Each year the Mid-America Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) applies to the Missouri Emergency Response Commission (MERC) for funding to support the operation of the LEPC. As part of the application package, all agreements with participating counties must be updated and County Commissioners must sign the application form.

Please sign both copies of the enclosed agreements, compliance certification forms, and membership rosters and return to MARC by June 16, 2017. Address these documents to the Mid-America Regional Council, 600 Broadway, Suite 200, Kansas City, MO 64105, Attention: Ms. Cynthia Allen. We will forward you an original once all of the signatures are obtained. The LEPC Chair will sign off on final applications submitted to the state.

LEPC funding in Missouri is from the State's Chemical Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) grant. The Mid-America LEPC is eligible to receive an estimated \$65,274 in CEPF funds. Jackson County's portion of this allocation is approximately \$34,535 which is financed by fees from facilities using, storing or producing hazardous materials above certain thresholds. In 2016 there were 627 facilities in Jackson County that filed required chemical reports and paid fees.

Activity: PROVIDING TRAINING RELATED TO CHEMICAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND PREVENTION OF CHEMICAL ACCIDENTS

Goal(s): To provide training to appropriate agencies in the LEPD area so they can safely respond to a hazardous materials incidents based on their level of capability; To ensure that the area hazmat teams increase/maintain their proficiency and are able to interoperate across jurisdictions; • Continue to convene the LEPC training subcommittee to assess training needs, identify available training, host trainings and secure trainings sites. Training is done in a way that increases interoperability between the various teams and helps develop leaders I.e. attendance from each team at the IAFC training conference in 2018. Activity: PROCESSING INFORMATION SUBMITTED BY FACILITIES AND IDENTIFYING FACILITIES TO REPORT

Goal(s): Design, set up and implement a program to make key information from facilities that house hazardous materials available to first responders on mobile devices addressing security and access considerations and coordinating with the MERC. Work with MARC 911 Public Safety to include these data layers on GeoLynx mapping software once the server upgrade is complete late 2017/early 2018

Outline a process to be able to identify the facilities that should be reporting that are not within the LEPD area.

Activity: RECEIVING AND HANDLING EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS OF CHEMICALS RELEASES

Goal(s): Ensure appropriate emergency response agencies receive required notifications of chemical releases

Work with area fire departments to gather information on number of initial notifications received from facilities of a spill with the potential for offsite consequences. Communicate with regulated facilities the need to provide written follow up to the LEPC. Establish a way to be notified by the fire department after an emergency notification has occurred

Activity: OPERATING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE

Goal(s): Sustain the LEPC as a mechanism for developing capacity to respond to hazardous material incidents and educating the public about chemical risks and protective actions

Maintain membership and contact information. Meet regularly to maintain and build relationships between industry, emergency response agencies and other community partner to identify & manage expectations, identify resources and discuss hazmat related topics. Review LEPC business processes in light of lessons learned from Incidents to improve preparedness and response. Educate members on proposed regulatory changes

Activity: PROCESSING INFORMATION SUBMITTED BY FACILITIES; MAKE IT AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC

Goal(s): Provide the public with open access to information about chemical hazards in the community.
