Treatment Summaries

First Call

Summary: First Call has a mission to reduce the impact of alcohol, drugs and addiction by providing quality resources to individuals, families, and the community. ME First is an intensive outpatient treatment program administered at the Jackson County Detention Center (JCDC) that provides a seamless array of treatment services that initiate while each client is incarcerated. ME After is an outpatient aftercare program administered at the Municipal Courthouse meant for transitional ME First clients after release to support and coaching in their home community. Both programs served adults ages 18 and over serving time at JCDC and RCC for a substance abuse related offense.

Healing House

Summary: Healing House has two programs, the Imani House, a supervised residential living facility, and the unsupervised General healing House Transitional Housing. Healing House serves as one of the primary Room and Board providers in Jackson County for people recovering from drug and/or alcohol addiction. Beyond meeting the basic human need for food and shelter in a safe, sober environment, the Healing House is designed specifically to help create and sustain comprehensive recovery; addressing the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual components of each person. Healing House provides group residential living and assists with various daily needs including: self-care practices, family care, mentoring, healthy meal preparation, training for employment and assistance with identifying employment opportunities, transportation when needed, education, opportunities to grow in faith and spirituality, development of healthy social networks that participate in clean and sober activities, and active community participation.

Synergy Services, Inc.'s Get Connected (GC) program is an age appropriate bullying violence prevention program which promotes building empathy and helps address and eliminate bullying behavior in youth ages 5 to 18. Get Connected's comprehensive anti-bullying program is facilitated through education workshop sessions at the classroom level. The program utilizes Trauma Informed Care strategies to focus on identifying bullying behaviors, understanding the types and causes of bullying, and offers youth strategies to counteract peer bullying abuse.
