WHEREAS, the Department of Corrections desires to contract with an independent firm to manage and oversee inmate telecommunications services for the inmate population at the Jackson County Detention Center; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing has solicited bids on Request for Proposal No. 13-10 for the furnishing of inmate telecommunication management services for use by the Department of Corrections; and,

WHEREAS, a total of five (5) notifications were distributed and two (2) responses received and evaluated as follows:

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends that the contract be awarded to Praeses of Shreveport, LA, as the best overall bid; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that award be made as recommended by the Director of Finance and Purchasing, and that the Director be, and is hereby, authorized to execute for the County any documents necessary to the accomplishment of the award.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Legislature of Jackson County, Missouri, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute a Cooperative Agreement with Praeses of Shreveport, LA, in a form to be approved by the County Counselor, at no cost to the county; and,

Review of Submissions for RFP Number 13-10, Inmate Telecommunication

Management Services

Two bids were received and reviewed for this RFP, Praeses and Protocall, LLC. Reviews were completed by Ken Conlee, Director, and Laura Scott, Manager of Services.

Praeses is headquartered in Shreveport, LA, while Protocall, LLC., is located locally in Olathe. Kansas. The bids were reviewed with the cited evaluation criteria commanding the most attention. The evaluation is as follows:

Response to terms and conditions: 5 points

- 1) Praeses responded adequately to all cited terms and conditions of the RFP. 5 points
- 2) Protocall, LLC does not address historical reconciliation, and appears to be a phone provider rather than a management consulting firm. 2 points

Experience: 20 points

- 1) Praeses has worked specifically in consulting, management and reconciliation with numerous large County facilities and State DOC's over the past 10 years. 20 points
- 2) Protocall LLC has worked with numerous small County facilities on phone, visitation and officer tracking system installation, and software training. The business is described as an inmate phone provider. Experience appears to be more technical than investigative. 10 points

Qualifications of Managers: 20 Points

- 1) Qualifications of the Praeses Manager(s) appear to be adequate. 20 points
- 2) Qualifications of the Protocall LLC Manager(s) appear to be adequate. 20 points

Proposal Content: 25 Points

- 1) The proposal submitted by Praeses appears to cover all of the major requirements cited in the RFP. 25 Points
- 2) The proposal submitted by Protocall LLC does not address historical reconciliation.

 Consulting services on the content and development of the RFP are more adequately described than other services. Related to measurement and actions Protocall states they will "Inform users of points of contact for repair, tech support, [etc]" however JCDC

"users" have the expectation that the consultant will be the point of contact to manage these services. 15 Points

Cost: 30 Points

- 1) Praeses charges a 10.47% rate of the total monies paid by the ITPS, and guarantees an increase on the average monthly net return or a payback that equals that average monthly net return after the first 18 months. The rate for historical reconciliation is 33 1/3%. 25 points
- 2) Protocall LLC offers hourly rates which are not definable as there is no indication of the number of hours historical reconciliation and current services would require. They also offer a straight fee or percentage "whichever is greater" at a cost of \$143,000 for the first year (the greater as compared to 9%). This amount is approximately 60% of the current inmate phone commission. Protocall LLC will forego \$15,000 of the fee in the first year if commissions are not increased by 10%, however even with a 10% increase in commission the county would still lose money off the current commission. Year two and beyond \$60.000 is 25 % of the current inmate phone commission. 0 points

Based on the review and subsequent evaluation, the Department of Corrections recommends that the County accept the proposal offered by Praeses.

PRICING

Praeses' fee for services rendered to Jackson County will be assessed as follows:

- A) A rate of 10.47% of the total monies paid by Inmate Telecommunication Service Providers (ITSP) to Jackson County for any and all revenues generated by and through the inmate telephone system operated by the ITSP at the Jackson County facilities;
- B) A rate of 33 1/3% of all historical reconciliation compensation paid to Jackson County. If no historical reconciliation is collected because Jackson County elects not to pursue identified compensation, then Jackson County will pay Praeses a rate of 15% of the identified historical reconciliation compensation. Jackson County's pursuit of identified historical reconciliation compensation is defined as performance of reasonable business means.

Historical reconciliation compensation is defined as specific anomalies in revenue or revenue due Jackson County but not initially reported or paid by an ITSP, which results in compensation paid to Jackson County.

These fees will pay for the management services identified in the proposed Agreement. This will be the only compensation Praeses receives for servicing Jackson County's account. Praeses shall not receive any additional fees from any ITSP, that are paid based on the revenue generated on the inmate telephones covered by the proposed Agreement. The management fees described above will be deducted monthly by Praeses at the time of the delivery of the monthly reports.

GUARANTEE

Within the first 18 months of the Agreement with Praeses, Praeses guarantees that Jackson County will receive, at a minimum, its average monthly net return from inmate telephones for the 18 months prior to the effective date of the proposed Agreement. If Praeses fails to increase the average monthly net return to Jackson County enough to cover the Praeses management fee during the first 18 months of the agreement, Praeses will return, within 30 days and upon the request from Jackson County, the difference between the net monthly average revenue earned in the 18 months prior to the Agreement with Praeses and the net monthly average revenue earned during the 18 months with Praeses under the Agreement up to the total fees retained by Praeses. Jackson County will void the guarantee if Jackson County enters into an agreement with an ITSP for rate reductions that cause commission reductions that are beyond Praeses' control or takes any other action what will materially reduce inmate populations or inmate telephone revenue.
