Re CARES Grant Application Mid-Continent Public Library proposes the implementation of a hotspot lending program to facilitate additional connectivity for students of higher education within the MCPL District. We understand from Dr. Beatty that the migration to virtual classrooms is challenging for students, especially community college students. Consequently, the program will target students of the Metropolitan Community Colleges (MCC) located within the Library District.

MCC locations that will be supported by this program include the Blue River Campus (Independence, MO), Longview Campus (Lee's Summit, MO); and Maple Woods Campus (Kansas City, MO). MCPL proposes providing 10 mobile hotspots for checkout at each of the following branches to support the MCC campuses mentioned above: North Independence, South Independence, Blue Springs North, Blue Springs South, and Bucker; Lee's Summit, East Lee's Summit, Colbern Road, Grandview, and Blue Ridge; Woodneath, Liberty, Claycomo, North Oak, and Antioch.

The hotspot lending program will be compliant with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPPA). At least five hotspots at each branch will be reserved (through June 30, 2021) for students currently enrolled at higher education institutions.


A match of \$50,000 from Jackson County would allow MCPL to purchase about 63 more hotspots with lending equipment and corresponding service for two years. If the match is allocated the following branches will be allocated 17 devices instead of 10: North Independence, South Independence, Blue Springs North, Blue Springs South, Buckner, Lee's Summit, East Lee's Summit, Colburn Road, Grandview and Blue Ridge. As you know, MCPL is undergoing a significant capital improvement and replacement program. If a branch is closed for remodeling, any assigned hotspots will be moved to a neighboring library branch within Jackson County.
