## **MEMORANDUM**

Re: Recommendation for Drug Court Treatment Provider

I am writing to recommend that an agreement be reached to obtain treatment services from the Heartland Center for Behavioral Change ("HBC") for our Drug Court Program.

After posting a request for proposal for a treatment provider for our Drug Court Program, our finance department received proposals from HBC and Comprehensive Mental Health Service, Inc. On April 10, 2020, a review team met virtually via Microsoft teams to score/grade the two submissions. Based on the raw scores, the submission from HBC scored slightly higher than that of the submission by Comprehensive Mental Health Service, Inc. Attached is the score sheet showing the cumulative score.

Thereafter, while still being in the midst of the pandemic and adjusting to the re-opening of Court with multiple new revised dockets and staggered work schedules, our staff met with members of HBC to discuss various items related to their submission in late April and May 2020.

First, we sought information regarding the increased pricing in HBC's quotation page (see page 61 of their submission). We were advised that the new pricing was related to the increased cost of providing services identified. In addition, HBC noted that the prior pricing had remained at one level for the five previous years without an increase. Second, we advised HBC that it is our expectation that they are required to provide an observer for testing. This point was identified and discussed by them in their submission on pages 98-105. HBC noted that they recognize their obligation and noted that currently they have staff available that can meet this need. Third, we noted that "CLEARLOGIC" or any system used by HBC for maintaining participant records must be accessible to the treatment team to the extent that those members will be able to view the system and track the progress and treatment of participants. In addition, HBC agreed to allow us to retrieve this information should there be a future end to the program's connection to HBC.

Fourth, we discussed with HBC that there has been a growing need for flexibility in scheduling regarding locations to test, individual therapy and group therapy. We anticipate that this need will grow given the logistical issues created by the pandemic. HBC are aware of these issues and appears ready to meet these challenges and they have agreed to work with the treatment team and the Court on this issue.

In late May 2020, my father in law became ill and entered hospice treatment. He passed away in late June 2020 after fighting a devasting stroke that limited him over the last two years. Because of personal obligations, I was sporadically in and out of the office through the middle of July. That personal matter combined with other work deadlines and responsibilities have caused my delay in providing this memorandum. I apologize for that delay and take full responsibility for timing of this memorandum.

The ability to provide the high level of quality treatment for our Drug Court and Veterans' Court participants is a critical part of our program. As part of any contract, HBC will be required to perform an assessment for each participant. This assessment will identify an individualized treatment plan designed specifically for each participant based on that participant's history (i.e. social, criminal, and abuse), access to resources, and projected needs for achieving and maintaining sobriety. HBC's contractual obligations will also require a variety of additional services be provided to participants. These include but are not limited to individual counseling, group counseling, sanction groups, and observation during urinalysis drug testing.

Completing the agreement with HBC to provide treatment in our Drug Court is of critical importance. The Jackson County Drug Court started in October 1993. To date, the Drug Court program has graduated over 2700 participants. As of March 1, 2020, our treatment Court programs had over 400 active participants. Based on a review of prior treatment provider billing in conjunction with the projected costs identified in HBC's request for proposal response, we project that we will need approximately \$70,000 a month or \$840,000 annually to maintain the programmatic standards for treatment.
