COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

(Food Services)

R. 17482

AN AGREEMENT by and between Jackson County, Missouri, a Constitutional Charter County, hereinafter referred to as "the County" and the **Mid-America Regional Council**, 600 Broadway, Suite 200, Kansas City, MO 64105, a regional planning commission operating pursuant to Section 251.150 et seq., RSMo, hereinafter referred to as "MARC."

WHEREAS, the County deems it to be in the best interest of its citizenry to support programs and services for the aging community as provided by MARC and other agencies, under subcontracts with MARC; and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 70, RSMo, dealing with cooperative agreements; therefore,

The County and MARC agree, in consideration of the following mutual promises and valuable consideration, as follows:

- 1. <u>Services To Be Provided</u>. MARC shall provide scheduled transportation services for elderly residents of Jackson County who are now participating in those programs funded by the **MARC Commission on Aging**, as is more fully set out in the document attached hereto, as Exhibit A. In addition, MARC shall prepare and deliver a nutritious meal to the homes of elderly County residents who, due to physical impairment, cannot participate in the congregate center activities.
- 2. <u>Terms of Payment</u>. In consideration for the nutrition and transportation services provided above, the County shall pay the sum of \$91,858.00 upon execution of this Agreement.

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- 3. Annual Report. MARC shall submit an annual report, including invoices and cancelled checks, and other documentation as requested by the Director of Finance and Purchasing to show that the funds paid to MARC by the County were used for the purposes set forth in this Agreement. Said annual report shall be submitted no later than December 31, 2011. Failure to submit said annual report shall disqualify MARC from future funding by the County.
- 4. <u>Audit</u>. The County further reserves the right to examine and audit, during reasonable office hours, the books and records of MARC pertaining to the finances and operations of MARC.
- 5. **Default**. If MARC shall default in the performance or observation for any term or condition of this Agreement, the County shall give MARC written notice setting forth the default and the correction required. Thereafter, if said default by MARC shall continue and not be corrected within 10 days of the notice of default, the County may, at its election, terminate the Agreement and take such action in law or equity to recover all funds given to MARC under this Agreement, but not used for the purposes set forth in the Agreement, as the County deems appropriate.
- 6. <u>Conflict of Interest</u>. MARC warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall in any manner whatsoever be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be effective January 1, 2011, and shall terminate on December 31, 2011. This Agreement may be terminated prior to that date by either party upon written notice delivered fifteen days prior to the effective date of

termination. If this Agreement is terminated by either party, the County shall pay only for those services actually performed as verified by the County's audit as provided in paragraph 4.

- 8. Equal Opportunity. In carrying out this Agreement, MARC shall insure that none of the benefits or services of the program are denied to any eligible recipient on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap or national origin. MARC shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap or national origin in terms and conditions of employment or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship. MARC shall in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of MARC state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap or national origin.
- 9. Liability and Indemnification. No party to this Agreement shall assume any liability for the acts of any other party to this Agreement, its officers, employees or agents and MARC shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) including but not limited to violation of civil rights and/or bodily injury to or death of any person and for damage to or destruction of property if and to the extent caused by the negligence, willful misconduct or omissions of MARC during the performance of this Agreement.
 - 10. Incorporation. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and

agreement of the parties.

The functions related to this service include intake and assessment of the client, preparation of the meal by the caterer, delivery of bulk food items by the caterer to the senior center; packaging of individual meals at the senior center, and delivery of the meal to the home of the client. Meals are delivered Monday through Friday. Meals are provided to eligible residents of the county over the age of 60 and older and/or disabled adults between the ages of 18 and 59, inclusive.

The target population is older adults [aged 60 and above] confined to their homes due to physical and/or mental incapacity and lacking resources to provide or prepare nutritious meals for themselves. Recent data estimates the age 60 and over population of the County in excess of 100,000. National research estimates that 15 to 20 percent of the senior population is in need of community support and assistance as a factor in their long-term care.

The program also provides services to disabled adults, aged 18 to 59, who meet the same criteria. Current population data estimates there are 58,000 disabled persons residing in the County. We do not have sufficient research information to make the same types of projections and inferences for the disabled population.

Would you provide these services to anyone at your door?

Answer: No

No. Recipients of home dellivered meals must meet an eligibility requirement set by the Older Americans Act.

Is anyone denied services?

Answer: Yes

Home-delivered meals come from the senior centers. We are currently operating through several centers located in Kansas City in Jackson County: St. Louis Parish, Guadalupe Center, Inc, Don Bosco Community Center, Mohart Multi-Purpose Center, and Holy Cross Catholic Church. MARC also funds senior center programs and operations in the cities of Blue Springs, Buckner, Grandview, Independence and Oak Grove. MARC also supports "Meals on Wheels" programs operated by Westport Cooperative Services, Whatsoever Community Center, Christ the King Catholic Church and Shepherd's Center.

Persons requesting service are assigned to the center from which their meal will be delivered. Our reporting system identifies the exact location to which every meal is delivered.

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
