Re: LexisNexis Subscription Agreements

I am asking for your approval for the Sole Source renewal of a 50 user subscription agreement with LexisNexis, and for Lexis Advance a two user subscription agreement with LexisNexis for Accurint Government. The subscription will provide the County Counselor's Office, the Prosecuting Attorney's Office and the Medical Examiner's Office with research tools that are necessary to the operation of those offices.

I request LexisNexis be considered a Sole Source vendor for these research subscriptions because the databases that can be accessed are unique and not available through any other vendor, and because LexisNexis has entered into an exclusive partnership with Microsoft that will allow linked access to the research databases in analyzing pleadings received from other parties in ligation, as well as facilitate the preparation of documents and pleadings prepared by the County Counselor's Office and the Prosecuting Attorney's Office. This company is the only company that has the ability to provide the unique research sources contained in the proposed subscription agreements.

No other company, to our knowledge and according to the Purchasing Department's research, has the ability to provide this commodity.
