Two proposals were received in response to the above RFQ from the following: Resource Development Institute and the University of Missouri Institute for Public Policy. A review Committee was assembled to score the two responses. The review Committee met on September 2, 2015 to discuss the proposals, then submitted independent ratings.

The scoring of the two proposals appears on the attached document. The highest average Total Score was received for the Resource Development Institute's proposal (88.3). The University of Missouri Public Policy Institute received an average score of 80. The individual scores by each reviewer followed the same pattern.
