WHEREAS, the Division of Youth Services now desires to award additional funds in the amount of \$50,000.00, to expand the scope of the program to include a demonstration project called Parenting with Love and Limits, which combines parent education and group therapy with individual coaching sessions for adolescents and their parents; and,

WHEREAS, the grant does not require local matching funds; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriation is necessary to place the grant funds in the proper spending account; now therefore,

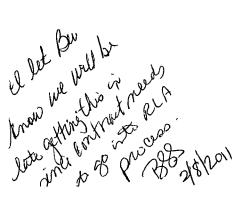
