County Executive Sanders:

I am the Chief Operating Officer of Truman Medical Center and manage Truman's Lakewood Facility in Eastern Jackson County. In that connection, I have been working with the City of Independence to establish a medical clinic in Western Independence, located on Independence Avenue in the Fairmount Subdivision. It is my understanding that Gerard Grimaldi, our Governmental Relations Officer, and Jerry Riffel, Special Counsel for our Redevelopment Corporation, have prepared and filed an application with Jackson County to convey a certain Land Trust Property for less than its fair market value.

We would appreciate your support of that application for the following reasons:

- 1. Truman's medical clinic will facilitate quality medical services for a medically under-served area of Jackson County.
- 2. The Land Trust Property is blighted and in its current state, has a negative impact on the real property values of Jackson County.
- 3. Truman's budget for its medical clinic requires that it obtain all of the real property at as low a price as is reasonably possible.
- 4. The City of Independence has agreed to provide fee simple interest in real property it owns within the 353 Plan Area at below market value.

I have attached a Site Plan which shows the location of the Land Trust Property and the Independence Property to be conveyed in fee simple interest for parking purposes. If you should have any questions or concerns, I would appreciate an opportunity to discuss these issues with you.



Dear Applicant:

Based on information supplied, and assuming your operations will be as stated in your application for recognition of exemption, we have determined you are exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Our ruling letter dated March 25, 1968, which denies you such status is hereby revoked.

We have further determined that you are not a private foundation within the meaning of Code section 509(a), because you are an organization described in the sections of the Code shown above.

If your sources of support, or your purposes, character, or method of operation change, please let your key district know so that office can consider the effect on your exempt status and foundation status. Also, you should inform your key District Director of all changes in your name or address.

Unless you are an instrumentality referred to below or otherwise specifically excepted, beginning January 1, 1984, you must pay taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) for each employee who is paid \$100 or more in a calendar year. You are not required to pay tax under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA). However, if you are a wholly-owned instrumentality of a state or political subdivision of a state, and social security coverage is desired for your employees, the coverage may be obtained only by an agreement between the State and the Secretary of Health and Human Services, entered into under section 218 of the Social Security Act, as amended. Generally, employees hired after March 31, 1986, are subject to the Medicare portion of the social security tax if they are in a group not covered by an agreement with the Secretary of Health and Human Services. Also, if you are a wholly-owned instrumentality remuneration for services performed for you is not subject to federal unemployment taxes. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other federal taxes, please address them to your key District Director.

Any questions that you may have as to whether you are an instrumentality of a state or a political subdivision thereof should be addressed to the Internal Revenue Service, Office of Chief Counsel, CC:IND:S:3, 1111 Constitution Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20224.

Unless you are an instrumentality referred to below, you are required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, if your gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If your gross receipts are not normally more than \$25,000 we ask that you establish that you are not required to file Form 990 by completing Part I of that Form for your first taxable year. For guidance in determining if your gross receipts are "normally" not more than the \$25,000 limit, see the instructions for the Form 990. Such returns are not required to be filed by organizations that are instrumentalities of a state or a political subdivision thereof, the income of which is excluded from gross income under Code section 115. If you believe your income is excluded from gross income pursuant to Code section 115, you should request an appropriate ruling from the Office of Chief Counsel, as indicated above. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of your annual accounting period. There is a penalty of \$10 a day, up to a maximum of \$5,000, when a return is filed late unless you establish, as required by section 6652(d)(1), that the failure to file was due to reasonable cause.

You are not required to file federal income tax returns unless you are subject to the tax on unrelated business income under Code section 511. If you are subject to this tax, you must file an income tax return on Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your present or proposed activities are unrelated trade or business as defined in section 513.

Since you are not a private foundation, you are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, you are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes. If you have any questions about excise, employment, or other federal taxes, contact you key District Director.

Donors may deduct contributions to you as provided in Code section 170. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to you or for your use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522.

Please show your employer identification number on all returns you file and in all correspondence with the Internal Revenue Service.

We are informing your key District Director of this ruling. Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it in your permanent records.

Dear Ms. Burnette:

It is my understanding that Land Trust is considering the conveyance of certain real property located at 10315 E. Independence Avenue in Independence, Missouri to Truman Medical Center. My staff has been working with Truman Medical Center to establish a medical clinic in the Fairmount Subdivision.

This parcel is within Phase I of the approved Fairmount 353 Development Plan, and is needed to remove the blight and complete the medical clinic as now planned. In Phase I of the Plan, Truman's affiliate has agreed to develop the medical clinic. The City of Independence plans to convey property it owns for use by Truman's medical clinic for parking. During the period of construction (now underway), Independence has also leased for minimal consideration a portion of this property for an interim temporary clinic. When the clinic is completed, this property will be conveyed to Truman or its affiliate for parking purposes.

We would appreciate your approval of the application for the following reasons:

- 1. Truman's medical clinic will facilitate quality medical services for a medically underserved area of Jackson County.
- 2. The Land Trust Property is blighted and in its current state has a negative impact on the real property values of Jackson County.
- 3. The City of Independence has agreed to provide fee simple interest in real property it owns within the 353 Plan Area at below market value.
- 4. The approved 353 Plan will result in removal of blight from western Independence and encourage other improvements in the surrounding neighborhoods.
