COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT (Youth Recreation Program)

THIS AGREEMENT, made by and between JACKSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, a Constitutional Home Rule Charter County of the First Class of the State of Missouri, hereinafter referred to as "the County" and a Missouri not-for-profit corporation, GUADALUPE CENTERS, INC. 1015 AVENIDA CESAR E. CHAVEZ KANSAS CITY, MO 64108, hereinafter referred to as "Organization".

WHEREAS, the County and Organization desire to enter into an Agreement to provide funding to be used for Youth Recreation Program; and,

WHEREAS, the County deems it to be in the best interest of its citizenry to support such programs and activities; and,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the terms and provisions herein contained, the County and Organization respectively promise, covenant, and agree with each other as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. **Services**. Organization shall provide services Youth Recreation Program, as is more fully set out in the proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. The term of this contract is January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2018, and as such, all expenditures must occur within this period. The budget Organization submitted as part of Exhibit A is considered final and non-changeable. If Organization encounters unforeseen circumstances that require a change to Organization's budget, Organization shall submit a written request of line item changes limited to contractual services and supplies and a narrative explaining the



circumstances to the Jackson County Legislative Auditor's Office no later than October 31, 2018. The Jackson County Legislature must authorize any changes to the budget. Any changes approved by the Legislature will not take effect until your agency receives written notification from the Jackson County Legislative Auditor's Office.

- 2. Terms Of Payment. The County agrees to pay Organization the total amount of \$20,400.00 in quarterly installments of \$5,100.00, with the payment for the first and second quarters to be made upon execution of this Agreement. The remaining payments shall be made upon the County's receipt of the quarterly reports as set forth in paragraph 3 hereof. The County reserves the right to audit all invoices and to reject any invoice for good cause. The County retains the right to deduct from an invoice of Organization any overpayment made by the County on a prior invoice. The County retains the right to make invoice corrections/changes. The County will not reimburse sales tax expense.
- 3. Reports/Other Documentation. Within 30 days after the conclusion of each calendar quarter under this Agreement, Organization shall submit a quarterly reconciliation report on forms provided by the County along with documentation that reconciles to the quarterly report, including cancelled checks and/or a copy of the face of the check and corresponding bank statements, invoices, and any other documents requested by the Department of Finance and Purchasing, to establish that the funds provided pursuant to this Agreement were used for the purposes set forth herein. The report for the first and second quarters shall be submitted within 30 days after the execution of this Agreement. The last quarter's report shall include an annual report which shall summarize all of Organization's activities pursuant to this Agreement.

Organization's failure to submit this annual report shall disqualify Organization from future funding by the County. Organization must submit quarterly reconciliation reports in the format specified by the County before the next quarterly payment will be processed. Any quarterly reports that are incomplete or incorrect will delay payment.

Organization must notify the County in writing on Organization's letterhead, within five working days of the following changes:

- a. Organization name, address, telephone number, administration, or board of directors
- b. Organization funding that will affect the program under this contract
- c. Liability insurance coverage
- d. Management or staff responsible for providing services pursuant to this contract
- e. Any proposed or actual merger or acquisition either taken by the Organization or toward the Organization
- 4. <u>Submission of Documents</u>. No payment shall be made under this Agreement unless Organization shall have submitted to the County's Department of Finance and Purchasing through the Jackson County Outside Agency portal accessible on www.jacksongov.org/auditor: (1) a written proposal setting out in detail the intended use of the County's funding, including the target population to be served; (2) Organization's IRS Form 990 from the previous fiscal or calendar year; (3) a statement of Organization's total budget for its most recent fiscal year; and (4) a detailed explanation of actual expenditures of the County's funds (pertains to final payments and payments on contracts for future years). If Organization has previously received funding from the County, to be eligible for future payments, Organization must submit either an audited financial statement for Organization's most-recent fiscal or calendar year, or a certified public accountant's program audit of the County's funds. Any documents described herein which were submitted to the Department of Finance and

Purchasing as a part of an application for funding need not be resubmitted to qualify for payment. No payment shall be made if Organization is out of compliance on any other County contract, or has not paid county taxes on all properties owned by Organization and assessed by the County.

- 5. <u>Equal Opportunity</u>. Organization shall maintain policies of employment as follows:
 - A. Organization and Organization's subcontractor(s) shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. Organization shall take affirmative action as set forth to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited, to the following: recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Organization agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the policies of non-discrimination.
 - B. Organization and Organization's subcontractor(s) shall, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, age, disability, or national origin.
- 6. <u>Employment Of Unauthorized Aliens Prohibited</u>. Pursuant to §285.530.1, RSMo, Organization assures that it does not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the State of Missouri

and/or Jackson County, and shall affirm, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Further, Organization shall sign an affidavit, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B, affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services.

- 7. Audit. The parties agree that the County may, for any reason and at any given time, examine and audit the books and records of Organization pertaining to this Agreement. Further, Organization agrees to establish and adopt such accounting standards and forms as recommended by the County prior to receipt of the County's first distribution of funds under the terms of this Agreement. The forms used to document expenditure of these funds may be changed from time to time by the County.
- 8. <u>Default</u>. If Organization shall default in the performance or observation of any covenant, term or condition herein contained to be performed by Organization, the County shall give Organization ten days written notice, setting forth the default. If said default shall continue and not be corrected by Organization within ten days after receipt of notice from the County, the County may, at its election, terminate this Agreement and withhold any payments not yet made to Organization. Said election shall not, in any way, limit the County's rights to sue for breach of this Agreement.
- 9. Appropriation Of Funds. Organization and the County recognize that the County intends to satisfy its financial obligation to Organization hereunder out of funds annually appropriated for that purpose by the County. County promises and covenants to make its best efforts to appropriate funds in accordance with this Agreement. In the

event no funds or insufficient funds are appropriated and budgeted, or are otherwise unavailable by any means whatsoever for payment due hereunder, County shall immediately notify Organization of this occurrence and this Agreement shall terminate on the last day for which appropriations were received, without penalty or expense to the County of any kind whatsoever, except as to the portions of the payment amounts herein agreed upon for which funds shall have been appropriated and budgeted or are otherwise available, or at any time after the last date that County has paid for the Services, if earlier.

County further agrees:

- A. That any funds authorized or appropriated for services rendered under this Agreement shall be applied to the payments hereunder until all such funds are exhausted.
- B. That County will use its best efforts to obtain authorization and appropriation of such funds including, without limitation, the inclusion in its annual budget, a request for adequate funds to meet its obligation under this Agreement in full.
- 10. <u>Conflict Of Interest</u>. Organization warrants that no officer or employee of the County, whether elected or appointed, shall, in any manner whatsoever, be interested in or receive any benefit from the profits or emoluments of this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Severability</u>. If any covenant or other provision of this Agreement is invalid, or incapable of being enforced by reason of any rule of law or public policy, all other conditions and provisions of this Agreement shall, nevertheless, remain in full force and effect; and no covenant or provision shall be deemed dependent upon any other

covenant or provision unless so expressed herein.

- 12. <u>Indemnification</u>. Organization shall indemnify, defend and hold the County harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, damages, and costs (including reasonable attorney's fees directly related thereto) including but not limited to violation of civil rights and/or bodily injury to or death of any person and for damage to or destruction of property if and to the extent caused by the negligence, willful misconduct or omissions of Organization during the performance of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Insurance</u>. Organization shall maintain the following insurance coverage during the term of this Agreement.
- A. Organization shall maintain Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.
- B. Organization shall maintain, if any motor vehicles are used in the performance of the Services, Commercial General Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability insurance, and Automobile Liability insurance including owned, non-owned, or hired vehicles, each in a combined single limit of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.
- C. Organization agrees to provide the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the above described coverage prior to the start of Services, and annually thereafter, if required by the County. Such certificates shall provide that the applicable insurance policies have been endorsed to provide a minimum

of thirty days advance notice to the County in the event of cancellation, nonrenewal, or reduction in limits by endorsement.

- 14. <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall commence January 1, 2018, and shall continue until December 31, 2018, unless sooner terminated pursuant to paragraph 8, 15, or 19 hereof. If this Agreement is terminated by either party, the County shall pay only for those services actually performed by Organization as verified by the County's audit.
- 15. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated for any reason or no reason by either of the parties upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party's designated fiscal representative. All services and payments shall continue through the effective date of termination. Termination of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of the rights or obligations which the County or Organization may be entitled to receive as provided in this Agreement, or be obligated to perform under this Agreement for services prior to the date of termination. Should this Agreement terminate, all County written materials of any kind must be delivered and returned by Organization to the County within ten (10) days of the termination of this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Standard of Care</u>. Organization shall exercise the same degree of care, skill, and diligence in the performance of the Services as is ordinarily possessed and exercised by professionals operating under similar circumstances.
- 17. <u>Financial Contact</u>. Organization shall designate a fiscal representative to act as a liaison between the parties to resolve any problems, complaints, or special circumstances encountered in the billing of the services agreed upon here.

- 18. Affirmative Action Compliance. The performance of this Agreement shall be subject to review by the County. The County Compliance Review Officer shall review this contract according to his responsibilities as set out in Chapter 6 of the Jackson County Code. Organization shall file quarterly compliance reports as required by the County Compliance Review Office. The County warrants that all books, records, accounts, and any other documents in the possession of the County relating to this Agreement are public records open for inspection in accordance with Chapter 610, RSMo.
- 19. <u>Remedies For Breach</u>. Organization agrees to faithfully observe and perform all of the terms, provisions, and requirements of this Agreement, and Organization's failure to do so constitutes a breach of this Agreement. In such event, Organization consents and agrees as follows:
- A. The County may, without prior notice to Organization, immediately terminate this Agreement; and
- B. The County shall be entitled to collect from Organization all payments made by the County to Organization for which Organization has not yet rendered services in accordance with this Agreement, and to collect the

County's reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and service fees if it is necessary to bring action to recover such payments.

- 20. <u>Transfer And Assignment</u>. Organization shall not assign or transfer any portion or the whole of this Agreement without the prior written consent of the County.
- 21. <u>Organization Identity</u>. If Organization is merged or purchased by another entity, the County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement. Organization shall immediately notify the county in the event it is merged or purchases by any other entity.
- 22. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Organization's records concerning the identities of those participating in its programs shall be strictly confidential; the County shall be entitled to examine said records in performing its audit and review functions, but shall not disclose said identities to any third party in any fashion.
- 23. <u>Incorporation</u>. This Agreement incorporates the entire understanding and agreement of the parties.

Provide program description: Funding from Jackson County would be used to support recreational and youth development operational programming targeting youth in Western Jackson County by the Guadalupe Centers (GC). Specifically, funds from Jackson County would be utilized to support the operation of the Guadalupe Centers Youth Recreation Facility and to support GC youth recreation programming. This facility is located on the corner of 27th and Belleview in the Westside community. It is being completely renovated to house all of the organized athletics and after school and summer school staff. This building will be dedicated completely to the need of the youth the Guadalupe Centers serves. Additional funding secured by GC is utilized to support part time staff who oversee and coach in the organized athletic program that consists of the following leagues; soccer, baseball, football, volleyball, and basketball, GC Youth Recreation Building will also be utilized for other youth activities that promote safe alternatives including teen nights, dances and overnight lock-ins. GC youth development staff will oversee activities that will take place in the facility and in the Gymnasium across the street at the Guadalupe Centers Middle School, Staff will also coordinate all summer enrichment camp activities for "tweens" (ages 10 - 14) out of this facility. The Agency runs its youth program in accordance with the Youth Program Standards promoted and supported by United Way. Following these standards all staff and volunteers working with youth must pass criminal background checks and child/abuse and neglect background checks. Staff must also receive training in principles of youth development and first aid. Youth facilities and youth recreation programming in the western half of Jackson County is extremely limited. GC programs are among the few that receive county funds for these types of services and the agency has been expanding youth services to meet increasing needs in the Northeast and Eastside communities. GC collaborates and partners with others including KCMO Parks and Recreation, Whatsoever, and Della Lamb. These partnerships are beneficial in enhancing youth services provided to underserved neighborhoods in Western Jackson County.

Describe the benefits of this program to Jackson County Missouri: Youth facilities and youth recreation programming in the western half of Jackson County is extremely limited. GC programs are among the few that receive county funds for these types of services and the agency has been expanding youth services to meet increasing needs in the Northeast and Eastside communities. These youth that will be served would have an empty house to come home to if the center is not open to receive them when they are out of school. Statistics show that the time kids are most vulnerable are between 3 pm and 6pm. Also with these kids participating in a variety of organized athletics activities we can insure that these youth are in healthy organized activity with caring adults. The more time we can fill for these youth in those critical hours the less time we leave them to get in trouble or be harmed by someone.

Describe target population to be served: The main target population for this program are Latino and urban youth from Western Jackson County. Many of the participants and/or their families are limited English proficient. The programs provided by the Youth Development Program target a wide variety of ages in sports programming that serves youth in beginners leagues for children ages 4 to 6 years of age, and regular leagues for children ages 10 and under, 12 and under, 14 and under, middle school, and high school. Teen diversion groups are established for participating youth 14 to 18. Social and educational programs for the tween segment ages 9 - 14.

What are the qualifications for participants: The Agency runs its youth program in accordance with the Youth Program Standards promoted and supported by United Way. Following these standards all staff and volunteers working with youth must pass criminal background checks and child/abuse and neglect background checks. Staff must also receive training in principles of youth development and first aid. In addition all volunteer coaches are very competent and very qualified coaches in their perspective sports.

This affidavit affirms that **Guadalupe Center**, **Inc.**, is enrolled in, and is currently participating in, E-verify or any other equivalent electronic verification of work authorization operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security under the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 (IRCA); and, **Guadalupe Center**, **Inc.**, does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in conjunction with the contracted services.
