- o Revenues grew to \$1,001,156.

 - O Budget more than doubled in this 7-year period. (\$900,000 to over \$2M)
- Springboard to Learning, Inc. An international education non-profit serving the elementary and secondary schools in the St. Louis metropolitan area.

- o Part-time staff of 55 teachers, 2 full-time support staff and small cadre of volunteers.
- o In final year, semester-long teaching programs were provided to 30,000 youngsters.
- o Budget grew from \$30,000 to \$325,000 during time of tenure.

 - o Staff included one part-time assistant and faculty of part-time teachers.
 - O Student body increased from 40 to 1,000 persons weekly.
 - o Annual programming revenue grew from \$15,000 to \$100,000.
