WHEREAS, Federal Communication Commission (FCC) regulations require that all public safety radio systems must convert to a narrow-band system by December 31, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends the purchase of a narrow band public radio system for use by the Sheriff's Office, Parks and Recreation Department, Public Works Department, Emergency Management, and the Transportation Unit of the Department of Corrections to Motorola Solutions, Inc., of Schaumburg, IL, under the terms and conditions set forth in the City of Kansas City, Missouri Contract No. EV0593, an existing government contract, at an actual cost to the County not to exceed \$4,838,855.00; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Purchasing recommends the award to Motorola, Inc., under the existing government contract due to the higher volume discounts offered to larger entities; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 1030.4, Jackson County Code, 1984, the Director of

Finance and Purchasing is required to submit any purchase under an existing government contract which exceeds \$25,000.00 to the Legislature for approval; and,

WHEREAS, an appropriation is necessary to fund a portion of this purchase; and,

Background Analysis


Currently, the County's radios operate on conventional analog VHF frequencies which are used to support public safety and public service operations within Jackson County. The Jackson County Sheriff's Office provides 911 Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) dispatch services to unincorporated area of Jackson County in addition to providing dispatch services by contract to several municipalities. In addition, several Jackson County departments operate radio communication systems including the Parks + Recreation Department and Corrections Department.

In 2011, the County contracted with Tusa Consulting Services to analyze the County's radio system and recommend options that would put the County's system in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) requirement of narrow-banding public safety radios by January 1, 2013 as well as provide greatly needed improved coverage and enhanced communication system for the County.

Tusa Consulting met with department representatives and identified significant deficiencies in the current radio system. Departments noted inconsistent mobile (car) radio coverage, poor portable (on hip) radio coverage, interference and minimal interoperability capability with outside and neighboring radio systems. Another concern identified is the fact that the Sheriff's Office existing radio system does not repeat incoming transmissions, which does not allow field personnel to be aware of evolving public safety situations.

Radio coverage within the County was analyzed using computer modeling. These coverages were confirmed by system users based on their experience of use. As pictured below, coverage in the "corners" of the County is extremely poor, which creates challenges and even potential life safety issues for public safety personnel.


Current VHF Coverage of Jackson County



The County considered several options for upgrading the radio system including joining the State of Missouri VHF system as compared to joining the local regional system. Based on this analysis, it was determined that the best option was to join the Metropolitan Area Regional Radio System (MARRS), which is a 800 MHz Digital P25 system, coordinated with Mid America Regional Council (MARC). The MARRS system complies with the federal narrow-banding requirements; and is part of an overall interoperability project underway for the region. In Jackson County, this system is currently being utilized by Kansas City, Missouri and within the last year, Cass County, Platte County, Blue Springs, and Independence, Missouri have joined the regional network. Because of some recent infrastructure investments that contribute to digital coverage in Jackson County, the cost to the County of joining the MARRS network has significantly reduced, making this the preferred option for the County.

The illustration below shows what the current coverage would be for the County if it connected to the existing MARRS system. Coverage in the western portion of the County would be provided by existing system components installed by Kansas City and the recent Blue Springs/Independence project. The dark areas on the map demonstrate the existing coverage, with a significant gap in coverage noted in the eastern portion of the County. Staff has worked closely with our consultant to identify options to provide expanded coverage in the uncovered portion of the County.

In order to address the areas not covered by the existing system, Jackson County's project will address this area benefiting the County agencies as well as regional law enforcement and local police departments.


New Digital Radio System

Jackson County has the ability to utilize an existing governmental contract which was competitively bid and awarded to Motorola Solutions, Inc. with Kansas City, Missouri. Working with our consultant and Motorola, a system was designed that will provide 95% reliability for "on-street portable" coverage and a DAQ (Delivered Audio Quality) of 3.4 which is the regional accepted standard of coverage. The components of the new system include additional tower sites, subscriber equipment (radios and accessories), upgrades to the PSAP dispatch equipment and system updates.

Sites

The system includes the addition of two new tower sites to provide expanded coverage and address the areas not currently covered (illustrated on the map above). This will include lease on an existing privately owned tower in Lone Jack and an additional tower site to be located on a planned water tower in Oak Grove (contingent upon City of Oak Grove final approval). Staff is working on lease arrangements on the tower in Lone Jack and has talked with Oak Grove staff about the terms of an intergovernmental agreement that would allow us to install equipment on and in the water tower at no charge to the County. Once these sites are installed, the coverage for the County will be much improved.

As demonstrated in the graphic above, the addition of two new sites in Eastern Jackson County will significantly improve radio coverage. County department representatives have tested radios in the eastern portion of the County and have reported good coverage with the existing MARRs system; the two new sites will ensure coverage levels to an even higher degree.

Subscriber equipment

The new radio system will serve a variety of County departments including the Sheriff's Office, Parks Department (Parks Rangers and Operations), Public Works Department Operations, Corrections Department (transportation unit), and Emergency Management. Because of the diverse needs of the user departments, each group has identified the appropriate type of radios (mobile, portable) and functionality of subscriber equipment that will best fit their individual needs. The Sheriff's Department, for example, has selected a multi-band radio that will allow VHF interoperability with local agencies and the State of Missouri. Equipment for the Park Rangers and Public Works chose single band radios with functionality appropriate to the job duties of their personnel, in addition to mobile and/or portable radios that will most efficiently and effectively support their tasks. In addition to radio equipment for the Sheriff's Department, Park Rangers and Public Works, equipment is included for the Corrections Department's transportation division and Jackson County Emergency Preparedness. Programming and installation is included as part of the project.

Dispatch equipment

In order to dispatch on the MARRS system, an upgrade to existing dispatch equipment is required. The proposal includes upgraded equipment and systems for four (4) operator positions and 4 back up control stations that give the Sheriff's Department dispatch personnel many enhancements.

System maintenance

Motorola will provide maintenance services for subscriber equipment during the warranty period. Additionally, support for the software is included in the proposal. Other costs associated with the radio project will be radio maintenance (after the warranty expires), a port fee (to connect our equipment to the master switch located at Kansas City Police Department's North Patrol station), and a per-user fee that contributes to the maintenance of the MARRS network as a whole. These maintenance fees will be incorporated into the budget in 2014, but were part of the overall evaluation of the ongoing costs of the system to the County.

Timeline

This RLA / ordinance will encumber the funds to purchase all of the equipment related to the equipment, software, and infrastructure related to the project. The project will be operational early 2013 but various components will come on line through the next year. The radios will be acquired and will begin being used in early 2013. The dispatch improvements will be installed in mid 2013. The coverage enhancements will occur during 2013 / early 2014 as the sites become available.

Funding

The total cost of the project with Motorola a maximum not to exceed of \$4,838,856 which is under budget. Beyond the contract pricing with Kansas City, Missouri negotiated a system incentive of 5% with Motorola due to the size and scope of the project and an early payment provisions for an additional discount (additional savings of \$32,895). Working with the other outside agencies the Sheriff's Office dispatches for, an additional incentive may be available which would provide additional savings to the overall project.

The detailed pricing proposal is attached as an exhibit to this memo. Funding for this project was included in the FY12 budget, which will be as follows:
