Justification regarding RLA

The Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office (JCMEO) is requesting submission of the attached RLA in the amount of \$57,000 to cover deficits in the 2019 adopted budget.

As you know, the JCMEO 2019 budget was reduced by over \$300,000 before being presented for approval in January. That reduction was based on expectations that our caseload would decrease substantially after the loss of the three previously contracted counties. Unfortunately, the Jackson County homicide and opioid death rates remain at an all-time high. With a higher case load, expenditures on each case have increased across the board within our own jurisdiction.

Due to the savings created by the new lab services contract that began in September 2018, we can request this transfer within our own budget, creating no additional expense to Jackson County.

I greatly appreciate your assistance in this matter. Please let me know if you have any questions or request any documentation on this issue.
