	Background: The Anti-Drug Sales Tax Fund authorizes the County to execute agreements and contracted services for the purpose of providing substance abuse treatment, prevention, and other anti-drug and anti-violence initiatives in the community.		
	Previous legislation was authorized for the funding of these programs. These agencies have not utilized their total allocations and allowing them to extend their contracts will allow the funds to be utilized in providing services to Jackson County citizens. The Drug Commission reviewed the funding extension on February 3, 2015 and recommended that they be presented to the Legislature.
