# 1 Cost and Staffing Overview

Correct Care Solutions (CCS) is pleased to provide the following cost proposal for the consideration of Jackson County. CCS has developed our cost proposal for the services required by RFP NO. 4-16 for Comprehensive Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical Services for the inmate populations of the Jackson County, Missouri Detention Center, the Regional Correctional Center and Kansas City Police Department arrestees. Additionally, we have reviewed the addendums and have utilized our knowledge of your program and Missouri state systems.

Our proposal is based on our extensive experience in Jackson County, our perspective on the needs of the patient population, competitive salary surveys for healthcare professionals in Jackson County, and our experience at multiple similarly sized facilities. We are proposing the following solution to best meet the County's specific needs. CCS is open to discussing our proposal in order to provide the optimal healthcare program for the County; at the same time, we are very confident in our understanding of your facility. With staffing comprising the vast majority of costs, we have looked intensely at the operations to ensure that we have the capacity to operate within the needs of the patient population and JCDOC expectations. Simply stated, our goal is to provide the County with the best healthcare services program that meets or exceeds your requirements. We look forward to discussing our proposal with you.

The proposed CCS staffing plan was developed consistent with your stated goals of program improvement and movement towards facility accreditation. The plan also recognizes significant changes that have already occurred within the facility such as the introduction of new arrestees from the Kansas City Police Department and the requirement to screen all inmates at intake, and seeks to provide staffing solutions to provide care for this added population.

CCS realizes this annual rate constitutes a significant investment in contract value for Jackson County. The cost of the additional staffing (discussed below) presents the vast majority of the increase over our current contract. Other factors include:

- Inmate ADP increased from 800 in our current contract to 952 in this contract
- Inclusion of a Performance Bond
- Addition of shift differentials for nursing staff and on-call pay for the dentist, per RFP requirement

With nearly all costs being fixed, the CCS proposal is based on this annual rate. The RFP requests pricing based on per diem costs. With an ADP of 952, the annual costs would average a Per Inmate Per Day rate of \$9.23. However, since fixed costs will not adjust with fluctuations in population, our proposal is for a contract in which invoicing will be monthly, based upon 1/12 of the annual rate, and payable within 45 days of billing to ensure timely subcontractor payment as outlined in RFP section 9.22.6.

We appreciate the opportunity to engage in discussion with JCDOC about this Cost Proposal.

## Flexible Staffing Matrix

CCS will provide the County with a comprehensive healthcare staffing program consisting of qualified medical professionals. The following staffing matrix provides detailed staffing plans for the Jackson County Department of Corrections. This enhanced staffing plan represents an increase of 8.3 FTE which will allow for CCS to dedicate a RN and an LPN 24/7, to the intake screening process and the detox need of your increased admissions.

Please note that the exact days shown in the charts below are for illustrative purposes only and are flexible to meet the County's needs. We will work with the County to create an exact schedule which best maximizes the County's utilization of CCS's resources.

### **Enhancement Option**

CCS proposed that, in addition to the staffing defined above, the contracted matrix include a Quality Assurance & Accreditation Nurse. This role would be filled by a Registered Nurse, who would work with current on-site leadership to monitor our processes through our Quality Improvement program, facilitate nurse training in policies and procedures to ensure appropriate and consistent care in accordance with accreditation standards.

The addition of this position would be \$95,000 incremental cost over our base pricing.

### **Intake Nursing**

The CCS staffing matrix allows for one (1) Registered Nurse in intake at all times, with assistance by an LPN to ensure management of the detoxification population and peak intake times. The LPN is, according to licensure and industry standard, able to collect information and he or she will consult with the RN regarding any inmate who meets certain criteria for emergent and further evaluation.

Based on our operations in various sites and national standards, CCS is comfortable with this model, and we feel it is a more financially responsible model for Jackson County. However, we understand that JCDOC may prefer two RNs in intake instead of an LPN, based on the RFP. This would require replacing 4.2 LPNs (2.1 on Day Shift and 2.1 on Night Shift) with RNs, at an incremental cost of \$119,220 per year over our base pricing.

## Comprehensive Medical, Dental, and Pharmaceutical Services

CCS will provide the County with a wide-ranging inmate healthcare program consisting of 31.65 equivalent full-time employees as well as comprehensive onsite medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services. CCS will also provide the County with healthcare policies and procedures, 24 hours a day on-call services, medical and office supplies, medical waste disposal, comprehensive medical malpractice insurance, an electronic medical records application (ERMA) as well as corporate management and oversight.

## **Pharmacy**

Our proposal includes a comprehensive pharmacy program and management solution. This program includes medication prescribing, filling, dispensing, administration, accurate recordkeeping, reporting/invoicing, and quality assurance. CCS will be responsible for all the pharmaceutical costs incurred for County inmates, with the exception of certain medications that are included in the cap.

## **Electronic Medical Records Application (ERMA)**

CCS will provide Jackson County with its electronic medical record application (EMRA) at no cost. This offering also includes installation of and any updates to our exclusive Electronic Records Management Application (ERMA) and Electronic Medication Administration Record (eMAR) during the life of the contract, along with related computer installations and software, as well as regular refreshing of computer hardware.

To ensure the facility receives the maximum benefit of ERMA, CCS would act in a consultative role regarding upgrades and expansion of internet coverage to areas where medical services are normally performed, but not for the cost of system upgrades. Additionally, we would require an interface with your JMS systems. We understand currently there are separate JMS systems documenting inmate information for the County inmates and the Municipal inmates. CCS will not bear any costs that the county or city might incur in the building of this interface.

## Performance Bond

CCS understands the mandatory RFP requirement of a performance bond. The cost of issuing and maintaining the bond is \$44,553.00 annually. If the county elects to waive the requirement of the bond in recognition of CCS's continuation of satisfactory performance, CCS will remove this amount from our annual costs.

## **Pricing Assumptions**

The proposed prices reflect the scope of care as outlined in our technical proposal, in the RFP requirements, and based on the current community standard of care with regard to correctional healthcare services. Should there be any change in or modification of the local, national, or community standards of care or scope of services, court rulings or interpretation, state or federal law or statute, or interpretation thereof that results in sustained and material increase in costs, coverage of costs related to such changes are not included in this proposal and may need to be negotiated with Jackson County.

## Annual Adjustments – Renewal Pricing

CCS agrees that the contract length shall be 36 months with two (2) 12 month options. The annual cost presented in this price quote will remain in effect through the initial 12-month period. CCS proposes an annual increase based upon the medical component of the Consumer Price Index, not to exceed 3 percent per year.





This proposal is based on a base average daily population (ADP) of 952 total inmates. If, in any calendar month, the County ADP exceeds 1050 inmates, the County will pay CCS a per diem of \$.73 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly. If, in any calendar month, the ADP falls below 850 inmates, CCS will credit the County a per diem of \$.73 per inmate to be reconciled quarterly. As mentioned above, the majority of expenses are fixed costs related to staffing, as reflected by this minimal per diem rate.

This per diem is intended to cover additional costs in those instances where short-term changes in the inmate population result in higher utilizations of routine supplies and services. However, the per diem is not intended to provide for any additional fixed costs, such as new staffing positions, which might prove necessary if the inmate population grows significantly and if the population increase is sustained. In such cases, CCS reserves the right to negotiate for a contract price increase in order to maintain the same high quality of care for the increased inmate population. If the County experiences a sustained decrease in inmate population, CCS is open to discussing changes in staffing levels to better reflect the normalized inmate population.

# 3 Aggregate Capitation Limits

## Aggregate Cap with County Rebate

CCS will incur the first \$100,000 in costs associated with healthcare services defined under its Aggregate Cap (Cap 1). Such services under the annual Aggregate Cap include all pharmaceuticals for municipal inmates; HIV, Hepatitis, mental health, cancer, and court-ordered pharmaceuticals for county and municipal inmates; onsite and offsite laboratory services; onsite and offsite radiology services; and onsite and offsite dialysis. Any expenses incurred for such services in excess of \$100,000 per year will be the responsibility of the County. Should the costs associated with the provision of healthcare services listed above not exceed \$100,000 in the aggregate in any contract year, CCS shall reimburse the County at a rate of 100% of the difference between the actual cost to CCS for these services and the \$100,000 Aggregate Cap.

We thank you for the opportunity to present this Cost Proposal in conjunction with our Technical Proposal. CCS truly values our partnership in Jackson County, and we respectfully ask to continue this partnership. We welcome discussion on this or any aspect of our proposal.
