WHEREAS, the Commission's applications are based on reviews by independent evaluators of applications submitted by the outside agencies; and,

WHEREAS, the execution of agreements for the services of these agencies, in the amounts indicated on the document attached hereto as Exhibit A, is in the best interest of the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Jackson County; and,

WHEREAS, a transfer is necessary to place a portion of the funds needed in the proper spending account; now therefore,
