	Background: The Anti-Drug Sales Tax fund authorizes the County to execute agreements and contracted service for the purpose of providing anti-violence initiatives in the community.				
	Previous legislation was authorized for the funding of these programs. These agencies have not fully utilized their allocations and allowing them to expend their contracts will allow the funds to be utilized in providing services to Jackson County citizens. The Drug Commission reviewed the funding extensions on February 3, 2015 and recommended that they be presented to the Legislature.
