#### **Application for COMBAT Targeted Neighborhood Funding to Reduce Violent Crime**

Name of Agency: Independence Police Department

Please provide responses to the following as your application for COMBAT Targeted Neighborhood Funding to Reduce Violent Crime.

- 1. What is the Violent Crime in the Area?
  - a. What is the evidence of Violent Crime?See attached maps
  - b. What are the levels and types of Violent Crime?
     Assault, Aggravated Assault, Sexual Assault, Robbery
  - c. Where is this crime occurring geographically? Is it occurring in homes, businesses, public—where and who is affected?
     Primarily residential; hot spots have been identified on attached maps.
  - d. Who is responsible for this violent crime?

    In a large number of cases, these crimes are being committed by individuals who are in a mental crisis state of mind, self-medicated or under the influence.
- 2. Describe your Proposed Targeted Neighborhood approach to address this Violent Crime.
  - a. What is your overall Goal? This pilot program intends to redirect consumer focus from the judicial system to the healthcare system that is needed. The program will connect people who are committing violent crime with the services to detox them. Currently, the IPD has a part-time/"as-time-allows" CIT program, however due to budgetary constrictions many cases and consumers are falling through the cracks. With the requested funding, we will dedicate time and resources to this project in an effort to form

correlations within the identified hot spots. With this information, we can take appropriate actions

b. Strategies, Activities: what will you do?

to reduce crime and disorder.

- The IPD will partner with mental health professionals in conducting home visits with the purpose of building relationships and ensuring consumers are receiving the services needed. As part of these home visits, the officer and case worker will also follow up with the consumer to verify they are following the established care plan.
- The IPD will also conduct CIT training and educational classes to department personnel, community groups and mental health professionals.
- c. How will this solution reduce the violence crime in the area noted above?
  By identifying and connecting chronic consumers with the services they need, we will reduce the level of unprovoked violent crime in the targeted neighborhoods.

d. Will any Evidence Based Strategies be used? If so, what? August 2015 PERF, NAMI, CIT International

This pilot project will be expanding on current CIT strategies the department has already implemented.

- e. How will COMBAT funds be used?

  COMBAT funding will be used to fund 100% of one officer's salary and benefits, along with overtime funding for any CIT-trained officer to complete CIT re-visits, reports and administrative paperwork concerning CIT issues.
- f. Is this part of a larger strategy? If so, please describe.

  Yes. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) was established in 1988-- Since it's establishment, NAMI and their national network of local and state organizations have partnered with law enforcement agencies on Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) programs, which help law enforcement cope with these difficult calls for service and increase safety in these situations—for officers, individuals in crisis and bystanders. The IPD implemented concepts of this program in 2002 and with funding will expand this to a full-time focus.
- g. Who are other partners? What are their roles?

The <u>Independence Municipal Court</u> has committed to this project by the involvement of their Judges, Prosecutors and Court personnel. They will work closely with the dedicated CIT officer and coordinate efforts to provide services for those in need. The prosecutor and Judges will review all cases and consider all requests for Mental Health treatment.

<u>Comprehensive Mental Health Services</u> has committed to the project with the involvement of their Community Mental Health Liaison. This liaison will be dedicated to working with law enforcement in identifying people in the community that are in need of mental health treatment. With this partnership, we will be able to more quickly identify and coordinate individuals that need services.

The CIT Unit will work closely with the Family School Liaisons and Truancy Officers of the *Independence School District*. The goal of this collaboration will be to provide the Family School Liaisons with additional resources concerning mental illness. This information can be utilized with students and their families as well. In result, we hope to see a decrease in the number of occurrences within the schools, along with a decrease in calls for service for these situations.




