirus case in Eastern Jackson County. On April 16th, 2020, Jackson County Executive Frank White, Jr. signed a Stay-at-Home Order for Jackson County, MO, and on the same day, 16th Circuit Court Presiding Judge David M. Byrn signed an order effectively closing court facilities to public access.

Statement of Current and Future Need

Since the arrival of coronavirus in Jackson County, the Jackson County Sheriff's Office began immediate steps to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. Registration of Sex Offenders is required by the State of Missouri to occur in person. However, beginning March 17th, 2020, the State made provisions to allow for remote registrations using telephone, internet, or mail-in contact with offenders. These provisions will not allow remote registration to continue past June 15th, 2020, and all registrations or updates after that date will be required to occur in person.

Of the 2,252 persons residing or working in Jackson County who are required to register as sex offenders, many are homeless and/or unemployed and rely on walking or using public transportation to reach the Sheriff's Office Sex Offender Registration Unit.

The Sheriff's Office Sex Offender Registration Unit, where registrations take place, is located at 1315 Locust Street, Kansas City, in the Albert Riederer Community Justice Complex. This complex also contains two active courtrooms, and other county offices. The Sex Offender Registration Unit sees an average of 39 offenders per day with appointments and accommodates an average of 30 walk in offenders per day seeking to make updates to their registration. The office space used for Sex Offender registration will only accommodate two offenders inside the office at a time when social distancing guidelines are used. When walk-in or waiting offenders are present, there is not adequate space for offenders to wait while observing social distancing guidelines.

The Sheriff's Office has faced unexpected difficulties in preventing, preparing for, and responding to COVID-19 where the continued registration of sex offenders is concerned.

In order to accomplish the legally required task of registering and updating offender registrations while taking social distancing and other measures to prevent the spread of coronavirus, the Sheriff's Office will need to conduct registrations in alternate locations, or in the field, instead of or in addition to in the existing Sex Offender Registration office.

Field deployable registration equipment and personnel should be deployed to locations that will allow for suitable measures to prevent, prepare for and respond to COVID-19, including increased social distancing, adherence to stay-at-home orders or facility closures, and preventing gathering / loitering in groups.

Current and future purchase costs include, but are not limited to computers, fingerprint collection equipment, printers, scanners, and portable protective barriers / shields to be used outside the

offender registration office. Jackson County would not utilize the CESF program to fund direct administrative costs that exceed more than 10 percent of the total award amount (\$58,008).

Based on the rapidly changing needs related to the coronavirus pandemic and its effects on the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, financial support from the CESF program would be best received through advanced draw down funds. Jackson County is prepared to place those funds in an interest-bearing account dedicated specifically to the program award. These funds would not be comingled with any other funds, and would not be supplanting state or local funds that have been made available for this emergency.

Summary and Conclusion

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office has been extensively involved with the coronavirus pandemic since the virus's arrival in Jackson County. The current and unforeseen costs related to the Sheriff's Office response cannot be covered within the offices' annual budget and will impact its ability to address other public safety needs. Utilization of the Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF) Program solicitation will help mitigate the financial impact of this local and national emergency.

BUDGET NARRATIVE

The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) identified Jackson County for an eligible allocation of \$58,008 in the CESF solicitation. This allocation would be utilized for prevention, preparation, and response to the coronavirus. Due to the unforeseen effects of this pandemic, the Jackson County Sheriff's Office did not have funding allocated for its response to this emergency in the annual Sheriff's Office budget.

The Sheriff's Office is obligated to accommodate in-person registrations and updates with persons required to register as sex offenders beginning June 15th, 2020. The Sheriff's Office sees an average of 39 offenders with appointments, and 30 offenders without appointments per day. These visits occur in an office located at 1315 Locust Street, Kansas City, which is a facility shared by two active courtrooms and other county offices. The volume of offenders required to visit the Sex Offender Registration Unit's offices daily is too large to allow for adequate social distancing and other measures to prevent the spread of coronavirus.

The Sheriff's Office will incur equipment expenses to allow for registration appointments to be held in additional locations outside of the Sex Offender Registration Unit's offices. Conducting registration in additional, alternate or in-field locations will allow the Sheriff's Office to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus.

Where COVID-19 prevention, preparation and response require the Sheriff's Office Sex Offender Registration Unit to conduct mandatory registration contacts in modified or alternate locations to accommodate social distancing, sanitization, and contact with quarantined or isolated offenders, federal funding is requested for equipment. Sheriff's Office personnel use computers to enter registration information, use fingerprint identification confirmation devices to confirm offender identity, and use Livescan fingerprint and photograph stations to collect fingerprints from offenders for entry into State and FBI databases.

Offender registrations are required by law to be conducted in person. Sheriff's Office personnel use printers and document scanners to collect required documents from offenders, provide offenders with printed notices, and print physical copies of registrations for files. Sheriff's Office personnel would use portable desktop protective barriers / screens to provide additional protection between the offenders and Sheriff's Office personnel. Sheriff's Office personnel would use rugged equipment transport cases to move required registration and social distancing equipment between their office and any modified, alternate, or in-field registration locations.

Expendable office supplies include paper for portable printers, cartridges and expendable items for use in printers and scanners, and cleaning supplies to sanitize all equipment between offenders and moves. The amount for expendable office and cleaning supplies is based upon \$485.00 for one year, was calculated using prior Sheriff's Office experience with portable printer operation and sanitization of equipment, and is calculated for use only when registration contacts are conducted in alternate, modified, or in-field locations away from the Sex Offender Unit office due to prevention, preparation or response to COVID-19.

Capt. Covey,

On 03-13-19, members of the command staff (Maj. M. Montgomery, Capts. Covey, Epperson, Goodman, and Rogers) joined me in viewing an internet-based demonstration of IAPro and BlueTeam applications.

The IAPro and BlueTeam applications could facilitate electronic completion, routing and review, and recording of administrative personnel records of the Sheriff's Office. This includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Citizen Complaints, and Subsequent Investigations
- 2. Policy Violations, and Subsequent Investigations
- 3. Pursuit Reports, and Subsequent Review / Policy Violation Investigations
- 4. Use of Force Reports, and Subsequent Review / Policy Violation Investigations
- 5. Sheriff's Office-Involved Vehicle Crash Reporting / Review / Investigations
- 6. Requests for Equipment, Off-Duty Employment, and nearly all other current "Inter-Office Memo" requests
- 7. Injury and Accident Reports involving members
- 8. Critical Incident Exposure reports for members

Where all of the above tasks are currently accomplished using paper forms, files, and attachments, IAPro and BlueTeam would make the tasks paperless. The applications accept entries from field level personnel, and automatic routing through the appropriate chain of command. This removes any delays, possibilities of lost or misplaced paperwork, or accountability issues associated with the movement of paper files through the chain of command.

The applications would also accommodate automatic tracking of time limits or deadlines established by the chain for the movement of items through the process.

In addition to the paperless processing of personnel records associated with discipline and administrative records, the IAPro and BlueTeam software features robust report creation tools, which can create custom reports involving incidents and members, such as:

- 1. Report of member disciplinary history
- 2. Report of discipline imposed in the past by violation type
- 3. Early Intervention reports / warnings by violation type / incident type / use-of-force
- 4. Exposure warning / reports when members are exposed to pre-determined levels of critical incidents
- 5. Early Intervention reports / warnings when members accumulate citizen complaints / reports of policy violations within pre-determined periods of time

I believe that the acquisition of the IAPro and Blue Team applications would be beneficial to the Sheriff's Office to streamline the reporting of incidents, complaints, policy violations, and other administrative record keeping processes associated with our members. The paperless nature, timekeeping, and automatic routing features will reduce liability associated with the possibility of lost or missing files. The Early Intervention and reporting features will aid the command staff in ensuring the ongoing wellbeing of our members. Most importantly, the consolidation of tasks associated with the current paper-based processes into a monitored and controlled electronic software platform will increase accountability and compliance with reporting requirements from the field level, up to and including the command staff.

In addition to research and demonstration of the product by the developer, several members of the command staff and I have spoken with Interim Chief Maj. Hudspeth of Raytown Police Department, and Capt. Michelle Rogers, also of Raytown Police Department. The Raytown PD currently uses the IAPro and BlueTeam solutions, and are pleased with them.

I have attached the following to this memorandum:

- 1. Quote from IAPro dated 06-09-2020
- 2. Informational Materials from IAPro and BlueTeam

The purchase of IAPro and BlueTeam software includes on-site training of users, setup and configuration of the software, and on-site training for field level personnel in the use of BlueTeam for the initial entry of reports.

I recommend that funds be sourced for the purchase of the IAPro and BlueTeam softwares.

This software can be purchased through SHI, existing Term and Supply Vendor for Jackson County. Bid process would not be required. Legislative action would be required to approve the expenditure.

RESOLUTION NO. 20467, July 27, 2020

INTRODUCED BY Ronald E. Finley, County Legislator

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2014, ministers across Missouri staged a demonstration in the Missouri Senate gallery after lawmakers refused to expand Medicaid; and,

WHEREAS, this peaceful protest was made in solidarity, and by prayer and pleas for greater health equity and healthcare affordability in Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, this selfless act of protest resulted in the arrest of the twenty-three protesters, who were charged with trespassing and obstructing government operations; and,

WHEREAS, those arrested on May 6, 2014, were the Medicaid 23: Rev. Dr. Wallace S. Hartsfield, Sr. (deceased), Rev. Emmett Baker, Jr., Rev. Dr. John H. Bennett, Rev. Tony Caldwell, Rev. Chania Chandler, Rev. W.T. Edmonson, Rev. Lloyd D. Fields, Sr., Elder Jessie Fisher, Dawn Hickman, Evangelist Esther L. Holsendorf, Bishop Steve Houpe, Rev. Dr. Vernon P. Howard, Jr., Rev. Tony Johnson, Rev Karlous Kalu, David Kingsley, Riccardo Lucas, Rev. Dr. Samuel E. Mann, Rev. Susan McCann, Rev Donna McDaniel, Rev. Kenneth Moseley, Rev. Dr. Tex R. Sample, Bishop James D. Tindall, and Rev. Dr. Rodney D. Williams; and,

WHEREAS, this group has continued their advocacy for Medicaid expansion in Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, Medicaid expansion is on the August 4, 2020 ballot for approval across Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, if passed, Missouri Amendment 2 will require the state to provide Medicaid healthcare services for persons under the age of 65 whose income is equal to or below 138 percent of the official poverty line; and,

WHEREAS, Missouri is one of only fourteen states that have rejected federal funds to cover the costs of the recommended Medicaid expansion; and,

WHEREAS, it is estimated that over 200,000 citizens of Missouri will benefit if Medicaid is expanded in the state, with the federal government covering ninety percent of the cost through the Affordable Care Act; and,

WHEREAS, the Medicaid 23 are due our gratitude for their sacrifice, leadership, and commitment to the betterment of the lives of Missourians; and,

WHEREAS, support for this ballot initiative is vital to helping lower-income people get access to cost-effective, preventative, and primary healthcare; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the Legislature hereby proclaims its gratitude to the Medicaid 23 and extends its support for the Yes on 2 Healthcare for Missouri ballot initiative.

WHEREAS, pursuant to article V, section 3 of the Jackson County Charter, the Jackson County Prosecuting Attorney did, on January 22, 2020, execute an Agreement with Zamkus and Associates, of Jefferson City, MO, for governmental consulting services for use by her office at a cost of \$10,000.00; and,

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20425, dated May 11, 2020, the Legislature did authorize a one-month extension to this contract, at a cost to the County in the amount of \$5,000.00; and,

WHEREAS, the governmental consulting services contracted for include, but are not limited to, monitoring and advocating for legislation, identifying and tracking appropriations to assist in the enforcement of criminal laws in Jackson County, facilitating key meetings with staff, and providing written and oral reports to the Prosecuting Attorney's Office; and,
