WHEREAS, the Missouri Department of Public Safety has awarded a grant in the amount of \$132,436.61 to the Prosecuting Attorney's Office for its Drug Abatement Response Team (DART) program for partial funding of salaries and benefits for the employees of the DART Unit for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the DART program is a collaborative and multi-jurisdictional team created to target and close down drug houses within the City of Kansas City; and,

WHEREAS, the grant is subject to a local match in the amount of \$183,421.54; and,

WHEREAS, a transfer and appropriation are necessary in order to place the grant and matching funds in the proper spending accounts; now therefore,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends a thirty-six month term and supply contract with Thomson Reuters/West Law of Eagan, MN, for the furnishing of on-line legal publications and legal research services for use by the Prosecuting Attorney's, County Counselor's, and County Executive's Offices, County Legislature, and Collections and Assessment Departments; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing further recommends that he not take competitive bids with regard to said contract for the reason that Thomson Reuters/West Law is the only supplier of its proprietary on-line legal publications and

legal research services which best meet the needs of the user agencies; and,

WHEREAS, a thirty-six month contract is recommended to secure the best pricing; and,

WHEREAS, this award is made on an as needed basis and does not obligate Jackson County to pay any amount, with the availability of funds for specific purchases remaining subject to annual appropriation; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that award be made as recommended by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, and that the Director be, and is hereby, authorized to execute for the County any documents necessary to the accomplishment of the award; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 20461, dated July 13, 2020, the County Legislature did transfer \$32,445.00 within the 2020 General Fund and authorize the County Executive "to execute a Cooperative Agreement with Westside CAN, on the terms outlined in [the] Resolution, in a form to be approved by the County Counselor;" and,

WHEREAS, the County Counselor has prepared and approved the form of the Cooperative Agreement, and Westside CAN has executed the Cooperative Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, County Executive has yet to execute the Cooperative Agreement with Westside Community Action Network; now therefore,

As requested, we are submitting a price for the added parking lot at the Raytown Chamber of Commerce. We feel the existing design does not allow for adequate cover over the RCP. In fact, the pipe profile shown on page 179 has about 8" of cover which would extend 4" into the asphalt. We propose to extend the pipe 2' and lower the outlet 1.5'. THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the ____ day of August, 2020 by and between County of Jackson, a public body corporate and politic of the State of Missouri, acting by and through the **Jackson County Legislature** (hereinafter referred to as "Owner"), and **JCDC Partners, LLC**, a Missouri Limited Liability Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Owner's Representative").

STATEMENT OF COMPONENT SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Component Services Agreement and the provisions contained herein form the basis of understanding between the Owner and Owner's Representative for scope, compensation, and schedule of performance, for the specific Owner's Representative services detailed as follows.

The Master Agreement for Owner's Representative Services sets forth the general basis of understanding, terms, and governance for this agreement. This Component Service Agreement is bound to, and becomes part of the Master Agreement for Owner's Representative Services executed December 23, 2019.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreement herein contained and hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. BENCHMARKING - SCOPE

- 1.1. Benchmark programmed facility with like high-performing facilities, with regard to proposed operations, configuration, procedures and staffing.





Attached you will find a table that compiles the evaluation from 4 panelists. Global offers the lowest price for lease and purchase of a trash compactor.

We are currently spending \$155.00 per week to rent a trash compactor which will have an annual cost of approximately \$8,000. In addition, we have had to increase the trash pickup to three times per week instead of two because we are unable to compact the trash. The additional pickup averages \$60.00 per week, an annual cost of \$3,120.00. The current rental expense will exceed the cost to purchase a compactor in a little over two years. The cost to purchase and install a trash compactor from Global is \$25,864.

The cost to lease is significantly more expensive than the cost to purchase a compactor. Global has many years of experience in this industry. I am recommending that we purchase a new compactor from Global.

The Jackson County Drug Court makes no guarantee of the number of units purchased under this contract/agreement or the amount of dollars expended. Re: Recommendation for Drug Court Treatment Provider

I am writing to recommend that an agreement be reached to obtain treatment services from the Heartland Center for Behavioral Change ("HBC") for our Drug Court Program.

After posting a request for proposal for a treatment provider for our Drug Court Program, our finance department received proposals from HBC and Comprehensive Mental Health Service, Inc. On April 10, 2020, a review team met virtually via Microsoft teams to score/grade the two submissions. Based on the raw scores, the submission from HBC scored slightly higher than that of the submission by Comprehensive Mental Health Service, Inc. Attached is the score sheet showing the cumulative score.

Thereafter, while still being in the midst of the pandemic and adjusting to the re-opening of Court with multiple new revised dockets and staggered work schedules, our staff met with members of HBC to discuss various items related to their submission in late April and May 2020.

First, we sought information regarding the increased pricing in HBC's quotation page (see page 61 of their submission). We were advised that the new pricing was related to the increased cost of providing services identified. In addition, HBC noted that the prior pricing had remained at one level for the five previous years without an increase. Second, we advised HBC that it is our expectation that they are required to provide an observer for testing. This point was identified and discussed by them in their submission on pages 98-105. HBC noted that they recognize their obligation and noted that currently they have staff available that can meet this need. Third, we noted that "CLEARLOGIC" or any system used by HBC for maintaining participant records must be accessible to the treatment team to the extent that those members will be able to view the system and track the progress and treatment of participants. In addition, HBC agreed to allow us to retrieve this information should there be a future end to the program's connection to HBC.

Fourth, we discussed with HBC that there has been a growing need for flexibility in scheduling regarding locations to test, individual therapy and group therapy. We anticipate that this need will grow given the logistical issues created by the pandemic. HBC are aware of these issues and appears ready to meet these challenges and they have agreed to work with the treatment team and the Court on this issue.

In late May 2020, my father in law became ill and entered hospice treatment. He passed away in late June 2020 after fighting a devasting stroke that limited him over the last two years. Because of personal obligations, I was sporadically in and out of the office through the middle of July. That personal matter combined with other work deadlines and responsibilities have caused my delay in providing this memorandum. I apologize for that delay and take full responsibility for timing of this memorandum.

The ability to provide the high level of quality treatment for our Drug Court and Veterans' Court participants is a critical part of our program. As part of any contract, HBC will be required to perform an assessment for each participant. This assessment will identify an individualized treatment plan designed specifically for each participant based on that participant's history (i.e. social, criminal, and abuse), access to resources, and projected needs for achieving and maintaining sobriety. HBC's contractual obligations will also require a variety of additional services be provided to participants. These include but are not limited to individual counseling, group counseling, sanction groups, and observation during urinalysis drug testing.

Completing the agreement with HBC to provide treatment in our Drug Court is of critical importance. The Jackson County Drug Court started in October 1993. To date, the Drug Court program has graduated over 2700 participants. As of March 1, 2020, our treatment Court programs had over 400 active participants. Based on a review of prior treatment provider billing in conjunction with the projected costs identified in HBC's request for proposal response, we project that we will need approximately \$70,000 a month or \$840,000 annually to maintain the programmatic standards for treatment.
